12 under housekeeping. We're going to move  
13 into our department heads. First department  
14 head is Joseph Lenceski, DPW manager. We  
15 all have Joe's report. Anything for the  
16 meeting?

17 MR. LENCESKI: Nothing for the  
18 meeting.

19 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anybody have  
20 any questions for Joe?

21 MR. HOOVER: Joe and Dave, how about  
22 this water down on Drakes Lane or Milwaukee  
23 Avenue?

24 MR. LOPATKA: On the bottom.

25 MR. HOOVER: Joe put that dye in

1           there last week when we were there. It  
2           hasn't come out yet. I'm checking that  
3           every day. I don't know where this water's  
4           coming from.

5                     MR. LOPATKA: Where did you put it  
6           in?

7                     MR. HOOVER: Up on the top of the  
8           hill where his trailers are. He's got  
9           trailers that are -- instead of being level  
10          they're level with the ground. He dug a  
11          hole so he doesn't have to jump up, so he  
12          can just walk in the trailers. So there's a  
13          hole there. There's four trailers there.  
14          They all have water underneath them, so we  
15          thought we'd put some dye in there and see  
16          if it comes out on the bottom, eventually.  
17          It's been a week, Joe, week and a half easy  
18          and it hasn't come out yet. The three of us  
19          were there.

20                    Now, the water company was up there  
21           and on Morton Street there's a valve we  
22           found that goes and feeds every one of those  
23           houses. It spreads out. That was quiet.  
24           Dead quiet. There's no noise on that at  
25           all. There's no noise on the water main on

1 Milwaukee, but when you look at it the whole  
2 road -- I mean, they paved the road,  
3 obviously. But they pitched it that way.  
4 Could that be pitched that much that all of  
5 that underground water was just going there?  
6 I don't know. It can't be.

7 MR. WATER: The water's coming out  
8 somewhere around below the wall there.  
9 Right?

10 MR. HOOVER: Yeah.

11 MR. LENCESKI: I had Earthworks  
12 there and we dug.

13 MR. BUTLER: Something's got to be  
14 busted. It's not a leak. It's continuous,  
15 and now, to me, looking at it it looks like  
16 it's worse.

17 MR. LOPATKA: Could be a spring,  
18 too. They can pop up anywhere.

19 MR. BUTLER: But it doesn't run  
20 continuous like that.

21 MR. LOPATKA: You have one in  
22 Dunmore that never stopped. It ran for  
23 years.

24 MR. HOOVER: I'm looking for the  
25 catch basin there and dig down four feet but

1 there's no place to put it. You can't put  
2 the water on the state road. I don't know  
3 what to do down there. I know it's not the  
4 best season in the world to be working on  
5 it.

6 MR. LOPATKA: When we were down  
7 there I was saying let's get it across the  
8 road, it's going to run down the shoulder to  
9 the state road, but ultimately it should  
10 probably get collected and tied in somewhere  
11 down there. For right now to alleviate the  
12 situation we can just talk about putting  
13 just a pipe across there.

14 MR. HOOVER: Can't we dig down into  
15 that road three feet and just put, like, a  
16 French drain?

17 MR. LOPATKA: Well, I think that Joe  
18 tried to do that and it fills up.

19 MR. LENCESKI: Continue that French  
20 drain further.

21 MR. LOPATKA: It's going to end up  
22 getting on the state road, and at some point  
23 it's going to filter out and go across the  
24 road and creating a hazard.

25 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: I didn't know,

1 first of all, that he dug down into the  
2 earth to drop the trailers. Do we have the  
3 timeline of when he dug down? Did he dig  
4 down four months ago and then three days  
5 later it started leaking?

6 MR. HOOVER: Those trailers have  
7 been there for years.

8 MR. LOPATKA: The water is sitting  
9 there. It's not leaking out.

10 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: We dropped dye in.

11 MR. LENCESKI: There had to be a  
12 problem there prior to this because someone  
13 put rip-rap there at one time. I don't know  
14 who did it or when they did it, but we dug  
15 up a lot of stone that was put there.

