All the tires on Butler Street where Ron Coles had his garage are all cleaned out.

Donna Scott -- Marylynn copied you guys on Donna Scott's letter. We have a hearing coming up soon with Donna Scott.

Bill, where is the Scott hearing, up at the courthouse?

ATTY. RINALDI: Yes, it's at the courthouse, I believe.

MR. PAPI: Nine o'clock. And you guys got the letter copied to you that Donna Scott wrote. I don't know if you guys want to do any leniency or not.

MR. FEBBO: Tell me about that, Paul. I'm not familiar with it.

ATTY. RINALDI: Just tell him the background, then we can discuss what

everybody wants to do in executive session.

It's litigation. Give him the background.

It's been going on quite some time.

MR. PAPI: Well, that's one of the first things I did 15 years ago, when I started working for the borough, was to work on Scott's property. He had just had a severe heart attack. He had showed me the stitches in his chest. At that point I just dropped it and let it go. I couldn't ask the guy to do anything. Then the next thing I knew I had a different job and then Steve was in charge.

It's not anybody that complains about it. The neighbors are fine with it because they like the Scotts.

MR. FEBBO: No, they're not, Paul.

That's a lie. That's not what I'm hearing.

MR. PAPI: It's only through my experience. Nobody's ever called me ever to complaint about them.

MR. FEBBO: I get it from almost everybody down there the last five years.

MR. PAPI: She sent in the letter to you guys, and we have a hearing coming up

it as well. It's good to see a listing of the permits that were given out.

MR. PAPI: I'll have that every month in my report.

MR. NOTARI: Great.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anybody else?
Any other questions for Paul? Thanks, Paul.
Next we'll go to the street commissioner,
Joe Lenceski. Joe, everyone has your
report. Anything to add?

MR. LENCESKI: No, I don't.

MR. RUSSEL RINALDI: Anybody have any questions for Joe?

MR. NOTARI: Joe, how is the sewer project coming along on Main Street?

MR. LENCESKI: It's buttoned up right now. What's left, they tied the lateral in to Nardone's. The last two steps should be replacing the grass, the driveway, and in the spring we're going to have to hook up from the manhole they put in to the street, which would require some permits, and because of the winter weather to open up Main Street, it's going to be very difficult to do this time of year.

MR. NOTARI: Are they permits that we have to apply for?

MR. LOPATKA: That's an HOP. The borough has one yearly. I just have to see if it's upgraded. If it's upgraded, then we just have to notify them of the connection in the springtime.

MR. NOTARI: Thank you.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Any other questions for Joe? Thanks, Joe. Next we'll to go our engineer, Dave Lopatka. Dave, anything to add to your report?

MR. LOPATKA: I don't have anything to add, no.

MR. RUSSEL RINALDI: Any members have any questions for Dave?

MR. NOTARI: Dave, how about just an update on the progress at the borough building.

MR. LOPATKA: We had a meeting this morning. Everything is moving along pretty quickly now. They got the footers and everything poured out front, they got the trench and all the conduit installed in the back to go to the generator. They will be

pouring that pad for the generator next week or the week after.

They've been sheetrocking. Most of the borough office area now is framed up. I think they have some framing to do still in the police area, put those walls up. But everything seems to be moving pretty good right now.

MR. HOOVER: Dave, those three change orders that we received?

MS. BARTOLETTI: Eleven, 12, 13.

MR. LOPATKA: Yeah.

MR. HOOVER: We have ten change orders to date. What's the total on those ten?

MR. LOPATKA: I don't know off the top of my head, but it's somewhere around 30,000, I think. The one change order that they sent is, I think it was 13, was a credit for the back railing.

MR. HOOVER: For the back railing. So there's another \$12,000 in these other three change orders? That's what they add up to.

MR. LOPATKA: I don't know. I'll

get you guys an update. I have a breakdown of everything on a spreadsheet. I'll give it to Marylynn, she can share it with you guys.

MR. NOTARI: Dave, do we have an artist rendering yet of what the building is going to look like? I'm going to keep asking until either the building's done or we have it.

MR. LOPATKA: I actually have a call in to the architect. I'm trying to find out where that's at. I'll get that for you.

MR. NOTARI: Thanks, Dave. I know it doesn't seem important to some people but I think it's important to all of us.

MR. LOPATKA: I think it's important, too. I mean, a rendering would be nice, and actually it would be nice if we put it on a big board and put it out in front of the building.

MR. NOTARI: Absolutely.

MR. FEBBO: Absolutely.

 $$\operatorname{MR}.$$  LOPATKA: I'll press them on that.

