the borough, and it doesn't go unnoticed and it was very appreciated. So I thank you once again.

Now I have a couple questions. In your report you talked about the 2008 Ford F-550 that you feel is no longer operable. We need to replace that vehicle?

MR. PAPI: Yes. We're currently doing that.

MS. BARTOLETTI: I don't know if you heard us talking earlier, that we had one on order for four months. We were notified it's not going to be available through that dealer any longer. I believe that we're already set up to be able to order one from a different dealer.

MR. NOTARI: Is that included in the budget?

MS. BARTOLETTI: Yes.

MR. NOTARI: The subsidence at Pero Park, you were out to fix it with your crew?

MR. PAPI: Yes.

MR. NOTARI: What's the status?

MR. PAPI: We cut the grass there today. It looked just like it did when we

finished it. We pack it with the backhoe with gravel and modified, two tons of topsoil on top.

MR. NOTARI: Did we have that problem there before?

MR. PAPI: The problem is happening all over town. I've seen subsidences in people's yards.

MR. NOTARI: That's the amount of water. It's nothing major?

MR. PAPI: No.

MR. NOTARI: I received some concerns and I spoke to Marylynn about it. She assured me it wasn't anything major. There's stories going around town that they were expecting the entire field to open up. I was a little nervous about that, but I'm glad it was put to rest. I'm glad we were able to take care of that.

MR. PAPI: It was about an eight-foot circle.

MR. SEMENZA: About five feet deep, maybe.

MR. NOTARI: Paul, the Taylor side of Sibley Avenue, it seems like the gas

company is cleaning that out. Do we know why?

MR. PAPI: I would think just so they have access to their gas line.

MR. HOOVER: DEP ordered them to clean all their right-of-ways, so if something should happen they don't have to worry about the trees being in the way.

MR. PAPI: Probably get a vehicle in there.

CHIEF DUBERNAS: They said they were supposed to clean it out for the last four years.

MR. HOOVER: They're mandating the gas and the water, we have to clean our right-of-ways out.

MR. NOTARI: The drain at the Old Forge cemetery on Smith Street. Obviously we have problems all over town. The rain water was coming from somebody's yard, actually, spilling out from the old -- where the pines are, spilling through the Mancuso driveway and onto that road and right over that drain. I realize there's probably nothing we can do at the moment to fix that.

Maybe in the future we can take a look. I know the day after, when everything was stopped, I looked. The pipe is not very big. My guess was that's why the water was just not flowing into the pipe and just flowing right into the --

MR. SEMENZA: You have to realize how much water we had.

MR. NOTARI: I'm not complaining,
I'm just saying for the future or if anybody
has any questions about it, that pipe just
doesn't look like it can handle that water.
A lot of our pipes couldn't handle the
water. It was just one of those storms that
in the future, when we talk about water
management, wastewater management, that's
something we can point to and look at. I
know we had trouble with that drain when we
paved and then he fixed it.

MR. PAPI: We had trouble with water getting into it.

MR. NOTARI: The water was just running right over it.

MR. LOPATKA: That happened a lot of places.

MR. NOTARI: I noticed across the street from where it was coming out of that person's driveway and not going down that other drain that's across the street a little farther down. Obviously that's how we designed it.

MR. PAPI: I was told the cemetery was under water.

MR. NOTARI: It was. At least --

MR. HOOVER: To the flag.

MR. NOTARI: At least 60 or 70 yards, to the middle road that you drive through. From that point to Smith Street, yeah, a good 60 yards.

One other question. It could be for Dave, Paul. I'm not sure. Obviously I don't think we do, but does Saint John's Creek get cleaned out at all? Is that the property owner's concern? Is that the borough's concern? Whose responsibility would that be? Maybe Bill can help us.

MR. SEMENZA: I don't think it would be a borough concern.

MR. LOPATKA: It's actually a named stream, so to clean it out you'd have to

actually get a permit to do it. It would be a DEP issue. I know it's overgrown.

MR. NOTARI: If it was cleaned out or taken care of a little better it may have helped us with --

MR. PAPI: It went over the bridge.

