4 MR. LENCESKI: We have enough salt
5 probably to get to March. All the trucks,
6 we put the spreaders on, augers, changed the
7 lights on the plow, greased everything and
8 it's operational.

9 MR. NOTARI: Good work.

10 MR. LETTIERI: Outstanding.

11 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Good job, Joe.
12 Anyone else?

13 MR. FEBBO: I want to compliment Joe
14 and the DPW guys on the leaf pickup this
15 year. They did put a lot of time in.
16 Eventually we're going to have to put up a
17 new leaf picker upper. Again, I want to
18 thank Joe and his crew for an outstanding
19 job.

20 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anyone else?
21 Thanks, Joe.

22 Mr. Hart, zoning/code enforcement
23 officer report. We all have it. Anything
24 else?

25 MR. HART: Nothing.

1 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Does anybody
2 have anything for the zoning officer?

3 MS. AVVISATO: Nice job putting
4 everything together.

5 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Thanks, Chris.
6 Dave Lopatka, engineer's report?

7 MR. LOPATKA: I didn't submit one.

8 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: We have the
9 payment applications.

10 MR. LOPATKA: I didn't get you a
11 report. I'll give a quick rundown. So the
12 borough building, all the stone is up. They
13 have a little bit of stuff to do with the
14 facia on the front of the building.

15 The elevator, there's a meeting on
16 January 3rd with the security company,
17 Vector, and the elevator company. They're
18 meeting there so they can make sure that
19 everything gets addressed all in one shot.
20 We did do a punch list walk through last
21 week where we marked out a bunch of spots
22 where they need to touch up and anything
23 else that they needed to do. So they're in
24 the process of doing that.

25 They're supposed to be finishing the

1 outside, grading it. They're going to seed
2 it. They may have to come back in the
3 spring, depending on what comes up and what
4 doesn't.

5 But for the most part the inside of
6 the building is just about done. There are
7 some minor things we have punch listed, so
8 hopefully after the 3rd, when that
9 inspection is done, we can hopefully get it
10 closed out.

11 MR. FEBBO: Is everything set up n
12 the front, cannon and all that?

13 MR. LOPATKA: I think they actually
14 are. Everything in the front is back where
15 it was.

16 MS. BARTOLETTI: We're going to redo
17 part of it in the spring. We're going to
18 bring in our own contractor, the cannon and
19 the monument.

20 MR. FEBBO: What about the clock?

21 MS. BARTOLETTI: The clock is going
22 to be the next thing. We're trying to get
23 this part finished.

24 MR. LOPATKA: We have the electrical
25 out, so when the clock goes in they don't

1 have to punch through the building. Then
2 the landscaping will be done in the spring,
3 too. We did do a landscape plan for the
4 bed, so that will be going in in the
5 springtime.

6 MR. NOTARI: So, do we think we'll
7 be moved back in by the end of January?

8 MR. LOPATKA: I believe.

9 MS. BARTOLETTI: My plan is the
10 second week of January to start moving the
11 offices over.

12 MR. NOTARI: And once the offices
13 are moved back in will they start on the
14 front of the --

15 MR. LOPATKA: That stuff has been
16 ordered, so once they get the senior center
17 windows and all that they'll come back and
18 do that. But we don't want to hold them up
19 on the main building.

20 MS. AVVISATO: It looks beautiful.

21 MR. LOPATKA: Russ, you do have two
22 payment applications.

23 I did meet with the school board
24 guys and walked the site with them. They
25 wanted to see where the corners were. I met

1 with them about a week and a half ago,
2 showed them where the corners were, they
3 seemed fine with that. They have to get
4 approval by the board. Hopefully that will
5 be done once and for all.

6 ATTY. RINALDI: We'll take it back
7 to planning, get it reapproved.

8 MR. NOTARI: For the third time.

9 MR. LOPATKA: They seemed like they
10 were fine with the plan.

11 ATTY. RINALDI: The solicitor said
12 it will be on their agenda for January.

13 MR. NOTARI: Fingers crossed, we'll
14 be in the new building in February?

15 MS. BARTOLETTI: My goal is the
16 February meeting.

17 MR. LOPATKA: That's all.

18 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Does anybody
19 have any questions for Dave? Thanks, David.

20 Chief Dubernas, police report.

21 Anything to add?

22 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Just the hiring of
23 a part-time police officer, Ryan Erma1,
24 tonight.

25 ATT. RINALDI: Do you want to do

1 your annual list for January, like we did?

