1 MR. RINALDI: Good evening, ladies
2 and gentlemen. I'd like to call the work
3 session to order with the Pledge of Allegiance.

5 (Pledge of Allegiance.)

6
7 MR. RINALDI: Roll call, please,
8 Marylynn.

9 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilwoman
10 McCawley.

11 MS. McCAWLEY: Present.

12 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilwoman
13 Shotwell.

14 MS. SHOTWELL: Present.

15 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman
16 Komensky.

17 MR. KOMENSKY: Present.

18 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Lettieri
19 is absent. Councilman Butler.

20 MR. BUTLER: Here.

21 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Hoover.

22 MR. HOOVER: Present.

23 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Rinaldi.

24 MR. RINALDI: Here. Once again,
25 ladies and gentlemen, welcome to the work

1 session of the Old Forge Borough. Today is
2 Tuesday, April 1, 2025. The purpose of our
3 meeting will be to set the agenda for our
4 regular meeting, which will be Tuesday, April
5 15th.

6 We'll hear from our department
7 heads, we'll hear from our Council members,
8 mayor, our engineer, borough manager,
9 solicitor.

10 There's a public sign-in sheet. If
11 anyone from the public would like to address
12 us, we'll give you a few moments at the end of
13 the meeting. But before we go into the regular
14 sequence of the work session, Mayor Legg has a
15 proclamation that he would like to recognize
16 Mr. Genell who's in the audience. So, we're
17 gonna do that first, and then we'll go on with
18 the meeting.

19 MAYOR LEGG: Thank you.

20 MR. RINALDI: You're welcome.

21 MAYOR LEGG: Ang, would you come up
22 to the podium here?

23 MR. GENELL: I wish I dressed.

24 MAYOR LEGG: Unless you've been
25 living in Siberia the last 30 years, folks, I

1 think everybody knows Mr. Genell. He, along
2 with his wife Tracy and brother Mark are the
3 proprietors of Arcaro and Genell restaurant,
4 which is down the road a piece.

5 Angelo is one of the kindest, most
6 generous persons that I know. Any time there's
7 an event going on in town, Angelo is there with
8 his place, with his workers, and with his
9 wallet wide open.

10 I have a little story to tell you
11 about Angelo. First of all, he's a nervous
12 wreck because when I saw him a couple weeks ago
13 and asked him to come --

14 MR. GENELL: I thought I didn't pay
15 my taxes.

16 MAYOR LEGG: I think he thought I
17 had a hit man waiting for him. No, you're
18 safe.

19 MR. GENELL: All right.

20 MAYOR LEGG: A while back we had an
21 affair at Angelo's place for the banner program
22 and all the people who had banners or purchased
23 banners were invited, every veteran in the area
24 was invited, and those that came got a nice
25 pin. Our own borough manager, Marylynn, Rick

1 Malucci (phonetic) and John Haluska (phonetic)
2 were honored for their participation in the
3 program, making it the success that it was.

4 It was a real nice affair, really,
5 really nice. And when it was winding down, we
6 went to Angelo, we said, Angelo, can you give
7 us a bill so we could cut you a check? And he
8 gave us one of those, like, don't worry about
9 it. Well, you know, it's not like we purchased
10 happy meals at McDonald's. This was a big
11 bill.

12 Angelo disappeared. And first I
13 thought he was in the witness protection
14 program, but he finally surfaced and we pressed
15 him, and he gave us a ridiculous figure, a
16 ridiculously low figure. And we know at this
17 juncture in time we weren't gonna get anywhere
18 with Angelo, so we cut a check for him and,
19 again, he disappeared like Casper the friendly
20 ghost.

21 So, when we finally found him, he
22 didn't want to take the check. It was
23 unbelievable. That's Angelo. That's Angelo.
24 Angelo, I have a little something -- go ahead.

25 MR. GENELL: No. That's the least I

1 could do. This room could be full of people
2 like me.

3 MAYOR LEGG: You are one of a kind.
4 I have a little something for you I'd like to
5 read. This Mayor's outstanding citizen award
6 is presented to Mr. Angelo Genell for his
7 continuous dedication and never ending
8 generosity to the Borough of Old Forge.