MR. FEBBO: I have a question about

out front. We've talked about putting a big clock out there?

MR. LOPATKA: I don't recall that discussion, but, I mean, it's something we can look at. I mean, you're talking like one of the ones a lot of people have out on the street at an intersection or something?

MR. FEBBO: Yeah. I've had a couple people tell me it looks like Weissman's out here with the cannon and the anchor and everything.

MR. LOPATKA: I can inquire about it. Dunmore put one in a couple years ago.

I'm not sure what their cost was.

MS. BARTOLETTI: I have e-mails about those that I can look into, if you'd like, as well.

MR. FEBBO: Can we do that and then we can discuss it at council, see if it enhances the appearance of the front of the building?

MR. NOTARI: Sure.

CHIEF DUBERNAS: Good evening.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Do you have anything to add?

CHIEF DUBERNAS: No. The report I gave you guys, I gave you the year-end report and everything from all the calls we had last year. I included the breakdown for comm center for you guys, too, if you guys received all that.

MR. FEBBO: Chief, it was a good job. It was very thorough.

MS. AVVISATO: It was a good report.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Thanks, Chief.

Anybody have any questions for the chief?

MR. NOTARI: Do we have to add this to the agenda, that we need to approve our roll of police officers?

MS. BARTOLETTI: If you're planning on doing that tonight, then, yes, or you can wait until the February meeting, I guess.

MR. NOTARI: Okay. I thought we needed to have it done in January. If we can wait, then I don't have a problem with that.

ATTY. RINALDI: Is it done, Chief?

Do you have it?

CHIEF DUBERNAS: Yeah. It was attached to their whole report.

MS. AVVISATO: I got it.

ATTY. RINALDI: Was it in my packet,
Marylynn? I didn't see it.

MS. BARTOLETTI: It's probably what Sandy sent because Sandy sent out Jason's report.

CHIEF DUBERNAS: I gave Sandy the whole, entire --

MS. BARTOLETTI: It's in the one Sandy sent out.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Bill, would you recommend that we do it tonight or would you say February?

ATTY. RINALDI: I see it. Yeah, you

can approve it tonight. Then if we want to add to it, we add to it. Any more applications or anybody else you have to interview, Chief?

CHIEF DUBERNAS: No, it would just be who we'd hire in the future for part-time, and then I would have to set up interviews for February with the personnel committee. Either February or March.

ATTY. RINALDI: I always like to get a new list first thing out of the year, so if you want to approve his part-timers -- well, Harris isn't really -- he's a regular two part-timer. It would be the other ones on that list. Correct?

CHIEF DUBERNAS: Yeah, but I just put the whole roster together for everybody to know who is left. Do you want me to separate for February and do it that way or is that all right the way you have it?

ATTY. RINALDI: That's fine the way it is. It's up to council, what they want to do.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Members, if you feel you want to put it on the agenda

tonight we can do that. Somebody can make a motion for it or I can just put it right on the agenda. You let me know.

MR. FEBBO: Are we going to have a list -- I don't have it in front of me -- of who we have on there?

MS. AVVISATO: Yes.

ATTY. RINALDI: Chief, do you want to read off the names of the part-timers.

MS. BARTOLETTI: They were sent on Friday at 1:15, and it was from oldforgeborough@oldforgeborough.com.

ATTY. RINALDI: Just read off the names, the part-time list. That's the important one. Everybody else is covered by the contract.

CHIEF DUBERNAS: It should have Pat Walsh on it, Kery McHugh, Thomas Sherwood, Robert Grunza, Cody Cawley, Liz Caserse --

ATTY. RINALDI: That's it.

MR. NOTARI: I say we add it to the agenda.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Okay. Mare, if we can add that as number six, then.

Chief, that's the 2021 part-time roster?

CHIEF DUBERNAS: Yeah, for now.

They're the ones that currently are working with the department.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anything else, Chief?

CHIEF DUBERNAS: No. Any questions from you guys?

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anybody have any questions for the chief?

MS. AVVISATO: I'm good.

MR. HOOVER: No.

MR. FEBBO: Once again, Chief, good report.

MR. RUSSEL RINALDI: Thanks, Chief.

Next we'll go to our borough manager,

Marylynn.

MS. BARTOLETTI: Okay, just a couple things. First, does anyone have any questions on any of the financial reports?

No? Okay. One little note. Since we started using Municipay for allowing people to use their credit cards to pay their bills we've had 40 transactions that total over \$18,000. So that's been a nice help for people to be able to use it.

The sewer department, we're going to be sending out the late notices within the month.

