We need to get it signed by the 8 Borough and get him the contract back and then issue 9 notice to proceed. So, I'll talk with you afterwards 10 on that. 11 The project at the DPW, we did some cost 12 estimating. And we kind of feel that being that the 13 cost come in under the number you need to bid it, three 14 quotes, instead of putting it through a bidding 15 process, so we can do that at any time. 16 If you guys want to let us know who you 17 want us to go through, we can send it out. 18 MR. FEBBO: Need three bids or quotes? 19 It's going to be over 10 or 20? 20 MR. LOPATKA: Over 10. So we need three 21 written quotes. I think, what's the requirement, 22 20,100 or something? 23 MS.