9 I wish it was a million dollars,
10 Ang, but you probably already have a million
11 dollars, and I'll tell you what, I'm available
12 for adoption. I'm house trained.

13 MR. GENELL: Thank you.

14 (Applause.)

15 MR. RINALDI: Angelo, if you
16 wouldn't mind, could you come up, we'd like to
17 get a picture with you. Just come up and stand
18 with us at the table, please.

19 Ang, once again, congratulations.

20 MR. GENELL: Okay. Thank you.

21 MR. RINALDI: You're very welcome.

22 Thank you.

23 MAYOR LEGG: Thank you,

24 Mr. Chairman. I appreciate it.

25 MR. RINALDI: You're welcome.

1 Thanks, Ang.

2 MR. GENELL: Thank you.

3 MR. RINALDI: You're very welcome.

4 Have a good night.

5 We'll continue with the meeting.

6 Mayor, real quick, great job on that by taking
7 that, and I know that was your idea, I know you
8 came up with it, and I know you said you were
9 gonna do it to a few other people as we move
10 forward in the year and the years to come, so I
11 think that's a great idea, as well. It's a
12 good thing to recognize people from the borough
13 who do a lot of good things for people in the
14 borough.

15 MAYOR LEGG: And we have a lot of
16 them.

17 MR. RINALDI: We do. We do. But
18 it's a good job by you for --

19 MAYOR LEGG: Thank you.

20 MR. RINALDI: -- coming up with it
21 and, like, basically beginning and starting the
22 program. It's good.

23 MAYOR LEGG: Thank you. I
24 appreciate that.

25 MR. RINALDI: You're welcome. We'll

1 continue on with the work session. Like I
2 said, we're going to set the agenda for our
3 next meeting. So, we'll go through our
4 department heads first, we'll see if they have
5 anything for tonight or for the upcoming
6 regular meeting.

7 DPW manager, Joseph Lencieski. Hi,
8 Joe. Good evening.

9 MR. LENCESKI: How are you?

10 MR. RINALDI: Good. Thank you.
11 Anything for tonight or for the agenda coming
12 up?

13 MR. LENCESKI: Nothing tonight.
14 Nothing for the agenda.

15 MR. RINALDI: Any members have any
16 questions for Joe?

17 MR. HOOVER: Joe, grass this week?

18 MR. LENCESKI: Yes. Thursday and
19 Friday.

20 MR. HOOVER: Thursday and Friday?

21 MR. LENCESKI: Yeah.

22 MR. BUTLER: Check on the signs for
23 Teddy Giglio, the slow, children at play sign,
24 or whatever?

25 MR. LENCESKI: I was in Florida last

1 week, so I'm trying to catch up.

2 MR. BUTLER: I know. I'm sorry I
3 bothered you.

4 MR. LENCESKI: We'll get on it.

5 MR. RINALDI: You're back now.
6 We'll get everything rolling again.

7 MR. LENCESKI: Yeah.

8 MR. RINALDI: Any other members have
9 any questions for Joe?

10 MR. KOMENSKY: No. Thanks, Joe.

11 MR. RINALDI: Joe, thank you.

12 MR. LENCESKI: Thank you.

13 MR. RINALDI: You're welcome. Mike
14 Sokolowski, code enforcement, zoning officer.
15 Mike, good evening.

16 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: Good evening.

17 MR. RINALDI: Anything for the
18 meeting tonight or for the upcoming agenda?

19 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: No.

20 MR. RINALDI: Any members have any
21 questions for Mike?

22 MAYOR LEGG: I'm gonna tell you
23 something, Mr. Chairman, I've had a couple
24 people nailing me, and Mike has been
25 tremendous, okay? I've had two or three

1 situations, I've gone to him, okay, and he
2 alleviated my burden and he took care of these
3 situations. Thanks, Mike. Fantastic job. I
4 appreciate it. That's all.

5 MR. RINALDI: Good work, Mike.

6 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: Thanks.