It was just a volume of water. It was more than the bridge could handle.

MR. NOTARI: Even throughout town, off Oak Street.

MR. SEMENZA: I've walked that creek from Sibley Avenue all the way down to the river.

MR. NOTARI: Does the council send a letter to DEP asking it to be cleaned out?
Who would do that?

MR. FERRETT: I don't think you're going to have much of a problem because of the fact that most of the sewer lines that come in from Taylor, all the way down, go into Lower Lack, goes in that creek all the way down. That's one of the reasons why you can't open up that creek or drain that creek or go in deeper and clean it out.

MR. SEMENZA: Cleaning out the

clean it, but whose responsibility is it to take care of it? Is it ours?

MR. LOPATKA: I don't know. If it's not on borough land it's probably the landowner's responsibility to cut whatever is fallen over in it. The big thing with cleaning it out overall is you just have to be careful that you're not disturbing the whole --

MR. NOTARI: I read the manual.

MR. LOPATKA: You can't go in there and disturb the bottom. You can cut down the vegetation, stuff like that probably without a permit. If you're going to get in the creek and do anything to kind of clean anything out of the creek you'll need a permit.

MR. SEMENZA: Make some calls.

MR. LOPATKA: I'll make a call.

MR. NOTARI: That's all I have for Paul.

MR. SEMENZA: Paul, I'd also like to echo off Rick and say fantastic job done by all. I'd also like to thank Mike Kaminsky. You did a fantastic job. Thank you.

MR. HOOVER: The sign on Sussex
Street, no left turn, it's off the pole and crooked. See if you can raise it. It's tilted.

MR. SEMENZA: Anybody else have questions for Paul? Thanks.

Anybody have any questions for Steve? First, Steve, do you have anything to add to your report?

MR. BIERYLA: I do. You were asked about that property on Edith Street, West Grace Street, dilapidated and filthy. It went up for tax sale and nobody bought it. It's in repository up at the tax office, and there's a tax due of about \$3,600. That's where it's sitting right now.

MR. SEMENZA: Basically that sale fell through, that guy that was going to buy it?

MR. BIERYLA: Yes.

MR. SEMENZA: Where do we go from here now?

MR. BIERYLA: I'd ask our attorney what do you do now?

ATTY. RINALDI: Well, you can tell

somebody to buy it or you can go up and put in a bid to buy it. Probably cheaper than -- well, you want to tear it down anyway. Get the word out that somebody can probably put in a bid for a couple hundred dollars and get it.

MR. SEMENZA: Thirty-six hundred?

ATTY. RINALDI: I don't think that's the minimum bid.

MR. BIERYLA: They would take less.

ATTY. RINALDI: They'll have a minimum that they want.

MR. BIERYLA: We have to go up every year and hire somebody to clean it.

ATTY. RINALDI: There's nobody there that's going to do the work. It's going to be up to us. See if council wants to purchase it and tear it down, try and sell it.

MR. NOTARI: I think if we were to purchase it we could use CDBG funds, I believe, to demolish it.

ATTY. RINALDI: Check with Marylynn.

MR. SEMENZA: We'll hold off on that. Anything else?

MR. BIERYLA: No.

MR. SEMENZA: Anybody have any questions for Steve? Steve, behind Bridge Street, that house back there that we've had some trouble with garbage, have you been back there lately?

MR. BIERYLA: Yes. I've asked the chief to try and get me a number because the husband -- prior to this the wife was living there, had a PFA on the husband, so the husband couldn't come. Then she moved out. Don't know where she went.

MR. SEMENZA: Somebody's living in there because there's lights on. Today there's lights on. There's garbage bags on the porch five feet high.

CHIEF DUBERNAS: He was locked up for a while.

MR. BIERYLA: I posted it heavy, clean up the rubbish. If there's somebody there I guess we'll have -- either during the day or evening.

MR. SEMENZA: Give it a shot tomorrow, see if you can find anybody.

