

1 paving project this year, that we take a
2 look at Smith Street between Hoover and
3 Smull. It's the side of the Old Forge
4 cemetery right in front of Mr. Terruso's
5 house, Mr. Mancuso's house, Mr. Bellenzeni's
6 house, Mr. Cordino, Mr. DeLuca. That
7 section there is torn up pretty good.

8 MR. FERRETT: I plan on putting
9 under new business a program for paving.
10 You will get a slip, every councilman will
11 get a slip, and Smith Street is on the
12 agenda.

13 MR. NOTARI: Thank you very much.
14 Also, I believe we all received a letter
15 from the county regarding a municipal arts
16 grant. A \$500 grant that the county gives
17 out to every municipality. You just have to
18 apply for it. So if anybody has any ideas.
19 I have some ideas. I received the letter at
20 home, actually, maybe last week of January.
21 I'll forward it to you tomorrow from work
22 just so you see it. If anybody has any
23 ideas. Maybe use it for the summer program.

24 MS. BARTOLETTI: Is that the one I
25 used in the past?

1 MR. NOTARI: Yeah, the \$500 one. I
2 thought I'd bring it up. That's all.

3 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Rinaldi?

4 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Two items just
5 to update council. From the sewer
6 department committee, we met -- me, Chairman
7 Semenza, Councilman Notari -- and our
8 recommendation would be to take a look at
9 somebody to upgrade the computer system in
10 the sewer agency.

11 Then I met with Lucille on Friday.
12 I asked her to contact Chairman Semenza just
13 to get his input and see how he wanted to
14 take it, what direction. So he contacted
15 Ron D'Eliseo. He's going to meet us here
16 Tuesday at 10 a.m. for a sewer committee
17 meeting just to give us some information on
18 how we could upgrade the system, if he
19 could, and what he'll be doing to it, how he
20 could make it better for the department. So
21 that's from the sewer committee. After
22 Tuesday of this week I'll have more.

23 Also, from the long-range planning
24 committee, I'm going to wait until
25 Councilman Febbo gets back, and I'm going to

1 contact Councilman Brown to see if we can
2 set up a meeting. But I'll wait until
3 Councilman Febbo gets back. I think early
4 March.

5 MAYOR MULKERIN: Next week.

6 MR. SEMENZA: If I can just echo off
7 what Councilman Rinaldi said, Ron D'Eliseo
8 with Computer Visionaries, he does computer
9 work for the Lower Lackawanna Valley
10 Authority's computer system. So we thought
11 maybe we'd get him in to see if maybe we can
12 help out with Lucille making it more user
13 friendly or something. We don't know.

14 MR. FERRETT: The only thing I'd
15 like to say is under new business I'd like
16 to put a motion on the floor about a paving
17 program for the year 2017. So I'll wait
18 until new business comes in and I'll bring
19 that up and everything.

20 Hearing what the sewer committee has
21 to say and everything, I had the opportunity
22 of talking with Councilman Lenceski and
23 everything, and I'm just wondering whether
24 council might take it into consideration
25 that at one time in the past when the sewer

1 authority was first established and
2 everything, that there was a commission, the
3 way that's supposed to be brought up and
4 everything and I think, according to
5 Councilman Lenceski, it's in our code book.
6 Correct?

7 MR. LENCESKI: Yes. It's 70-1.

8 MR. FERRETT: I'm just wondering if
9 the sewer committee would like to look into
10 that and see what they think and how they
11 feel about the whole subject.

12 MR RUSSELL RINALDI: Joe, are you
13 talking about under the ordinance that it
14 states about a board of directors?

15 MR. FERRETT: Well, not a board of
16 directors. It's like an authority that
17 overlooks everything. They'll answer to
18 council. It's a good way and a good system
19 to have a check and balance on the whole
20 situation. Somebody's got to be accountable
21 for everything that's going on. All these
22 outstanding bills that should never have
23 been there.

24 MR. LENCESKI: 70-1: "Sewer
25 collection hearing board established

1 4/21/88. The purpose of the board, three
2 council members, is to hear" -- and this is
3 a second thing. This is the sewer
4 collection hearing board but I'll get to the
5 sewer commission after that.

