MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Good evening, ladies and gentlemen. Welcome to the Old Forge Borough work session of February 2, 2021. We'll start off with Pledge of Allegiance, please.

(The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.)

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Once again, welcome to the Old Forge Borough work session. Chairman Semenza is absent this evening, so I'll be running the meeting. We'll go to some of our department heads, we'll go to our borough manager, go down the virtual screen of our council members, we'll hear from our chief of police, we'll see if anybody has anything they want to see on the agenda coming up for our regular borough meeting which will be Tuesday, February 16th.

With that said, let's start off with Paul. Anything coming up?

MR. PAPI: Well, after next week's planning commission meeting I'll probably have something for you, but I won't know until next Tuesday. That's it.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anybody have any questions for Paul?

MR. LETTIERI: Vito Salerno is requesting a handicap parking sign out in front of his house. What does he need to do in order to even have a chance to get one of those?

MR. PAPI: Well, does he have any off-street parking?

MR. LETTIERI: He has -- well, on the side of the road, yeah. Right in front of his house. I guess he's looking to get a sign in front of the house but it's -- I'm trying to think of the street. It's right off of Main when you're going down towards Drake.

MR. PAPI: He has to fill out paperwork at the borough and then Sandy will give me the address and I'll go and do an inspection. If I fail it he could still come to council anyway.

MR. LETTIERI: Marylynn, get the paperwork off you?

MS. BARTOLETTI: Yes, we applications here. Ask him to call here

coming up?

MR. LENCESKI: Nothing.

MR. FEBBO: Joe, great job yesterday with you and our team with 50 hours of work. Well organized and a lot of good results, lot of good comments again. Keep up the good work.

MR. LENCESKI: Thank you.

MR. PAPI: Good job, Joe.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: We got a lot of good comments on the streets the past two days. A lot of good comments on social media for once. That's a plus.

MR. NOTARI: I have a question for you. I had a resident reach out to me and ask about the intersection of Bridge Street and Lonesome Road. The e-mail might have been sent to all of us. I'm not sure. I responded to the gentleman that I believe that's a state intersection and they have control over that. I think we've asked for a traffic light in the past and they've told us no. I was just wondering if that is the case? Is it a state --

MS. BARTOLETTI: Yes.

any questions for the chief? Thanks, Chief.

Bill, solicitor, anything coming up or we have coming up on the agenda?

Anything for us?

ATTY. RINALDI: One ordinance to name that alley Panusky Way. I sent a copy to Marylynn. David helped me with the right directions. That's that alley behind Dave Solfanelli's office from Sibley to Keyser.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anything else?

ATTY. RINALDI: That's the only
thing I have so far.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Any questions for Bill? Thanks, Bill.

Marylynn, borough manager, anything we have coming up?

MS. BARTOLETTI: No, I don't really have anything for the agenda. Really, anything that's come up lately I've been just sending you guys text messages. So at this point I don't have anything to report on.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anybody have any questions for Marylynn? Thanks, Mare.

Is the mayor on?

MAYOR LEGG: I'm on.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: How are you?

MAYOR LEGG: Good, Russ.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Do you have anything you want to report on? Anything you want to add for the meeting for the agenda?

MAYOR LEGG: Joe, congratulations. Usually my phone is red hot, but I haven't had one -- well, I had two but they were minor. Great job. Keep it up. That's all I have.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Thanks, Mayor. Before I go down the screen, Rick, anyone from the public? Mare, anyone e-mail?

No, Russ, it doesn't MR. NOTARI: look like there's anybody here form the public.

MS. BARTOLETTI: And no e-mails.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: All right.

Anybody from the public logged in, Rick?

MR. NOTARI: I don't think so. it doesn't look that way.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Well, if there is anyone from the public and you'd like to

speak you can just let us know before we end the meeting.

All right, we'll go down the screen.

Councilman Febbo, anything for the agenda?

MR. FEBBO: Yeah. As a matter of fact, I have three things I'd like to present to council. First is the clock in front of the building. We had discussed that. Pass that to you guys. Do you feel that we want to put a clock there?

MR. NOTARI: I think so. I think it's a good idea.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: I think a clock would be a good idea.

MR. FEBBO: If that's the case, we should ask for some donations from some of the vendors that we do business with in the borough as a donation. Marylynn is looking at different clocks and different prices.

Rick, I'll go along with the blue clock with a gold stripe on it.