7 MR. RINALDI: Any other members have
8 anything for Mike?

9 MR. BUTLER: I have one question.

10 MR. RINALDI: Sure.

11 MR. BUTLER: What are you doing with
12 the condemned houses? We gonna let them sit
13 there forever or --

14 MR. RINALDI: Which ones?

15 MR. BUTLER: Is there some kind of a
16 formula or a process we have to follow? One on
17 South Main Street, that's one that they're
18 building a brand new house right next to it
19 that I get nervous, because if they have to
20 knock it down, you got a brand new house going
21 up right next to it.

22 MR. KOMENSKY: Where is that?

23 MR. BUTLER: South Main Street.

24 MR. RINALDI: South Main going down
25 on the left.

1 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: I said that, the
2 people, they're dead. They have no family. I
3 told you two months ago with the Lackawanna
4 County, she's researching it, also, and if it
5 doesn't, it goes for a short sale at the end of
6 the summer. I just got a report from them last
7 week on that.

8 MR. BUTLER: Okay. How about Ripple
9 Street?

10 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: He says as soon as
11 the weather breaks, so that should be any time.

12 MR. BUTLER: Okay. And the two on
13 Ray Street?

14 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: Ray? I'm working
15 on. The one in the back --

16 MR. BUTLER: The bear's gone,
17 though, I guess.

18 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: Yeah. He's up on
19 Tanya Drive. I saw him.

20 MR. BUTLER: The one on Drakes Lane
21 is coming down, also?

22 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: It just sold.

23 MR. BUTLER: Okay.

24 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: The second week of
25 March. That went for sheriff's sale.

1 MR. BUTLER: So it's sold?

2 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: Yeah.

3 MR. BUTLER: Okay.

4 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: The one on Sussex
5 Street was sold, and it started -- they pulled
6 permits for the roof yesterday, they're
7 starting to work on that to fix that.

8 MR. BUTLER: Okay. Good. And the
9 burn house?

10 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: That's still in
11 court. I talked to George Seig on that, and he
12 told me as long as it's in court, we can't do
13 anything with it until it's settled.

14 MR. BUTLER: Okay. So, we're going
15 to be fighting over it forever.

16 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: Yeah.

17 MR. KOMENSKY: Well, it's already
18 what, three years?

19 MR. BUTLER: Yeah. All right.
20 Thanks, Mike.

21 MR. HOOVER: Mike, that palm readers
22 building on South Main Street down there --

23 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: Yeah.

24 MR. HOOVER: -- that tree in the
25 back, one of the neighbors called me about the

1 tree in the back, I guess a significant branch
2 fell and they're worried about the rest of the
3 tree falling. It's a pretty big tree.

4 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: I talked to that
5 guy Friday. When was it they did the flagpole?
6 When did you say that was?

7 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Thursday or Friday.

8 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: Thursday or Friday.

9 (Inaudible crosstalk.)

10 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: -- I called him, he
11 said somebody took it down. And he has someone
12 coming to supposedly clean the back yard up.

13 MR. HOOVER: All right. Because
14 that tree is bad. All right. Thanks.

15 MR. BUTLER: So that RV in the back
16 yard --

17 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: He's got somebody
18 else doing it.

19 MR. BUTLER: All right. Because
20 what you call it told me that.

21 (Inaudible crosstalk.)

22 MR. BUTLER: Schuback told me as
23 soon as you go to pick it up it's gonna fall
24 apart.

25 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: It's gonna fall

1 apart. Right. Because that's what Schuback
2 was paid for but never did it because he said
3 it was gonna fall apart, he wanted more money.
4 So now he has supposedly something --

5 MR. BUTLER: Okay.

6 MR. RINALDI: Any other questions
7 for Michael?

8 (No response.)

9 MR. RINALDI: Thanks, Mike.

10 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: Okay.

11 MR. RINALDI: Dave Lopatka,
12 engineer. Good evening, Dave.

13 MR. LOPATKA: Good evening.

14 MR. RINALDI: Anything for tonight
15 or for the upcoming agenda?

16 MR. LOPATKA: Nothing for the
17 agenda. I've got a meeting set up next week
18 with Lindy to go look at -- to do, like, the
19 final inspection on Pagnotti, make sure
20 everything's finished.

