1 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Good evening,  
2 ladies and gentlemen. I'd like to call the  
3 meeting to order with the Pledge of  
4 Allegiance. After the Pledge if we can  
5 remain standing for a moment of silence.

6 (The Pledge of Allegiance was  
7 recited.)

8 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: The moment of  
9 silence is going to be for two elected  
10 officials. Mayor Turquatto, who passed away  
11 last week and was laid to rest. He was  
12 mayor of our borough from 2001 2005.

13 The other elected official was Mr.  
14 Eugene Talerico. He was a school board  
15 member for our Old Forge School District for  
16 a total of 28 years. So a brief moment of  
17 silence for both of those gentlemen would be  
18 appreciated.

19 (A moment of silence was observed.)

20 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Thank you.  
21 Bill, roll call, please.

22 ATTY. RINALDI: Ms. Shotwell?

23 MS. SHOTWELL: Here.

24 ATTY. RINALDI: Mr. Komensky?

25 MR. KOMENSKY: Here.

1 ATTY. RINALDI: Mr. Notari?

2 MR. NOTARI: Present.

3 ATTY. RINALDI: Mr. Butler?

4 MR. BUTLER: Here.

5 ATTY. RINALDI: Ms. Avvisato is  
6 absent, Mr. Hoover is absent. Mr. Rinaldi?

7 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Here. Once  
8 again, ladies and gentlemen, welcome to the  
9 regular meeting of the Old Forge Borough.  
10 Tonight is Tuesday, May 21, 2024. The  
11 purpose of our meeting will be to go through  
12 a few housekeeping motions. We'll then go  
13 through some of our department heads, we'll  
14 see if they have any report or anything for  
15 the meeting. We'll go down the table, we'll  
16 hear from our solicitor and our council  
17 members before we adjourn.

18 There's a public sign-in sheet that  
19 the chief has. If anyone at the end of the  
20 meeting would like to address us please sign  
21 in. We'll give you a few minutes before our  
22 meeting ends.

23 With that said, we're going to move  
24 into our first housekeeping motion. That's  
25 going to be a motion to approve the minutes

1 of the prior meeting.

2 MR. NOTARI: I'll make that motion.

3 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: By Councilman  
4 Notari.

5 MR. BUTLER: I'll second it.

6 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Seconded by  
7 Councilman Butler. On the question? Public  
8 input? Roll call, please.

9 ATTY. RINALDI: Ms. Shotwell?

10 MS. SHOTWELL: Yes.

11 ATTY. RINALDI: Mr. Komensky?

12 MR. KOMENSKY: Yes.

13 ATTY. RINALDI: Mr. Notari?

14 MR. NOTARI: Yes.

15 ATTY. RINALDI: Mr. Butler?

16 MR. BUTLER: Yes.

17 ATTY. RINALDI: Mr. Rinaldi?

18 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Yes. Second  
19 item is going to be a motion to approve the  
20 treasurer's report. Please note this does  
21 not include the sewer account.

22 MR. NOTARI: I'll make that motion,  
23 Mr. Chairman.

24 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: By Councilman  
25 Notari.

1 MR. KOMENSKY: I'll second it.

2 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Seconded by  
3 Councilman Komensky. On the question?  
4 Public input? Roll call, please.

5 ATTY. RINALDI: Ms. Shotwell?

6 MS. SHOTWELL: Yes.

7 ATTY. RINALDI: Mr. Komensky?

8 MR. KOMENSKY: Yes.

9 ATTY. RINALDI: Mr. Notari

10 MR. NOTARI: Yes.

11 ATTY. RINALDI: Mr. Butler?

12 MR. BUTLER: Yes.

13 ATTY. RINALDI: Mr. Rinaldi?

14 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Yes. Third  
15 item is motion to approve invoices for  
16 payment. Please note once again this does  
17 not include the sewer account.

18 MR. NOTARI: I'll make that motion.

19 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Motion by  
20 Council Notari.

21 MS. SHOTWELL: I'll second.

22 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Seconded by  
23 Councilwoman Jones-Shotwell. On the  
24 question? Public input? Roll call, please.

25 ATTY. RINALDI: Ms. Shotwell?

1 MS. SHOTWELL: Yes.

2 ATTY. RINALDI: Mr. Komensky?

3 MR. KOMENSKY: Yes.

4 ATTY. RINALDI: Mr. Notari?

5 MR. NOTARI: Yes.

6 ATTY. RINALDI: Mr. Butler?

7 MR. BUTLER: Yes.

8 ATTY. RINALDI: Mr. Rinaldi?

9 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Yes. Fourth  
10 item is motion to approve treasurer report  
11 for the sewer department.