MR. NOTARI: I think that's a nice clock. Very fashionable. Class the area up a little bit.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Definitely.

MR. FEBBO: Let Marylynn pick out the location that she thinks would be most advantageous for fitting into the scheme of things.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Lou, I think it's a good idea, too, with the donations. I think if we send out some letters to residents, businesses, whoever wants to put in.

MR. FEBBO: I was thinking about BIU, Reuther-Bowen, Mascaro, Bill Rinaldi. If we run short from them, if we can't come up with -- again, I don't think we're looking at a \$30,000 clock. Marylynn, you've been looking at them. Did you get anything price wise?

MS. BARTOLETTI: No. You kind of have to have a pretty good idea of what you want before they'll start quoting prices.

So I wanted to hear what you guys have to say first and then I'll start working on it. You get to design this from the clock face to the style of numbers to the pole that it's on. Like, you start from scratch. So now that I know that you're very interested

I'll take it more seriously.

MR. FEBBO: So should we pool council here or just is everybody on board with that idea, clock for the front?

MR. NOTARI: I think we're all on board.

MS. BARTOLETTI: Okay.

MR. FEBBO: All right, then we'll go forward with that one.

The next thing is the church rectory complex, whatever you want to call it, I talked to Father two weeks ago. The diocese and the parish is all set to go to turn it over to us. So, Bill, we need you to contact Carlon again and get that project going there.

ATTY. RINALDI: Have they sent a letter? Did you get a letter, Marylynn?

MS. BARTOLETTI: No.

MR. FEBBO: Father said they're waiting for you to get back to -- you guys have to get in touch with each other or Carlon.

ATTY. RINALDI: I'll give him a call.

MR. FEBBO: Then the last thing on my list is the Project 70 land. If we're going to go forward with the church and rectory, I think we should also go forward in a stronger process with the Project 70 land, convert that land into money so we can put it into our recreation program. We can discuss that. We're looking at 380-some thousand dollars sitting there doing nothing, that's never going to be used for anything.

I guess we all know that investors want to build housing on it. That would be one of the projects. Let's turn that money into a tax base where we recognize taxes down the road for many years.

We're already starting to see the fruit of our investments on Milwaukee Avenue with Birchwood Estates in wage taxes, and I think that in the next couple years, two or three years when the LERTA is up we're going to be seeing a substantial amount of money coming in there through the tax base.

That being said, if the same investor wants to put housing up on land

we're not using we should go for it.

Also, I know that he's -- talking about George Dunbar, obviously. He's buying the property down -- the PCB property down along the river, and he's going to develop that also.

So I think that anytime we have an opportunity to take land that's been dead and doing nothing for us and convert it into a tax base and put it on our tax rolls we should go ahead with it. It's not too often you have a guy come into town with a satchel full of money that's willing to invest in the community, especially taking property that is rendered useless right now. That's my opinion on that one.

I know Bill's been working on the Project 70 with whatever, DCR and so on, but, Bill, anything that we need to do as council to move it along?

ATTY. RINALDI: Yeah. You have to vote on either a purchase of lands as a replacement property or a project that they will approve.

MR. FEBBO: Did we not discuss that,

equally splitting the money between Pagnotti Park and -- let's call it the recreation complex, where the church and the rectory is, and convert that into a recreation complex itself? Let's leave the word community center out and make it a recreation complex where it will be utilized for everything that involves recreation. Both buildings, by the way, the church and the rectory, under one umbrella there.

MR. LETTIERI: Should we get a rec meeting going to discuss this?

MR. NOTARI: Probably a good idea to start.

MR. LETTIERI: I think we need to start there first to kind of just come up with some ideas and then bring it to council.

MR. FEBBO: Are you talking about the rec committee with council?

MR. LETTIERI: Yes.

 $$\operatorname{MR}$.$  FEBBO: I'd like to get in on that, too, if I can.

MR. LETTIERI: Absolutely.

MR. FEBBO: I know it's a three

member deal.

MR. HOOVER: So we're going to take the \$380,000 and put it into the rectory and the church to make them --

MR. NOTARI: Or to develop Pagnotti Park.

MR. LETTIERI: I think we need to discuss that. We're not saying that that's where it's going because I don't think we should put all that money there.

MR. FEBBO: I didn't say that. I said split that between --

MR. LETTIERI: That's why we have to have a meeting.

