2 ladies and gentlemen. I'd like to call the

14 MR. LENCESKI: Nothing.

15 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Do any of the
16 members have any questions for Joe?

17 MAYOR LEGG: Good job on the snow
18 over the weekend. You and your crew.

19 MS. CHICKEY: The Heights are
20 looking good.

21 MR. KOMENSKY: Thank you for getting
22 the decorations down before the ice and
23 everything and the roads. It's been a rough
24 winter so far. Thank you and your guys.
25 Appreciate it.

1 MR. BUTLER: Joe, before spring
2 comes are we going to get a gate up down by
3 the DPW garage down there to keep people
4 from going in there and dumping stuff?

5 MR. LENCESKI: I hope so.

6 MR. KOMENSKY: I have a plan. We're
7 going to work with them.

8 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Any other
9 members have any questions for Joe? Thanks,
10 Joe. Good job.

11 Zoning/code enforcement officer,
12 Mike Sokolowski. Good evening. Other than
13 your report, anything for the meeting this
14 evening?

15 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: No, I have nothing.

16 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Do any of the
17 members have any questions for the zoning
18 officer?

19 MR. NESE: I saw in your report that
20 Amity Ave. they're doing a demo. Before
21 anything goes forward you guys are going to
22 go in and make sure that we're all good with
23 it before we go any further?

24 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: Yes.

25 MR. KOMENSKY: Any idea how long

1 they have to go yet before we get that
2 inspection done?

3 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: As far as I
4 understand the sheetrock is being removed,
5 the kitchen is removed, the flooring is
6 removed, the doors, trim, stuff like that.

7 MR. KOMENSKY: Could we just make
8 sure that that report from whoever is in
9 writing and submitted to them in writing so
10 there's no hearsay like we had the last
11 time?

12 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: Yes.

13 MR. BUTLER: The girl that's related
14 to the guy that was on 602 Maple, that was
15 living in the house with no heat or water,
16 he said he's staying in the house.

17 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: I don't know. The
18 house went for sheriff's sale. The lady
19 from the sheriff's office or whoever made
20 the sale called me and asked me if I had
21 contact with them. I said yes, I've
22 contacted them. I wrote them a letter
23 saying he had money coming back. They were
24 trying to get a hold of him. I put a note
25 in his mailbox and that's the last I heard

1 of it.

2 MR. BUTLER: Still in the house.

3 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: It went for sale,
4 so whoever owns it now I don't know. There
5 is power there.

6 MR. BUTLER: Well, that's not --
7 doesn't have anything to do with us.

8 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: No, whoever owns
9 the house now.

10 MR. BUTLER: Eventually he's going
11 to have to get out of there.

12 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: Yes.

13 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Any other
14 questions from the members for the zoning
15 officer? Thank you, Mike.

16 Engineer, Dave Lopatka. Good
17 evening, Dave. Other than the report
18 tonight anything extra for the meeting?

19 MR. LOPATKA: Nothing extra for the
20 meeting, no.

21 MR. KOMENSKY: Dave, in light of
22 that me or Marylynn will call you and we'll
23 try to get together with Joe, like I just
24 told Beaver. So we'll try to get that
25 ironed out before the spring, maybe.

1 MS. BARTOLETTI: We've been
2 discussing it. Joe, Dave and myself, we've
3 been working on it for a while. What we
4 were trying to figure out, too, was we do
5 have a grant in to remodel the whole DPW
6 facility, and I just don't want to put
7 something in that we may have to move.
8 That's why we kind of held out, making sure
9 what the plans were and everything.

10 But the grant that I have in --
11 again, thank you, Dave for helping me get
12 that all put together -- it's still months
13 out. We won't hear about that grant for a
14 while.

15 MR. KOMENSKY: Something temporarily
16 when it comes to the spring. Maybe that
17 will be the way to go. Maybe get two
18 concretes and a cable or something just so
19 we can lock it at night.