CHIEF DUBERNAS: I'll have my guys

neighborhood, I received a complaint from a resident of 405 Dunn Avenue that there's an empty lot next to their home that is also overgrown. In front it doesn't look that bad, but in the back of the lot -- I mean, it's all trees, all junk, but the back of the lot there are weeds and grass at least four feet high.

I believe the property owner, from the research I did, and I don't know if it's updated, same property owner that owns the property between Hill Crest and Kohler.

It's not very big. If you can just take a look tomorrow.

MR. BIERYLA: It's not the same owner. I know where you mean. It has a garage on it in back.

MR. NOTARI: I don't think there's anything on the property. It's on Dunn Avenue. I'm guessing it's 407. It could be nothing that we can do. It could just be the way I'm looking at it. That's why I'd like you to take a look at it, if possible.

MR. BIERYLA: At this point I probably have about 35 of those properties.

I'm trying to pick them off one at a time.

MR. NOTARI: I appreciate that. I appreciate the time concerns because of the weather we've had this summer. There's a lot of overgrown problems. Empty lots are something we need to take care of, too.

In that vein, the bottom of Moosic Road, what is that zoned, the properties there?

MR. BIERYLA: C-2.

MR. NOTARI: There's one property that seems to be collecting cars and tires right across the railroad tracks, on the right. As councilman Semenza said, we're going after people in town regardless of -- if they're not living up to the standards we abide by. It seems like that's turning into a junkyard. It seems like the property on the corner is turning into a junkyard. There's all cars parked there. It doesn't look like there's anything for sale or anything being sold.

MR. BIERYLA: The one, they took a big hit in the flood.

MR. NOTARI: Even before the flood

it was overgrown and not taken care of. In your travels just take a look. Let me know if something needs to be done there. I know the one property has tires stacked nicely, but still it's out in the open, exposed. We're not running a junkyard in this borough. I hope that people don't feel that way.

Lastly what I have is the property on the corner of Moosic Road and Maxon Drive. I know we had some residents come in at the work session regarding that property, the Scavo and Caputo property.

MR. BIERYLA: The property was cleaned up.

MR. NOTARI: The property is not cleaned up.

MR. BIERYLA: As far as hedges and grass.

MR. NOTARI: There's cars on the property, on the street. Some have license plates, some I don't know if they do. If you can look into that. I've been approached by a couple members.

MR. BIERYLA: He's in the process of

putting up a fence and he's getting the property surveyed. Then the imperious cover as to what kind of cover he can give the cars that are on the property right now. So as soon as the surveyor comes back and calculates that. I know he can't put a building up because the impervious cover would probably be over, but if he put some kind of carport up, or if the impervious cover is on the line, meets the standards or gets a variance for those standards to put those cars under cover, then that's where he's at right now.

MR. NOTARI: What does our ordinance state in terms of cars being parked in yards? I've seen a couple places in town --

MR. BIERYLA: Have to be registered.

MR. NOTARI: So if there's a license plate on a car it can be parked anywhere in the yard?

MR. BIERYLA: If it's registered.

If it's a classic, antique. He has four of them sitting there covered up. They're registered. They're not junk. Different classification.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: If they're junk they can't be there.

MR. BIERYLA: Junk is junk.

MR. NOTARI: Chief, that same property, can you look at the cars?

MR. NOTARI: So that process is under way. Thank you.

CHIEF DUBERNAS: He has to get them registered, remove them, or once we get the paperwork from the state we can actually take possession of them and have the salvager take them.

MR. NOTARI: That can be up to a 90-day process?

CHIEF DUBERNAS: Four to six weeks.

Majority of people act on them before we take them.

MR. SEMENZA: Anybody else?

MR. BIERYLA: On that property on Orchard Street, I went to the magistrate, it came back unclaimed. Now, does council want the magistrate to, because it's a civil matter, send out the constable to serve

them?

MR. SEMENZA: I would think we have to.

MR. HOOVER: That's the next step, isn't it?

MR. BIERYLA: No, that was unclaimed registered mail through the magistrate.

MR. NOTARI: Nothing has been done at that property. Right?

MR. BIERYLA: Nothing. Nothing since it's been boarded up, so the answer is yes.