6 "The purpose of the board, three
7 council members, is to hear requests from
8 these who are in arrears with payments of
9 their Old Forge Borough Sewer Agency bills
10 and to establish affordable payment plans
11 for people with special financial needs."
12 That's one thing that I don't think we've
13 done since 1988. You've been handling that.

14 ATTY. RINALDI: There was one at one
15 point because there was some payment plans
16 that were worked out. I remember when Donny
17 Vender was here there was a meeting, and I
18 think Tony Pero was on it. They set payment
19 plans up for people. So there used to be.
20 I think when they left nobody reappointed
21 them.

22 MR. NOTARI: Is that the sewer
23 committee?

24 ATTY. RINALDI: No.

25 MR. NOTARI: So that's a separate

1 three council members?

2 MR. LENCESKI: Yes.

3 ATTY. RINALDI: There was activity
4 maybe five, six years ago.

5 MR. LENCESKI: And the sewer
6 commission membership: "The Old Forge
7 Borough Sewer Commission shall consist of
8 seven members. Said members shall be
9 residents of the borough of Old Forge duly
10 appointed by the Old Forge Borough Council."

11 Duties and responsibilities, 73-5:
12 "It shall be the purpose of the commission
13 to monitor sanitary storm sewer
14 construction, determine problem sewer areas,
15 hear citizens' complaints regarding sewers,
16 make recommendations to borough council
17 concerning future development and expansion
18 of the existing sewer system, and advise the
19 borough council regarding collection of
20 sewer rentals."

21 MR. NOTARI: Would that be like a
22 planning commission or zoning board, same
23 type of --

24 ATTY. RINALDI: No. That's
25 something you guys enacted probably when

1 they were laying out the sewers.

2 MR. LENCESKI: 1986.

3 MS. YEAGER: There was supposed to
4 be a commission and council said no. They
5 wanted the sewer agency under the control of
6 council. Because I remember the ordinance,
7 and this was never done. I think it was
8 three councilmen and four other people. I
9 don't remember. But council wanted the
10 agency under council. That was the choice.
11 Commission or under council.

12 MR. LENCESKI: Seven members' terms
13 of office: "Each commission shall be
14 appointed for terms of five years. The
15 terms of office, however, shall be set so
16 initially there shall be two three-year
17 terms, two four-year terms, and three
18 five-year terms."

19 MR. FERRETT: I think it's in the
20 best interest there's a commission that's
21 actually involved because the
22 recommendations made for future development
23 in the town and everything can be made by
24 this commission. Council has to act on it
25 anyhow no matter how you look at it.

1 MS. YEAGER: Under council or a
2 commission, doesn't matter. That's
3 council's decision.

4 MR. NOTARI: The way I'm listening
5 to it you're going to be under council
6 because the commission is just going to make
7 recommendations.

8 MR. SEMENZA: That's all they are.

9 MR. NOTARI: It's not necessarily
10 something that council would have to accept.

11 MR. SEMENZA: I would almost think,
12 though -- I don't know so much by a lot of
13 the wording in it --

14 MR. LENCESKI: At least I think we
15 should discuss this and maybe work on it the
16 next work session, maybe bring it to a vote
17 in March. But at least it's something that
18 we should all know about, take into
19 consideration.

20 MR. SEMENZA: Can a copy of that
21 ordinance go in everybody's packet so they
22 can review it for next month?

23 MS. BARTOLETTI: Yes. If somebody
24 wants it sooner they can always come up and
25 get it. Anything else, Joe?

1 MR. FERRETT: No.

2 MR. LENCESKI: I don't have anything
3 tonight. I just want to tell the public
4 that the finance committee did meet on the
5 16th and we talked about the paving program,
6 the building, funding for the building,
7 Street Scape, the RCAP grant and the
8 Multi-Mobile grant. That's all I have.

9 MR. SEMENZA: Thanks. Myself,
10 Marylynn, I was contacted by an electrician,
11 actually, and had told me there is something
12 out there for LED lighting or lighting for,
13 like, the monument, for flagpoles, for any
14 kind of -- all the equipment and everything
15 is free. You just have to have somebody
16 install it. Do you know anything about
17 that?

18 MS. BARTOLETTI: No.

19 MR. SEMENZA: Can we look into it,
20 maybe?

21 MR. BIERYLA: We can probably get
22 that from the sales rep for All Phase. The
23 salesman is naturally going to see it before
24 the electrician gets it. Unless you tell
25 somebody at the counter you're not going to

1 know about it.

