

1 part of land and on the other side is  
2 another private developer, that you got a  
3 road that goes between both properties that  
4 are only 30-some feet wide, that he's going  
5 to be able to put -- he's going to get a HOP  
6 to put the right kind of a road for traffic  
7 to go through there? And you got a pole  
8 standing in the middle of the road and  
9 underneath the road there's utilities.

10 MR. LOPATKA: All that is part of  
11 their design. PennDOT will look -- and  
12 that's basically -- they actually submit a  
13 totally separate set of drawings just for  
14 the driveway.

15 MR. FERRETT: That's the reason why  
16 I'm trying to tell you it's not going to be  
17 easy, like you people think, that he's going  
18 to get a HOP. But preliminary opinion, I'm  
19 hearing over here that he can put buildings  
20 up, he can do this.

21 ATTY. RINALDI: He's risking his  
22 money, Joe.

23 MR. SEMENZA: Joe, if he doesn't  
24 have an HOP he can't access the land. So  
25 it's over with. How are people going to get

1 in and out?

2 ATTY. RINALDI: He wasted his money  
3 there because he doesn't have access. But I  
4 will tell you that's the access for that  
5 property. It's 50 feet wide. It's a  
6 50-foot right-of-way to get to that  
7 property. It wasn't a lot, it was a 50-foot  
8 right-of-way to get there.

9 MR. LOPATKA: That was actually part  
10 of the parcel, that access point. So, I  
11 mean, he has the width. Your ordinance  
12 requires a 34-foot-wide roadway --

13 MR. FERRETT: We'll see what PennDOT  
14 is going to say.

15 ATTY. RINALDI: That's all we can  
16 do. We can't control it.

17 MR. LENCESKI: Well, I'd like to go  
18 to court or have you talk to Minora about  
19 Rosemount, and I think Dunbar, Birchwood  
20 should be shut down until they give us  
21 money.

22 MS. BARTOLETTI: I wouldn't worry  
23 too much about that. I think there's some  
24 kind of a misunderstanding because I'm  
25 trying to get an answer about it right now.

1 I can't imagine why they would think they  
2 can postdate a check.

3 MR. NOTARI: Councilman Lenceski has  
4 an opinion. Do we need to act on it?  
5 You're saying wait until you check with him,  
6 but then it's another month that --

7 MR. FEBBO: I think she wants to see  
8 what the date on the check is, if it was a  
9 mistake.

10 MS. BARTOLETTI: It seems to me that  
11 there's some sort of misunderstanding here  
12 because at no time is anyone ever allowed to  
13 postdate --

14 MR. SEMENZA: Steve can stop work  
15 down there at any time.

16 MR. FEBBO: If it's a postdated  
17 check, then he stops it. If it was a  
18 mistake, he corrects it.

19 MR. FERRETT: Well, why didn't  
20 Dunbar bring in the check himself?

21 MS. BARTOLETTI: His person brought  
22 it in. And to be quite honest, the fact  
23 that he gave it to Ann Marie, and I guess  
24 the comment was I knew that he was giving a  
25 check that had a different date on it, I

1 have no idea what they're talking about. I  
2 was out of town.

3 MR. FERRETT: How would you know if  
4 you're not in town.

5 ATTY. RINALDI: It would be a  
6 petition for contempt. Now, if I file it  
7 the first response I'm going to get is well,  
8 wait a minute. You didn't see my drawings.  
9 They're supposed to come in October 6th.  
10 When is he coming back to planning?

11 MR. BIERYLA: November.

12 ATTY. RINALDI: But I know what I'm  
13 going to hear.

14 MR. SEMENZA: My opinion is give him  
15 this last chance, and if he doesn't do it --

16 MR. LENCESKI: It's been years.

17 ATTY. RINALDI: I don't want to go  
18 in and say well, wait a minute. They're  
19 filing a contempt petition that they want it  
20 done immediately and their planning  
21 commission just said I can give them my  
22 plans on November. So it's kind of, like,  
23 what do you want me to do.

24 MAYOR MULKERIN: Because you want to  
25 make sure that that's followed through in

1 November, because we've seen this episode  
2 before that November comes and it's not  
3 there.

4 ATTY. RINALDI: I don't have a  
5 problem going to court.

6 MR. LENCESKI: The problem I have is  
7 not the extensions, but he should have taken  
8 care of this over a year ago. Yeah, of  
9 course they did give him extensions, but  
10 it's still no excuse.