MR. SEMENZA: Anybody else have any questions for Steve? Thanks, Steve.

Everybody has Dave's report.

MR. LOPATKA: I don't really have much going on. I think I have to give Bill a map for the church where we want to put the division line, breaking a piece out, creating two lots. I have to get that over to Bill.

I apologize for the last meeting. I was actually out of town and didn't realize there was a meeting. My fault. I'll get it over to him probably before the end of the

week. 1 MR. HOOVER: Corcoran Street 2 sidewalks will be done next week, paving by 3 September 10th. 4 MR. LOPATKA: All the other work was 5 finished. I think we closed out their 6 contract. 7 MS. BARTOLETTI: Yes. 8 MR. SEMENZA: Anybody have any 9 questions for Dave? 10 MR. NOTARI: Kohler Avenue, are we 11 ready to start that project yet? 12 MR. LOPATKA: We've been ready. 13 MR. NOTARI: We're waiting on the 14 15 county. MS. BARTOLETTI: There is one piece 16 of equipment there. 17 MR. LOPATKA: I got an e-mail today. 18 They're trying to put it off until next 19 year. I said I don't think the borough is 20 going to be too happy. 21 MR. NOTARI: I thought at our work 22 session somebody told -- Marylynn mentioned 23 two weeks. 24 MS. BARTOLETTI: That's what they 25

said.

MR. LOPATKA: We got an e-mail from the county and, I guess, a letter from the contractor seeing if he can put it off.

MR. HOOVER: Who is the contractor?

MR. LOPATKA: Snowden.

MS. BARTOLETTI: His associate was at the meeting, pre-construction, after the changes.

It was supposed to be MR. LOPATKA: started within two weeks. We had the other pre-construction meeting. At that time it was supposed to be started in two weeks. There was a letter from the contractor asking to put it off until spring. Μv comment back was, first of all, it's not up It's the county's project. I said I know the borough is not going to be happy if they have to wait until springtime. It got pushed off from the end of last year to the beginning this year, and now they're asking if they can -- if the guy bids, they should maybe look at the next bidder. It's the county's decision. The county's funding the project.

MR. LOPATKA: I'll find out tomorrow.

CHIEF DUBERNAS: I'd like to post that road that says no parking.

MR. SEMENZA: Thanks, Dave. Chief?

CHIEF DUBERNAS: Just what I gave

you. For the last couple weeks I've been

getting a complaint from a lady on South

Main Street about a traffic study. I contacted James May. He said they don't do it. So I'm just in the process of waiting back from him for an answer. But he doesn't think they're going to be able to lower the speed limit because that's classified as a commercial zone. It's only 35 going into Duryea, which is a 25 on both our ends. We don't make the decision, the state does.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Are those the strips going across the street?

CHIEF DUBERNAS: Yeah.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: They have them on Union Street, too. Who put those there?

CHIEF DUBERNAS: They wanted to count how many cars. Lonesome Road, their detour says to go out to Main Street. Their detour will run Bridge Street to Drake Street to Dick Street, back to Main Street in Moosic.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Are there other strips?

CHIEF DUBERNAS: There's supposed to be a set somewhere in front of Lucarelli's Body Shop.

MR. FEBBO: Keyser Avenue.

CHIEF DUBERNAS: They're talking about three months.

MR. FEBBO: Chief, you're saying three months?

CHIEF DUBERNAS: That's the time they were trying to give a time frame around. They're supposed to pave Main Street in Moosic to Main Street in Old Forge. I'm not sure if that's the time frame to rebuild it and pave the entire road or is that just rebuild the 200-foot section.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Dave, when is the cutoff for paving, usually, PennDOT?

MR. LOPATKA: It used to be the end of October but it's been getting extended because of the weather. It's been nice until Christmas.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Three months, that's pretty close. That's taking us right to November 30th.

MR. LOPATKA: It all depends. The weather's been warm through Christmas.

MR. FEBBO: Anything we can do to

expedite that?

MR. LOPATKA: PennDOT? Can't help you there.

MR. NOTARI: I know we've had discussions, me and you. Is there anyone we can contact, write a letter to ask them to survey that land at the river and can they build a flood protection wall or even build it up?

