MR. CIUCCIO: I think he addressed that today. I think he sent a letter this afternoon.

ATTY. RINALDI: He didn't address everything. Are you coming in to the meeting Thursday?

MR. CIUCCIO: I don't know anything about it.

ATTY. RINALDI: The quicker you get in there and they final approve that road the quicker you get paid and we can get it. That's my recommendation.

MR. CIUCCIO: Okay, but this work that's done, that's approve, I'd like to get paid. That was -- you're not paying it?

ATTY. RINALDI: We're going to pay it when we get the roads. That's the recommendation.

MR. CIUCCIO: I thought our agreement was when the work was done I'd submit the paid invoice and you reimburse me. That's changing?

ATTY. RINALDI: No. Actually, there was no agreement on payment. Council's been nice enough to pay you as you go rather than

approve payment for what the engineer says a payment should be approved for. I'm going off of what the engineer said.

MR. FEBBO: What's in our stipulation?

ATTY. RINALDI: The engineer's saying the work was completed.

MR. LOPATKA: That's all I'm saying.

I can't vote for you guys.

ATTY. RINALDI: I think you want to own the roads before you make the last payment.

MR. CIUCCIO: There's more invoices coming, though.

ATTY. RINALDI: Is there any money owed to American Asphalt besides this last retainage?

MR. LOPATKA: No.

ATTY. RINALDI: So that's the ten

percent retainage on the whole American

Asphalt contract. Once we get the roads for

Villa you get that retainage. Once you deed

that over to the borough.

MR. CIUCCIO: We sent you the deeds.

ATTY. RINALDI: We can't take --

Lou, I've been through this with your engineer for four years. We can't accept those roads until we accept Mountain Road.

MR. CIUCCIO: Well, I'm not here for you to accept the roads. I'm here for payment.

ATTY. RINALDI: I sent Pat a letter. Have him call me, I can explain it to him. I know Dave's been reviewing what was sent and it's incomplete and we're trying to figure out what you're giving us so we can take it.

MR. CIUCCIO: Well, maybe I shouldn't have paid American Asphalt. He suggested I pay them.

ATTY. RINALDI: That's up to you. You have the contract with them, not us. We're just splitting the costs once the project is complete.

MR. CIUCCIO: We kind of worked on it together. It's not me. Dave worked closely with American Asphalt.

ATTY. RINALDI: I agree.

MR. CIUCCIO: The work is done. I should be paid.

ATTY. RINALDI: If the borough wants to pay you without accepting the roads, that's up to them. Address them. My recommendation is get the deeds and make the final payment. It's ten percent of the contract. You've been paid 90 percent of the contract price. I'm talking about Villa's roads. There's two sets of roads there. There's the American Asphalt contract, which you've been paid 90 percent of. Ten percent the borough owes you, and they'd like to get the deed for the roads.

TSE, you've been paid all but the ten percent retainage on that. Correct?

MR. CIUCCIO: No.

ATTY. RINALDI: Well, 33, I think, is about the last payment on it. Right?

MR. LOPATKA: Overall, yes.

ATTY. RINALDI: Once we get Mountain Road you'll get that check. The ball's kind of in your court to get to the borough the deeds so we can --

MR. CIUCCIO: We did give you the deeds a month ago.

MR. LOPATKA: We reviewed the deeds

and you can't understand exactly who's getting what. I contacted your engineer and I asked him about it and he's supposed to be sending me a map, but I told him based on the way they're written we can't record them because you're going to have remnant pieces of property.

ATTY. RINALDI: You have four parcels of land there on four separate deeds. So you've got to come back to get final approval and consolidate it so we can take it. It's not hard. It's easy, actually.

MR. LOPATKA: I told George anytime you want to sit down I can show you what my concerns are and, if you guys can resolve them, then resolve them. I talked to George two days ago.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: So we have the deeds?

MR. LOPATKA: We have deeds.

