2 ladies and gentlemen. I'd like to call the

1           Tonight is Tuesday, June 17, 2025. The  
2           purpose of our meeting will be to go through

11 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Yes. We'll

12 move into our department heads. First

13 department head, our DPW manager, Joe

14 Lenceski. Joe, good evening. We have Joe's

15 report. Joe, anything else to tell us for

16 tonight?

17 MR. LENCESKI: Nothing for tonight.

18 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Any members

19 have any questions for Joe?

20 MR. HOOVER: On Dunn Avenue they did

21 that cut. The water company restored the

22 cut on Dunn Avenue at Eigen's house. They

23 just did the cut itself. We just paved that

24 road. They have to be aware they have to

25 fix 20 feet on both sides of that cut.

1 Right, Dave?

2 MR. LOPATKA: It's 25.

3 MR. HOOVER: Twenty-five feet on  
4 both sides of that cut. Let's explain that  
5 for them. Write them a letter, let them  
6 know what they have to do. There's another  
7 one on a paved road. I'll check that out.  
8 I know the one on Dunn Avenue, we just saw  
9 it today.

10 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Any other  
11 members have any questions for Joe? Thanks,  
12 Joe.

13 Our code enforcement/zoning officer,  
14 Mike Sokolowski, is absent. We have his  
15 report. If anyone has any additional  
16 questions for him they can either e-mail him  
17 or contact him this week.

18 Engineer's report, Dave Lopatka.  
19 Dave, good evening. Anything additional for  
20 tonight?

21 MR. LOPATKA: No. We had the two  
22 prebid meetings today. One for Pagnotti  
23 Park, phase two, and the other one for the  
24 memorial wall project. We have the Marion  
25 Street Park lighting project is out to bid.

1 We have a prebid meeting two weeks. July  
2 2nd. Then the Marion Street/Miles Street  
3 Park project will be going out by the end of  
4 the week, which is fixing the basketball  
5 courts and adding some trails. That trail  
6 around the lower part of the playground up  
7 on Marion Street.

8 MS. BARTOLETTI: The frame would be  
9 where the apparatuses are to keep the mulch  
10 in. Putting a frame around each area.

11 MR. LOPATKA: The walkway going  
12 around the low side of those. We're redoing  
13 the basketball courts over there and then  
14 the ones over here.

15 MR. HOOVER: Could you give us a  
16 spread sheet when it comes out?

17 MR. LOPATKA: Sure. I'll give you  
18 the date it went out, the prebid, and then  
19 I'll give you the bid date as well.

20 MR. HOOVER: Lot of things going on.

21 MR. LOPATKA: The bids for the park  
22 are, I think, next week. The 26th, that  
23 might be.

24 MS. BARTOLETTI: The 26th is for the  
25 two --

1 MR. LOPATKA: The 26th is Pagnotti  
2 Park and the memorial wall. The week after  
3 that I believe -- I think they're all  
4 separated by a week. The week after that  
5 would be the lighting project. Then the  
6 week after that will be the two parks. I'll  
7 put a sheet together.

8 MR. BUTLER: Dave, is the sod in at  
9 Pagnotti?

10 MR. LOPATKA: No, that's part of the  
11 project that will be bid out.

12 MS. BARTOLETTI: That's the second  
13 phase that's out to bid now.

14 MR. LOPATKA: Pagnotti, they're  
15 regrading the whole infield and then they're  
16 going to sod the whole thing.

17 MR. BUTLER: What's going on with  
18 the building?

19 MS. BARTOLETTI: That has nothing to  
20 do with that. One is separate from the  
21 other. The building is just a small  
22 addition to the garage/concession stand.  
23 All the work that's being done in this bid  
24 is strictly at the upper fields that the  
25 high school uses. Two separate things.

1 MR. BUTLER: They wanted to know if  
2 we sent that out for bid, the building.

3 MS. BARTOLETTI: It's a very small  
4 project and it's being done in-house.

5 MR. LOPATKA: Other than that, I  
6 don't have anything else.

7 MR. HOOVER: How about the survey on  
8 First Street? Did they do that yet?

9 MR. LOPATKA: They didn't do it yet.  
10 They were backed up.

11 MR. HOOVER: Also Nicholas.

12 MR. LOPATKA: They're going to be  
13 getting to that next week.

14 MR. HOOVER: They paved Bubernack  
15 Tuesday.

16 MR. LOPATKA: Thursday. Tuesday  
17 they were supposed to be there but it  
18 rained.

19 MR. HOOVER: Came out nice.

20 MR. LOPATKA: The e-mail I got was  
21 they think they got two bad batches of  
22 asphalt.

23 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: If you're  
24 going down towards Sibley they did the whole  
25 left side. I was there the other day.

1 MR. LOPATKA: That's the side where  
2 most of the issues were. They got two bad  
3 batches of asphalt.

4 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: When we walked  
5 it that day you could see it is chewed up in  
6 certain spots. As long as they fixed it.

7 MR. LOPATKA: Hopefully I'll have  
8 the surveys back for Nicholas, First Street.

9 MR. KOMENSKY: Dave, we have to have  
10 a discussion about Lonesome Road. We have  
11 to get DEP back up so we can do kind of a  
12 diagram so we can put that out to bid.

13 MR. LOPATKA: So what exactly is DEP  
14 allowing you to do? They're allowing you to  
15 dig out a certain portion. Do we know what  
16 the limits are?

17 MR. KOMENSKY: They're going to come  
18 up. So we would have to get you with them,  
19 whoever was there to go back down so we can  
20 kind of have that ready before August.  
21 Marylynn has everything.