12 MR. BUTLER: I'll make that motion.

13 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: By Councilman  
14 Butler.

15 MR. NOTARI: Second.

16 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Seconded by  
17 Councilman Notari. On the question? Public  
18 input? Roll call, please.

19 ATTY. RINALDI: Ms. Shotwell?

20 MS. SHOTWELL: Yes.

21 ATTY. RINALDI: Mr. Komensky?

22 MR. KOMENSKY: Yes.

23 ATTY. RINALDI: Mr. Notari?

24 MR. NOTARI: Yes.

25 ATTY. RINALDI: Mr. Butler?

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MR. BUTLER: Yes.

ATTY. RINALDI: Mr. Rinaldi?

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Yes. Last item of housekeeping is going to be a motion to approve sewer department invoices for payment.

MR. NOTARI: I'll make that motion.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: By Councilman Notari.

MR. BUTLER: I'll second it.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Seconded by Councilman Butler. On the question? Public input? Roll call, please.

ATTY. RINALDI: Ms. Shotwell?

MS. SHOTWELL: Yes.

ATTY. RINALDI: Mr. Komensky?

MR. KOMENSKY: Yes.

ATTY. RINALDI: Mr. Notari?

MR. NOTARI: Yes.

ATTY. RINALDI: Mr. Butler?

MR. BUTLER: Yes.

ATTY. RINALDI: Mr. Rinaldi?

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Yes. We'll move into our first department head. Mr. Lenceski is absent. He is involved right

1 now in a championship game that he is  
2 coaching and his daughter is playing. Good  
3 luck to Mr. Lenceski and the team.

4 Our second department head would be  
5 our code enforcement/zoning officer, Mike  
6 Sokolowski. Michael, anything for the  
7 meeting?

8 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: No, I have nothing.

9 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anyone have  
10 any questions for Mike?

11 MR. NOTARI: No questions, but you  
12 might be receiving a call from the Tomasonis  
13 on Bridge Street. They're having a problem  
14 with UGI controlling some of the trees, I  
15 guess, overhanging and stuff.

16 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: They called me up  
17 last week, asked who owned the property.

18 MR. NOTARI: She's been calling UGI  
19 and dealing with them and not getting any  
20 satisfaction. Just a precursor.

21 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Any other  
22 questions for Mike? Thanks, Mike.

23 Engineer, Dave Lopatka, anything for  
24 the meeting?

25 MR. LOPATKA: Nothing for the

1 meeting.

2 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anybody have  
3 any questions for David?

4 MR. NOTARI: Do we have a plan yet  
5 on paving the roads?

6 MR. LOPATKA: Yes. Actually that  
7 will be out. I'll have the advertisement in  
8 probably next week. Everything is done.  
9 Advertised for bid in next week.

10 I also got -- I e-mailed it to  
11 Marylynn and Jim earlier today, the price  
12 for those pickleball courts. I think it  
13 was, like, \$23,000 to do them. Put in the  
14 posts, fix any cracks, paint it. I sent it  
15 to them. You guys take a look at it, let me  
16 know what you want to do with it. I know at  
17 that number it probably will have to be bid,  
18 unless there's something in there that can  
19 be removed.

20 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anything else?

21 MR. LOPATKA: No.

22 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anybody else  
23 have any questions for Dave? Thanks, Dave.

24 Police chief, Jason Dubernas,  
25 anything for the meeting?

1 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Just a couple.  
2 Civil Service gave a physical test and a  
3 written. The written is sent out to Chicago  
4 to have them graded. We had four  
5 applicants. We're down to three. One  
6 backed out.

7 Second, our rifles that were on  
8 order from eight and a half months ago  
9 finally came in and they're in service.  
10 They came in three days before we went to  
11 the range last week. So we were able to get  
12 them all together and get them in service.

13 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anything else?

14 CHIEF DUBERNAS: That's it. Once  
15 the test results come in oral interviews  
16 will start with the Civil Service Board.

17 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anybody have  
18 any questions for the chief?

19 MR. NOTARI: I don't know if it's  
20 your department or Lenceski or both. I know  
21 we're having a problem with vandalism again  
22 at Miles. I noticed the other day that  
23 there is no light near the entrance of the  
24 bathrooms, so I thought it looked kind of  
25 dark compared to the other parts of the

1 park. I was wondering if we put spotlights  
2 on the top of the fence pointing down at  
3 least to illuminate the area.

4 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: I'll take a look at  
5 it.

