1 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Good evening,
2 ladies and gentlemen. I'd liked to call the
3 meeting to order with the Pledge of
4 Allegiance.

5 (The Pledge of Allegiance was
6 recited.)

7 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Roll call,
8 please, Marylynn.

9 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilwoman
10 Avvisato?

11 MS. AVVISATO: Here.

12 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Butler?

13 MR. BUTLER: Here.

14 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Febbo?

15 MR. FEBBO: Here.

16 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Hoover?

17 MR. HOOVER: Here.

18 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Lettieri
19 is absent. Councilman Notari?

20 MR. NOTARI: Present.

21 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Rinaldi?

22 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Here. Once
23 again, ladies and gentlemen, welcome to the
24 Old Forge Borough meeting tonight. We
25 apologize for a little late start. Also,

1 before we get started I would just like to
2 offer a quick moment of silence. In between
3 our last meeting our solicitor's father had
4 passed away, Anthony Rinaldi. I'd just like
5 to give him a brief moment of silence in
6 respect to him and his family.

7 (A moment of silence was observed.)

8 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Thank you.
9 Once again, welcome to tonight's meeting.
10 Tonight is Tuesday, August 15, 2023. The
11 purpose of our meeting is to go through our
12 department heads, we'll hear from our
13 council members, go down the table and hear
14 from our borough manager and our solicitor.

15 The chief of police has a public
16 sign-in sheet. If anybody from the public
17 would like to address us we'll give you a
18 few minutes at the end of the meeting.

7 MR. HOOVER: Yes.

8 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Notari?

14 MR. HOOVER: I'll make that motion.

15 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: By Councilman

16 Hoover.

17 MR. NOTARI: Second.

18 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Seconded by

19 Councilman Notari. On the question? Public

20 input? Roll call, please.

21 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilwoman

22 Avvisato?

23 MS. AVVISATO: Yes.

24 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Febbo?

25 MR. FEBBO: Yes.

1 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Butler?

2 MR. BUTLER: Yes.

3 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Hoover?

4 MR. HOOVER: Yes.

5 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Notari?

6 MR. NOTARI: Yes.

7 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Rinaldi?

8 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Yes. No more

9 items under housekeeping, we'll move to our
10 first department head. DPW Manager Joe
11 Lenceski is on vacation. We'll go to our
12 code enforcement/zoning officer, Mike
13 Sokolowski. Mike, anything to add for the
14 meeting?

15 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: I have nothing
16 right now.

17 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Does anybody
18 have any questions for Mike?

19 MR. FEBBO: Mike, the garage
20 situation, where are we at with that?

21 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: I'm getting killed.
22 That day we called and I just didn't get a
23 chance to write something up for that
24 lawyer. I have to get in touch with him
25 again.

1 MR. FEBBO: Can you get on that
2 again?

3 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: It's on my list.

4 MR. FEBBO: I know the other party
5 had some undesirables looking at the house
6 also. The neighbors are getting a little
7 antsy.

8 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: I'll get on it
9 tomorrow.

10 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Didn't we get
11 in contact with him and he said he was
12 coming to a planning meeting?

13 MR. FEBBO: We're talking about the
14 one on Drake's Lane.

15 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: It's an abandoned
16 property.

17 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: I'm talking
18 about the Moosic Road property. The fence
19 company.

20 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: He's coming
21 Thursday.

22 MR. LOPATKA: I received a call from
23 John Rebar, his consultant, today and he
24 asked me if I would meet with them Thursday
25 at Cherundolo's office. That's his

1 attorney. I think they want to have a
2 better understanding of what they need. So
3 I'll go and explain to them that they need
4 to provide us plans.

5 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: It's not you,
6 Dave, it's them. That was my question.

7 MR. FEBBO: I was talking about the
8 house on Lonesome Road, the back yard
9 between Schuback's son's house and Bobby --
10 anyway, that garage is falling down, there's
11 rodents in there. It's over a full year.
12 Every time Mike calls it's the same
13 old deal. We're working on it, somebody's
14 going to take care of it. Didn't happen.
15 The house itself should be knocked down.
16 It's falling apart.

