He's working on the sports both at the school level and 16 17 at the community level. 18 Basically what they're doing is 19 they've asked us to put together a lot of pieces of film, so we went out and we made 20 21 sure we had the right kind of camera so it interfaces with their HD equipment. 22 have the most sophisticated HD equipment of 23

Street and down Moosic Road taking video 1 I have a friend coming in at 2 shots. Christmastime who has a drone. He's going 3 to do some aerial shots for us free. 4 So what we're asking is that we want 5 everybody involved because we did this to 6 preserve our past for my children and my 7 grandchildren and for your children and your 8 grandchildren, to preserve it for the future 9 of Old Forge. Because as we all know, we've 10 lost Main Street. Our character, the little 11 12 stores that were there, they're not there I just came from an area where 13 anymore. there's a small community and it's still all 14 little mom and pop stores. We've lost that. 15 So one of our purposes is to look at 16 our past, because that's where our tradition 17 is, but to talk about what we're doing now 18 and where we're headed in the future. 19 20

That's where I would like you gentlemen to come in. I've already spoken to Marylynn. On January 20th there will be a filming day. It will be held in the vestibule of Saint Lawrence's Church because they would like to have one site so they can

set up all their equipment and be there all
day. So they'll probably be there in the
neighborhood of ten to 12 hours, and they're
qoing to do this in ten-minute intervals.

What they want us to do is have the people who are interested in telling a story about Old Forge, whether it's history, sports, education, a personal recollection to come in -- and they won't fire questions at you. What they're going to do is they're going to ask you to bring five or six questions that you want them to ask about what it is you want to a tell them so that you're not hit stone cold. I mentioned it to Russell and to Mr. Febbo -- and Rick already knows about it.

I mentioned it to Mr. Febbo because of his association with the Sons of Italy, and to Russell because we want to talk about -- we're putting a lot of emphasis on family and tradition. So families who have been here and now they're part -- we went from mining and industry into our Main Street now, our restaurants. That's what we're famous for. Mr. Febbo and I talk

 about Old Forge being the gem of the valley because there's just something here, and when people come here they like it here.

So what I'm asking is if you would have a story you want to share with us or if you have videos or eight-millimeter film or anything you have in a picture or artifact, we can take that, we can scan pictures. The videos and the eight-millimeter films, WVIA will transpose that into videos. Just put it in an envelope with your name on it. I already talked to Marylynn. We would like to have Marylynn talk about what's going on currently in government, and we put the invitation out to you gentlemen to maybe appoint a couple of the borough council members to be interviewed.

I just talked with Lisa Mazzarella, who is the producer for the program, and she said rather than have them in groups she would -- let's say you had three councilmen. They would come at the same time but they would be interviewed ten minutes, ten minutes, ten minutes. They interweave your interview with the pictures and so forth.

She feels that, based on what we already have, we're probably going to have one of the best Our Town productions they've ever done. On top of that, we lucked out because every time they do this they have to get a different cinematographer to put it together. Sometimes they have visiting cinematographers. The cinematographer that's going to be doing ours has won Emmys for her documentaries. So this is going to be a really special one.

They're going to use it, obviously, to raise funds. They're going to ask for membership at WVIA, and as part of the membership you'll get a CD. They're also going to give some back to us, the Old Forge Historical Society, so that we can sell them and put that money in our treasury so we have more running money. I know they're canvassing the community to see if anybody would like to be a sponsor on the production. They have a list of all the businesses and professional people.

So tonight I just ask that if you can get in touch with me as soon as possible

1	either through Rick or Russell or Lou. You
2	all know where I live. You can even knock
3	on my door. We would be glad to set up the
4	times. The morning shots are already done.
5	I think we're booked up until 1:30. If we
6	can get two or three people and that's
7	the other thing. They don't want for
8	example, I have four spots. I'm actually
9	trying to get somebody to do a couple
10	because they don't want the same people
11	they don't want it to be all Sal Luzio on
12	the film or all Bob Semenza. They want
13	different people to talk about different
14	things.
15	The other thing is on March 8th we
16	would like you to be at the studio. I don't
17	know the time yet, but they're going to have
18	a reception and we're going to try to get
19	some restaurants to donate some things.
20	They celebrate Old Forge that night at the
21	studio.

2	The project is going to be pavement
3	of the roads within their housing authority,
4	which is Apollo Drive and Eisenhower Drive,
5	by Pennsy Supply, who did our roads. The
6	agreement is either they're going to
7	contract directly with Pennsy or will work
8	through the borough with a change order. If
9	they contract directly with Pennsy they're
10	responsible for payment. If they contract
11	through our change order they have to
12	deposit the funds with the borough prior to
13	us issuing a notice to proceed to Pennsy on
14	the changes.
15	They're responsible for the cost of
16	the roads. After the roads are done they'll
17	dedicate them over to the borough.
18	MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: So it cost the
19	borough no money?
20	ATTY. RINALDI: Zero money.
21	MR. FERRETT: The funds are going to
22	be in there for the roads to be paved by the
23	county before we say it's okay.