2 MAYOR MULKERIN: I'll send it to
3 you, Mare.

4 MR. SEMENZA: Bob will get you the
5 info. I don't have anything else, so at
6 this time I'm going to go to public comment.
7 Larry Enderline?

8 MR. ENDERLINE: Good evening. Larry
9 Enderline, 324 Milwaukee Avenue. I'm here
10 tonight representing the fire department,
11 Old Forge Hose & Engine, the ladder company.
12 On behalf of Chief Tag and Chief Stull, they
13 told me I could ask about the budget and
14 stuff. You already answered that. The last
15 check was coming.

16 MS. BARTOLETTI: Yes.

17 MR. ENDERLINE: The reason is we
18 really rely on that money. Mr. Notari, you
19 mentioned tonight about us having reports
20 and stuff like that. It's very expensive to
21 run a fire department.

22 MR. NOTARI: I understand that, and
23 I hope you realize it's very expensive to
24 run a borough as well.

25 MR. ENDERLINE: I do.

1 MR. NOTARI: I think it's not out of
2 our purview to ask for that report.

3 MR. ENDERLINE: We are part of the
4 borough. Correct?

5 MR. NOTARI: Understood.

6 MR. ENDERLINE: Like I tried to
7 stress, me and Mr. Semenza had a discussion
8 the other night and Mr. Brown, I spoke with
9 Mr. Febbo. We're here for you. I don't
10 know if you realize that.

11 MR. NOTARI: I very well realize
12 that, and I hope you realize that we're here
13 for the people of this borough.

14 MR. ENDERLINE: So are we.

15 MR. NOTARI: And we have to make
16 sure that that money is spent the right way.

17 MR. ENDERLINE: So are we.

18 MR. NOTARI: We're not questioning
19 anything -- I'm not questioning anything. I
20 would just like to see where that money is
21 spent.

22 MR. ENDERLINE: In the past --

23 MS. BARTOLETTI: That basically is
24 the only money that the borough spends that
25 we have no idea how it's actually spent. We

1 have no accountability for that money when
2 we're audited. It is in the borough code
3 that we are entitled to it.

4 MR. ENDERLINE: That's not a
5 problem.

6 MR. NOTARI: I'm not questioning --
7 I'm not even saying there's any kind of
8 improprieties. Just trying to keep us safe
9 as well.

10 MR. ENDERLINE: I understand. I
11 really do.

12 MR. SEMENZA: I believe this is not
13 the first time we're asking for it, either.
14 I believe we asked before.

15 MR. ENDERLINE: It's not difficult
16 to do that. I also -- in the past we've
17 said come over, come to meetings, after what
18 was going on last couple years. Come to
19 meetings, see what we do to see what kind of
20 money we have. We even said come on calls
21 with us. You're welcome.

22 MR. NOTARI: I'd like to do that,
23 actually. I've never been in that area of
24 the building.

25 MR. ENDERLINE: I asked Mr. Brown

1 several times if you're here, you see us
2 pulling out, jump on. We've been really
3 busy the last 14 hours. We're tired. We
4 went to Duryea, left Duryea, came here, went
5 over there.

6 MR. SEMENZA: Our hats are off to
7 you for that. Don't let just anybody on
8 your trucks. Only people that are covered
9 by insurance.

10 MR. ENDERLINE: Another thing was
11 with the parking over here. This has just
12 come up many times in the past and it's an
13 issue again. I spoke to you over the phone.
14 When we put this addition on Old Forge Hose
15 & Engine paid to have the monument moved
16 forward and we paid to have that pavement,
17 that parking lot put in so we'd have
18 somewhere to park when we're here and we
19 have a call. Then over the years we all
20 left -- a bunch of us left for issues, and
21 when we came back there was handicap parking
22 and borough business, which I understand, we
23 understand, but --

24 MR. SEMENZA: I read through the
25 whole lease. I don't see anything about the

1 parking lot.

2 MR. ENDERLINE: Well, yeah. I spoke
3 with our attorney. It was a poorly written
4 lease.

5 MR. SEMENZA: Very poor. I didn't
6 see a lot of things in the lease.

7 MR. ENDERLINE: Me being a realtor
8 and stuff and a landlord over the years
9 that's a very poorly written lease.

10 MR. FERRETT: When we get a new
11 building there will be plenty of parking.

12 MR. ENDERLINE: Earlier tonight you
13 mentioned about parking. Let's get that
14 done. Try to solve that problem, if we can.