17 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Any other
18 questions for Mike? Thanks, Mike. Dave
19 Lopatka, engineer, anything for the meeting?

20 MR. LOPATKA: Other than the paving,
21 they have the majority of the paving done.
22 They're supposed to be bringing the miller
23 back in to do those other two streets. The
24 main section of Milwaukee that we talked
25 about. So once they bring the miller back

1 in, which should be within the next day or
2 two, they'll mill that and get that paved.
3 They're waiting for the inlet boxes to put
4 them on either side of Dunn Avenue, right at
5 Sampson Street, where we talked about
6 crossing the road. So I think the majority
7 of the roads have been paved at this point
8 other than, I think, those two. They're
9 pretty much done other than that.

10 MR. HOOVER: Sampson, they can only
11 get it across the street. It's supposed to
12 run about 200 down, but we're going to do
13 that at another time.

14 MR. FEBBO: Milwaukee Avenue to
15 Drake's Lane?

16 MR. HOOVER: Milwaukee to Drake's
17 Lane.

18 That Moosic Road job by Panel Prints
19 came out very well. They paved right to the
20 parking spots, made it look nice. They only
21 went down 250 feet.

22 There was one thing on Dunn Avenue
23 that they didn't -- there was a couple side
24 streets like Reilly that they didn't go in
25 the 20 feet. How come?

1 MR. LOPATKA: I don't know.

2 MR. HOOVER: It doesn't matter.

3 Some of the streets they went in 20 feet and
4 did the approaches to the roads and some of
5 them they didn't. I just didn't know why.

6 MR. LOPATKA: I'm not sure why. I
7 can ask.

8 MR. HOOVER: Still looks good.
9 Third Street, Connell Street and Moosic Road
10 and Kohler Avenue are all completely done.
11 The only one is the inlet we have to get in
12 and millings.

13 Sonny Drive, I've been on the phone
14 with the water company three times this
15 week. They're going to get a price. The
16 price of \$62,000 that we're going to
17 probably end up eating that amount to do the
18 street the right way. The water company's
19 going to pave and do the milling. They are
20 doing three inches and an inch and a half,
21 Dave.

22 MR. LOPATKA: What he left out of
23 here was what they were already required to
24 do by the water company. So three inches
25 base -- well, it's three inches but it

1 amounts to two and a half and then the rest
2 of it. So what's not in here is money that
3 they have left to do the other --

4 MR. HOOVER: It's confusing the way
5 they wrote this up. Then the top. We want
6 to get rid of the swale on both sides of the
7 road, make the road a couple feet wider.
8 Put a curb along the whole side and then
9 back up with topsoil. Try to get that done.

10 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anything else,
11 Dave?

12 MR. LOPATKA: No. I'm going to meet
13 with them and I'll go over with them what is
14 required.

15 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anybody have
16 any questions for Dave? Thanks, Dave.

17 Chief of Police Jason Dubernas,
18 anything for the meeting?

19 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Before we get
20 started, the drug task force was out on
21 George Street right now. They have three
22 guys in custody -- two guys, one female.
23 But nothing, really. I won't be at the next
24 meeting. I'll be out of town. The mayor is
25 under the weather.

1 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anything else?

2 CHIEF DUBERNAS: That's it.

3 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anybody have
4 any questions for the chief?

5 MR. FEBBO: I'm getting complaints
6 about Milwaukee, the speed zone. Can we get
7 lines on Lonesome Road and in the morning to
8 maybe sitting out on Milwaukee?

9 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Yeah. He's talking
10 about South Milwaukee.

11 MR. BUTLER: Where I live.

12 CHIEF DUBERNAS: They took my lines
13 out. When they milled the road they took
14 our lines out. The one line was closer to
15 West Morton, then the other line I'm not
16 sure. There's a big parking lot there.