16 MR. HOOVER: There was originally  
17 stone before we dug there.

18 MR. LENCESKI: And we put more stone  
19 in to try and figure out where the water was  
20 coming from. We started out high up the hill  
21 and I had Matty test it to see if the  
22 water's coming from the ground and riding  
23 the shoulder of the road. So we were  
24 digging, dirt's dry. Digging down, digging  
25 down, then we started digging in front of

1 the wall. It was coming through the wall,  
2 the base of the wall, below grade. The  
3 stone that existed.

4 MR. BUTLER: Could it be that it was  
5 actually draining there and the dirt got on  
6 top of it and stopped the water from going  
7 through the gravel?

8 MR. LENCESKI: When we dug it, we  
9 dug it much deeper than the existing gravel  
10 that was there, so I don't know.

11 MR. LOPATKA: They did mill it.

12 MR. HOOVER: Inch and a half off,  
13 inch and half on.

14 MR. LOPATKA: If they just milled  
15 it, it would have kept doing the same thing.  
16 I don't think it's the paving. All they did  
17 was take an inch and a half off.

18 MR. BUTLER: The water would change,  
19 the quantity, how much it goes on the road.  
20 It can't be consistent. Being it's  
21 consistent I'm saying it's coming from a  
22 pipe. It never slows down.

23 MR. HOOVER: They said it's quiet.

24 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: So the dye  
25 came out nowhere?

1 MR. HOOVER: I listened to the  
2 service to that house. That's where I  
3 thought it was, that green house. They're  
4 quiet. Then I called the guy from the water  
5 company, met him down there an hour later --

6 MR. LOPATKA: If it was the service  
7 somebody would have called the water company  
8 at some point. The main can't be broke.

9 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Was there, like, an  
10 old water system for the grape vines?

11 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: There was, yes.

12 MR. BUTLER: When he had the grapes  
13 there he had a sprinkler system set in with  
14 the grapes. So obviously he was getting  
15 water from somewhere.

16 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Maybe a pipe  
17 broke underground.

18 MR. HOOVER: But that valve, like I  
19 said, on Morton Street it goes into the  
20 curb. There's a valve there. He put his  
21 key on that valve and put electronic  
22 sounders on it and it was quiet. Then you  
23 look up the street about 200 feet, then it  
24 goes to that house, it goes to that house,  
25 to that house, to that house, and then it

1 goes -- because the building where -- the  
2 furniture place. It goes to that. There's,  
3 like, five services off of it. You think  
4 you would have heard it.

5 MR. LOPATKA: If there was something  
6 broke --

7 MR. HOOVER: Now, there's got to be  
8 another line going to the grapes on the  
9 hill.

10 MR. LOPATKA: He's saying that's  
11 above ground.

12 MR. HOOVER: We need to get a look  
13 in those buildings, that furniture building,  
14 to see if there's water --

15 MR. BUTLER: There's people been  
16 working in that furniture store. I don't  
17 know what they're doing in there. But he's  
18 had people working in there.

19 MR. HOOVER: The last service on  
20 that line, you have the green house, then  
21 you have the car wash, which is across the  
22 street. That would go down that bank there.  
23 Then it comes across the street, 45, it's in  
24 the berm of the road. From the berm of the  
25 road, which is about 40 feet from where Joe

1                   dug, that blow-off is quiet and it's dry.

2                   MR. LOPATKA: Where does the line go  
3 up the street? Is it in the road?

4                   MR. HOOVER: It's in the berm of the  
5 road. Right on the edge of the road.

6                   MR. LOPATKA: On the low side?

7                   MR. HOOVER: Yeah. It's on the edge  
8 of the road. Would have heard that. That  
9 would have been screaming. If there's  
10 irrigation -- we have to get in that  
11 building.