11 MR. FEBBO: They gave him 90 days  
12 and the 90-day period --

13 MR. LENCESKI: Should have done --  
14 on the agreement I think it was that year it  
15 was supposed to be done.

16 ATTY. RINALDI: I agree, but at the  
17 same token our planning commission is  
18 sending him back for redraws. You can't  
19 predict whether it's going to be acceptable  
20 or not. There's a couple things that he  
21 knows he should have but not everything. So  
22 the first thing he's going to say well,  
23 judge, I've been to planning five times.  
24 They keep sending me back for new drawings.  
25 I'll do it, but --

1 MR. FERRETT: I think, Bill, one of  
2 the biggest problems -- and I can say this  
3 because I'm here a long time. This guy is a  
4 monster. We're having problems every time  
5 with him. This thing will carry on for  
6 another ten years because he knows all the  
7 tricks of the trade how to get over  
8 everybody. It's ridiculous. It's  
9 ridiculous that it's going on.

10 MR. LENCESKI: I have it right in  
11 front of me. It says "now, this 17th day of  
12 July, 2014" --

13 ATTY. RINALDI: I wrote it. I know  
14 what it says. He went over the schedule --

15 MR. LENCESKI: "Assuming cooperation  
16 of the borough, best efforts are to be  
17 undertaken to perform and complete all work  
18 by October 31, 2014." So we're two years.

19 ATTY. RINALDI: I wrote that one and  
20 the second one. I know what they say.

21 MR. LENCESKI: We have to do  
22 something. It's two years out. I mean, I'm  
23 not a lawyer, I don't know what to do, but  
24 I'm sure Minora's not going to be happy when  
25 he finds out it's two years later and it's

1 still not done.

2 MR. PAPI: One of the residents from  
3 Rosemount was complaining that one of the  
4 lots that Mr. Ciuccio owns that hasn't sold,  
5 the vegetation is growing all out into the  
6 street. She wants us to cut it back. I  
7 said the borough's not going to do that.  
8 You have to go after the property owner.

9 ATTY. RINALDI: I don't have any  
10 problem. Just make sure everybody's in  
11 agreement and I'll file it. I don't have a  
12 problem.

13 MR. NOTARI: I think we should file  
14 it. How long do you wait? Is there any way  
15 for us to direct planning on this is it  
16 or --

17 ATTY. RINALDI: They already gave  
18 him that ultimatum. There was one period, a  
19 long delay, and I think I know why.

20 MR. NOTARI: Do we need to make a  
21 motion to direct Bill to do that?

22 ATTY. RINALDI: Go ahead, file a  
23 motion. I'll do it.

24 MR. LENCESKI: At this time I'd like  
25 to make a motion for Bill to file contempt

1 of our agreement with Villa, Incorporated as  
2 soon as possible.

3 MR. SEMENZA: Motion by Councilman  
4 Lenceski.

5 MR. NOTARI: I'll second it.

6 MR. SEMENZA: Second by Councilman  
7 Notari. On the question? Public input?  
8 Roll call, please.

9 MR. BROWN: On the question, I just  
10 want to make sure it's not going to be a  
11 conflict of interest just for what the  
12 solicitor said pertaining to the planning  
13 commission giving him an extension and now  
14 we're going to go against their extension or  
15 their recommendation to them.

16 MS. BARTOLETTI: This was supposed  
17 to be done two years ago, so what conflict  
18 of interest would there be?

19 MR. BROWN: I agree it should be  
20 done and completed, but we have the  
21 governing -- like, two governing bodies that  
22 are going against each other now.

23 MR. LENCESKI: They're not a  
24 governing body.

25 MR. FEBBO: Planning is really fed



1 up. I've been to the planning meetings.

2 MR. BROWN: Then why did they grant  
3 the extension?

4 MR. FEBBO: I guess it's the next  
5 thing to do.

6 MS. BARTOLETTI: They didn't have a  
7 choice. Is that what it was?

8 MR. BROWN: I agree it should be  
9 done. I'm just saying a conflict of  
10 interest. We're opposing bodies.

11 ATTY. RINALDI: He'll just use it as  
12 a defense, and I'll word it in such a way  
13 that, listen, council wants this done. End  
14 of story.

15 MR. FEBBO: I think we can take the  
16 burden off of planning because they're  
17 trying to do the right thing there and he's  
18 giving them the same thing. The run around,  
19 the run around. They don't have the  
20 authority to do what we're doing. If they  
21 did they would have done it a long time ago.

22 MR. SEMENZA: Public input? Roll  
23 call, please.

24 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Brown?

25 MR. BROWN: Yes.

1 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Notari?

2 MR. NOTARI: Yes.

3 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Ferrett?

4 MR. FERRETT: Yes.

5 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Febbo?

6 MR. FEBBO: I'm going to abstain on  
7 this one.

8 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Rinaldi?

9 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: I abstain as  
10 well.

11 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman  
12 Lenceski?

13 MR. LENCESKI: Yes.

14 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Semenza?

