1 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Good evening,
2 ladies and gentlemen. I'd like to call the
3 borough council meeting to order with the
4 Pledge of Allegiance, please.

5 (The Pledge of Allegiance was
6 recited.)

7 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Once again,
8 ladies and gentlemen, welcome to the Old
9 Forge Borough regular council meeting.
10 Tonight is Tuesday, January 19, 2021.
11 Chairman Semenza is going to be absent from
12 the meeting. We're going to begin the
13 meeting with roll call, Marylynn.

14 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilwoman
15 Avvisato?

16 MS. AVVISATO: Here.

17 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Febbo?

18 MR. FEBBO: I guess here. I can't
19 hear.

20 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Hoover?
21 I'll come back to him. Councilman Lettieri?

22 MR. LETTIERI: Present.

23 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Notari?

24 MR. NOTARI: Present.

25 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Rinaldi?

1 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Here.

2 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Semenza
3 is absent. Councilman Hoover, are you
4 present?

5 MR. HOOVER: Yes.

6 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: The purpose of
7 tonight's meeting, we're going to go through
8 some of our housekeeping motions, we're
9 going to hear from some of our department
10 heads, we'll hear from our borough manager,
11 our mayor, we'll go down the virtual screen
12 and we'll hear from our council members.
13 Also, we have an e-mail list, Marylynn. If
14 anybody e-mailed in from the public you can
15 speak.

16 MS. BARTOLETTI: Yes.

17 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: If you didn't
18 and you're at the meeting at the end and
19 you'd like to speak we'll let you speak.

20 With that a being said, we'll start
21 the meeting off with our first motion. That
22 is a motion to approve the prior meeting
23 minutes.

6 Public input? Roll call, please.

7 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Febbo?

8 MR. FEBBO: Yes.

9 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Hoover?

10 MR. HOOVER: Yes.

25 Councilman Lettieri. On the question?

1 Public input? Roll call, Marylynn.

2 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilwoman

3 Avvisato?

4 MS. AVVISATO: Yes.

5 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Febbo?

6 MR. FEBBO: Yes.

7 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Hoover?

8 MR. HOOVER: Yes.

9 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman

10 Lettieri?

11 MR. LETTIERI: Yes.

12 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Notari?

13 MR. NOTARI: Yes.

14 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Rinaldi?

15 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Yes. We're

16 going to go into some of our department

17 heads. We all have Paul's report. Paul, do

18 you have anything to add?

19 MR. PAPI: Yes, I do. We had

20 Kardos' hearing last week and he never

21 showed. The magistrate wasn't too happy.

22 So we'll find out in the coming days what's

23 going to happen there.

24 I'm all set up for a commercial

25 zoning hearing for zoning next week for

1 Pride Mobility. We're all set for that.
2 They're going to put in a sign and they need
3 a variance.

4 Also, I'm going to write a letter on
5 Thursday if Boyko doesn't have his property
6 cleaned up on Maple Street and then file
7 with the magistrate.

8 All the tires on Butler Street where
9 Ron Coles had his garage are all cleaned
10 out.

11 Donna Scott -- Marylynn copied you
12 guys on Donna Scott's letter. We have a
13 hearing coming up soon with Donna Scott.
14 Bill, where is the Scott hearing, up at the
15 courthouse?

16 ATTY. RINALDI: Yes, it's at the
17 courthouse, I believe.

18 MR. PAPI: Nine o'clock. And you
19 guys got the letter copied to you that Donna
20 Scott wrote. I don't know if you guys want
21 to do any leniency or not.

22 MR. FEBBO: Tell me about that,
23 Paul. I'm not familiar with it.

24 ATTY. RINALDI: Just tell him the
25 background, then we can discuss what

1 everybody wants to do in executive session.
2 It's litigation. Give him the background.
3 It's been going on quite some time.

4 MR. PAPI: Well, that's one of the
5 first things I did 15 years ago, when I
6 started working for the borough, was to work
7 on Scott's property. He had just had a
8 severe heart attack. He had showed me the
9 stitches in his chest. At that point I just
10 dropped it and let it go. I couldn't ask
11 the guy to do anything. Then the next thing
12 I knew I had a different job and then Steve
13 was in charge.

