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MR. SEMENZA: Good evening, ladies and gentlemen. I'd like to start the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance.

(The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.)

MR. SEMENZA: Once again, ladies and gentlemen, welcome to the Old Forge Borough Council meeting of February 7, 2017. The purpose of tonight's meeting is to set the agenda for the February 21st meeting. We'll hear from our department heads, see if they have anything for the agenda. We'll go down the table and talk to council, see if they have anything to talk about.

There's a public sign-in sheet if anyone would like to address council. Paul Papi?

MR. PAPI: I don't have anything,
Bob. Everything's running smooth.

MR. SEMENZA: Anybody have any questions for Paul? Thanks, Paul. Steve Bieryla?

MR. BIERYLA: The only thing on the agenda are Bob Mendola for Carol Dombroski's subdivision and council to approve again the

transient license for Varsity Garden Center.

The other thing I wanted to mention to council, at the planning meeting -- and Bill can go a little further into detail.

But planning gave -- at the June 1st meeting -- all of the items on the list were to be completed by June 1st for Rosemount and the Mountain Road development.

MR. SEMENZA: Anybody have any questions for Steve? Thanks, Steve. I don't see anybody else here. Bill, solicitor's report?

ATTY. RINALDI: Myself, Marylynn and Dave managed to get in our RCAP application.

A copy was sent to Marylynn for the project.

It was approximately \$2,088,000?

MS. BARTOLETTI: About \$2.7 million.

ATTY. RINALDI: For the street scape project. So we got it filed under the deadline. So we're waiting to hear.

Also, another fund that's opening up -- and the deadline is three months away. I sent that link to Marylynn. Instead of a 50 percent match, the borough only has to come up with 30 percent match that we might

want to look into as well.

I actually did talk to the state senator, told him you were filing one.

Touch base with Representative Kavulich, let him know you filed it. I'm sure that they get copies of it. This part of the application includes who your district representatives and senators are. So that is in and pending.

MR. SEMENZA: What grant is that?

ATTY. RINALDI: The RCAP for the street scape project. That's a 50/50 match. We asked for \$1,010,000 and we will match the rest.

The second item is the Chelland hearing is going to be 6:30 on the 21st. I did send certified letters out to the Chellands, which came back, but Steve did hand deliver one to her so she's aware of it. I also sent to two of the banks that have mortgages on the property to give them notice of it as well, which would have been Peoples Security Bank and M&T Bank. M&T came back. They moved so I sent a new one out, which I haven't gotten a green card

back on that one yet.

MR. SEMENZA: I believe everybody had a copy of that in their mailbox.

ATTY. RINALDI: The RFP, one came back. I believe we looked at it and I think it was missing some documents. So we can talk about that later.

I believe we found the LLVSA tapes.

Did we get the right ones? Those three
tapes.

MR. PAPI: I gave them to our engineer, the ones we had taken. I gave them to Dave.

ATTY. RINALDI: So those are the ones that you took, not the ones that LLVSA took?

MR. PAPI: Right. We never found anything from LLVSA.

ATTY, RINALDI: Okay.

MR. SEMENZA: Paul, who did you speak with at LLVSA?

MR. PAPI: Frankie. He said he can't remember who he gave them to. He can only remember he brought them to the borough but he doesn't know who he gave them to.

Lucille's office, the front office.

MR. SEMENZA: Lucille has no --

MR. PAPI: She has no recollection of it.

MR. SEMENZA: They don't have copies of anything?

MR. PAPI: Not that I'm aware of.

ATTY. RINALDI: You're sure -- well,
he's going to look at them.

MR. PAPI: The three that we had were the ones that Mike Ford took the day that we were called down there because they ground up the manhole and everything went in the sewer. The very next day he started cameraing everything just to make sure he got everything out before they paved the street, and while he was doing that we were stopped. Otherwise, we would have done everything.

MR. FERRETT: That is the proper thing to do, really.

ATTY. RINALDI: Maybe Lucille has them buried somewhere.

MR. SEMENZA: Paul, weren't we watching them on your computer in your

office one day?

MR. PAPI: Yeah, the ones that we took. Mike Ford took them. Villa Drive, Stone Hill Drive. That's what he had on there.

ATTY. RINALDI: That's it. That's all I have. Hutchinson, the check went out. That case isn't settled. We got a release back from them. Marylynn's got the original and a copy to the sewer authority. I have a copy. I believe that's it. That's all I have.

MR. SEMENZA: Anybody have any questions for Bill?

MR. RINALDI: Bill, what time was the hearing on the 21st?

MR. SEMENZA: 6:30.

ATTY. RINALDI: 6:30, here.

MR. SEMENZA: Anyone else? Thanks,

Bill. Marylynn, borough manager's report?

MS. BARTOLETTI: Well, what I just wanted to mention is to let you guys know this week and last week I was at the courthouse for the civil trial that the borough was involved in, and I think

everybody knows, but for those who don't

I'll read to you what it's going to say in
the paper tomorrow. It says a federal jury
cleared Old Forge Borough, the fire company
and two former police officers of all
liability in a civil lawsuit filed by a
woman who alleged she was sexually abused as
a teenager. So it says the verdict, which
came following six days of testimony,
completely vindicated the borough. So
obviously something very, very good for the
borough finally.

MR. SEMENZA: Good day in Old Forge today.

MS. BARTOLETTI: Absolutely.

Besides that, I haven't been here for a while. There's a lot to catch up with the meeting in two weeks. There's just a lot of stuff.

I do need to get together with the finance committee. Maybe after this meeting we can just -- I didn't bring my calendar in. Other than that, we'll be having a personnel committee meeting to go over contracts that we discussed, get everybody

back to normal.