6 MR. NOTARI: Just a suggestion just  
7 to keep that lit better, maybe.

8 CHIEF DUBERNAS: My guys are doing  
9 park checks. They're actually doing  
10 bathroom checks now. I told my guys if they  
11 don't feel comfortable grab a parent and ask  
12 them to check. With them now checking the  
13 bathrooms every 15, 20 minutes --

14 MR. NOTARI: I thought it was odd  
15 it's so dark. Maybe it's easy to sneak in  
16 and sneak out. Thank you.

17 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Any other  
18 questions for the chief? Thanks, Chief.

19 Assistant fire chief, Bill Stull,  
20 anything for the meeting?

21 MR. STULL: Just that this upcoming  
22 Saturday is the fire department's 5K. It  
23 starts at 9:00 in the morning and will be  
24 running until about 10:30, 10:45. So  
25 everything is coordinated with Jay. I

1 talked to Joe from DPW. He's going to just  
2 check to make sure there's no potholes or  
3 anything like that. Miles Street will be  
4 blocked off for probably about two hours in  
5 front of the football stadium. I did talk  
6 to Pa. Bedding. They don't work on Saturday  
7 so that's fine. That's all.

8 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anyone have  
9 any questions for Bill? Thanks, Bill.

10 Attorney Rinaldi, anything for the  
11 meeting?

12 ATTY. RINALDI: Nothing other than  
13 what was already in my report, the  
14 litigation I think you're all familiar with.

15 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anybody have  
16 any questions for the solicitor? Thanks,  
17 Bill.

18 Our borough manager is absent  
19 tonight. It's her birthday this evening, so  
20 we gave her the night off. Happy birthday,  
21 Mare.

22 Before we go into new business we'll  
23 go to public comment. Anyone from the  
24 public like to speak?

25 MR. ZUKAUSKUS: I'm just wondering

1 is there an update on this Emlaw case, the  
2 fence guy? I'd be interested in that.

3 ATTY. RINALDI: Other than the  
4 pleadings are closed. I just sent a letter  
5 to his attorney. He's requesting an  
6 occupancy permit. I told him he can't get  
7 one until he completes his subdivision  
8 requirement. So we haven't gotten any  
9 plans.

10 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: Nothing yet.

11 ATTY. RINALDI: The last meeting I  
12 was at they came in and said they were going  
13 to modify the plans to do an addition.

14 MR. ZUKAUSKUS: So was he fined?  
15 After the court hearing wasn't the judge  
16 fining him a certain amount per day and this  
17 is adding up? Isn't there thousands of  
18 dollars involved right now?

19 ATTY. RINALDI: He appealed that.  
20 We filed --

21 MR. ZUKAUSKUS: So he appealed the  
22 thousands of dollars of fines, so that --

23 ATTY. RINALDI: He appealed that  
24 hearing, so he gets a new hearing. So it  
25 starts all over again. We're asking for

1 fines again from that time.

2 MR. ZUKAUSKUS: So we're back to  
3 square one?

4 ATTY. RINALDI: Yes.

5 MR. ZUKAUSKUS: And as far as the  
6 new hearing I'd have to contact the  
7 magistrate?

8 ATTY. RINALDI: No, that's down in  
9 county court.

10 MR. ZUKAUSKUS: It's in Scranton.  
11 So I call the courthouse in Scranton to ask  
12 when this guy is going to stand before --

13 ATTY. RINALDI: Well, you can but it  
14 hasn't been listed yet.

15 MR. ZUKAUSKUS: Okay. Another  
16 thing, first of all, I want to thank you for  
17 what you've done as far as the junk monkey  
18 on Main Street. There's a big improvement  
19 as far as Babylon is concerned. I'd want to  
20 thank you very much for that. What I'd like  
21 to bring up now is this bus stop, the bench.

22 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Mr. Zukauskus,  
23 the bus stop, we're not putting a building  
24 back. We talked about this.

25 MR. ZUKAUSKUS: Just a bench. This

1 is a gentleman there. He's sitting on the  
2 grass. There's no place to sit. There's  
3 another guy in the retirement home. Just a  
4 bench. I understand that's something that  
5 COLTS put there, but just so not to be  
6 sitting on the ground. If we're going to be  
7 spending \$13,000 on a clock that doesn't  
8 work.

9 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: We're not in  
10 control of that clock.

11 MR. NOTARI: Would you go to the  
12 podium, please.

13 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: I'm going to  
14 ask our solicitor, our zoning officer to  
15 look into the requirements in order for a  
16 bench to be placed.