MR. CIUCCIO: The deeds in the development haven't changed.

MR. LOPATKA: The deeds for Mountain Road is where the biggest issue is.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: I'm only listening to the solicitor. He said we need the deeds.

ATTY. RINALDI: We can't accept Villa's roads until they connect to a borough street. We have deeds.

MR. LOPATKA: We have the deeds for both, but the deed for Mountain Road, if you plot the deed for Mountain Road and look at the map there's going to be remnant pieces of property left over that should be somehow described somewhere, because you can't record a map and leave remnant pieces of property. If, 20 years down the road, somebody comes to research this nobody's going to understand who owns what there. the whole process is putting a map together that shows -- if they're going to put that right-of-way where they're showing it and there's four other pieces of property and they're going to change description they need to be shown on the map.

ATTY. RINALDI: Right now it looks like he might have modified a plan that's already recorded. So we're trying to

straighten that out.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Then we don't need the deeds, we have the deeds. We need the deeds to be arranged.

MR. LOPATKA: The deeds for Rosemount, like Louis said, they're kind of the same as they were other than an edge of Edgewood, which is actually getting subdivided off on the right-of-way for Mountain Road.

So the Mountain Road deed, it describes correctly, but there's remnant pieces of property that you can't leave out there.

MR. RUSSEL RINALDI: My question is -- because we've been going on and on and on about this since 2014. No offense to Dave or Bill, but the longer this drags on the more taxpayer money we have to pay you, we have to pay you. How do we settle it? When is it going to be over? What do we need to do?

MR. FEBBO: Russ, how about we do it right.

ATTY. RINALDI: I sent his lawyer a

letter. We can't create his documents.

MR. LOPATKA: Believe me, I'd like it to be over, too.

ATTY. RINALDI: It's kind of simple.

It's a map, lot consolidation to put it all together. It's like any other plan that comes through.

MR. LOPATKA: You can't record something like this. It can't be tracked.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: July 4th we had a stipulation. We had 12 points on the stipulation to do. He had to do them. We had to do them together. Go down the bullet one to 12. It should have taken six months. It's now a year and six months.

MR FEBBO: Russ, because the problem that existed then still exits. It wasn't resolved. The problem is where the road is, according to the road, and the configurations on the map don't match up. There's a recorded deed in the courthouse, the specs on that. If you look at the deed they don't match up. Am I correct?

MR. LOPATKA: Well, it's not even recorded.

ATTY. RINALDI: He has to get the borough to sign off on it to record it.

That's why he has to come back to planning.

MR. CIUCCIO: We did go to planning and it was approved by planning and approved by the borough.

ATTY. RINALDI: You got preliminary approval. You have to come back for final.

MR. CIUCCIO: It's the same thing.

ATTY. RINALDI: No, it's not. To make sure you constructed it, and now --

MR. CIUCCIO: You had an inspector there every day.

ATTY. RINALDI: This is your land.

Okay? I'm just telling you what you need to do. It's all spelled out in the code. It's the same for anybody that does any road or any lot consolidation or any lot subdivision in the borough. They all come on Thursdays, they get their plans approved. I'm not telling you anything different than anybody else does.

MR. FERRETT: Can I say one word?

Russell, I'm only going to speak for myself.

You're talking about going back, you're

talking about when this problem started.

What I understand is I sat here with
everyone at that time. The plan originally
was Mountain Road has to be done first
before we do the other roads. We jumped the
gun, we done the other roads, we didn't do

Mountain Road. Now we got trouble with
Mountain. If we done Mountain Road the
first time, it was done the right way and it
was approved, the other roads there would be
no problems with. Today we got a problem.

We jumped the gun the opposite way. We do
what we want to do.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Mountain road was done first.

MR. FERRETT: No, it wasn't.

ATTY. RINALDI: You got preliminary approval. That gives him three years to do it. He's completed the work, comes back to planning and say hey, I completed my work, here's my final plan --

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Mountain Road wasn't done first?