14 It's not anybody that complains
15 about it. The neighbors are fine with it
16 because they like the Scotts.

17 MR. FEBBO: No, they're not, Paul.
18 That's a lie. That's not what I'm hearing.

19 MR. PAPI: It's only through my
20 experience. Nobody's ever called me ever to
21 complaint about them.

22 MR. FEBBO: I get it from almost
23 everybody down there the last five years.

24 MR. PAPI: She sent in the letter to
25 you guys, and we have a hearing coming up

1 with her next week, I believe.

2 MR. HOOVER: Paul, is there some
3 progress?

4 MR. PAPI: Very little. I mean,
5 there's so much there that a lot of progress
6 really takes a lot of work. She said her
7 and her brothers were --

8 MR. FEBBO: I can't hear anything
9 he's saying.

10 MR. LETTIERI: Paul, if a
11 residential house wants to put a handicap
12 ramp to their house, do they need a permit
13 for that?

14 MR. PAPI: Yes. Anything involving
15 ingress and egress to a house involves BIU.
16 They need to come and see me. I'll give
17 them all the applications to fill out.

18 MS. BARTOLETTI: That's at 212.

19 MR. PAPI: That's all I had to add.

20 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anybody have
21 any questions for Paul?

22 MR. NOTARI: I don't have any
23 questions, but, Paul, thanks for the permit
24 report that I know I look forward to looking
25 at, and I know Chairman Semenza would want

1 it as well. It's good to see a listing of
2 the permits that were given out.

3 MR. PAPI: I'll have that every
4 month in my report.

5 MR. NOTARI: Great.

6 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anybody else?
7 Any other questions for Paul? Thanks, Paul.
8 Next we'll go to the street commissioner,
9 Joe Lencieski. Joe, everyone has your
10 report. Anything to add?

11 MR. LENCESKI: No, I don't.

12 MR. RUSSEL RINALDI: Anybody have
13 any questions for Joe?

14 MR. NOTARI: Joe, how is the sewer
15 project coming along on Main Street?

16 MR. LENCESKI: It's buttoned up
17 right now. What's left, they tied the
18 lateral in to Nardone's. The last two steps
19 should be replacing the grass, the driveway,
20 and in the spring we're going to have to
21 hook up from the manhole they put in to the
22 street, which would require some permits,
23 and because of the winter weather to open up
24 Main Street, it's going to be very difficult
25 to do this time of year.

1 MR. NOTARI: Are they permits that
2 we have to apply for?

3 MR. LOPATKA: That's an HOP. The
4 borough has one yearly. I just have to see
5 if it's upgraded. If it's upgraded, then we
6 just have to notify them of the connection
7 in the springtime.

8 MR. NOTARI: Thank you.

9 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Any other
10 questions for Joe? Thanks, Joe. Next we'll
11 to go our engineer, Dave Lopatka. Dave,
12 anything to add to your report?

13 MR. LOPATKA: I don't have anything
14 to add, no.

15 MR. RUSSEL RINALDI: Any members
16 have any questions for Dave?

17 MR. NOTARI: Dave, how about just an
18 update on the progress at the borough
19 building.

20 MR. LOPATKA: We had a meeting this
21 morning. Everything is moving along pretty
22 quickly now. They got the footers and
23 everything poured out front, they got the
24 trench and all the conduit installed in the
25 back to go to the generator. They will be

1 pouring that pad for the generator next week
2 or the week after.

3 They've been sheetrocking. Most of
4 the borough office area now is framed up. I
5 think they have some framing to do still in
6 the police area, put those walls up. But
7 everything seems to be moving pretty good
8 right now.

9 MR. HOOVER: Dave, those three
10 change orders that we received?

11 MS. BARTOLETTI: Eleven, 12, 13.

12 MR. LOPATKA: Yeah.

13 MR. HOOVER: We have ten change
14 orders to date. What's the total on those
15 ten?

16 MR. LOPATKA: I don't know off the
17 top of my head, but it's somewhere around
18 30,000, I think. The one change order that
19 they sent is, I think it was 13, was a
20 credit for the back railing.

21 MR. HOOVER: For the back railing.
22 So there's another \$12,000 in these other
23 three change orders? That's what they add
24 up to.

25 MR. LOPATKA: I don't know. I'll

1 get you guys an update. I have a breakdown
2 of everything on a spreadsheet. I'll give
3 it to Marylynn, she can share it with you
4 guys.

5 MR. NOTARI: Dave, do we have an
6 artist rendering yet of what the building is
7 going to look like? I'm going to keep
8 asking until either the building's done or
9 we have it.