22 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: The last that  
23 they left us when we had the meeting with  
24 them here, a Zoom meeting, they're going to  
25 come down around mid-July. But they're

1 going to come down and they're going to mark  
2 it off and tell us how far we can go towards  
3 the river, towards the back and the left or  
4 right. So they're going to meet us down  
5 there one more time. So that's when we'll  
6 want all of us down there.

7 MR. LOPATKA: Do you know if they're  
8 going to want us to quantify the quantity of  
9 the materials?

10 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: I think  
11 they're going to give us the limits where we  
12 can go as far as the parameter and also how  
13 deep. They're going to tell us everything  
14 we're allowed to do.

15 MR. LOPATKA: You guys are going to  
16 need to put together a plan and have someone  
17 go in there and dredge it, then.

18 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Yes. They  
19 didn't give us the final yet. They said in  
20 July, when they come back, that's when  
21 they're going to give us the finals of what  
22 we could and can't do.

23 MR. HOOVER: They're going to give  
24 us the plan of what to do?

25 MR. LOPATKA: We're probably going

1 to have to put it out to bid. So the big  
2 problem right now is the river's still so  
3 high. Normally in the summer it goes down.

4 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: That's why  
5 they said around August. They were going to  
6 come down and tell us the area we're allowed  
7 to take out.

8 MR. LOPATKA: Let me know.

9 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anything else  
10 for us?

11 MR. LOPATKA: I do not.

12 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Any other  
13 members have anything for David?

14 MR. LETTIERI: Where are we at with  
15 the senior center?

16 MR. LOPATKA: I believe they're  
17 waiting for the windows to come in. All the  
18 cabinets and everything were put in.

19 MS. BARTOLETTI: They're working on  
20 the lighting right now.

21 MR. LOPATKA: The ceiling as well.  
22 They have the framing up. I think Marylynn  
23 has to approve the tiles.

24 MS. BARTOLETTI: Yes.

25 MR. LOPATKA: Once they're approved

1 everything goes in, all the venting goes in.  
2 I think they're waiting for windows.  
3 Typically right near the end they'll put the  
4 floor in.

5 MR. KOMENSKY: I walked in and the  
6 lights automatically came on.

7 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Any other  
8 members have any questions for Dave?  
9 Thanks, Dave.

10 Police chief, Jason Dubernas. Good  
11 evening, Chief. Anything for the meeting?

12 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Just two things.  
13 First, I'll be setting up a meeting with the  
14 civil service commission for a possible  
15 extension on the active list that we  
16 currently have.

17 The safe exchange zone signs are in  
18 place and ready to go.

19 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Nice job, Joe,  
20 and Chief. Anything else?

21 CHIEF DUBERNAS: That's it. These  
22 three gentlemen are on the list.

23 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Any members  
24 have any questions for the chief?

25 MR. KOMENSKY: Thanks for taking

1 care of the cameras.

2 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Chief, I have  
3 two questions. I had a couple residents  
4 contact me from Howard Street. They were  
5 asking about doing a traffic study for a  
6 stop sign at the three corners of Howard  
7 Street, at Tindale.

8 CHIEF DUBERNAS: There is a stop  
9 sign at Tindale.

10 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: They said on  
11 Howard. It would be from Main Street up,  
12 and then I guess there would also be one if  
13 you were coming in or out of the Holly Ridge  
14 development or the alleyway.

15 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Is there a roadway  
16 coming out of Holly Ridge there?

17 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: There's going  
18 to be, and they were asking about a speed  
19 limit sign. Are we able to put a speed  
20 limit sign on a side street?

21 CHIEF DUBERNAS: The speed limit is  
22 25 miles per hour.

23 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Are we able to  
24 put a sign there? You have to do a study  
25 before you -- I know we can put it there,

1 but do you have to do a study before we do  
2 it?

3 CHIEF DUBERNAS: No, if it's  
4 unmarked it automatically goes to 25 an hour  
5 for an urban residential district. Unless  
6 you want to lower the speed limit to 15 or  
7 something. Then that's different.

8 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: They just  
9 requested a speed limit sign.

10 CHIEF DUBERNAS: I'll look at it.

11 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: If you think  
12 it should be lowered come back and let us  
13 know. Then a stop sign, which would be one  
14 going towards the development and one coming  
15 out of the development. It would be on  
16 Tindale.

17 Councilman Komensky is saying that  
18 if we're going to be looking at Howard  
19 Street, should we look at the other side,  
20 too. The other side would be in front of  
21 where the train property had the garage.  
22 Maybe if you want to just look at both while  
23 you're there. Anything else for us?

24 CHIEF DUBERNAS: No.

25 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anyone else

1 for the chief? Thanks, Chief.

2 Assistant fire chief, Bill Stull,  
3 good evening. Anything for the meeting this  
4 evening?

5 MR. STULL: The only thing I have is  
6 this Sunday we'll be closing off Fallon  
7 Street to South Main Street for the corn  
8 hole tournament from probably about 10:00 in  
9 the morning until about 5:00. That's about  
10 it. We shouldn't need any barricades or  
11 anything like that. We can take care of  
12 them with our own vehicles. That's all.

13 MR. RUSSEL RINALDI: Any members  
14 have any questions for the assistant fire  
15 chief? Thanks, Bill. Good luck with the  
16 event this weekend.