21 And also at the same time meeting
22 Arris over there who helped us out with the
23 electrical and plumbing and irrigation just to
24 see -- have them take a look and see what's
25 done and what we need to make sure we have on

1 the bids for the second phase, make sure,
2 because I know that there's the hookup and
3 everything for the irrigation system and
4 whatnot, so I just wanted to make sure that
5 what they have in there now as opposed to what
6 needs to go in there for the irrigation is
7 covered when we put it out to bid.

8 Other than that, I have Miles Street
9 and Marion Street parks, the paving and that,
10 that part I bid, almost ready to go. Arris,
11 who is do the lighting project, they'll have
12 that to me on Monday --

13 MS. BARTOLETTI: Okay.

14 MR. LOPATKA: -- next week to look
15 at, and we'll take a look at it, Marylynn, once
16 I get it, just to make sure it's what you're
17 looking for.

18 MS. BARTOLETTI: Okay.

19 MR. LOPATKA: So, there should be a
20 couple of them we'll be able to bid in April.

21 MR. RINALDI: Okay. Any other
22 items?

23 MR. LOPATKA: Nope.

24 MR. RINALDI: Any members have any
25 questions for Dave?

1 MR. HOOVER: DPW still going?

2 MR. LOPATKA: Yeah. I got to get
3 that together.

4 MR. HOOVER: Yeah. All right.

5 MR. RINALDI: Anyone else have any
6 questions for David?

7 (No response.)

8 MR. RINALDI: Thanks, Dave.

9 MR. LOPATKA: Yeah.

10 MR. RINALDI: Police Chief Jason
11 Dubernas. Good evening, Chief.

12 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Good evening.

13 MR. RINALDI: Anything for this
14 evening or for the upcoming agenda?

15 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Nothing for the
16 agenda. Just two updates. One, our AEDs are
17 in, the old ones are out, in our police station
18 in the hallway here.

19 And, second, just an update with the
20 crosswalk on Drakes Lane with Ms. Doherty on
21 128. So, I was in touch with Ms. Hannan, and
22 then she got me in touch with the directors of
23 operations. The reason why the crosswalk is
24 put where it is is because it's directly across
25 the street from a corner on Elm Street.

1 They couldn't go at an angle
2 because -- or the other corner on Elm Street is
3 because it would have come into her
4 driveway/Ms. Major's driveway. So they had to
5 go in the opposite corner to be AED compliant.
6 So, unfortunately, it landed right in front of
7 her house.

8 So, I think the gentleman's name is
9 Rob, he's gonna work it, look into it to see if
10 he could have it moved enough that they could
11 park a car there. And she's well aware of
12 this. I was on the phone with her twice
13 already.

14 MR. RINALDI: Okay. I'm looking on
15 the map, and, again, I mean, obviously it'd be
16 up to the State, the other corner looks like
17 they could move it to the other corner. Did
18 you notice it?

19 CHIEF DUBERNAS: No. They said it
20 comes into the driveway. It can't go to a
21 driveway. It has to --

22 (Inaudible crosstalk.)

23 MR. RINALDI: Oh, the -- yeah.
24 Okay. It comes into the driveway of the other
25 property. Okay. All right. Well, Chief,

1 thanks for looking into it, and give us an
2 update when you find out what they --

3 CHIEF DUBERNAS: And the final thing
4 with the Amity house, they were contacted
5 asking for addresses and everything, so things
6 are probably gonna move forward. They want an
7 updated address and final counts and
8 everything. So, as soon as I hear something,
9 I'll let you know.

10 MR. RINALDI: Sounds good. Thanks,
11 Chief. Any members have any questions for the
12 Chief?

13 MR. BUTLER: Bruce get in touch with
14 you about the cameras?

15 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Cameras?

16 MR. BUTLER: For the drop off.

17 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Yeah. He's gonna
18 give me a call to come here, so --

19 MR. BUTLER: Okay.

20 MR. RINALDI: Any other members have
21 any questions for the Chief?

22 (No response.)