15 MR. NOTARI: The problem is there's
16 not enough parking for your members when
17 there's a call?

18 MR. ENDERLINE: When there's a call
19 it's very difficult. Not all the time but
20 sometimes, and a lot of things been said and
21 we're going to be ticketed and this is going
22 to happen and we're going to be towed and
23 stuff.

24 MR. SEMENZA: If you're parking in a
25 handicap parking spot, first of all, that's

1 illegal there.

2 MR. ENDERLINE: I know that.

3 MR. SEMENZA: There's no exceptions.

4 MR. ENDERLINE: Well, like I said to
5 you on the phone you want us to spend an
6 extra 30 to 40 seconds, which maybe doesn't
7 seem like a lot of time to you, to go and
8 try to find somewhere to park down here or
9 across the street?

10 MR. SEMENZA: I understand what
11 you're saying, but I'm just saying --

12 MR. NOTARI: We don't make that law
13 either.

14 MR. SEMENZA: I didn't make the law.
15 I understand that.

16 MR. ENDERLINE: Plus keep in mind --
17 and this has also been brought up several
18 times. We have those two handicap spots
19 there, which are needed. Now we have
20 elderly people and whoever, whatever the
21 age, getting out of their car and walking
22 across the busted driveway that we're trying
23 to deal with how many years.

24 MR. SEMENZA: Well, the busted
25 driveway, if you look at your lease you're

1 responsible for all repairs.

2 MR. ENDERLINE: Well, a couple years
3 back, when I first came back, Donny Vender
4 was still on council, we brought it up, and
5 Donny Vender mentioned to me why don't you
6 go down where they're putting in a new beer
7 distributor. They're going to be pouring
8 concrete on Saturday. See if they'll help
9 you out.

10 So I went down there and spoke to
11 the foreman. They were going to give us all
12 the trucks we needed. I spoke to Ron
13 Gallagher. He was going to put it in labor
14 free. Then Larry Semenza found out about
15 it, who do I think I am, and put a stop to
16 it and it never got done. We were going to
17 have a free driveway put in.

18 MS. BARTOLETTI: I don't think that
19 was the case. I think the case was that
20 part of the problem now is the way the
21 drainage system was. It was just going to
22 be laid in again with no one making a design
23 or anything as far as how is that going to
24 not happen again. Right now there's that
25 opening. I don't know what you call that.

1 That they wouldn't have any kind of design.

2 MR. SEMENZA: How many years?

3 MR. ENDERLINE: When we were going
4 to have the concrete put in? When they were
5 being built down there, Verrastro. Seven or
6 eight years ago.

7 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Do you really
8 think that Larry Semenza, whether he was the
9 chief of police at the time or whether he
10 was a full time police officer and he was an
11 active member of the department, would not
12 want to get the driveway paved?

13 MR. ENDERLINE: It was me and him in
14 the driveway. He was screaming at me it's
15 not getting done.

16 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Really?

17 MR. ENDERLINE: Yeah, really. I had
18 everything set up.

19 MR. SEMENZA: Well, you should have
20 went to council with that because Larry
21 Semenza --

22 MR. ENDERLINE: Donny Vender told me
23 go do it.

24 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: I wasn't
25 there. I'm not calling you a lair. I'm not

1 saying he said it or didn't say it. I'm
2 just saying that's hard for me to believe,
3 and if he was here saying that about you, I
4 would say the same thing to him. It's hard
5 for me to believe that Larry Enderline would
6 not want to get the driveway paved,
7 especially if you're two active, dedicated,
8 devoted volunteer firemen. He's not
9 anymore. He was, and you currently are.
10 So, I mean, that's just me. I mean, that's
11 just my take on it.

12 MR. NOTARI: Larry, how many parking
13 spots are you looking for?

14 MR. ENDERLINE: Only, I mean --

15 MR. NOTARI: Obviously it's only
16 when there's a call. So how many? Ten?
17 Twelve?

18 MR. ENDERLINE: Between the two
19 departments we may get three guys on a call.
20 You may have --

21 MR. SEMENZA: How many guys today
22 were on the call?

23 MR. ENDERLINE: Between the two
24 departments, probably ten to 12 parking
25 spots.

1 MR. SEMENZA: How many guys were out
2 on the call today?

3 MR. ENDERLINE: Today we had eight.
4 The last company had eight and the engine
5 company only had two or three. It varies.