20 MR. LENCESKI: We do lock it at
21 night.

22 MR. KOMENSKY: But it's close to
23 where they can throw it over the fence.
24 Right?

25 MR. LENCESKI: Yes.

1 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Any other
2 members have any questions for the engineer?

3 MR. NESE: I saw construction
4 started at the park. Are there any
5 anticipated concerns for that construction
6 getting done on time?

7 MR. LOPATKA: Well, winter came, so
8 it kind of shut the majority of it down.

9 MR. NESE: Besides weather.

10 MR. LOPATKA: Besides weather? No.
11 They were moving actually half-decent, but
12 once it got cold the ground froze. You have
13 to wait it out a little bit.

14 MR. NESE: I'm just hoping it will
15 be done by the time the park will be usable.

16 MR. LOPATKA: Well, I think they're
17 going to get back there as soon as the
18 weather breaks. We'll contact them if we
19 need to.

20 MS. BARTOLETTI: I think it's going
21 smooth. Keep in mind we have three
22 different projects going on with three
23 different companies. The lighting is one
24 project, the courts at both parks and the
25 wall is another project. The equipment

1 that's at the Marion Street park, the third
2 piece we put in, that's still in the process
3 but not done yet. So it's three different
4 things going on and three different
5 companies.

6 MR. LOPATKA: A little coordination
7 going on. The lighting project is basically
8 done other than the panels. Once that
9 building portion is put in there they can
10 finish up the lighting project and get those
11 up and running sooner than later. But the
12 site stuff, you can't get asphalt, you can't
13 get any of that material anyway. We'll get
14 them going as soon as the weather changes.

15 MR. NESE: I would hate to see that
16 wall look like that come May.

17 MR. BARTOLETTI: I'm sure they
18 will --

19 MR. NESE: When you drive past it,
20 how it looks.

21 MR. LOPATKA: We'll get them going
22 as soon as we can.

23 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Any other
24 questions for Dave? Thank you, Dave.

25 Police chief, Jason Dubernas. Good

1 evening. Anything other than your report
2 for the meeting this evening?

3 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Yeah. I was
4 contacted by Ms. Doherty, Drakes Lane. She
5 sent me a thing regarding intersections that
6 doesn't involve crosswalks at the
7 intersection. She's asking if the borough
8 could possibly make a resolution since her
9 crosswalk doesn't come to an intersection,
10 it comes to the middle of the block. As
11 long as there's three or four feet on each
12 side of the crosswalk so she can have a
13 handicap parking spot. I told her I would
14 bring it to your attention, I would talk to
15 the solicitor, go from there.

16 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: I'll ask you a
17 question. According to state law --

18 CHIEF DUBERNAS: I don't know if she
19 has three or four feet there. She has her
20 slice that makes her driveway, then on the
21 other side -- I'll go down tomorrow and
22 look -- Mr. Martinelli. I don't really
23 think she has enough on each side.

24 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Is she looking
25 for the handicap spot to be where she wants

1 the crosswalk removed?

2 CHIEF DUBERNAS: She knows she can
3 get the crosswalk removed. She's thinking
4 there's enough space if she puts the
5 handicap parking spot by her driveway. As
6 long as the borough allows her to put it
7 there, she thinks there's enough space
8 between where she would park her car and the
9 crosswalk. I don't think it's feasible.

10 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Are you saying
11 she could remove the crosswalk but at her
12 expense? Is that what PennDOT gave us?

13 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Yes. She sent me
14 this now.

15 MR. KOMENSKY: I don't think it's
16 going to happen.

17 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Unless she's
18 driving a Yugo.

19 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Could we
20 remove the crosswalk?

21 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Yes, but at the
22 borough's expense.

23 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: If somebody
24 was to remove that crosswalk what does the
25 work entail? I know you do a lot of

1 concrete work.