I sent everyone a copy of a letter from the DPW union asking to start negotiations for their contract which expires at the end of 2021.

That's pretty much all I have. The clock company, Lou, that you had asked about is Verdin, if anyone wants to take a look at anything. It's called the Verdin Clock Company.

MR. FEBBO: Thank you.

MS. BARTOLETTI: I guess that's it.

Does anyone have any questions for me?

MS. AVVISATO: You're doing a good job.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Mare, good tour of the building last week when we came in for our personnel meeting. That was pretty interesting to see. I mean, we all know you do a great job, but the way you were describing what was where, what used to

be there. It was really good.

MS. BARTOLETTI: Thank you. I appreciate that. It's very different.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: She was
lifting up boards, opening up doors. It was
neat. Thanks, Mare. Anybody have any
questions? Thanks, Mare.

Bill, our solicitor?

ATTY. RINALDI: On your agenda you have a decision on a grievance. If you want to deliberate you can adjourn and deliberate. If you want to add anything, you can just make a motion to add any language you want to add. Otherwise, that's in front of you tonight for a vote.

Project 70, everybody got the information I sent them. That's the requirements, what they're looking for, which is the project.

And the street and the alley, I kind of think the one down by Dunbar's is already Orchard Street. I asked Marylynn to check or the chief to check with the post office because it looks like they have it as a circle listed as Orchard just coming around

because it's more like a cul-de-sac.

The other one, I sent a picture to Marylynn for everybody to take a look at because I think it's an alley in and an alley out, it looks like to me. There's not a name on either one of those streets behind Solfanelli's law office off Sibley.

So I just have to advertise the ordinance, which would be the name, and I'm probably going to need some kind of a description. Maybe we can find something. I can work with Dave to get a description. I don't know if you want to name the one or both because I can't say from Sibley to an unnamed -- I don't know what that is on the other end either. It looks like another alley that comes off Keyser, there. Unless there's a street sign that doesn't come up on Google Earth. But if you look at the aerial you'll see the way it's loops around. It's like an L.

MR. FEBBO: Can we just name it

Panusky Way or whatever --

ATTY. RINALDI: They're actually two roads, I think. There's probably two alleys

there. Chief, do you know where I'm talking about coming off Keyser?

CHIEF DUBERNAS: It's between
Shaffer's house and Panusky's house. It
actually surrounds the law office.

ATTY. RINALDI: Is there a sign there or anything? Is it a driveway more or is it an actual alley? What is it?

CHIEF DUBERNAS: It's an alleyway.

It comes off of Keyser and makes an L to come to Sibley, or you can come on Sibley and come out to Keyser. I'm not sure of the name of it. We always just had it as an alleyway.

ATTY. RINALDI: Do we plow it and maintain it?

CHIEF DUBERNAS: I wouldn't know that. Joe would know that. I want to say so because Panusky's house is on that.

ATTY. RINALDI: It looks like there's some houses on it. I'm assuming those are the streets everybody referred to at the work session that they want to name.

MR. PAPI: We always plowed them.

ATTY. RINALDI: So that's just in

your packet when somebody decides what they want to do. We can add another street there if you want to name the one going down to the intersection from Keyser to that new named street. Might as well name them both.

CHIEF DUBERNAS: I'll check
tomorrow, but I think Panusky uses a Rear
Sibley address there or it's a Rear Keyser
there.

ATTY. RINALDI: Probably a Rear Keyser because there's no name on it.

MR. FEBBO: Are they having a problem with deliveries because of it?

ATTY. RINALDI: There was a problem somebody brought up last meeting?

MR. NOTARI: They asked to have it named something else than Rear Keyser or Rear Sibley. It was in our packet last month.

CHIEF DUBERNAS: Because in front of Panusky's house there is a house there, and then it's his house that's in the alleyway.

MR. HOOVER: The one off Sibley

Avenue. Go the other way off of Sibley

Avenue, north, it's Flower Street. Can't we

name on the other one that comes off Keyser?

You're going to keep it the same? Okay.

That subdivision, I'm just waiting on that map, and I think that's pretty much it. Planning has not met to decide on their input on the zoning change.

MR. FEBBO: That would be where, near the school, Bill? Mariotti's property?

ATTY. RINALDI: Yes. Can we have a quick executive on those two litigation matters, Cole and the one that me and Paul have to go to next week. Just to get council's input on them.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: We'll have it tonight, after the meeting.

MR. PAPI: I put a copy in my report of what the Lackawanna County Planning Commission had said about the zone change. Everybody should have it in the packet. It's in my report.