15 MR. SEMENZA: Yes. Anybody have any  
16 other questions for Bill? Thanks, Bill.  
17 Marylynn, borough manager's report, please.

18 MS. BARTOLETTI: First thing, on the  
19 new business portion I put on there fire  
20 hydrant for Birchwood Estates. This is an  
21 application for a fire hydrant that the  
22 borough has to fill out even though it will  
23 be on private property, but the borough  
24 still has to approve it. Bill wanted it  
25 done at the public meeting to pass this or

1 not pass it.

2 MMO for police pension and MMO for  
3 administrative, these have to be part of the  
4 record of the meeting tonight. So the MMO  
5 is the minimum municipal obligation for the  
6 Old Forge Borough Police pension for 2017,  
7 and the amount will be zero. We have to  
8 have it on the record.

9 Minimum municipal obligation 2017  
10 for the Old Forge Borough non-uniform  
11 administrative pension plan is \$10,5166.

12 ATTY. RINALDI: If you want to add  
13 in, depending on Mark's schedule, a special  
14 meeting for the handing down of the order on  
15 the Guida property. If you want to have a  
16 special meeting rather than waiting until  
17 the regular meeting on the Guida property  
18 violation. Otherwise, you can do it at the  
19 regular meeting. I know Devon wants to get  
20 it done in a hurry. That's the quickest you  
21 can do it.

22 MS. BARTOLETTI: In your packets,  
23 Lackawanna County Association of Boroughs,  
24 they're asking for people to go to a  
25 meeting. Please let Ann Marie know if

1 anybody wants to go.

2 This is the letter we wanted to read  
3 earlier. It's addressed to council members,  
4 dated September 18th. "I'm constructing a  
5 new residence in the borough of Old Forge.  
6 I want to commend and express for  
7 appreciation to Zoning Officer Steve Bieryla  
8 for his assistance and efforts provided to  
9 me over the past several months. Steve  
10 guided me through the planning and  
11 permitting process. He was very responsive  
12 each time I approached him with any issue.  
13 Steve worked with my various contractors to  
14 ensure proper compliance with the permitting  
15 procedure. Steve was easily reachable and  
16 approachable. I enjoyed working with him.  
17 Our borough is fortunate to have Steve and I  
18 greatly appreciate his efforts." It's  
19 signed by Jack Schuback.

20 MR. FEBBO: Good job, Steve.

21 MS. BARTOLETTI: I have a letter  
22 from the DPW union. We have one guy that's  
23 been out on comp for a long time. We have a  
24 temporary employee. This is from the union,  
25 that there was a request made by some

1 council members to check into this.

2 "The parties are in agreement to the  
3 following: The borough is willing to hire a  
4 permanent employee to replace a current  
5 employee out on extended leave. If the  
6 employee on extended leave is able to return  
7 to work on a permanent status the borough  
8 will lay off the least senior permanent  
9 employee, and this agreement does not set  
10 any precedent." That's from SCIU 668.

11 Does everyone have my financial  
12 reports? There's a couple things that I  
13 want to go over. The first thing is, we  
14 talked about the unpaid bills tonight.  
15 Rick, you asked about the list, and I just  
16 want to point something out. When you look  
17 at our balance sheet and it shows dollar  
18 figures that the borough has, okay, for  
19 example, general fund says 387,000 and  
20 some-odd dollars, these dollars have to get  
21 us through the rest of the year. We're  
22 still in September. I know when people look  
23 at these they say we have tons of money in  
24 the bank we have to spend.

25 Just for this month alone our bills

1           were \$204,000. That's on this unpaid bills  
2           list. So everyone has to keep in mind that  
3           just because it says on paper that we have  
4           that much money, that is not meaning that we  
5           could just spend it and not worry about  
6           anything.

7                     If you look on the profit and loss  
8           report on page seven, this is just something  
9           that will make things very easy to  
10          understand. The profit and loss is set up  
11          so you can see your actual spending and  
12          money coming in, but then it also shows you  
13          the budget.

14                    So if you look at the very last page  
15          of this report it tells us that there's  
16          still \$606,358 that are going to be spent by  
17          the end of the year, and I can guarantee you  
18          we will spend every penny of that. That is  
19          for all different insurances, whether it's  
20          vehicle insurance or health insurance,  
21          anything of that type of stuff. That  
22          includes salaries. It just includes  
23          everything that the borough does. So  
24          \$606,358, and you compare that to what's in  
25          the general fund right now, \$387,000.

1                   Keep in mind that all of our taxes  
2                   come in in the beginning of the year, so  
3                   Gary still has a little bit of money to give  
4                   us. But basically what we have has to last  
5                   until the end of the year. So when people  
6                   look at this and say we've got tons of money  
7                   to spend it's not really the truth. That's  
8                   a distorted thought. If anyone doesn't  
9                   understand that or wants me to sit down and  
10                  explain to them I'd be really happy to do  
11                  it, but it's something that everybody really  
12                  needs to understand.