MR. FEBBO: That complex -- as a matter of fact, any other recreation facilities in town. Marion Street or wherever we need to put money into. But the Pagnotti Park project, I know we talked about putting lights down at Pagnotti or whatever. But again, let's leave it up to the rec committee to come up with suggestions as to what we feel we need in terms of recreation.

But obviously we know that we could

use a bunch of money to redo the rectory.

The church is not a big expense but the rectory would be.

MR. NOTARI: Why don't we try to meet before our next meeting. Come up with a day.

MR. LETTIERI: I'll come up with a day. I should be good the rest of the week.

Let's get that done this week.

MR. FEBBO: We've been making a lot of headway here with the community. The big thing is the borough building. It's been long overdue and it's looking beautiful. If we have the opportunity to keep on improving the quality of life in Old Forge and the beauty of Old Forge and build new structures and draw more people to this community I think we should go for it and push it. We get a lot of top-notch people coming into town.

Anyway, I feel strongly about the three issues that I just brought up to you guys. That's all I have to say.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Lou, you mentioned about George. What land did he

purchase or is he purchasing?

MR. FEBBO: He purchased the PCB land down along the river. Giambra's.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Across from Lonesome Road. He bought that already?

MR. FEBBO: He bought it, and he's looking to put another development down there.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Same type like he has over here or --

MR. FEBBO: No. He's come up with a theme -- I don't know if he has it out yet, but he has a theme that he wants to follow, and he's looking to put a lot more money into that project than he has down here at Birchwood. We know that he's got a 20-some million dollar investment with Birchwood. So he's looking to build bigger and better down there. Again, I know he's after the Project 70 land to do something similar. But anything he puts together is top notch.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: He definitely does good work. No doubt.

MR. FEBBO: I think it's a plus for the community.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: I agree. Figure else?

MR. FEBBO: No, that's it. Three big items I've been running with for a while here, and I think it's time we move forward with them. Especially with the borough building coming around the corner. It will be finished up by late spring or summer.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anything else?

MR. FEBBO: No, I'm good.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Councilman Notari, anything?

MR. NOTARI: Just one thing, since
Lou mentioned the rectory and the church.

Mr. Wansacz approached me. He's the head of
the SLHDA, Scranton-Lackawanna Human

Development Agency, and the Head Start

Program in Lackawanna County. He is looking
to put a Head Start location here in the
tri-borough, in the lower valley, and he
inquired to me about the church. I told him
we are yet to own it and we haven't gone
through that process yet, but that would
be -- if we were to acquire the church, that
would be something that would pay us rent

and it would be a good way to start developing that property, if that's something council decides to do.

So he's looking for a spot in August or September, so I think if we start thinking about plans and if we're for developing that property or not, this way I can give him some information in the next month or so.

MR. FEBBO: He had spoken to me about that also. I didn't feel it was the proper time to bring it up. I referred him to Marylynn. Marylynn could talk to him about that. But again, we're always looking, like, what are we going to do with the place. That's an excellent example of one of the many things that can be done with that. So you know that it's pretty solid. I think Marylynn has some ideas with that also going forward.

MR. NOTARI: I just wanted to bring it to council.

MR. FEBBO: Well, now that he's spoken to somebody else other than me that's fine. It just shows the potential that we

along to continue the trail through there.

MR. LETTIERI: That's all, Russ.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Thanks, Mike, Councilman Hoover?

MR. HOOVER: No. The only thing I have, are you going to put that picture in the paper?

MS. BARTOLETTI: Dave is working right now on getting it made into a bigger size. We were thinking we would put it out on the fencing so if people are walking by they'll be able to see it. Then we're going to have one that we're able to put on our website as well.

I just talked to the newspaper. At some point they are planning on doing a little story about our remodeling. So that would be a perfect time to unveil it.

MR. HOOVER: That's it.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: I don't have anything. Mare, did we get any applications for the DPW position?

MS. BARTOLETTI: So far just the one that we discussed. And if we're going to have a little executive session after the

meeting I'd like to mention one or two little things about that.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: We can have one. That's no problem.

Rick, anyone from the public now before we make a motion to adjourn?

MR. NOTARI: No, nobody.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anybody have anything from council before we adjourn?
Well, at this time the chair will entertain a motion to adjourn the work session and break into an executive meeting.

MR. NOTARI: I'll make the motion, Mr. Chairman.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Motion by Councilman Notari. All in favor?

(Unanimous. Meeting adjourned.)