MR. SEMENZA: Me and Marylynn talked about this. I think we're going to have to maybe contact the Army Corps of Engineers, see if they can do something. I don't know. I don't know who you contact for dikes. It has to be the state?

MR. LOPATKA: It would be the Army Corps. They'd have to come and do a study. It would take years. It's worth a phone call.

MR. NOTARI: Can we ask them to do that? Can we send a letter? I think we really need to do at least something.

MR. SEMENZA: Second time in eight, seven years the road washed out.

MR. LOPATKA: That would be a major

study, a major project.

MR. NOTARI: PennDOT should be pushing for that, too. How many times do we want to rebuild the road.

Chief, the letter that you included in our packet regarding canvassing, do we need to put credence to this letter? We do have ordinances in the borough forbidding canvassing without registering with the borough. Correct?

CHIEF DUBERNAS: Yes. We have a form they pay to fill out for background checks.

MR. NOTARI: This is nothing we need to worry about?

MR. SEMENZA: The only ones were religious.

CHIEF DUBERNAS: Right now there's probably 25 of them from the church in Duryea going around. Every Friday the guy sends me a list of all his parishioners that are going to be out and about.

MR. SEMENZA: Do we want to add politicians to that?

MR. NOTARI: They would need to

1 register. Probably. MR. SEMENZA: Everybody should think 2 it over to add politicians to it. Include. 3 Right now they're exempt. 4 MR. NOTARI: I didn't think anybody 5 was exempt except the church. 6 MR. SEMENZA: Steve, no politicians 7 ever register, do they? 8 MR. BIERYLA: Never. 9 MR. SEMENZA: I never registered. 10 MR. NOTARI: What this letter is 11 12 saying is our police force was in the wrong, that these are politicians going around. 13 MR. SEMENZA: No, because I stopped 14 somebody and they weren't. When they handed 15 me the letter it had nothing to do with a 16 17 politician on it. CHIEF DUBERNAS: It was some town 18 hall meeting. 19 MR. SEMENZA: Do you have a permit? 20 We don't need a permit. I called Jason. 21 MS. BARTOLETTI: Was it in regard to 22 the property taxes? The people who didn't 23 answer their door or weren't home they taped 24 the letter to their front door. That's what 25

we were getting a lot of complaints about.

People were a little intimidated by having a letter taped to their front door. The people were supposedly with Frank Scavo but they didn't say they were with him. It was about a different topic.

MR. NOTARI: So returning to your question, personally I don't think anybody should be exempt. Anybody could walk the streets and knock on doors and say they're so and so.

MR. SEMENZA: I don't think legally we can stop church people.

ATTY. RINALDI: There are a couple cases on who you can.

MR. NOTARI: Anybody we could make exception for, I don't think we should.

Come and register. That's my opinion.

MR. SEMENZA: Me, too.

MR. NOTARI: We have an elderly community. We see it on the news, in the paper who is representing the water company and they're not, who's representing this person. If you don't know me, I can knock on the door -- and I'm sure there's a lot of

neighborhoods in town that people don't know me and I can knock on the door and be anybody, say I'm running for council.

MR. SEMENZA: In that ordinance does it state that politicians are exempt or somebody running for political office?

ATTY. RINALDI: There's a case that came out. It said you can't stop them. I don't know there's politicians involved.

That was only based on religion.

MR. SEMENZA: See if it's updated.

ATTY. RINALDI: I remember doing this when we recodified the code.

MR. NOTARI: We don't want to stop anybody, we just want to know what they're doing.

MR. BIERYLA: Dealing with
Mr. Scavo, when I called up the party who
was down the line for the campaign for that
they were very vocal about Blake is running
scared and this is all a scam. I explained
to her all I'm asking for is that -- we have
an elderly community. Kindly put a list
together, I gave her my e-mail address, I
said so we can notify the authorities that

if they get somebody knocking on the door you're going to be in town and you're not impersonating anybody. I can say I'm with your group. That's all I'm asking. It's like religious groups. We just ask them to notify us that you're in town. We're not going to stop you. All we want to know is you're here and who are you. If you get asked what group you're with and you come up with Franklin or Abraham Lincoln you're not with that group. You have no idea.