ATTY. RINALDI: No, I think American Asphalt paved first.

wasn't overlaid properly. If it was done properly, then you know what? Everything would be a go.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: It didn't get overlaid until November.

MR. LOPATKA: At this point it's not even as much about the construction as it is about the description. The construction portion of it, you know, it was redone, repaved. There's one section that we need to figure out. But other than that, it has nothing to do with the construction side of it, it has to do with the deed.

ATTY. RINALDI: There's got to be a plan recorded.

MR. LOPATKA: It's not whether or not it was constructed first or not. We need to resolve the issue with the description and the map that we have.

MR. RUSSEL RINALDI: How long have we had to do that?

MR. LOPATKA: We got it about a month, month and a half ago. So that's how long I've had the deeds to review them.

ATTY. RINALDI: So if he gets into

planning on the first Thursday in February, they pass final approval, come back to council, final approval, he fixes the descriptions -- I think he needs a little lot consolidation for that road because there's, like, four different parcels that make up the road. So somehow it's got to be consolidated and put together.

MR. LOPATKA: The right-of-way and five parcels.

ATTY. RINALDI: I mean, I know there's a Villa piece, there's a Louis piece.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: We'll still be working on this 20 years from now.

MR. FEBBO: Not until we get it right.

MR. CIUCCIO: Can we make approval for some of the payment? It's \$60,000 I put out. The work is done.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: According to past payments he presented invoices, cancelled checks and we paid him. Correct?

MR. LOPATKA: Yes.

ATTY. RINALDI: Yes, but this is the

final payment. So in other words -
MR. CIUCCIO: I'm not going

anywhere.

ATTY. RINALDI: I don't want to be chasing him for the deeds for the roads.

MR. RUSSEL RINALDI: If we've done it in the past why not hold a portion and pay a portion.

ATTY. RINALDI: Normally in any contract you make sure all the work is done --

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: This is not a normal contract.

ATTY. RINALDI: You make sure all the work is done before you pay the last payment.

MR. FEBBO: I believe we're paying our solicitor for his advice. Maybe we should start listening to our solicitor.

ATTY. RINALDI: I just want to see the borough get everything and this be over with. This can all be done by next month if he gets the stuff in. I don't want to be chasing him to get stuff in and he's gotten paid for it.

He's your engineer. You have to instruction him what to do. We can't. We can just tell you what you're missing and what you need to get done.

MR. LENCESKI: I'm only one of seven council members. At this time I'd like to make a motion to hold ten percent of the money on Mountain Road and ten percent of all the roads in Villa, Inc, which includes Edgewood Drive, Oakwood Drive, Stone Hill Drive and Villa Drive.

MR. SEMENZA: Motion on the floor by Councilman Lenceski that you would like to hold ten percent on payment on Edgewood Drive, Oakwood Drive, Stone Hill Drive, Villa Drive --

MR. LENCESKI: And Mountain Road, ten percent until all 12 points of the stipulation are met.

MR. SEMENZA: Until all 12 points of the stipulation have been met. We have a motion on the floor.

MR. FERRETT: I'll second it.

MR. SEMENZA: Seconded by Councilman Ferrett. On the question?

MR. FEBBO: Mr. Rinaldi, is that feasible?

ATTY. RINALDI: We need one calculation from Dave from the Mountain Road invoice. We have to extrapolate what that amount is. And the Villa, Inc. roads, you're saying ten percent of the \$33,000 payment.

MR. LENCESKI: I'm saying ten
percent of the overall cost of the project.

ATTY. RINALDI: That is the ten percent. I'm okay with that.

MR. SEMENZA: Public input?

MR. RUSSICK: Does the engineer and solicitor agree with that motion?

MR. LOPATKA: It's not up to me.

They tell me what to calculate. I had recommended they withhold certain portions originally.