2 CHIEF DUBERNAS: I'll have another
3 report for you, too.

4 MR. NOTARI: So we hire the
5 part-time tonight or wait until January?

6 CHIEF DUBERNAS: I'm asking for the
7 hire tonight. He has nothing, so I need to
8 get the process rolling for him through
9 MPOETC.

10 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anything else?

11 CHIEF DUBERNAS: No.

12 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anybody have
13 any questions for the chief? Thanks, Chief.

14 Bill Stull, anything to report from
15 the fire department?

16 MR. STULL: Just what's in the
17 report.

18 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anybody have
19 any questions for Assistant Chief Stull?

20 MR. NOTARI: Just a great job
21 yesterday on that fire, getting everybody
22 out safe. Amazing. The pictures are
23 unbelievable.

24 MR. FEBBO: Compliment the fire
25 department and the chief for their action.

1 MR. HOOVER: Chief, how long is that
2 drive going to go on for?

3 CHIEF DUBERNAS: About noon Friday
4 we want to take it to them.

5 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Great job by
6 both departments.

7 MR. STULL: In just one hour it's
8 amazing how many donations came in. That
9 back room is filled.

10 MS. AVVISATO: I bought bedding for
11 them. At least they can start with
12 something. Thank God they were safe.

13 MR. NOTARI: A lot of good people in
14 our town.

15 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anything else,
16 Assistant Chief?

17 MR. STULL: There's one thing.
18 We're down one engine in town. Eagle's
19 engine, they blew the head gasket. It will
20 be out for probably three, four weeks.
21 That's not going to do anything for fire
22 protection. It was out of service
23 yesterday.

24 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Thanks, Bill.
25 Attorney Rinaldi, solicitor's

1 report.

2 ATTY. RINALDI: Everybody got my
3 report. Tonight you have an ordinance
4 adopting your budget based on the latest
5 revisions by Marylynn.

6 Then you have an ordinance levying
7 taxes, which is the same as last year's
8 taxes.

9 Of course, the budget you have.

10 You have an ordinance amending your
11 current sewer ordinance that we discussed at
12 the last several meetings.

13 You have a resolution to enter into
14 a shutoff agreement with Pa. American Water
15 Company that's provided by that ordinance.

16 You have a resolution allowing for a
17 draw down on remaining funds of your general
18 obligation of 2020 with People's Security
19 Bank. There was \$184,000 left over. We
20 want to get it drawn down by the end of the
21 year. That's all I have.

22 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anyone have
23 any questions for the solicitor? Thanks,
24 Bill.

25 Marylynn, borough manager's report.

1 MS. BARTOLETTI: Okay. Does anyone
2 have any questions on any of the financial
3 reports? So the only thing I wanted to add
4 besides, of course, the budget is I'd like
5 to advertise for a cleaning company.
6 Proposals, I guess, for a cleaning company
7 for the borough building before we move into
8 the new structure.

9 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Okay.
10 Anything else?

11 MS. BARTOLETTI: That's it.

12 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anybody have
13 any questions for the borough manager?

14 MR. NOTARI: Mare, I saw in our
15 packet we received a letter from a resident
16 on Orchard Street recommending that we renew
17 the T&R cat program. Is that part of our
18 budget to do that again?

19 MS. BARTOLETTI: It could be, yes.

20 MR. NOTARI: What did we do last
21 year, \$2,500?

22 MS. BARTOLETTI: I forget. What I'd
23 like to do is speak to Marsha, the woman in
24 charge. Last year there was an agreement
25 where we paid a portion and they paid a

1 portion. I believe we signed a contract for
2 a year. The year is not up yet. February
3 March, somewhere around there.

4 MR. NOTARI: So we'll wait until the
5 contract is up. Nice work on the budget, as
6 always.

7 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anybody else
8 have any questions for Marylynn? Thanks,
9 Mare.

10 Okay, we're going to move into new
11 business. Before we go down and start new
12 business I'm going to make a couple motions
13 to amend the agenda. It isn't going to
14 approve, just to amend.

15 The first motion will be to amend
16 the agenda this evening for a motion that

6 Merry Christmas to everybody,
7 especially our staff, our police, our fire,
8 our residents. But our staff does a great
9 job throughout the whole year. Enjoy your
10 holidays. Thank you for all your hard work
11 and merry Christmas.