MR. SEMENZA: Anybody have anything else for he chief? Thanks, Chief. You guys did a great job also.

Bill, solicitor's report, please.

Everybody has Bill's packet. Any questions for Bill?

ATTY. RINALDI: You have a couple ordinances tonight and a few resolutions to pass. One outstanding question is do you want to share the cost of appraisals. If you see that letter there, the tax assessment appeals. I attached the order with a schedule to Stocki so everybody would know.

MR. NOTARI: The tax appraisals, is that something that the landowner is asking for?

appeal is filed it goes to the county, so the county assessor attorney, which is attorney Carey, files an answer, the school district files an answer, we file an answer because we're three different taxing bodies. So if we don't want to oppose it there's no sense getting an appraisal. If you want to oppose it we need an appraisal. She's saying we'll share the cost three ways between the school district, the borough and the county.

MR. NOTARI: Again, who asks for these appraisals? The county is asking to do appraisals on these properties?

ATTY. RINALDI: The county is, right, because they appealed the assessment. The county didn't lower their assessment. They're appealing it and the county is saying no, and the school district -- we basically all filed the same complaints now. It's what the county assessed you at. You

can see what the market levels are compared to what the fair market values are with regard to mortgages and the appraisals submitted by the appellant. Which would be --

MR. SEMENZA: So it would be, like, \$750?

ATTY. RINALDI: So they're asking for 25 from us, 50 percent from the school district, and 25 from the county because the majority of the taxes go to the school district. So we're looking at 25 percent of \$3,000, which is \$750. It's cheaper than getting our own, unless you don't want to really contest the appeal and just stay in the case.

MR. SEMENZA: That something we need to go to the table with?

ATTY. RINALDI: Yes.

MR. NOTARI: We should contest the appeal. That's what the county is doing.

ATTY. RINALDI: It's actually three appraisal amounts. It would be \$2,250.

MR. SEMENZA: Between \$3,000 and \$3,500. Right?

ATTY. RINALDI: Right.

MR. SEMENZA: We'll put that to a vote.

ATTY. RINALDI: Let me know.

Otherwise, everybody has the ordinances in front of them. Somebody wants to make an amendment on the hours on the one, which you can do when it comes up.

The other resolutions are CDBG, civil service, and a second one for CDBG funds. Marylynn can explain those.

MR. SEMENZA: Anybody have any questions for Bill? Thanks, Bill.

Marylynn, borough manager's report, please.

MS. BARTOLETTI: First, everyone has my financial report. Does anyone have any questions for me? Earlier in the meeting, when you guys were talking about the waterways and who is responsible for maintaining, I went back to my office because I got an e-mail today that there's a guideline for maintaining streams in the community, but there's three different parts of it.

So what we'll do is probably

myself -- and I'll give a copy to Paul to take a look at it. There's a lot of things that people, individuals, if it happens to run through their property, what they can do, what the municipality can do. It's put out by the DEP, and it's basically what you have to go through if you want to do any work that is above and beyond what they talk about in here. You go through the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission.

Once we get through all this and figure it out -- there's quite a few papers -- we'll let you guys know.

MR. LOPATKA: I think that depends on the type of waterway.

MS. BARTOLETTI: Exactly.

MR. SEMENZA: I don't know how much of Saint John's Creek is going to be considered a waterway because it doesn't always flow.

MR. LOPATKA: That's one thing that may not kick it back to Fish and Boat because it doesn't consistently flow.

MR. SEMENZA: They might not considered that.

MS. BARTOLETTI: We'll take a look at it, see if there's anything that has to do with us or not. One other thing is about the circumstances on Mine Street that we were back and forth on. The very top of Mine Street. I do have a little bit more information on that. I'm not sure if anyone has seen it, but I did get a map from Steve today that we're going to take a look at later. The guidelines where our property ends and where other ones begin.