MR. SEMENZA: Anybody have any questions for Marylynn? Thanks, Mare. At this time I'll go down the table, see if any council members have anything to report.

MR. BROWN: Just that I'd touch base with Mr. Semenza about rescheduling the public safety meeting and the borough secretary can send out a phone call.

Whenever you're good I think we can set it up. I know Jason has some dates that he's not available but we can set that up in the near future. This will be our last public safety meeting. That's it.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: No items.

MR. FERRETT: Nothing.

MR. LENCESKI: Nothing tonight.

MR. SEMENZA: Myself, one thing. I received an e-mail from our engineer. We spoke about the storm water up on Powell last week, and I just printed them off recently. I'll send them down the table, everybody take a look at them. Maybe at our next meeting we can discuss them. I'll actually forward them to everybody's e-mail

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so they can have them and see what they think. There's two different ways here.

That's about all I have.

At this point I'll go to public comment. Anybody signed in?

ATTY. RINALDI: One thing. I'm going to ask Marylynn to make copies of the It was the only proposal received for BIU. the enforcement of the Neighborhood Preservation, Nuisance Abatement and Property Rental ordinance. In looking through it, it looks like it's missing some Maybe I'll contact them and of the indexes. ask them if they can look over what they submitted and give us the missing pages because the most important exhibit is the fee schedule, which is referenced as -- I don't know if that's 1 or I. I had not seen it in here.

So everybody will be able to take a look at it and we can talk about -- there is an attachment. The fees are in here.

Everybody will be able to look at it for the next meeting.

MR. SEMENZA: One other thing I'd

like to talk about before I go into public comment. Mr. Aulisio is here in reference to the Oak Street property, Sambo's.

Mr. Aulisio, what I can tell you is that --well, you know that Mr. Bieryla went over the property with the structural engineer from Reuther-Bowen. He does have a report

written up. He will have a report written

up for our February 21st meeting.

Mr. Aulisio has written a little letter here, and I'll pass it down the table for all council to see.

But the borough has not made any decision on anything with the property there. I don't know if you heard any rumors that we had, but it was just a discussion that was talked about and we asked our engineer to go check the building to be safe and structurally sound.

GEORGE AULISIO: And we complied with it. We boarded it up and it was covered with a metal thing. All we need is some time. Of course, the winter months are here and we can't do much.

MR. SEMENZA: Like I said, when he

gives the report to council, council will then make their -- he'll give his interpretation of what his feelings are on the building, basically. Like I said, we should have it for our next meeting, February 21st.

MR. BIERYLA: We should. I have to contact Dave and see when he gives it to him. I can't see no reason why we shouldn't.

MR. SEMENZA: We'll probably have it for our next meeting. So if you have any concerns on it and you want to come to the next meeting. As of right now we really don't know what -- I don't have any professional opinion on the property. But I do appreciate you coming in and showing concern.

PAT AULISIO: We wanted you to know we were concerned with the problem. We didn't want you to think we were blowing youse off.

MR. SEMENZA: Right. Thank you. Public comment. Joe Russick?

MR. RUSSICK: Joe Russick, 642 Clark

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the Lackawanna River here in Old Forge?

Down the river bank and so on. Insofar as long range planning is concerned, we have a gem down there and we don't utilize it.

Some of the people that live along the edge do. They have decks out there and so on.

That's pretty neat. If you ever get a chance take a walk there.

Now, there's land for sale I see back in there where they were going to build that development at one time, and I know Bernie McGurl from the Lackawanna River Corridor was involved. There was some work done. There was some type of earth moving and so on. I guess the trail is going to come down through there.

My point is this, the river is beautiful. There's areas down there that are not so pretty along the river, and that has a reflection on us. What we should do is take a look at that river and utilize it. That land is there. Take a look at it. We can put a little park in there or something. People fish down there.

MR. SEMENZA: I fish it all summer

long.

MR. RUSSICK: Good friend of mine who is a naturalist, he sees a lot of foul -- eagles, osprey, the whole bit.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: He's a truck driver?

MR. RUSSICK: Yes. But he lives on the hill. But we have a gem down there and we're not utilizing it the way it should be. So take a look at it and somewhere down the pike -- I know there's a lot or irons in the fire.

MR. SEMENZA: I believe we have Project 70 land that bumps right to it also.

MR. RUSSICK: Years ago, five, six years ago, I was involved with the scouting here in Old Forge. There was a group that came in from Wilkes-Barre, naturalists, and they went through the river bank and showing the aquatic life coming back, the bugs and so on, which is a good sign, until you get down at the bore hole down there. But anything fishing wise above Lehigh is probably okay.

MR. SEMENZA: Great fishing.

MR. RUSSICK: In saying that, just keep it in mind. If you haven't ever walked down in that area take a look. I would venture to say if somebody blindfolded you and took you down there you wouldn't know where you were at.

MR. FERRETT: What happened with that situation that Bernie McGurl was involved in with that land?

MR. RUSSICK: There was money spent,
I know. Joe Giambra. I don't know what
happened.

MS. BARTOLETTI: John Giambra.

MR. BIERYLA: I was contacted by
Mr. Giambra about two weeks ago. He's
looking into possibly some new investors to
go back and start that project, but he won't
know for a couple months. He said he'd get
back to me. I do believe he sent the plans
to our borough engineer, Dave, to review.

MR. RUSSICK: Again, just keep that in mind. Maybe we can clean it up a little bit and utilize it. Thank you.

MR. SEMENZA: At this time the chair would entertain a motion to adjourn the
