MS. BARTOLETTI: Depending on how we go forward in the spring, the rest of the roads in town will get their share as well.

MR. NOTARI: Marylynn, the RFPs that were passed at the last meeting, were they put in the paper yet?

MS. BARTOLETTI: No, but they will be. They're in the process of getting done.

MS. BARTOLETTI: Anyone else?
Solicitor Rinaldi?

ATTY. RINALDI: I started the process with Saint Lawrence Church. I still haven't gotten the title search back yet, but I arranged with Dave Lopatka to do the assessment of the property because we have 45 days to do that from our last meeting.

The only other matter I'm going to put on the agenda for you guys, you have the ability to opt out -- and you only get one shot at it -- if Mohegan Sun wanted to put in a slot machine here in town. So if you don't opt out by December 31st they can do it. If you do opt out you can always revoke it one time. So the safe bet is -- unless everybody wants to -- not opt out and allow -- I'm not saying they're going to, but they have the ability to say we want to put in a slot machine parlor in Old Forge.

MR. FERRETT: What benefit would there be?

ATTY. RINALDI: Mohegan Sun, they can put a satellite within their 25 miles, and we fall within it. So far a lot of towns I've seen are opting out. It's not something you have to do tonight. We'll prepare it for the next meeting. It just has to be delivered to the secretary of gaming by the 31st. So we get one shot at it since they passed the law. It went in effect October 31st. It gave every municipality the option of opting out. you opt out, you have the ability to revoke that opting out at a later date. If you don't opt out, you can't opt out later, after the 31th.

So you can talk about it between now and the meting if anybody wants to ask questions, but just to let you know it's going to come up for that meeting.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: That means that if we don't opt out after the 31st they can purchase a property or rent a piece of property and put a slot parlor in?

1 ATTY, RINALDI: Right. MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Within the 2 3 limits of Old Forge? 4 ATTY. RINALDI: Right. 5 MR. RUSSEL RINALDI: If they do, do we get any type of -- is there a fee or do 6 they have to pay us anything? 7 ATTY. RINALDI: No. 8 MR. FEBBO: No benefit to us? 9 10 ATTY. RINALDI: No. It goes into 11 their big gambling share. MR. NOTARI: We wouldn't become a 12 host community, then, and then we can apply 13 14 for LSA? 15 ATTY. RINALDI: That's my thinking. If they want you to revoke it and put a slot 16 parlor in town they're going to come and see 17 you and ask you to revoke it. 18 MR. FERRETT: Isn't that one of the 19 basic reasons why Luzerne County, Plains are 20 getting benefits from this, because they're 21 22 located --23 ATTY, RINALDI: Plains has one 24 there. 25 MR. FERRETT: If they come with

something in Old Forge doesn't that refer to the fact that we're entitled?

whether you're entitled or not because the casino still sits within Plains Township.

So they're only allowing you to stop a parlor, slots parlor from coming into your town. The only one that can do it is

Mohegan Sun because they're the only casino within 25 miles. Nobody else can put one in here.

MR. FEBBO: But when the benefits come out don't they use that word host community?

ATTY. RINALDI: You get a share now of the gambling funds.

MS. BARTOLETTI: We apply for it.

There's no guarantee but we apply for it.

ATTY. RINALDI: You only get one shot at saying no.

MR. FERRETT: If we don't they automatically get it?

ATTY. RINALDI: Automatically, if they come up and say we want to put a slot parlor in you can't stop them. You have

until the 31th to say no.

MR. NOTARI: Couple towns just opted out. It was in the paper this past week.

Jessup or Jermyn, somewhere up the valley.

MR. FEBBO: So we can put that on the agenda for the next meeting?

ATTY. RINALDI: Yes, and you can talk about it. They didn't give you a very big window.

MR. LENCESKI: Any other questions?

Public sign in, please. Justin Fiori?

MR. FIORI: I recently moved back to the area after 25 years and I purchased the home my parents lived in at 203 West Grace Street, the corner of Lawrence and Grace. My fiance is completely blind, she has no vision at all, and I'm looking on here to see if we can get a handicap placard on the Lawrence side of the house for a vehicle to park. We also have a 17-month-old baby girl, and she has two children, seven and nine, that will be joining us in January.

So I was reading through the rules, and I noticed that if I have a driveway or a place to park my vehicle, that it would be

potentially denied because of that. So I'm here to appeal that, proactively appeal that, to see if you guys would allow us to have that because the driveway and garage that I do have, as you may or may not know, it's pretty much close to Ray's and it's some distance from my side door entrance. My fiance never experienced snow or ice before. This is her first time.

So with all the original challenges that we do have in front of us, I was hoping to see if we can get that granted to us. The main reason is because it's a very active corner. There's funerals, sometimes daily. I've been there about a week and there's been daily funerals. Basketball in the evening at Saint Mary's and, of course, the weekends. So that's what I'm here to request.

MR. FEBBO: This is Loicano's old house?

MR. PARKER: Chris Donati's house.

MR. FEBBO: So you're looking for a placard across from the rectory?