6 MR. SEMENZA: I'm sure it does for
7 the size of the fire and time of day.

8 MR. ENDERLINE: We were in Duryea.
9 If I wasn't in Duryea, myself and Mike, we
10 would have been already in Wilkes-Barre,
11 working. We wouldn't have been here. We
12 would have come up.

13 MS. BARTOLETTI: Are all the people
14 here members of your --

15 MR. ENDERLINE: Yeah, these are all
16 the ladder company. We still have several
17 more. We have about 12 active people. I
18 mean, is there anything we can do right now?
19 Obviously you don't want us parking in the
20 handicapped.

21 MR. SEMENZA: Larry, the problem is
22 7:00 at night, 8:00 at night, when people
23 are parking in the handicapped parking spot,
24 people are parking ten feet off the corner
25 of the thing. The line of sight on Main

1 Street you can't see. A young kid or older
2 person it's tough, especially when you have
3 a vehicle pulling out of them parking spots
4 with no regard to any traffic on the road.
5 I was the result of that two nights ago when
6 I almost got hit with my five-year-old son
7 in the car, and I was pretty upset about it.
8 You know. Me and you spoke about it.

9 But not once when I spoke with
10 you -- it was everybody against me. It was
11 not once I apologize. They were parked in
12 the parking spot illegally. They backed
13 out, almost hit me, didn't stop, took right
14 off. Not once did you say I apologize, Bob.
15 I'll talk to the person. And I know exactly
16 who it was and I know who was at the fire
17 department. I'm getting riled up here now
18 because when I had my five-year-old son in
19 the car and I almost got hit by a truck
20 backing out of that spot that was illegally
21 parked -- it shouldn't have happened.

22 MR. ENDERLINE: Well, he wasn't
23 illegally parked.

24 MR. SEMENZA: Oh, he wasn't?

25 MR. ENDERLINE: He wasn't in the

1 handicapped spot.

2 MR. SEMENZA: He wasn't? Okay,
3 because when I came back by he was.

4 UNKNOWN SPEAKER: The way you were
5 driving you shouldn't have a child in the
6 car.

7 MR. SEMENZA: The way I was driving?
8 Who are you? Don't you come in here and try
9 to tell me the way I drive. Were you there?
10 Did you see me driving?

11 UNKNOWN SPEAKER: Yes, sir.

12 MR. SEMENZA: You did? Okay, then
13 file a complaint with the police department
14 about how I drive because I wasn't driving
15 fast at all. The gentleman next to you
16 backed out into the road and almost hit me
17 with no regard to traffic or anybody in the
18 street.

19 Chief, you know it happens way too
20 often. Everybody parks in that parking
21 spot.

22 MR. ENDERLINE: They said you
23 carried on.

24 MR. SEMENZA: Carried on? No, I'm
25 carrying on now.

1 MR. ENDERLINE: I wish I was.

2 MR. SEMENZA: I wish you were, too,
3 Larry. I wish you were, too.

4 MR. ENDERLINE: I believe my guys.

5 MR. SEMENZA: Good. I'm glad you
6 believe your guys.

7 MR. ENDERLINE: I have four people
8 that told me the story on three different
9 occasions and they told me the same story.
10 Okay?

11 MR. SEMENZA: Good.

12 MR. ENDERLINE: I went through all
13 this when I was up the DA's office with all
14 the other stuff going on here about how
15 people determine when they're telling the
16 correct story and when you're not. Okay?

17 MR. SEMENZA: That's fine. You
18 believe who you want to believe.

19 MR. ENDERLINE: And then what else
20 did you say? You said we're scum bags --

21 MR. SEMENZA: No, I did not, Larry.
22 You were not there.

23 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: We're suppose
24 to believe you, what Larry Semenza said to
25 you alone. Now you're asking us not to

1 believe him. Again --

2 MR. ENDERLINE: I didn't say that.

3 MR. SEMENZA: You were not there,
4 you don't know what was said.

5 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: You said you
6 believe your guys. I'm not saying your guys
7 are lying or not. I wasn't there.