17 MR. ZUKAUSKUS: Just a bench.

18 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: I'll have to  
19 look into that to see, number one, if it's  
20 legal for us to put one there, what the  
21 requirements are. I'll get back to you or  
22 if you come to a meeting or I can call you  
23 in a couple days.

24 MR. ZUKAUSKUS: Now, as far as I  
25 know you're dead set on this clock thing.

1 How far in the process has this progressed?  
2 Have you looked at different models? I  
3 really want to see what clock you're going  
4 to purchase for \$13,000.

5 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: We have no  
6 definite answer. We did a little research  
7 on different types, styles, shapes.  
8 Nothing's set in stone.

9 MR. ZUKAUSKUS: In the future we're  
10 actually going to make the purchase and  
11 decide on the clock. Maybe not this summer?  
12 Maybe the fall? Give me a timetable.

13 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Whenever  
14 council decides as a majority to move  
15 forward with it. I mean, if somebody  
16 brought up tonight to make a motion for it  
17 we'd pass it tonight. If they don't we'll  
18 discuss it further, and then once we come  
19 together --

20 MR. ZUKAUSKUS: Can I make the  
21 motion?

22 MR. NOTARI: No, you cannot.

23 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: You can't make  
24 a motion. Only elected officials can make a  
25 motion.

1 MR. ZUKAUSKUS: So I just like to  
2 keep informed about what's going on with the  
3 clock. Is there any other project going on?  
4 The landscaping is so beautiful. Fantastic.  
5 Do you have any other plans for what's going  
6 on there? You have the names on the  
7 veterans there, you got the artillery. Is  
8 it finished?

9 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Right now I  
10 don't see any construction or any plans.  
11 We're getting ready to remodel the senior  
12 center. Maybe some things might be done in  
13 front of there. As of right now just the  
14 normal upkeep.

15 MR. ZUKAUSKUS: I looks fantastic.  
16 Do our borough employees --

17 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Borough DPW  
18 department.

19 MR. ZUKAUSKUS: That's all I have.

20 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Have a good  
21 evening. Anyone else from the public like  
22 to address us before we go into new  
23 business?

24 MS. PICKARSKI: Just wondering, any  
25 update? Where do we go from here? How long

1 is it going to be? We're starting from the  
2 beginning now?

3 ATTY. RINALDI: That's the rules of  
4 court. I can't change those. He can appeal  
5 a magistrate decision to county court. If  
6 it rains and you get flooded take pictures  
7 and give me a call. I want to know about  
8 it. I can speed it up quicker. Just show  
9 me if you get flooded.

10 MS. SHOTWELL: Have you seen him  
11 there every day?

12 MS. PICKARSKI: He's not there in  
13 the day. He comes around 5:00, 5:30 a.m.  
14 and he's gone by around 7:15 a.m., then he  
15 comes back at night.

16 MS. SHOTWELL: Others working there?

17 MS. PICKARSKI: Yes, she's there  
18 every day.

19 MS. SHOTWELL: We're still fining  
20 him every day. Right?

21 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: Can I prove she's  
22 working there? I don't know. How do I --  
23 there's someone there.

24 ATTY. RINALDI: Knock on the door,  
25 see if it's open for business.

1 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: I see a car there.

2 MS. SHOTWELL: We should be citing  
3 him there every day.

4 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: It's not that he  
5 can't be in the building.

6 ATTY. RINALDI: He's operating the  
7 business. Just because he's there --

8 MS. SHOTWELL: He's the owner.

9 ATTY. RINALDI: Knock on the door.  
10 Somebody opens it they're operating.

11 MS. PICKARSKI: He must know about  
12 with the fines because he has not been  
13 there. He leaves by 7:15 a.m. and then he  
14 comes back at night and they load the  
15 trucks.

16 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Could we get a  
17 hold of him tomorrow and tell him that every  
18 day that somebody is in that building other  
19 than him he's going to be fined?

20 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: I have to go with  
21 Jay. He gets in my face.

22 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: That's fine.  
23 Take Jay. It's his property. He's allowed.

24 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: He told me don't  
25 ever come back on my property.

1 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Well, you're  
2 the zoning officer.

3 ATTY. RINALDI: You're the zoning  
4 officer.

5 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: You're allowed  
6 to be on the property. You're the zoning  
7 officer. Especially if you present your  
8 badge. If he's in violation that's part of  
9 your job description. You're empowered to  
10 do that. But if you feel more comfortable  
11 with the chief --

12 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: Last time I was  
13 there --

14 MS. SHOTWELL: Absolutely. He can't  
15 tell you you can't be there.

16 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Take the  
17 chief, notify him in person. If the chief  
18 wants to put on the body camera so we have  
19 it.