17 MR. FEBBO: You're going to reline
18 after it's paved.

19 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Yes.

20 MR. FEBBO: Again, you have a lot of
21 fast traffic.

22 MR. BUTLER: One guy every day
23 between 7:00 and 7:30. I don't know if he's
24 on his way to work or whatever. He goes by
25 there -- she said 60 but I think she

1 exaggerates.

2 CHIEF DUBERNAS: I clocked cars 70
3 on Lonesome Road.

4 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anything else?

5 CHIEF DUBERNAS: I have nothing
6 else.

7 MR. NOTARI: Any update on Edith
8 Street?

9 CHIEF DUBERNAS: No. I just got so
10 busy. We're going through a state police
11 audit. Hopefully it will be finished August
12 30th for everything. Last time we did it it
13 was 151 items. This time they're up to 239
14 items. Every two years.

15 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anybody else
16 have any questions for the chief? Thanks,
17 Chief. Assistant Fire Chief Bill Stull,
18 anything for the meeting?

19 MR. STULL: No, nothing.

20 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anybody have
21 any questions for Bill? Thanks, Bill.

22 Attorney Rinaldi?

23 ATTY. RINALDI: Just one reminder.
24 Thursday night is one of the last couple
25 comprehensive planning review meetings.

1 We'll go to public meetings probably in the
2 fall. So we're just about finalized.

3 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anybody have
4 any questions for the solicitor? Thanks,
5 Bill.

6 Marylynn, borough manager, anything
7 for the meeting?

8 MS. BARTOLETTI: My first question
9 is does anyone have any questions for me on
10 the financial reports? Okay. Just a little
11 reminder, for the ARPA funds we need to come
12 up with a project. So we can discuss that a
13 little bit so we can start moving forward
14 with it.

15 I had a question on the Felittese.
16 Their festival is coming up and they asked
17 if it's possible to make the street in front
18 of their property handicap only parking for
19 the days of their festival. So I just
20 mentioned it to Jason before we were coming
21 in.

22 MR. NOTARI: How can we do that?
23 There's people that live on that street.

24 MS. BARTOLETTI: Just in front.

25 MR. RUSSEL RINALDI: A temporary

1 sign or whatever.

2 ATTY. RINALDI: Under the code there
3 is something that gives the mayor and chief
4 temporary authority for parking.

5 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Does that need
6 a vote?

7 ATTY. RINALDI: Just tell the police
8 chief.

9 MS. BARTOLETTI: And just for the
10 record I have an audit on Friday for
11 workman's compensation. I think that's all
12 I have for tonight.

13 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anybody have
14 any questions for the borough manager?

15 MR. HOOVER: Mare gave me a picture
16 of a pickleball court that Dave drew up for
17 us for the one tennis court. You can get
18 three of them in there?

19 MR. LOPATKA: Yes.

20 MR. HOOVER: Three would be kind of
21 tight.

22 MR. LOPATKA: Technically, based on
23 the dimensions they work. You can put two.
24 Either way.

25 MR. FEBBO: Do we need three?

1 MR. HOOVER: My worst fear is
2 putting two up and we have people waiting.

3 MR. NOTARI: What about down at
4 Miles, the old racquetball court. Can we
5 put one or two there?

6 MS. BARTOLETTI: We didn't get that
7 far yet.

8 MR. HOOVER: If we put two up there
9 now with maybe adding one in the middle
10 later on if it goes enough. Put the one in
11 the middle and then maybe thinking about
12 putting one down at Miles.

13 MR. NOTARI: So we'll still have one
14 tennis court and two pickleball courts.

15 MR. LOPATKA: They actually run
16 perpendicular to the tennis court. That's
17 why everything works.

18 MR. NOTARI: Why not.

19 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: I would say
20 two.

21 MR. LOPATKA: All you need to do is
22 stripe them. You can paint over the tennis
23 court and then stripe out the two courts.