12                   ATTY. RINALDI: And he took it from  
13 before the meter, so it's not running on the  
14 meter.

15                   MR. HOOVER: I don't even think  
16 there's a meter in there. But if he tapped  
17 a line on the inside somewhere underground  
18 maybe but you would hear noise.

19                   MR. SOKOLOWSKI: You would hear it  
20 run.

21                   MR. BUTLER: We're just testing the  
22 things where we know pipes are. Right?  
23 What happens if he ran a pipe that nobody  
24 knows about?

25                   MR. SOKOLOWSKI: Still has to come

1 off that neighbor.

2 MR. HOOVER: Unless it's so far away  
3 and it's a small leak.

4 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: Not for that much  
5 volume.

6 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: The water  
7 coming down, remember I contacted you a  
8 couple months ago? It's getting more and  
9 more as time goes on.

10 MR. HOOVER: Mike, did they check  
11 for chlorine?

12 MR. LENCESKI: No chlorine. I had  
13 it tested.

14 MR. HOOVER: We have to get in touch  
15 with Chickey, see if there's anything  
16 tapped.

17 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Joe, what's  
18 some other options you can try and find it?

19 MR. LENCESKI: Dig a drench, fill it  
20 with gravel, let it naturally go onto the  
21 road. It's going to perk out on that side  
22 of the road.

23 MR. HOOVER: We'll have to get in  
24 touch with Chickey.

25 MR. LOPATKA: I'll call them again

1 tomorrow. They're not going to find  
2 anything.

3 MR. HOOVER: We have to get in that  
4 building.

5 MR. LOPATKA: The small, little  
6 building in front, it's slab on grade.

7 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: It's all concrete.  
8 There's maybe ten, 12 feet of building in  
9 front. That's all that's there. You have a  
10 wall around it, but there's no roof, there's  
11 nothing. If there's anything in that front  
12 little part I don't know.

13 MR. HOOVER: Something's not right.

14 MR. LOPATKA: The first inlet is  
15 probably 200 feet down the state road. If  
16 you're going to --

17 MR. HOOVER: Down by the car wash?

18 MR. LOPATKA: Yeah, before it.

19 MR. LENCESKI: Above it.

20 MR. LOPATKA: You'd have to put one  
21 on that side of the road, put one on the  
22 shoulder, and then run a pipe down PennDOT's  
23 road to fix the problem the right way. You  
24 can't just -- if we just put a pipe in and  
25 run an open end right at PennDOT's

1 right-of-way they might have a problem with  
2 it.

3 MR. HOOVER: They will.

4 MR. LOPATKA: Everything for them is  
5 a liability.

6 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Any other  
7 questions for Joe? Joe, everything good  
8 with the storm?

9 MR. LENCESKI: Everything was a  
10 battle today, but the temperature, the sun  
11 never came out. It was a battle.

12 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anything else?

13 MR. LENCESKI: It depends on how it  
14 freezes. After a certain temperature the  
15 salt won't work.

16 MR. RUSSEL RINALDI: Anything else  
17 for Joe? Thank you, Joe.

18 Mike Sokolowski, zoning code  
19 enforcement officer, anything for the  
20 meeting?

21 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: No, nothing. Just  
22 the Insalaco building. That's all we had  
23 that came in. Just the plans I showed you.  
24 That's it.

25 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anybody have

1 any questions for Mike? Thanks, Mike.

2 Dave Lopatka, engineer, anything for  
3 the meeting?

4 MR. LOPATKA: I don't have anything  
5 for the meeting. I know that at one of the  
6 last meetings you guys had asked -- I think  
7 I sent Marylynn the plan and cost estimates  
8 that we had done previously for the rec  
9 center up near the school.

10 I also sent the proposal for the  
11 traffic study. You have both of those, I  
12 think.

13 MS. BARTOLETTI: I have the one for  
14 the building, the traffic study. I'll have  
15 to look for that one.

16 MR. LOPATKA: I know I forwarded it  
17 to you. That's all I really have -- also  
18 the bid for that sewer replacement. I'll  
19 have the ad ready next week so we can  
20 advertise it next week or soon thereafter.