17 Solicitor's report, attorney  
18 Rinaldi. Good evening. Anything additional  
19 for the meeting tonight?

20 ATTY. RINALDI: Just accept the  
21 resignation of Councilwoman Shotwell, and  
22 the proposal for Pennoni Associates to  
23 finish up the comprehensive plan and SALDO  
24 for the remainder of the contract price for  
25 URDC. That's it.

1 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Any members  
2 have any questions for the solicitor?  
3 Thanks, Bill.

4 Borough manager, Marylynn  
5 Bartoletti. Good evening. Anything for the  
6 meeting tonight?

7 MS. BARTOLETTI: Yes. First, does  
8 anyone have any questions on any of my  
9 financial reports?

10 Just a couple of things. First, I'm  
11 just going to put out there that myself,  
12 Councilman Komensky, Councilman Hoover,  
13 Councilman Butler attended a Coffee with the  
14 Commissioners meeting today along with  
15 representatives from Moosic and Taylor. It  
16 was a short meeting but it was  
17 informational. We did talk a little bit  
18 about paving, as Councilman Hoover brought  
19 up, and we talked about some of the flooding  
20 issues that have been discussed. We talked  
21 about the resolution that the borough passed  
22 two weeks ago regarding the flooding and the  
23 whole new process that the county's putting  
24 together, that they're working on. I think  
25 Old Forge, Moosic and Taylor were all in

1 agreement about each problem that each one  
2 discussed. We all kind of have the same  
3 issues, which was kind of nice to hear, I  
4 guess.

5 MR. HOOVER: Infrastructure, we  
6 talked about paving roads. Big problems.  
7 We have \$1.7 million worth of roads that  
8 have to be paved and nowhere near we're  
9 going to get that money unless we take a  
10 loan out. That's not going to happen.

11 We also talked about the fire  
12 department. They picked on us first. I  
13 talked about the fire department, that  
14 either Lackawanna County or the state's  
15 going to have to do something. Eventually  
16 they're going to be looking for a second  
17 person on a truck, which leads to a paid  
18 fire department. The borough can't take  
19 that and they all agreed. They all had the  
20 same issues. So it was a good meeting. It  
21 was a good 45 minutes. I enjoyed it.

22 MS. BARTOLETTI: So just an update,  
23 we discussed, I think, at the last meeting  
24 about the Friends of the Poor having a food  
25 distribution, a pop-up pantry. The date was

1 going to be June 24th but it's changed.  
2 It's going to now be July 1st, and then it's  
3 going to be the 1st of the month throughout  
4 the summer, so July, August and probably  
5 September until they see if they have a  
6 different place that they'll be able to go.  
7 So originally it was the 24th. Now it's  
8 July 1st instead.

9 I wanted to talk a little bit about  
10 the equipment we ordered so far -- this is  
11 Joe and myself -- for the parks. The  
12 equipment we're using our ARPA grant money  
13 for. So right now, between what's ordered  
14 and what's in the process of being ordered  
15 we're at \$210,000. We did put an estimate  
16 together of \$300,000 that we were going to  
17 put toward this work.

18 So what I'd like to add is a small  
19 area for ADA play areas. It's some  
20 different type of equipment and the approach  
21 to that equipment would be different. You  
22 can't put mulch or anything. You would have  
23 to put another walkway in, which I will be  
24 talking to Dave about to see what he can put  
25 together for me. Anyone have any problem

1 with this, any issue?

2 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: No. I know on  
3 Marion Street but --

4 MS. BARTOLETTI: In the same area.  
5 Joe and I have it all mapped out how we're  
6 going to set up all this equipment, so as  
7 we're purchasing equipment, it's COSTARS, we  
8 also have the installers, and they have to  
9 be certified installers. So when they  
10 quote, they give you the quote on the  
11 equipment and the quote on the installation  
12 as well. So it's like a bundle because  
13 obviously we can't put it together ourselves  
14 or bring in somebody to put it together.  
15 They have to be certified.

16 So what Joe and I have worked on is  
17 putting different little areas together  
18 instead of everything jammed in where it was  
19 before. The two apparatuses that were taken  
20 out. We're putting one big one which we did  
21 pick out from the flyer. So we're saving  
22 \$25,000 on that.

23 Then a little bit further from that  
24 we're putting in an area that's more for  
25 older kids and adults. It's more physical

1 fitness.

2 MR. LENCESKI: Bars, rings, pull-up  
3 bars, ladders, rings to go through.

4 MS. BARTOLETTI: But we're putting  
5 that in for older kids and adults to use. I  
6 feel like the one thing that we're missing  
7 is something for ADA. There's a lot of  
8 really nice equipment that we can pick out  
9 that would fall into this category.

10 MR. KOMENSKY: I think it's a great  
11 idea.

12 MS. BARTOLETTI: I would like an  
13 executive session later for a personnel  
14 matter.

15 MR. KOMENSKY: Work session in July?

16 MS. BARTOLETTI: The work session in  
17 July, we talked about cancelling it. If  
18 everyone else is good with it I'd like to  
19 not have it. Then we'll talk about the  
20 August meeting. We're going to be having  
21 representatives from PennDOT and one of  
22 their engineering firms come in regarding a  
23 bridge that they're going to be doing some  
24 work on in the future. But they have to  
25 have one of their public hearings. So that

1 will be in August.

2 Also, the representative from the  
3 county CDBG funds will be coming as well.  
4 That's all I have.

5 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Any members  
6 have any questions for Marylynn? Thank you,  
7 Marylynn. Before we go into new business  
8 we'll go into public comment. Bruce Fahey?