8 CHIEF DUBERNAS: It's a handicap
9 pot. Don't park there.

10 MR. ENDERLINE: None of our guys
11 will park in that handicap spot anymore.

12 CHIEF DUBERNAS: No offense to you,
13 these guys here, I never see them parked in
14 it. It's always your red Dodge that's
15 parked in it.

16 MR. SEMENZA: Thank you, Chief.

17 CHIEF DUBERNAS: So don't go
18 pointing fingers, saying it's your other
19 firefighters. It's not. It's your red
20 Dodge. On Saturdays, Sundays, nights,
21 mornings it's always your red Dodge or
22 Mr. Coles' van. So don't go pointing
23 fingers at any of your firemen. You want to
24 start something? It's your red Dodge.
25 Point the finger at yourself. It's going to

1 get towed if it's parked there. It's a
2 legitimate handicap sign. The truck's
3 getting towed. You'll pay Schuback's or Old
4 Forge Gulf. Whatever it is, the day of the
5 week, your truck's getting towed out of
6 there. It's not Bertowsky, it's not
7 Piasecki, it's not Halfpenny. It's your red
8 Dodge pickup. It's simple. Don't park
9 there. I don't know what to tell you.

10 MR. ENDERLINE: I won't.

11 CHIEF DUBERNAS: It's that simple.
12 Do not park in a legitimate handicap spot
13 because, guess what, if you had a business,
14 if you had a handicap spot and somebody else
15 was parked there you'd be complaining to us
16 just like we're complaining to you.

17 Keep your members out of the parking
18 spot. Never mind your members, keep
19 yourself out of the parking spot. It's that
20 simple. Keep it out or it's getting towed
21 at your cost. I'm done with the baby games
22 of who said Bobby Semenza said this or Larry
23 Enderline did this. It's your
24 responsibility to keep your own truck out of
25 there.

1 MR. ENDERLINE: I didn't want to
2 bring that up tonight. I thought we dealt
3 with that, you and I, over the phone. Okay.
4 There's no parking in the handicap. It is
5 what it is. We park wherever.

6 MR. NOTARI: How many spots do we
7 have behind the building?

8 MAYOR MULKERIN: There's not too
9 many.

10 MR. NOTARI: Eight? What about
11 during non-working hours?

12 MR. ENDERLINE: Are there hours we
13 park in the handicap --

14 CHIEF DUBERNAS: No.

15 MR. NOTARI: You can't park in a
16 handicap spot. That's not our law, that's
17 the state law. That's a state law.

18 MR. ENDERLINE: Mr. Semenza, when
19 you and I were on the phone the other day,
20 after our conversation didn't you say to me
21 if there's a fire --

22 MR. SEMENZA: No, I said -- you said
23 if there's a structure these are your words.
24 If there's a structure fire I'll park
25 wherever I need to, and I said I understand

1 that sometimes you did that and sometimes it
2 happened but it's still not right.

3 MR. ENDERLINE: I know it's not
4 right. I'm not arguing that.

5 MR. SEMENZA: I just said I
6 understood. I didn't say that you can park
7 there. That's not my call, Larry. That's
8 not my call. I'm just insulted that the way
9 that it went down.

10 MR. ENDERLINE: In the past we were
11 told by other council members that aren't
12 here now -- Donny Vender was one of them --

13 MR. SEMENZA: Listen --

14 MR. ENDERLINE: I'm just saying.

15 MR. SEMENZA: Larry, it doesn't
16 matter who told you. Jason Dubernas can
17 tell you to park in that parking spot.
18 Guess what? It's still illegal. The state
19 police can drive by and give you a fine for
20 parking in that spot. You can't park in
21 that spot. Any other cop in the department
22 can give you a fine for parking in that
23 spot.

24 One other thing, Marylynn. Since
25 the renovations for the borough building are

1 going to be done soon, I'd like you to write
2 a letter to -- I don't know if it's your
3 department or the other department, about
4 the garage downstairs. The equipment and
5 everything they have down there that we need
6 removed as soon as they could. Thank you.
7 Anything else?