12 MR. LETTIERI: Just to piggyback on
13 these guys, merry Christmas to everybody. I
14 just want to give kudos to the fire
15 department, police department, the zoning
16 officer, Joe. It's been a great year, it's
17 been a great year with our DPW. Guys, just
18 keep working together. Like I said, I'm
19 very honored to be on this council with
20 everyone.

21 Mare, great job on the budget.
22 That's a lot of work. You need a lot of
23 kudos with that.

24 But other than that, merry
25 Christmas. Everybody stay safe.

1 MR. KOMENSKY: I also would like to
2 thank Chief Dubernas and his staff and Chief
3 Stull, Chief Tagliaterra for the excellent
4 job they did yesterday. I was stuck at
5 work. I couldn't get home in time. But I'm
6 really happy with the outcome and the way it
7 is because we all know. We've been down
8 that path. It's really not fun.

9 So thank you. Please pass along to
10 all your guys that we appreciate all of
11 their hard work day in and day out to keep
12 our residents save. It's truly, truly an
13 honor to work with a great bunch of guys.

14 Yes, this is my last meeting, but
15 I'm not going anywhere. I'll be sitting on
16 the other end of the table. I will be here.
17 I thank everybody for taking the time to
18 meet with me, whether it was last minute.
19 More spent, I think, two weeks with me to
20 try to get me up to speed on borough
21 business and I appreciate all of that, from
22 the department heads, everybody that sits at
23 this table. I thank you all for taking the
24 time to spend with me to try to get me up to
25 speed. It's clearly been a learning

1 experience that I have truly enjoyed and I
2 hope to be back. Thank you.

3 But again, merry Christmas to
4 everybody. Enjoy the time with your family,
5 your friends, and please be safe out there.
6 Thank you.

7 MR. FEBBO: It's been quite the year
8 for everybody. I can't thank everybody, our
9 staff enough for what they've done through a
10 bad year. It's been a real pleasure serving
11 with you guys on council here. I think that
12 we've accomplished a lot in a real bad year.
13 The comradery in the whole community with
14 the fire department, police department,
15 council working together, I think it speaks
16 volumes for our community here.

17 Mike, I'm going to miss you. You
18 did a hell of a job in the time you were
19 here. Hopefully we'll see you back here in
20 a while.

21 I wish everybody a merry Christmas
22 and a happy new year. Hopefully next year
23 will be a lot better than what we've
24 experienced in the past.

25 MS. AVVISATO: Same thing. I get

1 emotional, but I'm going to miss Mike. I'm
2 going to keep his seat warm and I hope he
3 comes back soon. You did a great job, Mike.
4 You came on and you took care of everything
5 for us.

6 I'd like to thank everyone, the
7 staff. You guys did a great job this year.
8 Firemen, police, Chris, Dave, Joe, Sandy,
9 Bill, Marylynn and council. It's a pleasure
10 to sit here with you all. I'm looking
11 forward to another year -- and Mayor. I
12 wish you all a very merry Christmas and
13 please stay safe and God bless.

14 MR. FEBBO: Sandy, you are going to
15 be missed. I can't thank you enough for
16 having Marylynn's back, having the borough's
17 back, reaching out to us when we needed the
18 extra. You are going to be a tough act to
19 follow.

20 MR. HOOVER: I told Sandy two weeks
21 ago if the quarterback wants to stay with
22 the team, he wants them to offer a lot of
23 money. I'm still waiting for a number. She
24 won't give my one. I want to thank you.

25 Being the second to last everything

1 is already said, but I really would like to
2 thank, again, council, the fire department,
3 police department. What goes on at the
4 police department every day is crazy, but I
5 want to thank you all for doing it.

6 Also, I want to thank the people
7 that are sitting here. You know, we've had

21 but behind closed doors. Really great job
22 by all of you this year in everything you
23 did. This isn't an easy job, this isn't an
24 easy task, but I respect all of you for
25 sitting here. I had a really good time with

1 you once again this year and I look forward
2 to continuing doing it. Echoing off the
3 words of Councilman Febbo, I think we did do
4 a lot of good things this year, especially
5 in the time of year it was.

6 So great job. I look forward to it.
7 I look forward to seeing everyone next year.
8 End it with a safe, healthy, happy holiday.
9 Merry Christmas to everyone and happy new
10 year. If you need anything, my phone's
11 always on. Give me a buzz.

12 With that said, does nobody have
13 anything?

14 MR. NOTARI: I'll make a motion to
15 adjourn this meeting.