9 MR. FAHEY: Bruce Fahey. I just  
10 wanted to introduce myself to council and  
11 bring everybody up to speed as to the work  
12 my company's done within the borough and the  
13 opportunity that it's now presenting to you  
14 guys as a borough from a surveillance  
15 standpoint.

16 So we finished the safe spaces  
17 project at the borough building, and through  
18 discovery of that I noticed you guys have a  
19 lot of surveillance cameras that are on a  
20 similar but not quite as robust platform,  
21 and I just wanted to kind of bring it to  
22 your attention. Those cameras can be  
23 migrated over to the new platform that you  
24 guys are currently running which is much  
25 more state of the art in regards to remote

1 connectivity, AI capabilities, things of  
2 that nature. It's actually -- and we do  
3 this on purpose. It's the same platform  
4 that the school district just implemented,  
5 that we finished up that project.

6 The reason we did that was so that  
7 if the police department is on the borough  
8 building system, if they so choose to they  
9 can remote directly into the school in an  
10 emergency because everything is an  
11 enterprise-wide -- I don't want to say  
12 shared because there are two separate  
13 systems, but they have connectivity through  
14 a remote cloud which is more like a traffic  
15 cop for technology.

16 So you're using some AI capabilities  
17 on the license plate scanner. The license  
18 plate reader that we put in will not only  
19 video tape plates, it will capture make,  
20 model and color of the vehicle, the plate  
21 number, and then allows the police  
22 department to search based off any one of  
23 those criteria. The school district, we're  
24 in the middle of doing the same thing.

25 I know from my experience -- I've

1           been doing this 35 years -- other boroughs  
2           that I've done -- like, we did a large  
3           project for Kingston. We're a COSTARS  
4           vendor, so we do this in a lot of government  
5           entities. I work with Luzerne County  
6           Housing all the time. Kingston Borough did  
7           the same thing quite a few years back on a  
8           different platform. They didn't have the  
9           ability at that time to involve AI  
10          technology, but most boroughs like  
11          yourselves, you kind of have that seed  
12          planted now. You have a state-of-the-art  
13          product with only two cameras connected to  
14          it. It's kind of like in its birth stage  
15          where if you choose to we can take the money  
16          you've already invested in this building and  
17          take these cameras and merge them right into  
18          that system. Then as you continue to expand  
19          your surveillance footprint, whether it be  
20          other buildings -- we're looking at  
21          designing a solution right now to tie in the  
22          football stadium into the same platform so  
23          it can be accessible from the school. The  
24          police department would be able to access it  
25          from here. That's going to be a pretty

1 elaborate project. Facial recognition, the  
2 whole nine yards.

3 So I just wanted to bring that to  
4 everybody's attention because a lot of times  
5 we do these projects and things kind of get  
6 moved on, and then another project gets put  
7 on the table and you don't realize what you  
8 currently own. You own one of the most  
9 sophisticated platforms in the world right  
10 now. I kind of really wanted to -- I'm an  
11 Old Forge resident. I really wanted to have  
12 you guys get the best of the best. I know  
13 there's a lot of vendors in the area that  
14 don't take that perspective.

15 I throw that out there because if  
16 you do another surveillance project I would  
17 be willing to step up -- quite honestly, I  
18 would do the design free of charge. If  
19 anyone was familiar with the school district  
20 project and the engineering layouts and  
21 designs it's pretty elaborate. It's all  
22 mathematically based to the exact coverage  
23 areas. I'd be willing to do that design for  
24 you if you were to put this out to bid or if  
25 you wanted to do it through COSTARS because

1 I think it's just an opportunity lost if you  
2 don't maintain the same platform. If you  
3 continue to grow out and maintain that same  
4 recording platform, which is open  
5 architected and non-proprietary. So anybody  
6 can deploy that system. That software will  
7 talk to just about any industry standard  
8 camera out there. It doesn't have to be  
9 specific to the Samsung manufacturer or  
10 anything like that.

11 I don't want to take up too much  
12 time. If anybody has specific questions  
13 I'll be here, but I just wanted to bring  
14 that to the table so that everybody's aware  
15 of -- you know, you guys basically own a  
16 Ferrari right now and you're running it in  
17 first gear because you only have two cameras  
18 on a system that's designed for thousands of  
19 cameras. Luzerne County Housing has the  
20 same platform. They're running 3,000  
21 cameras on 25 servers. That's the type of  
22 product you currently own. This isn't a  
23 monthly-fee-based system. You bought it,  
24 you own it. We'll main it for you on an  
25 as-needed basis. Upgrades are free for life

1 for the software, which is another benefit  
2 of this product. I just wanted to bring  
3 that to the table so everybody was aware.

4 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Appreciate it.  
5 Two quick questions. The system that we  
6 have now from you just with the two cameras  
7 for the safe zones, the cameras that we have  
8 throughout the building that aren't yours,  
9 those would be integrated right into the new  
10 system?

11 MR. FAHEY: Correct. You guys can  
12 investigate that on your end, but from a  
13 technical perspective, yes. We'd probably  
14 have to do a factory default because I'm  
15 sure the existing vendor has them locked  
16 out. Once you do a factory default we can  
17 recredential them and a new user password  
18 and we can set the IP address to be anything  
19 we want. They are a little bit lower-end  
20 camera, but they suffice for a lot of areas  
21 that you have them in. The outside's a  
22 little weak, but you have some great  
23 coverage on at least part of the parking lot  
24 now. Both cameras are 4K cameras out there.  
25 But that can all be integrated in.



1 walk past that corner of the sidewalk he can  
2 find them within seconds.