23 CHIEF DUBERNAS: There's two names,
24 Mr. Lutkowski and Mr. Pilosi.

25 MR. RINALDI: Okay. Thanks, Chief.

1 Assistant Fire Chief Bill Stull. Good evening,
2 Bill.

3 MR. STULL: Good evening.

4 MR. RINALDI: Anything for tonight
5 or the upcoming agenda?

6 MR. STULL: Yeah. Just for tonight,
7 this weekend, the 5th and 6th, Saturday,
8 Sunday, we're doing a flashover simulator over
9 at the fire station.

10 It's outdoor. It's a burn. It's
11 put on by the Pennsylvania State Fire Academy,
12 so we're using their instructors and everything
13 like that.

14 We went around yesterday to the
15 residents, we gave out about 200 flyers,
16 everything from Albion Street all the way over
17 to Milwaukee Avenue, from Oak Street over to
18 Wyalusing, down behind the school that way, so
19 we hit about 200 residents and we put flyers
20 out for them, and also it's on social media.
21 I'm gonna talk to the police chief, I guess
22 they're gonna put the signs up Thursday, Chief?

23 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Yeah, Thursday.

24 MR. STULL: Yeah. To let people be
25 aware.

1 MR. RINALDI: Good.

2 MR. STULL: So, that's it.

3 MR. RINALDI: All right. Thanks,
4 Bill. I appreciate you doing that. Any
5 members have any questions for Bill?

6 (No response.)

7 MR. RINALDI: Thanks, Bill.

8 MR. STULL: Uh-huh.

9 MR. RINALDI: Attorney Rinaldi,
10 solicitor, anything for the meeting or for the
11 upcoming agenda?

12 ATTY. RINALDI: I'm gonna try and
13 get a resolution on the fees for Mike and the
14 zoning office updated, and we may have one,
15 maybe two subdivisions for final improvement.

16 MR. RINALDI: Okay. Any members
17 have any questions for Bill?

18 (No response.)

19 MR. RINALDI: Thanks, Bill.

20 Marylynn, good evening. Anything for the
21 meeting tonight or for the upcoming agenda?

22 MS. BARTOLETTI: For the upcoming
23 agenda, I will have a resolution for a grant
24 that we're applying for to Department of
25 Conservation and Natural Resources for work to

1 be done at Pagnotti Park.

2 And not for the agenda for the next
3 meeting, but I just wanted to throw out that we
4 did have a construction meeting yesterday with
5 Dave, Mike was involved, myself, the
6 contractors, the electrical people, just to go
7 over all the work that's being done at the
8 senior center, you know, just to get everyone
9 on the same page, and so far so good.

10 We had a couple things that need a
11 little bit of tweaking, a couple changes, but I
12 think so far things are going pretty smooth,
13 and I would have to think it's pretty much on
14 schedule.

15 MR. RINALDI: What do you think the
16 schedule is, Marylynn, or Dave?

17 MS. BARTOLETTI: I think it was
18 July, August area.

19 MR. LOPATKA: Yeah, I think June or
20 July, early August.

21 MR. RINALDI: Pretty good.

22 MR. LOPATKA: They're moving
23 forward, which is good.

24 MR. RINALDI: Anything else,
25 Marylynn?

1 MS. BARTOLETTI: That's it.

2 MR. RINALDI: Any members have any
3 questions for Marylynn?

4 (No response.)

5 MR. RINALDI: Thank you, Mare. You
6 said who's on the public sign in?

7 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Mr. Lutkowski's
8 first, and then Mr. Pilosi.

9 MR. RINALDI: Okay. Hi, Karl. You
10 could come up now. Good evening.

11 MR. LUTKOWSKI: Good evening,
12 Council. As you all know, I'm the president of
13 Old Forge little league. I'm just coming here
14 to formally invite everybody to our opening
15 day, which is April 26th.

16 The parade will start at 10 from the
17 high school coming down to Miles field, and
18 then we'll have a bunch of festivities there,
19 ice cream truck for the kids, basket raffles,
20 and hopefully it's a good community day. We
21 have a face painter and a DJ and a photo booth,
22 as well.

23 So, I'm just coming to invite you
24 guys. Hopefully you guys stop by and show
25 support to the community and to our little

1 league.