2 MR. LENCESKI: There is a change,
3 and it's small, two or three --

4 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: So it's just
5 ripping that one --

6 MR. LOPATKA: What is there, a
7 depressed curb there? Probably have to lift
8 that curb up, take that out.

9 CHIEF DUBERNAS: PennDOT said they
10 put it there because they couldn't put it on
11 the other corner because it would go right
12 into a driveway.

13 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Chief, are
14 there any other spots that you could think
15 of in Old Forge that are also like that?

16 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Moosic Road, right
17 in front of Pat Stassi's house.

18 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Did he ever
19 bring it to the borough?

20 CHIEF DUBERNAS: PennDOT told him he
21 had to pay for it to be removed. To this
22 day it's still sitting there.

23 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Just those
24 two? I can't think of any.

25 CHIEF DUBERNAS: I'll look.

1 MR. LENCESKI: Marion.

2 CHIEF DUBERNAS: On the north side.
3 It goes from Marion Street side right across
4 to Oak Street. Right in the middle they
5 have an indent. That's middle of the block.

6 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: So what would
7 your recommendation be? Go down there and
8 measure it tomorrow? Then her options would
9 be see -- you're going to measure it, see if
10 it will fit, then come back and let us know.
11 But her option right now is if she wanted to
12 she could take the initiative, with our
13 permission, and remove it and do what I just
14 asked Joe could be done. Right?

15 MR. LENCESKI: Full restoration.

16 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: But she can do
17 that at her own expense?

18 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Why don't we
19 measure it and you tell us if it will fit or
20 not. Everyone good with that? All right.
21 Chief, anything else?

22 CHIEF DUBERNAS: That's it.

23 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Any members
24 have any questions for the chief?

25 MR. KOMENSKY: Thank you for the

1 report. Even though it was lengthy I
2 appreciate the time you put into it.

3 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Any other
4 members have any questions for the chief?
5 Thank you, Chief.

6 Assistant fire chief, Bill Stull,
7 good evening. Anything for us for the
8 meeting this evening?

9 MR. STULL: No, nothing at all.

10 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Do any members
11 have any questions for the assistant fire
12 chief?

13 MR. KOMENSKY: The engine is back
14 from Bulldog, fully in service. Then the
15 other engine is sold and gone?

16 MR. STULL: Yes.

17 MR. KOMENSKY: So we are down to one
18 engine --

19 MR. STULL: The reserve engine, the
20 Tower, and the brush.

21 MR. KOMENSKY: I'd just like to say
22 thank you. It's been a cold weekend. I
23 know you guys were out the other day in
24 Taylor. But thank everybody. It's cold.
25 We appreciate the hard work.

1 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Any other
2 members have any questions for the assistant
3 fire chief? Thanks, Bill.

4 Attorney Rinaldi, good evening.
5 Anything, other than your report, for the
6 meeting this evening?

7 ATTY. RINALDI: No. I'd just ask
8 for an executive session for personnel
9 litigation and real estate at the
10 conclusion.

11 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Do any members
12 have any questions for the solicitor? Bill,
13 one question I have under new business, item
14 three, resolution for compost facility, is
15 there paperwork on that?

16 MS. BARTOLETTI: There isn't. It's
17 to name someone to run --

18 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Well, that's
19 what me and Mike thought.

20 MS. BARTOLETTI: Bill, I told him he
21 can do it after the fact, and just that
22 we're going to participate again for another
23 year with the compost facility.

24 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: All right.
25 Any other members have any questions for the

1 solicitor? Thanks, Bill.

2 Borough manager, Marylynn. Good
3 evening, Marylynn. Anything for the meeting
4 this evening?

5 MS. BARTOLETTI: So I want to just
6 take a minute and go through the financial
7 reports that you were given tonight and just
8 give a little explanation. So we have one
9 report that's called "Current Month Invoice
10 List." This is an old report with a changed
11 name, but it basically tells you any
12 invoices that have been incurred in this
13 current month. So as you'll see on here
14 it's January 1st up to, for the most part,
15 the current day, and it just tells you
16 what's come in this month.