13                 Plus, the figure in the ASL account,  
14                 I know it says there's a million dollars  
15                 there, but there's still expenses that come  
16                 out of there. There's still expenses -- for  
17                 example, we have paying some of the bills to  
18                 Ciuccio and different things like that.  
19                 They will come out of there because that's  
20                 where it's decided that the bills would be  
21                 paid from.

22                 So please, when we're making  
23                 decisions please keep this in mind. Anybody  
24                 have any questions about it? Does anyone  
25                 want me to explain anything else or meet

1 with them?

2 MR. FEBBO: Good job.

3 ATTY. RINALDI: Could we just add  
4 one more resolution. A resolution to  
5 purchase -- because I know we did a  
6 resolution to order it, but we never -- I  
7 guess they want to pick it up and get it  
8 paid for.

9 MS. BARTOLETTI: Well, it's here, so  
10 we have 30 days to pay for it. It's on the  
11 bill list. Go back to the list of unpaid  
12 bills is the police vehicle. Bill just  
13 wants to do a resolution for the purchase of  
14 this vehicle, since it's here but it's not  
15 paid for yet. It's \$36,182.08. Kovatch.  
16 And that's coming out of the ASL, so we're  
17 not financing anything.

18 MR. SEMENZA: Anybody have any  
19 questions for Marylynn? At this time I'm  
20 going to go into new business. The chair  
21 would entertain a motion, the 2017 minimal  
22 municipal obligation for the police pension  
23 plan, and the amount is zero.

24 MR. FEBBO: I'll make that motion.

25 MR. SEMENZA: Motion by Councilman



1 Febbo.

2 MR. LENCESKI: I'll second that.

3 MR. SEMENZA: Seconded by Councilman  
4 Lenceski. On the question? Public input?  
5 Roll call, please.

6 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Brown?

2 Lenceski.

3 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: I'll second  
4 it.

5 MR. SEMENZA: Seconded by Councilman  
6 Rinaldi. On the question? Public input?  
7 Roll call, please.

8 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Brown?

9 MR. BROWN: Yes.

10 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Notari?

11 MR. NOTARI: Yes.

3 Caldwell. "Bill Stull and I are satisfied  
4 with the location of the fire hydrants  
5 throughout the development. We do not have  
6 any questions or concerns at this point."  
7 And it's signed Mark Tagliaterra.

8 MR. SEMENZA: Would it be the  
9 borough installing this fire hydrant?

10 MR. FEBBO: No, Dunbar.

11 MS. BARTOLETTI: Well, it's the  
12 water company.

13 MR. SEMENZA: So it's just basically  
14 for approval to have it. The chair would  
15 entertain a motion for approval for a fire  
16 hydrant, Birchwood Estates, at the  
17 location --

18 MR. LOPATKA: There's multiple.

19 MR. SEMENZA: Fire hydrants for  
20 Birchwood Estates.

21 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Mr. Chairman,

2 MR. NOTARI: I'll second it.

3 MR. SEMENZA: Seconded by Councilman  
4 Notari. On the question? Public input?  
5 Roll call, please.

6 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Brown?

7 MR. BROWN: Yes.

8 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Notari?

9 MR. NOTARI: Yes.

10 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Ferrett?

11 MR. FERRETT: Yes.

24 like to make a motion to hire Garrett  
25 Gleason as long as he can pass a physical

1 and drug test and obtain a CDL within six  
2 months.

3 MR. FEBBO: I'll second that motion.

4 MR. SEMENZA: Motion on the floor by  
5 Councilman Lenceski to hire Garrett Gleason  
6 as a full time DPW worker with the  
7 understanding that he passes his physical  
8 and drug test and obtains his CDL license  
9 within the six-month probationary period,  
10 seconded by Councilman Febbo. On the  
11 question?

12 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Mr. Chairman,  
13 just some clarification, and I think we  
14 should attach it to the motion. The letter  
15 that you read about not setting precedent,  
16 also -- just a question. Bill, if the DPW  
17 worker who's out now were to come back and  
18 if this DPW worker who was put in his place,  
19 he would get put on -- he would get laid  
20 off. He would have no seniority. Correct?

21 ATTY. RINALDI: Well, if somebody  
22 got hired after him he would have seniority,  
23 but he's last on the totem pole.

24 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: So, then, he  
25 would have seniority from what he gained as

1                   being hired.

2                   ATTY. RINALDI: From today.

3                   MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: From today.

4                   Okay. Mare, we're budgeted for it?

5                   MS. BARTOLETTI: Yes, because we're  
6                   not paying the person who is out. He's  
7                   being paid by workman's comp.