3 Now we're looking at another layer  
4 of software for more advanced AI where we  
5 can actually find weapons detection,  
6 silhouettes of firearms. The cameras will  
7 automatically pick an alarm on those  
8 notifications. Currently they can do  
9 persons, vehicle, clothing color, race,  
10 gender, eyeglasses. The system will search  
11 for all of that.

12 You own, like, the software that  
13 manages all that, and then various cameras  
14 deliver various levels of AI functionality.  
15 You have not the top, but one of the top  
16 tier cameras covering those spaces out back.  
17 The license plate camera you have is the top  
18 tier LPR camera right now in the world.

19 As you move forward don't reinvent  
20 the wheel. Build off what you already own  
21 because it's an awesome platform. We don't  
22 have to -- other vendors can put it in. We  
23 are a gold level dealer for that product.  
24 We're highly certified and we do a lot of  
25 large critical installations using that

1 application. We integrate building systems.

2 So I just wanted to bring that to  
3 the table. I appreciate the opportunity.  
4 If anybody wants to speak to me afterwards  
5 I'll hang out.

6 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Appreciate it.  
7 Joe DeStefano?

8 MR. DESTEFANO: For quite a few  
9 months there I was coming to every meeting.  
10 We were talking about the turf at Miles and  
11 the lights at Pagnotti. I'm just kind of  
12 here to follow up.

13 We were in Florida and they played  
14 on one of these new fields. When I was out  
15 on that field it was 95 degrees that day.  
16 You could have swore it was 75. No heat  
17 coming off that. It was actually cooler  
18 than playing on regular grass. It's a new  
19 system. All the microfilament is underneath  
20 the turf.

21 My question is where are we with it?  
22 Are we still talking about it?

23 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: My first  
24 question is going to be the lights. Are  
25 they in the project with --

1 MS. BARTOLETTI: So the lights, the  
2 grants that the little league had, \$95,000,  
3 what we were doing was we were going to  
4 attempt to try and change that over and put  
5 it possibly toward Miles Street because I  
6 did a grant for Miles Street as well. We  
7 probably won't hear on this grant for at  
8 least two or three more months, but it was a  
9 little over \$500,000, I believe, to try to  
10 do the turf. I put together a whole  
11 package, presented it to the state. So  
12 we're kind of, right now, waiting to hear  
13 because we were back and forth either taking  
14 the money for the lights and putting it  
15 towards that, but if we were granted the  
16 entire amount, then we wouldn't need it.  
17 Then we would try to put that towards --

18 MR. DESTEFANO: Can you use the  
19 money towards lights?

20 MS. BARTOLETTI: We could, but if  
21 we're doing all this other stuff we have to  
22 see where we're at monetary wise because 95,  
23 I don't think --

24 MR. HOOVER: We did talk about just  
25 doing the infield, not the outfield. We

1           tossed it around a little bit. It's better  
2           to hang out a little bit than do the whole  
3           thing all at once. It's a great spot to put  
4           it, Miles Street, but we were throwing it  
5           around, a little bit here and there.

6                    MS. BARTOLETTI: I don't exactly  
7           remember when they will make this  
8           announcement. I'm thinking it's somewhere  
9           around August.

10                   MR. DESTEFANO: So if we don't get  
11           the grant do we have a backup plan?

12                   MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: If we don't  
13           get the grant for the turf? We don't have a  
14           back up plan, but I know we discussed in the  
15           past not putting it towards it. But there  
16           was some talk about selling the church  
17           properties, putting that money towards  
18           recreation. We discussed not turf, but we  
19           had -- my question to you was about the  
20           lights. Did we have lights in the phase one  
21           project at Pagnotti?

22                   MS. BARTOLETTI: No, there's no  
23           lights there.

24                   MR. LOPATKA: I think we did have an  
25           electrical engineer out there to look

1           because we'd have to upgrade the service.

2                   MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: I wasn't sure  
3           if we had the lights in that package.

4                   MS. BARTOLETTI: The lights are for  
5           the smaller field. All the work that's  
6           being done is on the bigger field.

7                   MR. KOMENSKY: The grant, who is  
8           the --

9                   MS. BARTOLETTI: It's an LSA but  
10          it's a statewide. There's two different  
11          versions and they have two different time  
12          frames. One is the LSA Monroe, the other  
13          one is LSA state. This is state.

14                  MR. KOMENSKY: Probably once we know  
15          what's going on here we'll have to make a  
16          plan B.

17                  MR. DESTEFANO: So we're about two  
18          years out.

19                  MS. BARTOLETTI: No, I wouldn't say  
20          two years. If we are --

21                  MR. DESTEFANO: If you're awarded in  
22          August you wouldn't get it until fall, the  
23          earliest.

24                  MS. BARTOLETTI: Once you're awarded  
25          you start to move on it. What we would be

1 doing is probably looking for the one that's  
2 on the COSTARS.

3 MR. DESTEFANO: Thank you for your  
4 time.

5 MR. KOMENSKY: Can you ask them what  
6 the time frame is and let me know.

7 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Before we go  
8 into new business, any other members of the  
9 public want to address us? Okay.

10 First item under new business is  
11 going to be motion to approve to accept the  
12 letter of resignation from Councilwoman  
13 Jenna Jones-Shotwell. Before we make any  
14 motions, Mrs. Shotwell e-mailed a letter to  
15 the borough manager and asked to share it  
16 with borough council, so I'm going to read  
17 it for public comment.

18 The letter reads "dear council  
19 members and residents of the borough of Old  
20 Forge, it is with deep regret that I submit  
21 my resignation from the position of  
22 councilwoman effectively immediately. This  
23 decision does not come easily, but I believe  
24 it is necessary for the well-being of both  
25 myself and my family.