21 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anything else?

22 MR. LOPATKA: No.

23 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Does anybody  
24 have any questions for Dave?

25 MR. NOTARI: Dave, senior center.

1                   Where are we at?

2                   MR. LOPATKA:   Waiting to hear back  
3                   from the county.  I'll call them.

4                   MR. NOTARI:    We're 18 months now.

5                   MR. LOPATKA:   Well, they didn't have  
6                   it on their agenda, so it had to go toward  
7                   this year's money.  I'll call.

8                   MR. RUSSELL RINALDI:  Any other  
9                   questions for David?

10                  MR. HOOVER:    The Throop Civic  
11                  Center, in 1996 it cost \$1.6 million.  You  
12                  can probably triple that, maybe more.

13                  MR. LOPATKA:   I think the estimate  
14                  that we had done -- that was bought.  They  
15                  purchased just the footprint.  We kind of  
16                  laid out the inside and we sent it to a cost  
17                  estimator.  I think it was three point  
18                  something at least.

19                  MR. RUSSEL RINALDI:  Any other  
20                  questions for Dave?  Thanks, David.

21                  Chief Dubernas, anything for the  
22                  meeting?

23                  CHIEF DUBERNAS:  No, I have nothing  
24                  for the meeting.  I just gave you my  
25                  year-end report.

1 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anybody have  
2 any questions for the chief?

3 MR. BUTLER: I got a call the other  
4 day from somebody over by Bubernak.

5 MR. HOOVER: Bubernak and Dunn.

6 MR. BUTLER: Somebody's flying  
7 through that stop sign. Jennifer somebody  
8 mentioned it me, too. I know who it is.  
9 It's Billy Krypel's daughter. She drives a  
10 red Mercedes.

11 CHIEF DUBERNAS: She's going up  
12 Kohler.

13 MR. BUTLER: Going down, too. She  
14 goes right through. She's looking at her  
15 phone, not even stopping for the stop sign.  
16 They're worried about kids on the street. I  
17 was told Saturdays between 10:00 and 10:30.

18 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Have to be Kohler  
19 Avenue and Bubernak. Dunn doesn't come down  
20 to --

21 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Maybe just put  
22 a cop there just to control all speeders,  
23 not just looking for one person. Any  
24 speeders going through the stop sign. Any  
25 other questions for the chief? Thanks,

1 Chief.

2 Assistant Fire Chief Bill Stull,  
3 anything for the meeting?

4 MR. STULL: No, nothing at all.

5 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Does anybody  
6 have any questions for Bill? Thank you,  
7 Bill.

8 Attorney Rinaldi, anything for the  
9 meeting?

10 ATTY. RINALDI: I'll set up a  
11 special meeting for the RTN contract for the  
12 work session at 7:00 on February 6th, before  
13 the work session.

14 As a reminder our zoning is done.  
15 I've got to get it out of planning so we can  
16 get everybody to kind of look at it. We can  
17 also tweak it once it gets to us for final  
18 passage. I know planning wanted to review  
19 it with some other people. Then he can  
20 start on the subdivision ordinances after we  
21 pass that.

22 MR. NOTARI: The comprehensive plan?

23 ATTY. RINALDI: Yes.

24 MR. NOTARI: We were going to meet  
25 one more time, weren't we?

1 MR. KOMENSKY: Vince said he wanted  
2 to meet one more time. I haven't heard from  
3 him.

4 ATTY. RINALDI: I know we have a  
5 meeting this month with planning. I'll  
6 reach out to Charlie and get that back on  
7 track.

8 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anything else,  
9 Bill?

10 ATTY. RINALDI: That's it.

11 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anybody have  
12 any questions for the solicitor? Thank you,  
13 Bill. Marylynn, borough manger, any items  
14 for the meeting?