10 MR. LOPATKA: I actually have a call
11 in to the architect. I'm trying to find out
12 where that's at. I'll get that for you.

13 MR. NOTARI: Thanks, Dave. I know
14 it doesn't seem important to some people but
15 I think it's important to all of us.

16 MR. LOPATKA: I think it's
17 important, too. I mean, a rendering would
18 be nice, and actually it would be nice if we
19 put it on a big board and put it out in
20 front of the building.

21 MR. NOTARI: Absolutely.

22 MR. FEBBO: Absolutely.

23 MR. LOPATKA: I'll press them on
24 that.

25 MR. FEBBO: I have a question about

1 out front. We've talked about putting a big
2 clock out there?

3 MR. LOPATKA: I don't recall that
4 discussion, but, I mean, it's something we
5 can look at. I mean, you're talking like
6 one of the ones a lot of people have out on
7 the street at an intersection or something?

8 MR. FEBBO: Yeah. I've had a couple
9 people tell me it looks like Weissman's out
10 here with the cannon and the anchor and
11 everything.

12 MR. LOPATKA: I can inquire about
13 it. Dunmore put one in a couple years ago.
14 I'm not sure what their cost was.

15 MS. BARTOLETTI: I have e-mails
16 about those that I can look into, if you'd
17 like, as well.

18 MR. FEBBO: Can we do that and then
19 we can discuss it at council, see if it
20 enhances the appearance of the front of the
21 building?

22 MR. NOTARI: Sure.

23 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: I'm fine with
24 that.

25 MR. FEBBO: Mare, check on a price

1 with them.

2 MR. LOPATKA: I'll find out what
3 Dunmore's cost.

4 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Nothing wrong
5 with getting a quote, Lou. Any other
6 questions for Dave? Thanks, Dave. Next
7 we'll go to our police chief, Chief
8 Dubernas.

9 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Good evening.

10 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Do you have
11 anything to add?

12 CHIEF DUBERNAS: No. The report I
13 gave you guys, I gave you the year-end
14 report and everything from all the calls we
15 had last year. I included the breakdown for
16 comm center for you guys, too, if you guys
17 received all that.

18 MR. FEBBO: Chief, it was a good
19 job. It was very thorough.

20 MS. AVVISATO: It was a good report.

21 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Thanks, Chief.
22 Anybody have any questions for the chief?

23 MR. NOTARI: Do we have to add this
24 to the agenda, that we need to approve our
25 roll of police officers?

1 MS. BARTOLETTI: If you're planning
2 on doing that tonight, then, yes, or you can
3 wait until the February meeting, I guess.

4 MR. NOTARI: Okay. I thought we
5 needed to have it done in January. If we
6 can wait, then I don't have a problem with
7 that.

8 ATTY. RINALDI: Is it done, Chief?
9 Do you have it?

10 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Yeah. It was
11 attached to their whole report.

12 MS. AVVISATO: I got it.

13 ATTY. RINALDI: Was it in my packet,
14 Marylynn? I didn't see it.

15 MS. BARTOLETTI: It's probably what
16 Sandy sent because Sandy sent out Jason's
17 report.

18 CHIEF DUBERNAS: I gave Sandy the
19 whole, entire --

20 MS. BARTOLETTI: It's in the one
21 Sandy sent out.

22 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Bill, would
23 you recommend that we do it tonight or would
24 you say February?

25 ATTY. RINALDI: I see it. Yeah, you

1 can approve it tonight. Then if we want to
2 add to it, we add to it. Any more
3 applications or anybody else you have to
4 interview, Chief?

5 CHIEF DUBERNAS: No, it would just
6 be who we'd hire in the future for
7 part-time, and then I would have to set up
8 interviews for February with the personnel
9 committee. Either February or March.

10 ATTY. RINALDI: I always like to get
11 a new list first thing out of the year, so
12 if you want to approve his part-timers --
13 well, Harris isn't really -- he's a regular
14 two part-timer. It would be the other ones
15 on that list. Correct?

16 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Yeah, but I just
17 put the whole roster together for everybody
18 to know who is left. Do you want me to
19 separate for February and do it that way or
20 is that all right the way you have it?

21 ATTY. RINALDI: That's fine the way
22 it is. It's up to council, what they want
23 to do.

24 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Members, if
25 you feel you want to put it on the agenda

1 tonight we can do that. Somebody can make a
2 motion for it or I can just put it right on
3 the agenda. You let me know.