1                   From the moment I chose to run for  
2 office I faced an ongoing pattern of  
3 harassment and intimidation. While I  
4 understood that public service would involve  
5 scrutiny and disagreement, the hostility I  
6 have endured has gone far beyond the bounds  
7 of respectful civil discourse.

8                   Recently this behavior has escalated  
9 to targeting my professional life, my  
10 livelihood and my ability to provide for my  
11 family. What began with anonymous yard  
12 signs has involved into harassment through  
13 e-mail-type messages and other personal  
14 channels. These actions are not about being  
15 accountable as an elected official but they  
16 are about silencing, dissent and punishing  
17 independent thought.

18                   For those of you who supported me  
19 and may feel disappointed in my decision, I  
20 am sincerely grateful for everything you  
21 have done to help me obtain this position  
22 and I hope you understand I am sorry if you  
23 feel I'm letting you down. I may have been  
24 outspoken, but my intentions were always  
25 rooted in what I believe to be the best for

1           our community. I've always acted in good  
2           faith and with integrity and I am proud of  
3           that.

4                       This decision does not come from  
5           fear but from wisdom. As the saying goes,  
6           never wrestle with a pig. We both get dirty  
7           and the pig likes it. There are fights  
8           worth having and then there are battles that  
9           simply distract from meaningful progress.

10                      If my departure feels like a victory  
11           to those who sought to undermine me, so be  
12           it. I trust the residents of Old Forge will  
13           continue to seek leadership that value  
14           honesty, transparency and courage.

15                      Thank you for the opportunity to  
16           serve. Sincerely, Jenna Jones-Shotwell."

17                      MR. KOMENSKY: With deep regret, I  
18           make a motion to accept the resignation of  
19           Councilwoman Jenna Jones-Shotwell.

20                      MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: We have a  
21           motion on the floor by Councilman Komensky  
22           to accept the resignation.

23                      MR. HOOVER: I'll second it with  
24           regrets. She was a good council person.

25                      MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Seconded by

1 Councilman Hoover. On the question? Public  
2 input? Roll call, please.

3 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilwoman  
4 McCawley?

5 MS. MCCAWLEY: Regretfully, yes.

6 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman  
7 Komensky?

8 MR. KOMENSKY: Regretfully, yes.

9 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman  
10 Lettieri?

11 MR. LETTIERI: With regret, yes.

12 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Butler?

13 MR. BUTLER: With regrets, yes.

14 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Hoover?

15 MR. HOOVER: With regrets, again,  
16 yes.

17 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Rinaldi?

18 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: With regrets,  
19 yes.

20 The second item under new business  
21 will be a motion to consider a proposal from  
22 Pennoni Associates, Incorporated to complete  
23 work originally begun by Urban Research and  
24 Development Corporation to prepare a  
25 comprehensive plan and subdivision and land

1 development ordinance for the borough of Old  
2 Forge. Bill, Councilman Komensky would like  
3 you to explain it a little bit.

4 ATTY. RINALDI: So URDC, because of  
5 the stroke by their principal, has shut down  
6 business. He didn't recover. We paid them  
7 to date about \$47,400. There's \$12,000 left  
8 on the contract. They have reached out to  
9 Pennoni Engineers --

10 MR. KOMENSKY: Who is they?

11 ATTY. RINALDI: URDC, because they  
12 don't have the ability to complete the work.  
13 Pennoni has agreed to take on their clients  
14 and, depending on where they were in the  
15 process, complete the work. So they were  
16 made aware of where we are with our work.  
17 There hasn't been anything done in two years  
18 on it. There's \$12,000 left in our contract  
19 with them and they're willing to complete  
20 the work for the \$12,000.

21 MR. KOMENSKY: So we would get  
22 everything wrapped up in a package like we  
23 would have gotten through URDC for all the  
24 time we put in. They'll just finish it and  
25 be done.

1                   ATTY. RINALDI: Yes.

2                   MS. BARTOLETTI: The maps, the whole  
3 ball of wax.

4                   ATTY. RINALDI: If you look at their  
5 proposal, they've gone through it. They're  
6 really 90 percent. The only thing is a  
7 summary of the ordinance distribution  
8 because that's where we ended. We did all  
9 the workshop meetings. The adoption  
10 meetings come after the summary, and then  
11 the SALDO, there was just a sample using  
12 other boroughs. So they would finish doing  
13 our own SALDO, which hasn't been updated  
14 probably since the '90s, and that would be  
15 included in the \$12,000.

16                   MR. KOMENSKY: I was here prior to  
17 the meeting going on. I know everybody put  
18 a lot of time and work into this, and it  
19 seems as though every time we were having  
20 either a zoning -- some issue it was always  
21 stuff that we put in the new ordinance but  
22 we could not use.

23                   So I don't know if anybody else has  
24 other questions, but as far as I'm concerned  
25 I would make a motion to accept this \$12,000

1 and hire Pennoni Associates to finish this  
2 because it's been three and a half, four  
3 years in the works and we can finally say  
4 it's done. Is there a time frame?

5 ATTY. RINALDI: No. There was no  
6 time frame with the last one. It just kind  
7 of died for two years.

8 MR. KOMENSKY: Well, I make a  
9 motion.

10 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Motion on the  
11 floor by Councilman Komensky.