24 MS. BARTOLETTI: Is there a company
25 that does this?

1 MR. LOPATKA: A lot of them put in
2 special paint. I've been researching
3 pickleball courts. But they put a certain
4 paint down. You're going to want to spray
5 the underside. So when you stripe them you
6 just want to figure out if you want a color.
7 You want to color the kitchen.

8 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anything else?

9 MS. BARTOLETTI: No.

10 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anybody have
11 any questions for Marylynn? Thank you,
12 Mare. Before we go into new business I'll
13 go to public comment. James Gnall?

14 MR. GNALL: James Gnall, 324 Flower
15 Street, Old Forge. I just wanted to know if
16 we ever heard anything with that alleyway
17 between Flower Street and the field?

18 ATTY. RINALDI: So Marylynn's going
19 to give you a copy of the survey that we
20 have, and we can also give you a copy of the
21 subdivision plan. There's a private alley
22 behind all those lots on Sibley from
23 Flower -- and I'm not sure where it ends. I
24 think it goes down to Pero Park. So
25 everybody that fronts on Sibley has a

1 private alley that they own behind their
2 houses that is open.

3 MR. GNALL: So we can walk that?

4 ATTY. RINALDI: If you're on that
5 alley, that's your alley.

6 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Rear Flower, that
7 is.

8 ATTY. RINALDI: If you look at the
9 subdivision plan it was laid out for all the
10 people on Sibley, the rear. It's up to
11 them. It's a private alley. You can use it
12 to get down to the park but I would stay on
13 the right side.

14 MR. GNALL: What happens if we
15 don't -- if that doesn't happen? George
16 gave us permission to use half of his road
17 and cut through that woods there.

18 ATTY. RINALDI: That's between you
19 and George.

20 MR. GNALL: Well, that woods is
21 borough property.

22 ATTY. RINALDI: No, George has a
23 private driveway on his property. He owns
24 that land.

25 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Talking about

1 the road that goes --

2 MR. GNALL: After Sibley, that road,
3 there are trees behind it. That's not his.
4 That's borough property.

5 ATTY. RINALDI: That's the alley.
6 You'll see it on the survey plan.

7 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: No, you're
8 talking about if you're coming down Sibley
9 and the soccer field is on your left, you
10 make a left into that road. That's not the
11 road we're talking about.

12 MR. GNALL: It's Rear Flower Street
13 that supposedly is not a street. You would
14 want to call it a paper alley.

15 ATTY. RINALDI: It's a paper alley.

16 MR. GNALL: If I'm on Flower Street
17 looking down that alley anything to the left
18 is borough property. Right?

19 MR. NOTARI: No.

20 MR. LOPATKA: George owns the road.

21 MR. GNALL: I thought that was given
22 to us from the state to build a park on.

23 ATTY. RINALDI: You've got me
24 confused. Pero Park is on Sibley. Part of
25 that land is access to Sibley and to the

1 parking, yes.

2 MR. GNALL: But all that years ago,
3 when they tore all those houses out, who
4 gave -- whose property is it? Because if
5 we're going to say it's nobody's I'll make
6 my pathway through so the kids could go down
7 that way.

8 MR. LOPATKA: The borough owns Pero
9 Park plus it owns that patch of woods that
10 goes along Dunbar. Dunbar is next to it.
11 The borough owns that.

12 MR. GNALL: I'm asking if I can go
13 from -- because we talked to George about it
14 and he goes I don't care -- he's mad because
15 he doesn't want nobody -- again, I told you
16 he was going to shut that down because he
17 didn't want nobody playing where the trucks
18 go. He don't care if we use the dirt road
19 coming down the side to the park. Because
20 I'll ask Joe and all those guys that own on
21 that right hand side because I don't think
22 Joe would have a problem with me using the
23 property. See, I'd rather go down Dunbar's
24 anyway.

25 ATTY. RINALDI: That you have to

1 clear with him.

2 MR. GNALL: I know, but I need the
3 clearance to go through the woods, if I can
4 make a pathway through the woods.

5 MR. FEBBO: He's talking about
6 between the paper alley and George Dunbar's.

7 ATTY. RINALDI: So the only way you
8 can get to that property is going down the
9 paper alley or down George's property.