8                   MR. RUSSEL RINALDI: We had the  
9                   finance meeting today. We did discuss it  
10                  then. Just as long as you have everything  
11                  in order and it's all correct. That's all.

12                  MR. SEMENZA: I'd like to attach the  
13                  letter from the union to this motion stating  
14                  their agreement. Everybody has it. Public  
15                  input? Roll call, please.

16                  MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Brown?

17                  MR. BROWN: Yes.

18                  MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Notari?

19                  MR. NOTARI: Yes.

20                  MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Ferrett?

21                  MR. FERRETT: Yes.

22                  MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Febbo?

13 days maximum once a letter is sent. That's  
14 the first motion I'd like to make.

15 MR. SEMENZA: Motion on the floor by

18 it, Mr. Chairman.

8 Lenceski?

9 MR. LENCESKI: No.

10 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Semenza?

11 MR. SEMENZA: No.

12 MR. BROWN: Mr. Chairman, at this  
13 point in time I would like to make a motion  
14 to amend the dangerous building ordinance  
15 section 112-6, hearing procedures.  
16 Particularly, section C. I would like it to  
17 read reduce the amount of time frame to  
18 provide feedback from the hearing to a  
19 maximum allotment of ten days.

20 MR. SEMENZA: Motion on the floor by  
21 Councilman Brown. Can I have a second?

22 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: I'll second  
23 it.

24 MR. SEMENZA: Seconded by Councilman  
25 Rinaldi. On the question?

1 MR. NOTARI: What's the current?

2 ATTY. RINALDI: Within 30 days.

3 MR. SEMENZA: Public input? Roll  
4 call, please.

5 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Brown?

6 MR. BROWN: Yes.

7 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Notari?

8 MR. NOTARI: No.

9 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Febbo?

10 MR. FEBBO: No.

11 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Ferrett?

12 MR. FERRETT: No.

13 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Rinaldi?

14 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Yes.

15 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman

16 Lencieski?

17 MR. LENCESKI: No.

18 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Semenza?

19 MR. SEMENZA: No. At this time the  
20 chair would entertain a motion to have a  
21 special meeting on Tuesday, October 4th, our  
22 work session, at 6:30.

23 ATTY. RINALDI: It would be to issue  
24 an order on the hearing regarding the  
25 dangerous structure on the Guida property.

1 MR. SEMENZA: Regarding the  
2 dangerous structure on Guida's property on  
3 Winter Street, 516 Winter Street. Can I  
4 have a motion?

5 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: I'll make that  
6 motion.

7 MR. SEMENZA: Motion by Councilman  
8 Rinaldi. Can I have a second?

9 MR. LENCESKI: I'll second that.

10 MR. SEMENZA: Seconded by Councilman  
11 Lenceski. On the question? Public input?  
12 Roll call, please.

13 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Brown?

14 MR. BROWN: Yes.

15 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Notari?

16 MR. NOTARI: Yes.

17 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Febbo?

18 MR. FEBBO: Yes.

19 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Ferrett?

20 MR. FERRETT: Yes.

21 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Rinaldi?

22 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Yes.

23 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman  
24 Lenceski?

25 MR. LENCESKI: Yes.

1 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Semenza?

2 MR. SEMENZA: Yes.

3 MR. NOTARI: Steve, will you let  
4 Ms. Macheska know we're going to have a  
5 special meeting.

6 MR. BROWN: Mr. Chairman, at this  
7 point in time I'd like to make a motion to  
8 amend the dangerous building ordinance  
9 pertaining to section 112-8, notice of  
10 violations. Particularly, section D, which  
11 I would like it to read shorten the length  
12 of time frame for an owner of a dangerous  
13 building to complete the corrections or to  
14 demolish the property or to vacate within  
15 ten days.

16 MR. SEMENZA: Motion on the floor by  
17 Councilman Brown.

18 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: I'll second  
19 it.

20 MR. SEMENZA: Seconded by Councilman  
21 Rinaldi. On the question?

22 MR. NOTARI: What is it currently?

23 MR. BROWN: Thirty to 60, if I'm  
24 correct, Bill.

25 ATTY. RINALDI: That's D. Right now

1           it says work has to commence within ten days  
2           and be completed within 60 days from the  
3           receipt of the notice.

4                   MR. NOTARI: You want it to be  
5           completed within ten?

6                   MR. BROWN: With certain exceptions  
7           to people that are moving along with their  
8           properties.

9                   ATTY. RINALDI: You can't.

10                   MR. BROWN: Steve knows what that  
11           is. Two people came in so far and we dealt  
12           with them. We discussed it at the prior  
13           meeting and it was brought up in his notes  
14           today.