12 MS. MCCAWLEY: I'll second.

13 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Seconded by  
14 Councilwoman McCawley. On the question?  
15 Bill, the only question I would have, is it  
16 only going to be up to us to try to get this  
17 done as soon as possible or is it going to  
18 be -- is it us telling them or them telling  
19 us?

20 ATTY. RINALDI: We tell them. It's  
21 basically --

22 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Will they move  
23 as fast as we want?

24 ATTY. RINALDI: Yes.

25 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: My second

1 question would be after we get it all  
2 finished with them and then we would  
3 obviously have our planning review it and  
4 make sure we have everything in there that  
5 should be in there or maybe if we needed to  
6 add something in there? I'm not sure --

7 MR. KOMENSKY: I'm almost positive  
8 planning did all their stuff.

9 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: But moving  
10 forward.

11 ATTY. RINALDI: There would still be  
12 meetings with planning to review it, and if  
13 there's any questions and changes that would  
14 all go through planning same as it did  
15 before.

16 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: But my  
17 question is the time frame. I would like to  
18 have them work on our time, not theirs.

19 ATTY. RINALDI: Well, that's up to  
20 planning.

21 MS. BARTOLETTI: I think everybody  
22 agrees that we let it die the first time and  
23 I won't let you let it die. Bill has all of  
24 the information from URDC, so obviously  
25 Pennoni can handle this because that's what

1           they do. We can't as people who don't do  
2           that type of stuff.

3                         But also in the quotation that they  
4           had sent there's a full scope of service on  
5           here that gives all of the information.  
6           What's been completed, what still needs to  
7           be done. They're telling you exactly how  
8           they're going to handle it. So I'm assuming  
9           that once we sign this contract we'll have a  
10          meeting with them.

11                        MR. KOMENSKY: I commend them  
12          because it was a little rocky start.

13                        MS. BARTOLETTI: If you look them up  
14          they are --

15                        MR. KOMENSKY: Kind of all over the  
16          state.

17                        MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Any other  
18          questions? Public comment? Roll call,  
19          please.

20                        MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilwoman  
21          McCawley?

22                        MS. MCCAWLEY: Yes.

23                        MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman  
24          Komensky?

25                        MR. KOMENSKY: Yes.

1 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman  
2 Lettieri?

3 MR. LETTIERI: Yes.

4 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Butler?

5 MR. BUTLER: Yes.

6 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Hoover?

7 MR. HOOVER: Yes.

8 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Rinaldi?

9 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Yes. There  
10 are no more items under new business, but we  
11 should add a motion because we're going to  
12 have to advertise for the vacant seat on  
13 council. So this is just going to be a  
14 motion to add to the agenda, so item number  
15 three. It's going to be a motion to add  
16 authorizing the borough manager to advertise  
17 for the vacant seat on council.

18 MR. KOMENSKY: I'm make that motion.

19 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: By Councilman  
20 Komensky.

21 MR. BUTLER: I'll second it.

22 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Seconded by  
23 Councilman Butler. On the question? Public  
24 input? Roll call, please.

25 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilwoman

1 McCawley?

2 MS. MCCAWLEY: Yes.

3 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman

4 Komensky?

5 MR. KOMENSKY: Yes.

6 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman

7 Lettieri?

8 MR. LETTIERI: Yes.

9 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Butler?

10 MR. BUTLER: Yes.

11 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Hoover?

12 MR. HOOVER: Yes.

13 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Rinaldi?

14 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Yes. So item  
15 four is going to be a motion to approve item  
16 three, which is authorizing the borough  
17 manager to advertise for the vacant seat on  
18 council.

19 MR. KOMENSKY: I'll make that  
20 motion.

21 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: By Councilman  
22 Komensky.

23 MR. BUTLER: I'll second it.

24 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Seconded by  
25 Councilman Butler. On the question? Public

1 input? Roll call, please.

2 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilwoman

3 McCawley?

4 MS. MCCAWLEY: Yes.

5 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman

6 Komensky?

7 MR. KOMENSKY: Yes.

8 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman

9 Lettieri?

10 MR. LETTIERI: Yes.

11 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Butler?

12 MR. BUTLER: Yes.

13 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Hoover?

14 MR. HOOVER: Yes.

15 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Rinaldi?

16 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Yes. At this

17 time if there's no business the chair will

18 go down the table and hear from the mayor

19 and the members.

20 ATTY. RINALDI: You need to tell her

21 what she's putting in the ad in 30 days.

22 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: The chair is

23 going to entertain a motion to amend item

24 four to be worded Old Forge Borough Council

25 is going to authorize the borough manager to

1 advertise to accept applications up until  
2 July 15th at 4 p.m. for the vacant seat on  
3 Old Forge Borough Council.

4 MR. KOMENSKY: I'll make that  
5 motion.

6 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Motion on the  
7 floor by Councilman Komensky.

8 MR. BUTLER: I'll second it.

9 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Seconded by  
10 Councilman Butler. On the question? Public  
11 input? Roll call, please.

12 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilwoman  
13 McCawley?

14 MS. MCCAWLEY: Yes.

15 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman  
16 Komensky?

17 MR. KOMENSKY: Yes.

18 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman  
19 Lettieri?

20 MR. LETTIERI: Yes.

21 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Butler?

22 MR. BUTLER: Yes.

23 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Hoover?

24 MR. HOOVER: Yes.

25 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman

1 Rinaldi?

2 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Yes. If the  
3 members have no more items for new business  
4 we'll go down the table and hear from our  
5 mayor and our council members. Mayor Legg,  
6 good evening.