17 Then you have another report that's
18 called "Old Forge Borough Unpaid Bills
19 Detail." So this one is basically
20 everything that the borough has outstanding
21 at this time. Not just the current month,
22 but anything that's carried over from the
23 previous month or months.

24 Next -- again, these are all for the
25 general account. The next is the profit and

1 Fuels/Road Paving Balance Sheet", this gives
2 you a snapshot of what we have right now in
3 our liquid fuels account and paving account.
4 This is obviously where we take any money
5 that's for road paving or road salt.

6 We have a list of Old Forge liquid
7 fuels/road paving unpaid bills detailed,
8 same as the long one that you saw for the
9 general. Right now we just have American
10 Rock Salt, and that's for the road salt.
11 That's what we owe right now.

12 Next is "Old Forge Sewer Agency
13 Balance Sheet." So everything that you see
14 here obviously pertains to the sewer
15 department. Checking account, savings
16 account, Plgit account. Any bills that the
17 sewer incurs come from these accounts.
18 Anything that we collect from the sewer
19 department payments go into these accounts
20 as well.

21 Then finally, just the unpaid bills
22 for the sewer agency. There's just one
23 small bill there right now. Any questions?
24 Okay. I don't have anything else tonight.

25 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Any members

1 have any questions for the borough manager?
2 Thank you, Marylynn. Before we go into new
3 business we'll go to public comment.
4 Anybody on the sheet?

5 CHIEF DUBERNAS: No.

6 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Okay. We'll
7 move right into new business. First item
8 under new business is payment application
9 number three to Hoffman Electric. Mare, do
10 you want to take us through that.

11 MS. BARTOLETTI: So this is the
12 company that is doing the electrical
13 lighting project at the park at Marion
14 Street, and application number three is
15 \$36,990.

16 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: At this time
17 the chair would entertain a motion to
18 approve payment application number three to
19 Hoffman Electric for \$36,990.

20 MR. KOMENSKY: I'll make that
21 motion.

22 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: By Councilman
23 Komensky.

24 MR. BUTLER: I'll second it.

25 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Seconded by

1 Councilman Butler. On the question?

2 MR. KOMENSKY: Is there any more the
3 we owe them or is this the final --

4 MS. BARTOLETTI: This is not final,
5 but it's just current, up to date with the
6 work they've completed and Dave has
7 approved.

8 MR. LOPATKA: Whatever they have
9 remaining on their contract is on the
10 payment app as remaining work.

11 MS. BARTOLETTI: It's basically
12 retaining it to a little bit of other.
13 That's it.

14 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: On the
15 question? Public input? Roll call, please.

16 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Rinaldi?

17 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Yes.

18 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilwoman
19 Chickey?

20 MS. CHICKEY: Yes.

21 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Butler?

22 MR. BUTLER: Yes.

23 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Nese?

24 MR. NESE: Yes.

25 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman

1 Pritchyk?

2 MR. PRITCHYK: Yes.

3 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman
4 Komensky?

5 MR. KOMENSKY: Yes.

6 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Item two we
7 already took care of, so we're going to go
8 to item number three, which would be
9 resolution for a compost facility. Mare,
10 you said this is to appoint a member --

11 MS. BARTOLETTI: We're going to have
12 to have a representative who will attend
13 their meetings. I think it's once a month
14 or once a quarter. Councilman Hoover
15 represented the borough at those in the
16 past. I don't know if it's going to be
17 another council member or if it's going to
18 be an employee who goes to represent at
19 these meetings. It cost us \$2,500 a year to
20 participate. This is where we bring all of
21 our yard waste. Then just we just have to
22 have a resolution saying that we're going to
23 continue and naming our representative.

24 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Do any of the
25 members have any issues? I know Councilman

1 Lettieri is not here.

2 MS. BARTOLETTI: I don't think it's
3 a problem if you want to wait and do it at
4 the next meeting and discuss it a little
5 bit.