8 MR. ENDERLINE: Nope, I guess not.
9 Well, yeah, I guess, yeah, if I can stay
10 here. This is what I mean when I make
11 comments to several people that it seems
12 like we have -- I feel as though we have no
13 support from you people. Now, you just
14 threw us out of that basement --

15 MR. SEMENZA: We're doing a whole
16 renovation to the basement. The police
17 department is going down there. We have the
18 design and everything. Our engineer has a
19 full design of the whole basement. I'm just
20 saying that off the top of my head because
21 you guys were here. I'm not saying get your
22 stuff out now, but in due time it's going to
23 have to be moved. The police department is
24 going to be the whole basement. I mean, I
25 just thought about it. I figured let's get

1 a formal letter out to so you have it and
2 you know so it can be removed when you find
3 a place for it. I don't know if that stuff
4 can go upstairs.

5 MR. ENDERLINE: As far as me parking
6 there, I park there a lot because people in
7 the past have said as long as there's no
8 business hours here we can.

9 MR. SEMENZA: Right, but you know
10 what, a handicap parking spot isn't just for
11 this building. They can get out there and
12 walk to Ray's Supermarket.

13 MR. ENDERLINE: I have people
14 telling me it's okay to park there.

15 MR. SEMENZA: It's not for an Old
16 Forge Borough Building, it's a handicap
17 spot. They can get out and walk up the
18 street, walk to Ray's, go sit in Burger King
19 for 20 minutes. It doesn't mean you have to
20 be in the borough building. They can go in
21 the manor for the afternoon.

22 MR. ENDERLINE: Okay. That's just
23 not for the borough building?

24 MR. SEMENZA: No. No handicap spot
25 is designated for anything. Correct?

1 MS. BARTOLETTI: When we put
2 handicap signs at a person's property, they
3 have a doctor's note that they need a
4 handicap spot -- say, for example, at my
5 house. If somebody is visiting my neighbor
6 and they're handicapped they can park in
7 that spot. It's not specifically mine.
8 It's for anyone who is handicapped.

9 MR. ENDERLINE: Okay. People
10 screaming, I didn't want that.

11 MR. SEMENZA: Anything else?

12 MR. ENDERLINE: No, I guess not.

13 MR. SEMENZA: Thanks, Larry.

14 MR. MENDOLA: My name is Matthew
15 Mendola. I'm a professional land surveyor
16 from Mendola & Associates. We're here
17 tonight representing Carol Dombrosky. Back
18 in April of 2015 we had a minor subdivision
19 plan that was approved for a Dave
20 Bochnovich, which is Carol Dombrosky's
21 bother. At the time we had power of
22 attorney. His wife signed the plans for
23 him.

24 From 2015 to now there's been a
25 conveyance of land from Bochnovich to his

1 sister, now Carol Dombrosky. We never
2 recorded back in 2015. Now we changed the
3 actual ownership from Dave Bochnovich to
4 Carol Dombrosky. We just updated the map.

5 We're asking for approval of that
6 tonight. We received approval from the
7 planning commission earlier this month.
8 That's basically what we're requesting.

9 MR. SEMENZA: Anybody have any
10 questions?

11 MR. NOTARI: What's the address on
12 this property?

13 MR. MENDOLA: Milwaukee Avenue and
14 Bennett Street, on the corner.

15 MR. SEMENZA: Can we take a look at
16 the prints? Any questions of Matthew
17 Mendola? Thanks, Matt.

18 At this time the chair would
19 entertain a motion for a minor subdivision
20 for Carol Dombrosky.

21 MR. NOTARI: I'll make that motion.

22 MR. SEMENZA: Motion by Councilman
23 Notari.

24 MR. LENCESKI: I'll second it.

25 MR. SEMENZA: Seconded by Councilman

1 Lenceski. On the question? Public input?

2 Roll call, please.

3 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Brown?

4 MR. BROWN: Yes.

5 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Notari?

6 MR. NOTARI: Yes.

7 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Ferrett?

8 MR. FERRETT: Yes.

9 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Rinaldi?

10 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Yes.

11 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman

12 Lenceski?

13 MR. LENCESKI: Yes.

14 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Semenza?

15 MR. SEMENZA: Yes. At this time the
16 chair would entertain a motion to approve
17 Varsity Garden Center for a transient
18 license.

19 MR. LENCESKI: I'll make that
20 motion.

21 MR. SEMENZA: Motion by Councilman
22 Lenceski.

23 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: I'll second
24 it.