2 So, if anybody has any questions,
3 I'm here to answer them, but really that's my
4 only job is just to come formally invite
5 everybody.

6 MR. RINALDI: Thanks, Karl. We
7 appreciate it.

8 MR. LUTKOWSKI: Okay.

9 MR. RINALDI: Anybody have any
10 questions for Karl?

11 MR. KOMENSKY: Just, Chief, you got
12 the parade --

13 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Karl, same route as
14 last year?

15 MR. LUTKOWSKI: Yeah. Yep, same
16 route, just going down by Arcaro and Genell's,
17 and then down to Miles from the high school.

18 MR. RINALDI: So, down Grace, up
19 Main, down Miles?

20 MR. LUTKOWSKI: Yep.

21 MR. RINALDI: Okay. Any members
22 have any questions for Karl?

23 (No response.)

24 MR. LUTKOWSKI: All right. Thank
25 you.

1 MR. RINALDI: Thanks, Karl.

2 Appreciate it.

3 MR. LUTKOWSKI: Thank you.

4 MR. RINALDI: You're welcome. Have
5 a good night.

6 MR. LUTKOWSKI: Thank you for your
7 time.

8 MR. RINALDI: Thank you.

9 Mr. Pilosi. Good evening.

10 MR. PILOSI: Good evening, Council
11 members. I certainly appreciate the time.
12 It's come with a burden, come with my burdens.
13 You make -- well, I know -- well, most of you
14 know where I live. I live on the corner of
15 South Grace and East Morton Street.

16 Now, my neighbors are the Barons,
17 which is a vacant home right now. Mark owns
18 the home, and the house is vacant. He picks up
19 his mail once or twice a week. Across is
20 Loughney. And then directly across is --
21 (Inaudible). So, the four of us comprise that
22 corner.

23 It seems as though -- now, we
24 reside, my wife and I reside there, we're there
25 over 20 years, and every time when the Borough

1 paves, it never comes on the South Grace side.
2 And it's only the two homes, it's me and now
3 Baron.

4 Now, the macadam is considerably
5 deteriorating. It's getting to be pothole size
6 now. So, I said I'm not gonna burden the
7 Borough with expense, because we all know how
8 expensive it can be. I said, I'll pick up the
9 tab.

10 So I got a guy down there to give me
11 a price on how much it'll cost to do the road.
12 Like I said, it's not a big road because it
13 extends out only maybe 40 feet. I don't
14 have -- I have pictures but I don't have a
15 measurement. And the rest of it goes to
16 Orchard, which is no longer accessible, and
17 those properties now have -- are between
18 Dunmore and Gary Babursy (phonetic) their
19 properties.

20 But anyway, long story short, the
21 person that does paving says to me, I'm not
22 gonna touch this. I said, Why not? He said,
23 Because this is borough land. This is borough
24 property, and it has to be contractual.

25 So, now I'm here at your mercy

1 begging what could I do? What should you do?

2 MR. RINALDI: Well, my first
3 question's gonna be to Joe, do we collect
4 liquid fuels on it?

5 MR. LENCESKI: I'd have to look at
6 that.

7 MR. RINALDI: Okay.

8 MR. LENCESKI: I know exactly the
9 location. I just have to look at a map.

10 MR. RINALDI: Okay. So, that's our
11 first, we have to find out -- I think we
12 looked into this. Didn't we look into this
13 last year?

14 MS. BARTOLETTI: I'm not sure.

15 MR. RINALDI: I'm not sure either,
16 but I thought we talked about this road.

17 MR. HOOVER: There was something
18 going on down there with the water. Was there
19 a water problem there in the back yard?

20 MR. RINALDI: Guy, unless it's a
21 different area, I thought we talked about this,
22 but I could be wrong, but first thing we'd have
23 to find out is if we own the road.

24 MR. PILOSI: Okay.

25 MR. RINALDI: I can't see why we

1 wouldn't own the road, though, correct?

2 (Inaudible crosstalk.)