6 MS. CHICKEY: Some of us work on the
7 weekends, so I'm not really sure when we'd
8 have to be there.

9 MS. BARTOLETTI: These meetings are
10 during the week. They're in the evening.

11 MS. CHICKEY: Just a little more
12 information because I didn't know if the
13 meetings are on the weekends, but you said
14 they're during the week.

15 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Would the
16 members rather get a little more
17 information? Okay. So at this time the
18 chair would entertain a motion to table item
19 number three.

20 MR. KOMENSKY: I'll make that
21 motion.

22 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: By Councilman
23 Komensky.

24 MS. CHICKEY: I'll second it.

25 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Seconded by

1 Councilwoman Chickey. On the question?
2 Public input? Roll call, please.

18 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: If any of the
19 members don't have anything for new business
20 I'll go down the table. Mayor Legg?
21 MAYOR LEGG: Thank you. Mike, Dave,
22 Joe, Chief, Marylynn, Counselor, your
23 monthly reports are excellent, excellent.
24 I'm here just about every day and I don't
25 even know some of the things that are on

1 there. So keep up the good work.

2 Mare, I'd like to thank you for
3 getting us to that borough association
4 meeting two weeks ago. I met some mayors
5 from other towns, some council members and
6 it's nice to make contact with other areas,
7 other people. It was very nice. Thank you.

8 I'd just like to inform council that
9 my latest good citizen's award was presented
10 to Jimmy Hoover yesterday, and he was very
11 appreciative, for all the time he spent on
12 the school board and the eight years he
13 spent here. That's all I have.

14 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Where did it
15 take place?

16 MAYOR LEGG: There was something
17 going on which I'd rather not get into. I
18 presented it to him.

19 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: He decided to
20 have it privately, at his discretion?

21 MAYOR LEGG: Yes.

22 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: I would have
23 liked him to come into the chamber and
24 receive it like all the others have, but
25 that was Mr. Hoover's decision.

1 MAYOR LEGG: That was his choice.

2 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Just as long
3 as it was his choice I respect it. Great
4 job by doing that as well. You've done so
5 many in the past few months. Good job.

6 MAYOR LEGG: If anybody has a name
7 let me know. I may not agree with you.

8 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Maybe get you
9 one one of these days. Anything else?

10 MAYOR LEGG: That's all.

11 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Councilman
12 Nese?

13 MR. NESE: Just to the department
14 heads, thanks for your reports this month.
15 Appreciate the information. That's it.

16 MR. PRITCHYK: Same thing. Thank
17 you, guys. Stay warm the next couple days.
18 It's going to be brutal.

19 MR. KOMENSKY: Mayor, thank you very
20 much for just giving that award to Jimmy.
21 Appreciate that. Like Russell said, you've
22 given a few out. It really shows that we
23 appreciate people in this town. Thank you
24 very much. That's all I have.

25 MS. CHICKEY: I'd just like to thank

1 everybody for the time they put into their
2 reports and Marylynn for helping me out so
3 far, you know, getting settled in. Thank
4 you, Mayor, for those awards you did and for
5 all the hard work everybody's done,
6 especially with the snow and the weather,
7 challenges that you had. Really appreciate
8 it. Thank you.

9 MR. BUTLER: I want to commend the
10 DPW for the job with the snow removal. It
11 was really good. They jumped on my street.
12 I couldn't believe it. I can't snow blow or
13 anything so I've got to take it easy for a
14 month. Thank you. Excellent job.

15 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Great job by
16 everyone, always. Thanks for the hard work.
17 All I have is, once again, thank you to the
18 two applicants who applied this evening and
19 came in. Appreciate it very much.
20 Congratulations to Mr. Karam again.

21 At this time, if there's no other
22 items or no business the chair would
23 entertain a motion to break into an
24 executive session for the solicitor.

25 MR. KOMENSKY: So moved.

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MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: By Councilman
Komensky. All in favor?

(Unanimous. Meeting adjourned.)