Other than that, it's just basically everything that Bill talked about. We have the resolutions, the CDBG. When we come to that point, if there's any questions you can ask at that point. That's it.

MR. SEMENZA: Okay. Anybody have any questions for Marylynn?

MR. NOTARI: Mare, thanks for your work with the storm. I know you were here late. Appreciate it.

MR. SEMENZA: At this time the chair will go down the table, see if anybody has anything to address.

MAYOR LEGG: The only thing I have

is on Saturday we hung the 250th and final flag. The group asked me to again thank council, thank Paul and the DPW crew, and especially Marylynn. She's been tremendous throughout the whole thing.

Also, a week tomorrow is the get together over Arcaro's. I believe Judge Munley is going to be there, Commissioner O'Malley is supposed to be there. If anyone knows anyone who served in the military between 1955 and 1975 please let me know. They're going to be handing out pins. If they can't make it, make sure we'll get a pin to them. That's all I have.

MR. SEMENZA: Councilman Febbo?

MR. FEBBO: No, I'm good.

MR. NOTARI: I'd just like to report that the school committee met last Tuesday with members of the school board and school district administration, and we presented to the school that the borough would like to keep status quo on keeping a police officer patrolling the high school and elementary, how we did it in the spring. We informed them we'd like to keep that at least until

December. They were fine with that. They appreciated our work, us working with them.

We will meet again within the next month of so to begin discussing 2019 in terms of how the budgets may be affected and how we can prepare keeping a police officer in the school in 2019. Both the school and the borough have applied for grants to help with that. Again, thanks to Marylynn and thanks to the chief for getting our portion of that grant done and submitted. Hopefully we'll have a shot at getting some funds from the state, Safe Schools grant, to help with that.

Also, I'd like to thank the EMS director, Mike Kaminski, for the work he did this week as well. A lot of guys were out that didn't have to be out but they were to help the people in town. Mike, thanks very much.

I would like to ask if we can have a brief executive after the meeting to discuss sewer personnel.

MR. SEMENZA: Councilman Ferrett?

MR. FERRETT: Nothing.

MR. SEMENZA: Councilman Hoover?

MR. HOOVER: I just want to reiterate that Mike, the fire department, they did a great job, and also everybody else over the last few weeks. That's it.

MR. LETTIERI: Nothing.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Just two
things. To echo off the mayor, I spoke with
a guy today and directed him to you. He's
going to come down and donate his time.
He's going to photograph the event for you
guys. He's a retired vet. He was in the
air force eight years. He's from West Side.
I told him to be here about five but call
you guys for details.

Also, I'd just echo off all the other council members. Great job by everyone involved, all the crews, especially some council members. I was away on vacation and I was in contact. You guys were also out there as well. Great job by everyone involved. It's good to come together like that and help out, help the residents and each other. Great job by everyone. That's all I have.

MR. SEMENZA: I have a few things.

I was in contact with Frank Pero and Pat
Reviello today about when is his son going
to be in. Frank said that he was coming in
on the 2nd. Is it possible we can do
something for the 2nd down there, Saturday
or Sunday?

MS. BARTOLETTI: This is all based on Anthony and the Tri-Boro --

MR. SEMENZA: Right. Pat said

Tri-Boro doesn't have games on the 2nd, it's on the 1st. Can you contact them?

MS. BARTOLETTI: Yes.

MR. NOTARI: Sunday, the 2nd.

MR. SEMENZA: Also, I know everybody keeps saying it, but I was around with watching Mike and Paul Papi and Chief Dubernas and Mark Tag and his crew. You really have to tip your hat to these guys. They were out for hours upon hours upon hours upon hours pumping basements, shutting streets down, doing whatever they can. It's unfortunate, what happened to us. People were mad, arguing about streets being blocked off. It wasn't the police or the

fire department or the borough that caused the storm. I think you guys all did a fantastic job. Thank you for all your volunteer help. That's all.

At this time we'll go to the public.

Andrea?

MS. RIVERA: I'm talking 220 Moosic Road. Conveniently the weeds were cut yesterday. There are a total of 13 cars there. Six are on the property, seven on the street. No one else can park anywhere. There's literally nowhere else to go. News about him putting up a fence is new and different. I'd like to know what the zoning is for a fence. How far away from property lines?