20 MR. SOKOLOWSKI: We already have  
21 footage of it.

22 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Every day that  
23 someone's on the property other than him  
24 he's going to be fined. Just so we have it  
25 on record. Then we can continue to fine him

1 every day.

2 MS. PICKARSKI: And you know when  
3 you go down there how would you want to live  
4 next door to that? You know.

5 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: We'll send him  
6 down. I don't feel we need to do that, but  
7 just to stress it to him so he does  
8 understand face to face, in person.

9 MS. PICKARSKI: Thank you.

10 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: You're  
11 welcome. Anyone else from the public before  
12 we move into new business?

13 We have two items under new  
14 business. Our first item is going to be a  
15 motion for a change order to Linde  
16 Corporation in the amount of \$1,649.56.  
17 This was for the project on Josephine  
18 Street. The sewer project.

19 MR. NOTARI: I'll make that motion.

20 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: By Councilman  
21 Notari.

22 MR. BUTLER: I'll second it.

23 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Seconded by  
24 Councilman Butler. On the question?

25 MR. NOTARI: On the question, Dave,

1 is this something that we should be  
2 concerned about?

3 MR. LOPATKA: The change order? No,  
4 the change order was when they excavated for  
5 the existing manhole they found a second  
6 lateral in just below the manhole. I think  
7 it's more for the labor to do that part.

8 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Was that the  
9 part we found with the tape? That's the one  
10 when they dug it up it was duct taped.

11 MR. LOPATKA: It was actually  
12 connected below the manhole, so we needed to  
13 tie it into the new manhole because that  
14 lower section was being abandoned. We don't  
15 want something still going into that  
16 abandoned section.

17 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anyone else on  
18 the question? Public input? Roll call,  
19 please.

20 ATTY. RINALDI: Ms. Shotwell?

21 MS. SHOTWELL: Yes.

22 ATTY. RINALDI: Mr. Komensky?

23 MR. KOMENSKY: Yes.

24 ATTY. RINALDI: Mr. Notari?

25 MR. NOTARI: Yes.

1 ATTY. RINALDI: Mr. Butler?

2 MR. BUTLER: Yes.

3 ATTY. RINALDI: Mr. Rinaldi?

4 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Yes. The  
5 second item under new business is going to  
6 be a motion to approve payment to Linde  
7 Corporation for the completed work, Dave?  
8 Correct?

9 MR. LOPATKA: Work to date. They're  
10 supposed to be paving either this Friday or  
11 next Monday.

12 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: The amount of  
13 \$32,629.56.

14 MR. BUTLER: I'll make that motion.

15 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: By Councilman  
16 Butler.

17 MR. NOTARI: Second.

18 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Seconded by  
19 Councilman Notari. On the question?

20 MR. NOTARI: Can we please notify  
21 Mrs. Finnerty we'll be paving?

22 MR. LOPATKA: I actually told Linde  
23 to let me know when the pavers were going to  
24 be there so I can call her. Either the end  
25 of this week or early next week.

1 MS. SHOTWELL: Make sure she has a  
2 day's notice.

3 MR. KOMENSKY: Is this the total  
4 amount we owe them?

5 MR. LOPATKA: No, it's the paving  
6 part.

7 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Just the work  
8 to date.

9 MR. LOPATKA: Just the work to date.

10 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anyone else on  
11 the question? Public input? Roll call,  
12 please.

13 ATTY. RINALDI: Ms. Shotwell?

14 MS. SHOTWELL: Yes.

15 ATTY. RINALDI: Mr. Komensky?

16 MR. KOMENSKY: Yes.

17 ATTY. RINALDI: Mr. Notari?

18 MR. NOTARI: Yes.

19 ATTY. RINALDI: Mr. Butler?

20 MR. BUTLER: Yes.

21 ATTY. RINALDI: Mr. Rinaldi?

22 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Yes. No more  
23 items under new business. We'll go down the  
24 table and see if any of the members have  
25 anything to add before we adjourn.

1 Councilwoman Jones-Shotwell?

2 MS. SHOTWELL: I don't have anything  
3 this evening.

4 MR. KOMENSKY: I don't have  
5 anything.

6 MR. NOTARI: Just everybody have a  
7 good, safe and happy Memorial Day weekend.  
8 Enjoy the sunshine while it's here.

9 MR. BUTLER: I'm good.

10 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: The only item

12 executive session with our solicitor.

14 entertain a motion to adjourn.