7 MAYOR LEGG: I have two quick  
8 things. I also regret Jenna resigning.  
9 She's the kind of personal when she gets  
10 involved she really throws herself into it  
11 and I think it's a shame. I'm going to miss  
12 her.

13 The second thing I have real quick,  
14 Chief, I don't know how I missed it on my  
15 iPad, but Debbie Gladzik texted me and I  
16 went and called. They have a bear problem  
17 down in Connell's Patch. A bear and two  
18 cubs.

19 CHIEF DUBERNAS: I think the game  
20 commission was down on Oakwood.

21 MAYOR LEGG: The game commission  
22 didn't give them any satisfaction and he  
23 texted me and I talked to him on the phone.  
24 I told him I would call him back later or  
25 tomorrow. I guess the grandkids were there.

1 Bears are nasty. They came right up to the  
2 door.

3 CHIEF DUBERNAS: The game commission  
4 has a trap out on Oakwood. I'll call the  
5 game commission tomorrow. It kept trying to  
6 get in the pool. I want to say they put a  
7 trap there.

8 MAYOR LEGG: That's all.

9 MR. KOMENSKY: Again, I express  
10 concerns. I sure will miss Jenna. I'm  
11 sorry it's gone this way, unfortunately. I  
12 understand her point and I fully support  
13 her.

14 With that being said, there's a lot  
15 going on in the world today, and I think no  
16 matter what side of the aisle you are on all  
17 of the rhetoric has to be brought down, and  
18 even as far as workplace violence. We saw  
19 what happened in Dickson City over the  
20 weekend. These are unfortunate things.

21 I guess what I hope is that everyone  
22 starts to be nicer to their family, their  
23 friends, their neighbors. Maybe it's  
24 somebody you don't even like. Unfortunately  
25 in the world today I think some of that

1           stuff has to be brought down to a better  
2           level because it's totally getting out of  
3           hand. That's all.

4                   MR. LETTIERI: Bruce, thanks for  
5           coming in and explaining that. That's all.

6                   MR. BUTLER: I have nothing.

7                   MS. MCCAWLEY: I don't have anything  
8           but well said, Mike.

9                   MR. HOOVER: I'm good.

10                   MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: I have a few  
11           things. First of all, well said by  
12           Councilman Komensky. Just to add a few  
13           notes about Mrs. Shotwell.

14                   When we were notified by the borough  
15           manager that Mrs. Shotwell would be putting  
16           her resignation letter in I contacted her.  
17           I didn't get a hold of her. She was away or  
18           going away with her family members for a  
19           camping trip for the holiday weekend. I  
20           called and left a message. I wanted to talk  
21           to her. I know Jenna probably her entire  
22           life. I'm about ten years older than her  
23           but I know her family like we're all good  
24           friends with Jenna and all of her family.

25                   I asked her first if her family and

1 her were okay because the way I took the  
2 letter was that she was getting threatened  
3 and harassed and maybe she was in some type  
4 of danger. She said it wasn't that type of  
5 harassment and it wasn't that type of  
6 threatening. She said it was just day to  
7 day stuff like she said in her letter with  
8 the signs and text messages over the years.

9 I asked if there was anything that  
10 the borough could provide for her or if we  
11 could help her in any way. She said no, she  
12 just wanted to resign and move on with her  
13 family, move on with her husband and  
14 children and just go about her life.

15 I told her my advice for her would  
16 be to contact the authorities immediately.  
17 If you're getting threatened, anyone, you  
18 should contact the authorities immediately  
19 and seek the proper help that they would  
20 advise to have. She said she was going to  
21 consider doing that. I'm not sure if she  
22 has or not. That's her and her family's  
23 business.

24 I also asked her if I could share  
25 this conversation with the public at

1                   tonight's meeting, she said that I could.

2                   I asked her did you ever feel  
3 harassed or was anyone harassing you from  
4 the table, from council's standpoint or from  
5 the borough's standpoint or borough workers,  
6 council members, she said absolutely not.  
7 She said it all came from the public. I  
8 didn't ask her who after that. Like I said,  
9 it was none of my business. I was more  
10 concerned from the borough's standpoint, if  
11 she ever felt it from any of us or anyone in  
12 the building or any of the staff. She said  
13 absolutely not.

14                   I asked her if I could share that  
15 with the public as well this evening and she  
16 gave me permission to. So I just wanted to  
17 share that.

18                   A few other things about her, Jenna  
19 is a big community member. She's involved  
20 in a lot of organizations. We know she  
21 works at the school, we know she's involved  
22 in Snow Forge, she's involved with the  
23 little league. All three of her boys are  
24 involved in all types of sports throughout  
25 Old Forge. I know she donates her time and

1 helps out, like a lot of people do.

2 So I regret Jenna resigning. I feel  
3 Jenna, for an individual, whether man or  
4 woman, she's a strong willed person and it  
5 takes that to sit up here, and by her  
6 resigning I don't think she admitted any  
7 type of weakness or vulnerability. I just  
8 feel, as her letter stated, she felt it was  
9 best for her family. I still respect Jenna,  
10 I still have her in high regard. I just  
11 wish her and her family the best. I feel  
12 when I say those words I can say it from all  
13 of us. So I just wanted to add that to her  
14 and her family. Also, I told her that I'll  
15 be here and I'm sure the rest of us would be  
16 as well.

17 With that said, if no one has  
18 anything else we're going to break into a  
19 brief executive session.

20 The chair would entertain a motion  
21 to adjourn the meeting.

22 MR. KOMENSKY: So moved.

23 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Motion by  
24 Councilman Komensky. All in favor?

25 (Unanimous. Meeting adjourned.)