3 MR. PILOSI: In fact, years ago,
4 about 20 years, they told me, when I came to
5 the Borough to -- I forget what I came to the
6 Borough for, but anyway, I forget what the
7 problem was at that time, and they said to me,
8 Oh, that's a -- (Inaudible). And it's not,
9 it's on Grace Street.

10 In fact, there's a stop sign there.
11 And when I said, How many people have stop
12 signs on their driveways? And then the next
13 day the Borough came up and pulled the stop
14 sign out, the very next day. I said, But it's
15 still a road.

16 MR. RINALDI: And how long ago were
17 you here?

18 MR. PILOSI: Oh, I'm here 20 years.

19 MR. RINALDI: No, no. How long ago
20 were you here when they did that? You said you
21 came here?

22 MR. PILOSI: If I did come here,
23 it's --

24 (Inaudible crosstalk.)

25 MR. RINALDI: Well, yeah, I was just

1 trying to get a timeline.

2 MR. PILOSI: Yeah.

3 MR. RINALDI: Joe, do you have the
4 map?

5 MR. HOOVER: Mr. Pilosi, just to let
6 you -- East Morton Street is on our paving list
7 for this year.

8 MR. PILOSI: Yes. All my concern is
9 just to --

10 MR. HOOVER: We'll have to look at
11 it. If we get liquid fuels on it, then it has
12 to be a borough road. That's the biggest
13 thing.

14 (Inaudible crosstalk.)

15 MR. PILOSI: -- and I wasn't doing
16 anything, and like I said, I'd even --
17 (Inaudible) -- I'll do it myself, because if Al
18 was still with me, if Al Baron was still with
19 me, we would have pitched in and did it
20 ourselves and said to hell with it, you know,
21 but it's still, I believe, it's still --

22 MR. RINALDI: Joe just went to look
23 now. He's gonna find out.

24 MR. PILOSI: Okay.

25 MR. RINALDI: He'll find out for us.

1 MR. PILOSI: Yeah. Okay.

2 MR. RINALDI: Because like
3 Councilman Hoover said, if it is a borough road
4 and we are paving East Morton this year, we
5 could definitely get a quote to see with that,
6 I don't want to say little piece, but that
7 little piece would cost.

8 MR. PILOSI: Right. I have pictures
9 if you want to see them.

10 MR. RINALDI: No, no, no. You don't
11 have to show us pictures.

12 (Inaudible crosstalk.)

13 MR. RINALDI: I've been there
14 before, I know where it is.

15 (Inaudible crosstalk.)

16 MR. RINALDI: I know where you live.
17 I mean, I'm sure we all do. It is on liquid
18 fuels.

19 MR. LENCESKI: .03.

20 MR. PILOSI: Yeah. Okay.

21 (Inaudible crosstalk.)

22 MR. PILOSI: My concern is that they
23 come and that side, you know.

24 MR. RINALDI: Well, yeah, it's the
25 whole road, because you could see on the map,

1 right? You looked on it?

2 MR. LENCESKI: Oh, yeah.

3 MR. RINALDI: Right. So that's the
4 good thing. So the good thing is we do own it,
5 so we could ask the paving committee to put
6 that on a price list, as well, and see what the
7 addition would be.

8 MR. HOOVER: We could just add that
9 right to the paving list for East Morton
10 Street. I'll walk the streets with Dave and
11 we'll look at the side streets.

12 While we're down there, if the side
13 streets have to be done, then they have to be
14 done. So, that'll be one of them I'll keep in
15 mind.

16 MR. PILOSI: Okay. Well, that's all
17 I'm here for. I appreciate the time.

18 MR. RINALDI: All right.

19 MR. PILOSI: Thank you. Thank you
20 very much.

21 MR. RINALDI: You're welcome. At
22 the time, before we adjourn, we'll go down the
23 table, see if any of the members have anything.
24 First up, Mayor Legg. Good evening.

25 MAYOR LEGG: Thank you,

1 Mr. Chairman. I think I've said enough
2 tonight.

3 MR. RINALDI: But everything you
4 said was well said and very good.

5 MAYOR LEGG: Thank you. I
6 appreciate it.

7 MR. RINALDI: You're welcome.
8 Councilwoman Jones-Shotwell?

9 MS. SHOTWELL: I don't think I
10 really have anything tonight. No. Thank you.

11 MR. RINALDI: You're welcome.

12 MS. SHOTWELL: Oh, except to say
13 that, you know, because Angelo's gone now and
14 I, you know, but the world would be better if
15 there were more Angelo Genells. I don't know.
16 That's all I'll say.