10 MR. GNALL: Well, I'm asking if I
11 can make a pathway through that woods.
12 That's all I'm asking for. Just so that you
13 know. We could build a pathway, cut a
14 couple little spruce trees down to make a
15 pathway to go down to the park and they can
16 use Dunbar's road, and that eliminates
17 anybody going near her house so I don't have
18 to listen to her bitch. As long as I get
19 permission from George and if you want a
20 thing from George I can get it.

21 ATTY. RINALDI: We can't get
22 involved in that. This is a paper alley.
23 Now you're asking to create a path on
24 borough property that doesn't have a path
25 and it's not a road. It starts to get to be

1 an insurance issue. One of those kids gets
2 hurt there, now it's a borough problem
3 because we don't know what you're creating
4 down there as a pathway.

5 So you want to come down Dunbar's,
6 turn left through borough property, and then
7 turn left again to go to --

8 MR. GNALL: No, just go straight to
9 the park.

10 ATTY. RINALDI: You want to go all
11 the way down to Pero Park and George's.

12 MR. GNALL: We just want
13 something --

14 ATTY. RINALDI: I can't speak for
15 Mr. Dunbar. I can give you the map. I
16 don't know what neighbor backs up against
17 the woods. Just let him know you want to
18 clear it. It's his property. It's not the
19 borough's.

20 MR. GNALL: What do you do with the
21 paper alley?

22 ATTY. RINALDI: It was lady out for
23 the people who bought lots on Sibley.
24 You'll see when you see the map. Everybody
25 there has a right to use that paper alley.

1 MR. FEBBO: Their back yards.

2 ATTY. RINALDI: As their back yards.

3 MR. GNALL: What about us? We're on
4 Flower Street and you have 15 kids that want
5 to go to the park that we don't allow them
6 on Sibley.

7 ATTY. RINALDI: The only one that
8 can stop you -- and they have to take you to
9 court and tell you it's no trespassing --
10 would be any of those people on Sibley whose
11 back yards go there. She's not on it.
12 She's the other side of the alley. Anybody
13 on Sibley, that alley is behind. Stay
14 right. Walk right down along the alley.
15 The borough is not going to bother you.

16 MR. GNALL: Who is responsible for
17 that if anybody can use it? So I can cut
18 those trees down?

19 MR. FEBBO: No.

20 MR. NOTARI: No.

21 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: The paper
22 alley belongs -- behind the people's
23 property. Wherever the paper alley runs.

24 MR. GNALL: So if they're not taking
25 care of it --

1 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: If you want to
2 go ask them. We can't give you permission
3 to do that.

4 ATTY. RINALDI: You get the plan
5 you'll be able to see the pins.

6 MR. GNALL: Flower Street is sinking
7 again. That happened six years ago, seven,
8 eight years ago.

9 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: From pavement
10 or is it sinking from subsidence?

11 MR. GNALL: I don't know. Once
12 before in front of the garage and they
13 determined it was a pipe that was leaking
14 for a long time.

15 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: What's the
16 address?

17 MR. GNALL: So it's 324, 322.

18 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Give us the
19 address and we'll give it to DPW and they'll
20 come over.

21 MR. FEBBO: We'll have Joe take a
22 look at it.

23 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: We will have
24 Joe coordinate with Dave, let both of them
25 take a look at it.

1 MR. GNALL: All right.

2 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Thanks. JJ
3 and Allie Quinn?

4 MR. QUINN: I bought a house over
5 here and the address for the house is 142
6 East Grace Street Rear --

7 MS. QUINN: I'm wondering if we can
8 get the address changed. Since I've moved
9 in there it's been very hard to get mail and
10 packages delivered. I lost two packages
11 already, and it also makes me worry that,
12 like, if there was a fire if emergency
13 services would find me at 142 East Grace
14 Street. Technically, when you drive up to
15 the property it's labeled Mulhern Street.