25 MR. SEMENZA: Seconded by Councilman

1 Rinaldi. On the question? Public input?

2 Roll call, please.

3 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Brown?

4 MR. BROWN: Yes.

5 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Notari?

6 MR. NOTARI: Yes.

7 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Ferrett?

8 MR. FERRETT: Yes.

9 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Rinaldi?

10 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Yes.

11 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman
12 Lenceski?

13 MR. LENCESKI: Yes.

14 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Semenza?

15 MR. SEMENZA: Yes. At this time the
16 chair would entertain a motion to accept the
17 proposal for the DPW contract. How would I
18 state it?

19 ATTY. RINALDI: Just approve the
20 tentative agreement pending the final
21 agreement. It has to be written up.

22 MR. SEMENZA: Approve the tentative
23 agreement for the DPW contract.

24 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: I'll make that
25 motion.

1 MR. SEMENZA: By Councilman Rinaldi.
2 Can I have a second?

3 MR. LENCESKI: I'll second that.

4 MR. SEMENZA: Seconded by Councilman
5 Lenceski. On the question?

6 MR. NOTARI: Will we have to approve
7 this again once it's finalized?

8 ATTY. RINALDI: Yes.

9 MR. SEMENZA: Public input? Roll
10 call, please.

11 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Brown?

12 MR. BROWN: Yes.

13 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Notari?

14 MR. NOTARI: Yes.

15 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Ferrett?

16 MR. FERRETT: Yes.

17 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Rinaldi?

18 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Yes.

19 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman

20 Lenceski?

21 MR. LENCESKI: Yes.

22 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Semenza?

23 MR. SEMENZA: Yes. At this time the
24 chair would entertain a motion to adjourn.

25 MR. FERRETT: Before you adjourn I'd

1 like to put a motion.

2 MR. SEMENZA: At this time the chair
3 would entertain a motion. Councilman
4 Ferrett would like to have 2017 paving
5 project program --

6 MR. FERRETT: Yes. I'd like to put
7 a motion on the floor to have a paving
8 program for the year 2017 in the vicinity of
9 \$500,000 to \$600,000.

10 MR. SEMENZA: Motion by Councilman
11 Ferrett.

12 MR. LENCESKI: I'll second that
13 motion.

14 MR. SEMENZA: Seconded by Councilman
15 Lenceski. On the question?

16 MR. NOTARI: Are the monies
17 available for this project?

18 MS. BARTOLETTI: Not a penny over
19 \$600,000.

20 MR. SEMENZA: The finance committee
21 did speak about this, and like Marylynn
22 said, it's just about right to the dollar
23 amount.

24 Joe, let me ask you a question.
25 These streets, how did we come to determine

1 what streets were in worse shape in Old
2 Forge?

3 MR. FERRETT: By going around and
4 looking at them and making a determination.
5 Make sure that everything isn't done just in
6 one area.

7 Secondly, I don't possibly think
8 that we're going to get all those streets,
9 but in the event that money is there that
10 some of those streets would be done. Other
11 than that, if the engineer tells us that we
12 don't have -- that we overshot the thing,
13 that the paving committee will have to get
14 back together and make its decision just
15 where they want to go.

16 MR. SEMENZA: Okay. Public input?
17 Roll call, please.

18 MR. NOTARI: Wait. I mean, I
19 probably would like more time to go out and
20 look at it, but like just off the top of my
21 head I'm looking at Vine Street, Church
22 Street, Maple Street, which I'm sure they
23 all need to be paved, but Church Street from
24 Oak Street to Maple I think is really in bad
25 shape. Is it not?

1 MR. PAPI: It was just done.
2 MR. SEMENZA: Roll call, please.
3 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Brown?
4 MR. BROWN: Yes.
5 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Notari?
6 MR. NOTARI: Yes.
7 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Ferrett?
8 MR. FERRETT: Yes.
9 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Rinaldi?
10 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Yes.
11 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman
12 Lenceski?
13 MR. LENCESKI: Yes.
14 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Semenza?
15 MR. SEMENZA: Yes. At this time the
16 chair would entertain a motion to adjourn.
17 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: I'll make it.
18 MR. SEMENZA: Motion by Councilman
19 Rinaldi. All in favor?
20 (Unanimous. Meeting adjourned.)