15                   ATTY. RINALDI: Because I'm going to  
16           have to re-type this and advertise it, so  
17           you have to give me the certain exceptions  
18           to list them in there if you're going to  
19           change it that way.

20                   MR. BROWN: Based on the zoning  
21           officer's recommendation. I mean, he didn't  
22           ask us -- you know, he knew what was going  
23           on with the two that he brought up today.  
24           He didn't come and ask us or inform us. He  
25           gave them leeway. He knew that they were

1 making improvements.

2 ATTY. RINALDI: Well, this is after  
3 you guys vote, so this doesn't even come  
4 into effect -- this doesn't even affect  
5 Steve until after you guys vote on what the  
6 work is to be done. So if you vote on  
7 Tuesday night that you want that wall  
8 removed or repaired Steve would send that  
9 out. He has within ten days to start the  
10 work. If he doesn't start it within ten  
11 days Steve can take action. Once he starts  
12 it, he has to complete it within 60 days.  
13 And remember, this is for a lot of different  
14 projects.

15 MR. NOTARI: You want to shorten it  
16 to ten?

17 MR. BROWN: Shorten it to ten.

18 MR. SEMENZA: Start when?

19 MR. BROWN: Once they receive the  
20 letter they have ten days to start the work.  
21 Instead of giving them 60 days to complete  
22 it, give them ten days to complete it. Ten  
23 days to start, ten days to --

24 MR. SEMENZA: That's real quick.  
25 Are you kidding me?

1 MR. BROWN: Steve knows which  
2 properties -- like he said tonight, the two  
3 owners that came in made the corrections.  
4 He didn't fine them. So by common sense you  
5 know which owners are trying to make  
6 recommendations or improve their property.

7 MR. FEBBO: That's not always going  
8 to be the case, though. That doesn't mean  
9 in the future it's going to happen.

10 ATTY. RINALDI: If it's a building  
11 structure I can guarantee you nobody's going  
12 to get done within ten days.

13 MR. SEMENZA: Not even close. You  
14 have to look at weather to be a factor.

15 MR. BROWN: I get that, but I'm just  
16 saying hold the owner's feet to the fire.  
17 We just brought up how we want to move along  
18 Rosemount. How it's been going on for years  
19 and years and it's staying stagnant.

20 MR. SEMENZA: Well, you're not  
21 talking ten days. There's a motion on the  
22 floor by Councilman Brown, seconded by  
23 Councilman Rinaldi. On the question?  
24 Public input?

25 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: I have a

1 question. I actually should have asked it  
2 two motions before. I'm going to ask the  
3 zoning officer. Mr. Bieryla, the first two  
4 motions that Councilman Brown made -- and  
5 I'm going off of your expertise as the  
6 zoning officer because you definitely know  
7 more about it than I do. Were those motions  
8 going to strengthen your department or help  
9 you better than you have the capability now?

10 MR. BIERYLA: I would probably  
11 say --

12 MR. RUSSEL RINALDI: Would it have  
13 helped the borough? Because I want to  
14 understand.

15 MR. BIERYLA: I don't think the  
16 first two would have. I think the one that  
17 Mr. Brown has right now with the ten days  
18 and meaning -- our dangerous buildings --  
19 and maybe that's not the one to put in  
20 there. But our dangerous buildings has once  
21 you receive the letter you got to start  
22 within ten days and then it doesn't say  
23 anything. Within 30 days you got to have  
24 the council meeting.

25 ATTY. RINALDI: No, it says within



1                   60 -- the building's got to be down within  
2                   60 days.

3                   MR BIERYLA: But it says we send out  
4                   the letter, you got to start action within  
5                   ten days. Within that 30-day limit you  
6                   got --

7                   ATTY. RINALDI: You're mixing it all  
8                   up. This ten days is going to run when they  
9                   vote on the 4th.

10                  MR. BIERYLA: Then if it's after  
11                  counsel's action, then the ten days for them  
12                  to comply for something, definitely, because  
13                  you can't let it run that 30 to 60 days  
14                  after your decision. Now you're way out  
15                  into the 90 and 120 day.

16                  ATTY. RINALDI: They vote on the  
17                  4th, you mail the letter on the 15th. By  
18                  10/15 if they haven't pulled a permit --  
19                  they need a permit for most of this work --  
20                  you go right down the magistrate's office.

21                  MR. BIERYLA: That ten days,  
22                  definitely. That last one, yes.

23                  MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Would you  
24                  recommend this last one?