16 CHIEF DUBERNAS: You would have to
17 address that with the postmaster.

18 MS. QUINN: I also called the 911
19 operator. They told me to come here.

20 CHIEF DUBERNAS: We can change that
21 with the 911 system. That's not a problem.
22 Review with the postmaster, your driver's
23 license and everything else.

24 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: What address
25 is on the deed?

1 MR. QUINN: 142 Rear Grace Street.
2 The post office said you have to talk to the
3 borough or 911, with taxes and everything.

4 MR. NOTARI: I don't have a problem.

5 CHIEF DUBERNAS: We can call comm
6 center and tell them put a note in there
7 Rear 142 East Grace is actually 211 Mulhern.

8 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: You want it to
9 be 211 Mulhern?

10 MS. QUINN: To get things properly
11 to the house.

12 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: That's
13 something -- like the chief said, you would
14 have to tell that to the post office. But
15 the chief will notify 911 it's 211 Mulhern.
16 Have a good night.

17 Anyone else from the public before
18 we move into new business? We're going to
19 move into new business. First item under
20 new business is going to be a motion to
21 table the agreement with the Sound
22 Broadband/RCN Telecom.

23 MR. NOTARI: I'm make that motion.

24 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: By Councilman
25 Notari.

1 MR. FEBBO: I'll second it.

2 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Seconded by
3 Councilman Febbo. On the question? Public
4 input? Roll call, please.

5 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilwoman
6 Avvisato?

7 MS. AVVISATO: Yes.

8 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Febbo?

9 MR. FEBBO: Yes.

10 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Butler?

11 MR. BUTLER: Yes.

12 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Hoover?

13 MR. HOOVER: Yes.

14 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Notari?

15 MR. NOTARI: Yes.

16 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Rinaldi?

17 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Yes. Second
18 item under new business is a motion to add
19 additional paving to the 2023 paving
20 contract.

21 MR. LOPATKA: This is for the
22 section of Milwaukee Avenue. Section from
23 West Morton to Drake's Lane. Supposed to be
24 getting me the final cost so I can put a
25 change order together.

1 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: So it's going
2 to be a motion to approve the additional
3 paving to the 2023 paving project from West
4 Morton Street to finish it at the end of
5 Drake.

6 MS. AVVISATO: I'll make that.

7 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: By
8 Councilwoman Avvisato.

9 MR. HOOVER: I'll second it.

10 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Seconded by
11 Councilman Hoover. On the question? Public
12 input? Roll call, please.

13 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilwoman
14 Avvisato?

15 MS. AVVISATO: Yes.

16 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Febbo?

17 MR. FEBBO: Yes.

18 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Butler?

19 MR. BUTLER: Yes.

20 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Hoover?

21 MR. HOOVER: Yes.

22 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Notari?

23 MR. NOTARI: Yes.

24 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Rinaldi?

25 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Yes. No items

1 under new business. If anybody has
2 anything. If not we'll go down the table,
3 see if any members have anything before we
4 adjourn. Councilman Febbo?

5 MR. FEBBO: I'm good.

6 MR. NOTARI: Do we have a leash law
7 for dogs? I've gotten a few calls regarding
8 people walking a pit bull.

9 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Mr. Revello called
10 me. He lives on South Main Street. We're
11 familiar with it. He takes him to Brooks to
12 run. I'm not sure where on South Main
13 Street he lives.

14 MR. NOTARI: I think either in the
15 American Legion building or the building
16 next door. He is walking the dog without a
17 leash. If they're walking by the park
18 there's kids there. As long as you're on
19 it. Thanks.

20 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Councilman
21 Butler?

22 MR. BUTLER: Good.

23 MS. AVVISATO: No, nothing.

24 MR. HOOVER: I'm good.

25 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: I'm good as

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well. At this time the chair would entertain a motion to adjourn.

MR. NOTARI: I'll make that motion.


MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: By Councilman Notari. All in favor?