17 MR. RINALDI: Agreed.

18 MAYOR LEGG: You're right.

19 MR. RINALDI: Well said. Councilman
20 Komensky?

21 MR. KOMENSKY: I concur. I don't
22 have anything else. Thank you.

23 MR. RINALDI: You're welcome.
24 Councilman Butler?

25 MR. BUTLER: I concur with Jenn. I

1 think it's a great job by Bobby with this
2 Angelo Genell thing. I mean, he's been doing
3 this for years and years and years. I mean,
4 it's actually ridiculous how much he throws
5 into this town. So, it was a job well done,
6 Bob.

7 MAYOR LEGG: Thank you.

8 MR. RINALDI: Councilwoman McCawley?

9 MS. McCAWLEY: Yes. What Jenn said,
10 very good job.

11 MR. RINALDI: Councilman Hoover?

12 MR. HOOVER: One thing, Joe, that
13 batting cage down on Miles that's behind the
14 fence --

15 MR. LENCESKI: Yes.

16 MR. HOOVER: -- who owns that? I
17 mean, do we own that or does the little league
18 own it or --

19 MS. BARTOLETTI: It was a grant.

20 MR. HOOVER: Because it might have
21 to be --

22 MS. BARTOLETTI: The batting cage
23 was --

24 (Inaudible crosstalk.)

25 MR. HOOVER: Because the water

1 service, it's just for the football field, is
2 down there. That may have to come down. Yeah,
3 that may have to come down, because they have
4 to go through that fence and go down to the --
5 run the service for the football field.

6 MR. LENCESKI: Okay.

7 MR. HOOVER: Because it's right
8 there.

9 MR. BUTLER: Is that a Gene Pusley
10 (phonetic) thing?

11 MS. SHOTWELL: Yeah.

12 MS. BARTOLETTI: That's a Gene --
13 (Inaudible crosstalk.)

14 MR. HOOVER: So, I mean, we could
15 talk to the contractor when he's down there,
16 but there's not too much room to get a machine
17 in there and to get a water main in there.
18 We'll talk to him but --

19 MR. LENCESKI: Get a bucket truck in
20 between them.

21 MR. HOOVER: We'll see what happens.

22 MR. LENCESKI: Yeah.

23 MR. HOOVER: Yeah, we'll see what
24 happens, but it just may have to come down. I
25 want you to be aware of that.

1 MR. LENCESKI: I understand. Yeah.
2 Sure. And I actually told him that.

3 MR. HOOVER: Yeah. Okay.

4 MR. LENCESKI: Because I knew that
5 potentially Miles Street, that is Miles Street.

6 MR. HOOVER: Yeah.

7 MR. LENCESKI: It just is fenced off
8 from the park now. So I did tell everyone
9 while we were putting the net up, I'm like --
10 (Inaudible) --

11 MR. HOOVER: Once they do put the
12 trench in there, it's really gonna be a safety
13 issue. You know, they have to make sure they
14 do it cleaning up very good.

15 MR. LENCESKI: All right.

16 MR. HOOVER: Okay.

17 MR. LENCESKI: And we have
18 capability of locking the gates in a couple
19 different areas that any one would in that
20 area.

21 MR. HOOVER: Okay. That's it.

22 MR. RINALDI: I only have two items.
23 Just for public knowledge, we held an executive
24 session this evening regarding a legal matter,
25 and I'm gonna ask just that we have a brief

1 executive regarding another legal matter after
2 this work session.

3 If no members have anything, the
4 Chair would entertain a motion to adjourn.

5 MS. SHOTWELL: So move.

6 MR. RINALDI: By Councilwoman
7 Jones-Shotwell. All in favor?

8 ALL MEMBERS: Aye.

9 MR. RINALDI: Good night everyone.
10 Thank you for coming.

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