25                  MR. BIERYLA: Definitely.

1 MR. SEMENZA: Wait, Steve.

2 ATTY. RINALDI: Because it reads  
3 that way.

4 MR. BIERYLA: I got to have it in  
5 front of me. There's so many numbers.

6 ATTY. RINALDI: It says after  
7 they're notified that council said make this  
8 repair, which they're going to vote on this  
9 one on the 4th. You notify them, which  
10 means council voted here's your repairs you  
11 have to make. They have ten days to start  
12 that repair, which means if they're tearing  
13 down a building they have to come down and  
14 pull a permit for --

15 MR. BIERYLA: Is that what you  
16 recommended?

17 ATTY. RINALDI: No. He wants to  
18 then shorten it, they have to be completed  
19 within ten more days.

20 MR. BROWN: Because it's giving them  
21 up to 60. So I'm saying shorten that within  
22 ten days. You would obviously know like you  
23 did during the week --

24 MR. BIERYLA: The big thing is to  
25 start within ten days, but I would say, once

1           again, as you stated, it all depends on the  
2           size of the project. You have to make an  
3           attempt to come in to at least -- once  
4           again, we have no communication since --

5                   MR. SEMENZA: I don't think we  
6           should put a determination of who gets to do  
7           what in a code and in your hands. Not for  
8           nothing, I don't think you should be able to  
9           say well, Dave, you're making the attempt to  
10          do it, when this guy here, me, I don't have  
11          the money to hire somebody to do it so I'm  
12          doing it little by little but I work two  
13          jobs, this and that. Then all the sudden,  
14          you know --

15                   MR. BIERYLA: That's what I'm  
16          saying.

17                   MR. SEMENZA: I understand, but I'm  
18          saying Councilman Brown's motion is to have  
19          it done in ten days. Well, if I don't have  
20          money to do it and I'm only doing it in bits  
21          and pieces when I get out of work I don't  
22          have the time to do it in ten days. What  
23          about rain days and this, that and the other  
24          thing?

25                   ATTY. RINALDI: This covers, like, a

1 structure burns down in town. Okay? The  
2 guy's not doing anything. You come in, you  
3 have the hearing, we want it torn down.  
4 It's unsafe. It's not like he's going to  
5 come in and have it torn down within ten  
6 days. He's got to pull the permit, he's got  
7 to get the money. Might be waiting for the  
8 insurance guy to come in. Sixty days isn't  
9 a long period of time. The buildings we've  
10 taken down -- Main Bike World. I know how  
11 long that took. That huge structure we  
12 mentioned before. That took more than 60  
13 days. We just didn't go to court to find  
14 him in contempt because it was a concrete,  
15 four-story building down on Lonesome Road.  
16 Brown Derby. They got the permit and they  
17 were tearing it down, but it didn't come  
18 down in five days.

19 MR. BROWN: Tearing a building down  
20 I'm not saying is going to be accomplished  
21 within ten days, but we need to get these  
22 owners moving. Get their feet to the fire.

23 ATTY. RINALDI: That ten days you  
24 have there. They have ten days to get  
25 moving, which means they better have a

1 contract in hand and a permit pulled to do  
2 the work.

3 MR. NOTARI: If they're not moving  
4 in those ten days Steve goes to the  
5 magistrate.

6 ATTY. RINALDI: He goes to the  
7 magistrate. He mails the letter, that's the  
8 15th. The guy's going to get it on the  
9 17th. That's two days. He's got to go out  
10 and look for a contractor, then get the  
11 contractor to come in and do the work or bid  
12 it. It depends on the size of the job.  
13 This is a small job, so it's not a big deal.  
14 If it's a bigger job --

15 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: So if Steve  
16 tells them to do the work, if they're  
17 notified to do the work and they don't do  
18 the work --

19 ATTY. RINALDI: When you vote, if  
20 they don't within ten days you can go to the  
21 magistrate.

22 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: So the one we  
23 did tonight for the Guidas, we already voted  
24 on it?

25 ATTY. RINALDI: No, you're going to

1 vote on Tuesday. So we'll send the notice  
2 out that council found your structure is  
3 dangerous. It needs to be repaired,  
4 whatever the case is.

5 MR. RUSSEL RINALDI: He has ten days  
6 to start the work?

7 ATTY. RINALDI: You have ten days to  
8 start that work.

9 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: And the  
10 ordinance reads he has to have it completed  
11 within 60?

12 ATTY. RINALDI: Sixty days.

13 MR. SEMENZA: Going back to Steve --

14 MR. RUSSEL RINALDI: They can always  
15 come before council and ask for an  
16 extension, couldn't they?

17 ATTY. RINALDI: They can always ask  
18 for an extension, but I guarantee you in ten  
19 days he goes down to the magistrate they're  
20 going to have that done.

21 MR. PAPI: The thing is with the  
22 magistrate, you file with them and then it  
23 takes five weeks for a hearing.

24 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Whether it was  
25 five days or 500 days, they can always come

1 before us and ask for an extension, Bill?