MR. FIORI: On the Lawrence side of

the street. There's a side entrance to the 1 2 house. 3 MR. LENCESKI: Bill, can we put that 4 on the agenda for next regular meeting? 5 ATTY. RINALDI: I'd like him to at 6 least go through the process with Marylynn. MS. BARTOLETTI: You were already 7 8 here today. Right? 9 MR. PARKER: I filled out the 10 application and paid my \$10, yeah. 11 ATTY. RINALDI: It's not going to be 12 exclusive to you. Just so you know that. 13 On Sundays anybody going to church is 14 probably going to jump in that spot. 15 MR. FIORI: With a handicapped 16 placard. 17 MR. NOTARI: I thought we can make 18 it exclusive to him. 19 MAYOR MULKERIN: I thought it was 20 numbered so that it was to a specific 21 applicant. 22 ATTY. RINALDI: It's to the 23 applicant, but you can't preclude anybody 24 else that's handicapped from using it. 25 MAYOR MULKERIN: A couple months ago

we were told different. 1 2 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: We gave Mrs. 3 Wilk one, I thought. 4 ATTY. RINALDI: We went through this 5 and I straightened out Mrs. Wilk that, no, it's not just hers. It's anybody 6 handicapped. That's a state law. 7 MS. BARTOLETTI: Mrs. Wilk has 8 something different now. She has one that 9 10 has a number on it. 11 MR. FIORI: I did notice other 12 people. 13 MR. FERRETT: He has to have a 14 special permit. ATTY, RINALDI: That's what we're 15 16 talking about. MR. FEBBO: There is such an animal? 17 18 MR. FERRETT: You can't do that, have a special permit where it's only 19 20 special parking for that person? 21 MS. BARTOLETTI: That's how it was 22 decided with Mrs. Wilk. 23 ATTY. RINALDI: That's news to me. 24 MR. PAPI: It has a specific number, 25 the license plate number, on the underneath

1 of the sign. 2 MR. FEBBO: Issued by us? Is that a 3 state ruling? 4 MR. PAPI: That's what we did at a 5 meeting one night. Council decided to make it specific for her and her alone. 6 7 MS. BARTOLETTI: That one would have to be handled the same way. 8 9 ATTY. RINALDI: Everything I've 10 seen, the ones marked handicapped --11 MR. FEBBO: Where did the sign come 12 from, state issue? MR. PAPI: No, I went down and 13 14 ordered it. 15 MR. FIORI: The other question is 16 how is it enforced if someone else does park there? 17 MAYOR MULKERIN: Now, I believe that 18 you can call the police and it would be a 19 20 violation. Would it be a tow or would it 21 just be a parking violation? 22 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Have to be properly 23 posted if it's going to be towed or just a 24 fine. Like the one we had changed down

here.

There was no fine. So that has to be

25

1 properly posted. It's the same as the one 2 that's at the borough building. 3 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: My advice 4 would be that we should just structure it 5 the same way we structured Mrs. Wilk's. 6 That's how I think we should do it. 7 MAYOR MULKERIN: I think the sign included a fine. Doesn't it have a fine? 8 9 MR. PAPI: I know all the handicap 10 signs we put down the football stadium all 11 have the fine. 12 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: We should keep 13 them all structured the same, because I 14 think if we get people in the future we 15 should just set one precedent and keep 16 going. 17 MR. NOTARI: Because it is 18 definitely going to be a problem there. The other question is, 19 MR. FIORI: 20 with the weather changing, how does that go 21 to putting a sign up? Do we have a small 22 window of time? 23 MR. PAPI: Concrete sidewalk? 24 MR. FIORI: Yes. 25 MR. PAPI: We'll drill a hole right

through the sidewalk and hammer a three-foot piece of steel right into the ground and bolt the sign to the top. We can do that next week, two weeks.

MR. FEBBO: Do you have a handicapped tag on your both vehicles?

MR. FIORI: Yes, we do. We only have one vehicle.

MR. LENCESKI: Thank you. We'll have Bill look into that matter, find out exactly what is going on, and then if you want to come back and go through the process we'll have that information for you on the December 19th meeting.

At this time, we'll go through our councilmen, see if they want to put something on the agenda for the upcoming meeting.

MR. NOTARI: Nothing for the agenda, but I just remembered 123 Corcoran, now that Mr. Hoover is here, the lip into the driveway.

MR. HOOVER: They're supposed to take care of it tomorrow.

MR. FERRETT: Nothing.

MR. FEBBO: No.

MR, RUSSELL RINALDI: Just if Mr. Fiori -- and I'm sure he will -- gets all of his paperwork I'd like to see that on the agenda. I'm sure you will.

MR. LENCESKI: I have nothing. Ι just want to thank -- we have some members of the Snow Forge committee here, Marylynn, Rick and Mayor Mulkerin, and I just want to say great job. Family had a great time. Every year it gets better and we're looking forward to next year. Thank you all for your time and effort into it, everyone else who was part of it.

At this time I'll make a motion to adjourn.

MR. NOTARI: I'll make a motion to adjourn.