4 MR. FEBBO: Are we going to have a
5 list -- I don't have it in front of me -- of
6 who we have on there?

7 MS. AVVISATO: Yes.

8 ATTY. RINALDI: Chief, do you want
9 to read off the names of the part-timers.

10 MS. BARTOLETTI: They were sent on
11 Friday at 1:15, and it was from
12 oldforgeborough@oldforgeborough.com.

13 ATTY. RINALDI: Just read off the
14 names, the part-time list. That's the
15 important one. Everybody else is covered by
16 the contract.

17 CHIEF DUBERNAS: It should have Pat
18 Walsh on it, Kery McHugh, Thomas Sherwood,
19 Robert Grunza, Cody Cawley, Liz Caserse --

20 ATTY. RINALDI: That's it.

21 MR. NOTARI: I say we add it to the
22 agenda.

23 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Okay. Mare,
24 if we can add that as number six, then.
25 Chief, that's the 2021 part-time roster?

1 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Yeah, for now.
2 They're the ones that currently are working
3 with the department.

4 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anything else,
5 Chief?

6 CHIEF DUBERNAS: No. Any questions
7 from you guys?

8 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anybody have
9 any questions for the chief?

10 MS. AVVISATO: I'm good.

11 MR. HOOVER: No.

12 MR. FEBBO: Once again, Chief, good
13 report.

14 MR. RUSSEL RINALDI: Thanks, Chief.
15 Next we'll go to our borough manager,
16 Marylynn.

17 MS. BARTOLETTI: Okay, just a couple
18 things. First, does anyone have any
19 questions on any of the financial reports?
20 No? Okay. One little note. Since we
21 started using Municipay for allowing people
22 to use their credit cards to pay their bills
23 we've had 40 transactions that total over
24 \$18,000. So that's been a nice help for
25 people to be able to use it.

1 The sewer department, we're going to
2 be sending out the late notices within the
3 month.

4 I sent everyone a copy of a letter
5 from the DPW union asking to start
6 negotiations for their contract which
7 expires at the end of 2021.

8 That's pretty much all I have. The
9 clock company, Lou, that you had asked about
10 is Verdin, if anyone wants to take a look at
11 anything. It's called the Verdin Clock
12 Company.

13 MR. FEBBO: Thank you.

14 MS. BARTOLETTI: I guess that's it.
15 Does anyone have any questions for me?

16 MS. AVVISATO: You're doing a good
17 job.

18 MS. BARTOLETTI: I appreciate it.
19 Thanks.

20 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Mare, good
21 tour of the building last week when we came
22 in for our personnel meeting. That was
23 pretty interesting to see. I mean, we all
24 know you do a great job, but the way you
25 were describing what was where, what used to

1 be there. It was really good.

2 MS. BARTOLETTI: Thank you. I
3 appreciate that. It's very different.

4 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: She was
5 lifting up boards, opening up doors. It was
6 neat. Thanks, Mare. Anybody have any
7 questions? Thanks, Mare.

8 Bill, our solicitor?

9 ATTY. RINALDI: On your agenda you
10 have a decision on a grievance. If you want
11 to deliberate you can adjourn and
12 deliberate. If you want to add anything,
13 you can just make a motion to add any
14 language you want to add. Otherwise, that's
15 in front of you tonight for a vote.

16 Project 70, everybody got the
17 information I sent them. That's the
18 requirements, what they're looking for,
19 which is the project.

20 And the street and the alley, I kind
21 of think the one down by Dunbar's is already
22 Orchard Street. I asked Marylynn to check
23 or the chief to check with the post office
24 because it looks like they have it as a
25 circle listed as Orchard just coming around

1 because it's more like a cul-de-sac.

2 The other one, I sent a picture to
3 Marylynn for everybody to take a look at
4 because I think it's an alley in and an
5 alley out, it looks like to me. There's not
6 a name on either one of those streets behind
7 Solfanelli's law office off Sibley.

8 So I just have to advertise the
9 ordinance, which would be the name, and I'm
10 probably going to need some kind of a
11 description. Maybe we can find something.
12 I can work with Dave to get a description.
13 I don't know if you want to name the one or
14 both because I can't say from Sibley to an
15 unnamed -- I don't know what that is on the
16 other end either. It looks like another
17 alley that comes off Keyser, there. Unless
18 there's a street sign that doesn't come up
19 on Google Earth. But if you look at the
20 aerial you'll see the way it's loops around.
21 It's like an L.