2 ATTY. RINALDI: No, they have to  
3 have it done and work completed within 60  
4 days.

5 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: If they  
6 couldn't get it done within the amount of  
7 time, if they came before us, they started  
8 the work, here's my contractor, here's my  
9 this, that, but I can't get it done could  
10 you give me an extra five days, we wouldn't  
11 be able to grant that for them as a  
12 governing body?

13 ATTY. RINALDI: He can say well, I'm  
14 not filing a citation right now or he could  
15 say go ask council.

16 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Okay.

17 ATTY. RINALDI: He does have  
18 discretion on when he cites people.

19 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: So according  
20 to the last motion, ten days or 60 days, it  
21 really doesn't matter. Ten days isn't too  
22 short and 60 days is too long because it's  
23 ultimately up to him, you're saying.

24 ATTY. RINALDI: Well, he has  
25 enforcement discretion. The quickest he can

1 cite them --

2 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: I understand  
3 that. I'm trying to get the work done the  
4 fastest way possible. So with the motion on  
5 the floor, if it was only ten days -- and a  
6 couple people are saying wow, that's quick  
7 to get that done, but it gives them ten days  
8 to start. Then they come here on the ninth  
9 day and say I started it but I can't finish  
10 it, Mr. Bieryla, you're the zoning officer,  
11 could you give me another seven days, he  
12 could say yes?

13 ATTY. RINALDI: He does have to sign  
14 the citation, so it's when he signs --

15 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Or he can say  
16 I'm not going to file it.

17 ATTY. RINALDI: The guy can come to  
18 council, too.

19 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: So ultimately  
20 ten days isn't too short.

21 MR. SEMENZA: But he's going against  
22 what our code says, isn't he?

23 ATTY. RINALDI: Right.

24 MR. SEMENZA: I think we're putting  
25 too much on --



1 MR. BIERYLA: That's what I was  
2 trying to say. Once you put that in black  
3 and white, make that motion, you're holding  
4 me to black and white.

5 MR. SEMENZA: I think you should be  
6 held to black and white.

7 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: You're also  
8 holding them to black and white.

9 MR. SEMENZA: What it is, is what it  
10 is.

11 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Which is the  
12 most important one. Everyone should be held  
13 to black and white.

14 ATTY. RINALDI: You have to remember  
15 we're dealing with a wall in this situation.  
16 This is really made for a structure. A  
17 building that is gutted by a fire or caves  
18 in. We did Chelland's because it was  
19 condemned and, I'll tell you what, the  
20 borough didn't get it down in ten days. So  
21 now you're holding us to the same standard  
22 because the other part of this is we can  
23 also order it done ourselves. I mean, it's  
24 not that easy to take a building down that  
25 you can do it in four days, five days.

1 MR. RUSSEL RINALDI: Let me ask you  
2 this, are there other boroughs, counties,  
3 cities or anything in our area that have  
4 this within ten days?

5 MR. BROWN: Yes, Wilkes-Barre. They  
6 just passed it two months ago. The city of  
7 Wilkes-Barre.

8 MR. RUSSEL RINALDI: Okay, I'm good,  
9 then. So it could be done.

10 ATTY. RINALDI: They just lost a  
11 lawsuit down there on their landlord/tenant  
12 ordinance because they were throwing tenants  
13 out.

14 MR BROWN: And that was a whole  
15 previous council. They use money from the  
16 general fund to tear them down.

17 MR. SEMENZA: Motion on the floor  
18 and seconded by Councilman Rinaldi. On the  
19 question? Public input? Roll call, please.

20 (Councilman Ferrett left the room.)

21 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Brown?

22 MR. BROWN: Yes.

23 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Notari?

24 MR. NOTARI: No.

25 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Febbo?

1 MR. FEBBO: No.

2 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Rinaldi?

3 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Yes.

4 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman

5 Lenceski?

6 MR. LENCESKI: No.

7 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Semenza?

8 MR. SEMENZA: Absolutely not.

9 (Councilman Ferrett re-entered the  
10 room.)

11 ATTY. RINALDI: It's from 60 days to  
12 ten days that they have to have work  
13 completed.

14 MS. BARTOLETTI: Devon voted yes,  
15 Rick voted no, Lou voted no, Russell voted  
16 yes, Joe Lenceski voted no, Bob Semenza  
17 voted no.

18 MR. FERRETT: I vote no.

19 MR. SEMENZA: At this time the chair  
20 would entertain a motion to adjourn.

21 MR. NOTARI: I'll make that motion.

22 MR. SEMENZA: By Councilman Notari.

23 All in favor?

24 (Unanimous. Meeting adjourned.)