15 MS. BARTOLETTI: No, nothing for the  
16 meeting. I just wanted to say that for  
17 maybe the next meeting John Hambrose wants  
18 to stop in and just give council an update  
19 on what's going on at the landfill. So  
20 maybe February's work session or public  
21 meeting. I'll give you a date to let you  
22 know. Does anybody have any questions on  
23 the financial report? That's all I have.

24 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anybody have  
25 any questions for the borough manager?

1 Thank you, Marylynn.

2 Chief, is anybody on the public  
3 sign-in sheet?

4 CHIEF DUBERNAS: No.

5 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anybody want  
6 to speak before we go into new business? We  
7 don't have any items under new business.  
8 The only item we have to add as of right  
9 now -- and this is just a motion to add.  
10 It's going to be a motion to add the  
11 resignation letter of Mike Komenski from the  
12 Old Forge Zoning Board. This is just to add  
13 it to the agenda. Motion on the floor to  
14 add that?

15 MS. JONES: I'll make that motion.

16 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: By  
17 Councilwoman Jones-Shotwell. Second?

18 MS. AVVISATO: I'll second that  
19 motion.

20 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Seconded by  
21 Councilwoman Avvisato. On the question?  
22 Public input? Roll call, please.

23 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilwoman  
24 Shotwell?

25 MS. SHOTWELL: Yes.

1 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman  
2 Komenski?

3 MR. KOMENSKI: Yes.

4 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Notari?

5 MR. NOTARI: Yes.

6 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Butler?

7 MR. BUTLER: Yes.

8 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilwoman  
9 Avvisato?

10 MS. AVVISATO: Yes.

11 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Hoover?

12 MR. HOOVER: Yes.

13 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Rinaldi?

14 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Yes. This  
15 next motion is going to be a motion to  
16 accept the resignation for Michael Komenski  
17 from the Old Forge Zoning Board.

18 MS. AVVISATO: I'll make that  
19 motion.

20 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: By  
21 Councilwoman Avvisato.

22 MR. BULLER: Second.

23 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Seconded by  
24 Councilman Butler. On the question? Public  
25 input? Roll call, please.

1 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilwoman  
2 Shotwell?

3 MS. SHOTWELL: Yes.

4 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman  
5 Komenski?

6 MR. KOMENSKI: Yes.

7 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Notari?

8 MR. NOTARI: Yes.

9 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Butler?

10 MR. BUTLER: Yes.

11 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilwoman  
12 Avvisato?

13 MS. AVVISATO: Yes.

14 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Hoover?

15 MR. HOOVER: Yes.

16 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Rinaldi?

17 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Yes. No more  
18 items under new business, unless anybody at  
19 the table has any.

20 ATTY. RINALDI: You have a vacancy  
21 there now. You can move the alternate into  
22 that at the next meeting and then advertise,  
23 if you want, or appoint somebody.

24 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: I would say we  
25 should run an ad. If there's no other items

1 for new business, the chair would go down  
2 the table and just check with the members,  
3 if they have anything before we adjourn.  
4 Councilwoman Jones-Shotwell?

5 MS. SHOTWELL: I have nothing.

6 MR. KOMENSKY: I have nothing.

7 MR. NOTARI: Nothing.

8 MR. BUTLER: I have nothing.

9 MS. AVVISATO: I just want to  
10 mention if everyone would say a prayer for  
11 Kyle Gilmartin, who was an Old Forge police  
12 officer. He was one of the ones that was  
13 shot in Scranton. The chief heard he's  
14 doing better.

15 CHIEF DUBERNAS: They took him out  
16 of bed and they put him a chair today. He  
17 was very responsive.

18 MS. AVVISATO: So if everyone could  
19 just say a prayer. Thank you. That's all.

20 MR. HOOVER: No, I have nothing.

21 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: I don't have  
22 any items either. The only thing I would  
23 ask is just a brief executive session with  
24 council and the chief afterwards.

25 At this time the chair would

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entertain a motion to adjourn.

MS. SHOTWELL: I'll make that  
motion.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: By  
Councilwoman Jones-Shotwell. All in favor?

(Unanimous. Meeting adjourned.)