22 MR. FEBBO: Can we just name it
23 Panusky Way or whatever --

24 ATTY. RINALDI: They're actually two
25 roads, I think. There's probably two alleys

1 there. Chief, do you know where I'm talking
2 about coming off Keyser?

3 CHIEF DUBERNAS: It's between
4 Shaffer's house and Panusky's house. It
5 actually surrounds the law office.

6 ATTY. RINALDI: Is there a sign
7 there or anything? Is it a driveway more or
8 is it an actual alley? What is it?

9 CHIEF DUBERNAS: It's an alleyway.
10 It comes off of Keyser and makes an L to
11 come to Sibley, or you can come on Sibley
12 and come out to Keyser. I'm not sure of the
13 name of it. We always just had it as an
14 alleyway.

15 ATTY. RINALDI: Do we plow it and
16 maintain it?

17 CHIEF DUBERNAS: I wouldn't know
18 that. Joe would know that. I want to say
19 so because Panusky's house is on that.

20 ATTY. RINALDI: It looks like
21 there's some houses on it. I'm assuming
22 those are the streets everybody referred to
23 at the work session that they want to name.

24 MR. PAPI: We always plowed them.

25 ATTY. RINALDI: So that's just in

1 your packet when somebody decides what they
2 want to do. We can add another street there
3 if you want to name the one going down to
4 the intersection from Keyser to that new
5 named street. Might as well name them both.

6 CHIEF DUBERNAS: I'll check
7 tomorrow, but I think Panusky uses a Rear
8 Sibley address there or it's a Rear Keyser
9 there.

10 ATTY. RINALDI: Probably a Rear
11 Keyser because there's no name on it.

12 MR. FEBBO: Are they having a
13 problem with deliveries because of it?

14 ATTY. RINALDI: There was a problem
15 somebody brought up last meeting?

16 MR. NOTARI: They asked to have it
17 named something else than Rear Keyser or
18 Rear Sibley. It was in our packet last
19 month.

20 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Because in front of
21 Panusky's house there is a house there, and
22 then it's his house that's in the alleyway.

23 MR. HOOVER: The one off Sibley
24 Avenue. Go the other way off of Sibley
25 Avenue, north, it's Flower Street. Can't we

1 make that an extension of Flower?

2 CHIEF DUBERNAS: They're offset a
3 little bit.

4 MR. FEBBO: Can't we just make that
5 Wood Street?

6 ATTY. RINALDI: That's up to you
7 guys.

8 MR. FEBBO: Make it just one street.
9 Why put two names there.

10 ATTY. RINALDI: As long as that
11 doesn't cause more confusion. Everybody
12 starts going to that South Flower.

13 MR. NOTARI: Why are we making this
14 so hard?

15 ATTY. RINALDI: I can't see what the
16 other streets are named.

17 CHIEF DUBERNAS: The only two
18 streets up there are Sibley and Flower. You
19 have West Sibley on the other side.

20 ATTY. RINALDI: We have time. I
21 just have to advertise seven days before our
22 next meeting.

23 MR. HOOVER: Let's just end it now.
24 Make it Panusky Way.

25 ATTY. RINALDI: Do you want to do a

1 name on the other one that comes off Keyser?
2 You're going to keep it the same? Okay.

3 That subdivision, I'm just waiting
4 on that map, and I think that's pretty much
5 it. Planning has not met to decide on their
6 input on the zoning change.

7 MR. FEBBO: That would be where,
8 near the school, Bill? Mariotti's property?

9 ATTY. RINALDI: Yes. Can we have a
10 quick executive on those two litigation
11 matters, Cole and the one that me and Paul
12 have to go to next week. Just to get
13 council's input on them.

14 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: We'll have it
15 tonight, after the meeting.

16 MR. PAPI: I put a copy in my report
17 of what the Lackawanna County Planning
18 Commission had said about the zone change.
19 Everybody should have it in the packet.
20 It's in my report.

21 MS. AVVISATO: Okay.

22 MR. FEBBO: Could you touch on it?

23 MR. PAPI: They want to put the cell
24 tower in, and in order to do that they have
25 to change the zone. Lackawanna County

1 Planning addressed it and they said it's
2 okay with them. We're not making any
3 mistakes by doing so if we choose to.

4 MR. FEBBO: So they're throwing it
5 back in our lap?

6 MR. PAPI: Well, they always do.
7 They just give an opinion.

8 MR. FEBBO: And our planning didn't