MR. SEMENZA: I think actually you can put it right on the line. Correct?

MR. BIERYLA: Correct.

MS. RIVERA: Well, that's going to pose a big problem. He's had it surveyed. That's my son-in-law's truck. He puts a fence here we're screwed.

MR. SEMENZA: The problem is, and I don't want to tell you this, but you can't

there. There's nowhere to go.

MR. RUSSEL RINALDI: If he wants to put up a fence, and according to the ordinance he could put it right on his property line, could you ask him to move it over a little bit? He won't do that?

MS RIVERA: You got it. He's made a garbage pit out of the area for years and years and he gets away with it.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Again, though, is he breaking any ordinances right now?

MS. RIVERA: He's buying and selling cars from his back yard. Up until a few weeks ago 90 percent of the cars on the street had for sale signs on them.

MR. FEBBO: Only so many cars a year. Four. They have to go -- he has to pay tax on them, have to have titles.

MR. SEMENZA: Say you have ten cars for sale and you only sell four. Are you still under the limit even though you tried to sell ten?

MR. FEBBO: Can have a four car deal and the state will start investigating. The only recourse you have if you think that

he's an illegal dealer is call the state police.

MR. SEMENZA: Department of Labor and Industry?

MR. FEBBO: No, the state police.

CHIEF DUBERNAS: All the cars we

MR. FEBBO: He buys a car and wants to get that title in his name he has to pay a tax on it and it will be registered. He does not have to put a tag on it, but then

filed paperwork on all came back to him.

it comes into the fact that if there's no tag on it it's parked illegally.

MS. RIVERA: There's no tags.

CHIEF DUBERNAS: Classified as abandoned. Some of them have no tags, some are registration. I know Kimbal sent four or five of them, he sent letters to already.

MR. FEBBO: If he has a tag he has to have insurance on the vehicle.

CHIEF DUBERNAS: Then some of them
were on the property. The ones on the
roadway, we sent the letters for abandoned.
That takes about a four or six week process.
In the meantime, he can go online or to

Northeast Title and Tag, get a tag, pay the \$36 transfer fee, put it on there, there's nothing we can do.

MR. FEBBO: It's registered and he has to have proof of insurance on each vehicle.

MR. NOTARI: What's that property zoned?

MR. HOOVER: R-2.

MR. NOTARI: He can't operate a business there. Correct? How can we prove that he's operating an illegal business if he is operating an illegal business?

MR. SEMENZA: On the other hand, how do you stop somebody saying well, I just have cars for sale. Can't I personally sell two vehicles that I have?

MR. FEBBO: I think that's going to fall into the chief's department where they have to check each vehicle for registration and see if it's registered and insured.

MR. SEMENZA: All them vehicles came back registered to his name.

CHIEF DUBERNAS: The ones on the road, four or five of them. I'm not

positive. I had a stack of certified mail I had to send to him.

MR. FEBBO: How many are in the yard?

CHIEF DUBERNAS: I'm not sure. I think Steve was handling the other ones.

MR. BIERYLA: I just spoke with him two days ago. That's why I know the grass got cut today, because it wasn't cut yesterday. I was over there yesterday talking to go him about the cars and about the building and about the property and about everything.

MR. FEBBO: So he's looking to make an enclosure so he keeps the six cars there.

MR. BIERYLA: Right. With the ordinance, if it's underneath cover and locked doors he's allowed to have them there.

MS. RIVERA: How far away from the property lines would he have to be with that building?

MR. BIERYLA: First of all, he has to do the impervious cover. That's his biggest issue. Then the property line is

seven foot.

MS. RIVERA: It's 20 from the rear of the property.

MR. BIERYLA: That's the house.

Accessory structure is seven foot.

MR. NOTARI: Would he need to come before planning for that or just file for a permit?

MR. BIERYLA: First he'd have to do the calculations through the surveyor, then he'd have to show plans of where he was going to put the building. That would go through the zone application, and then that would go through the building inspector. So that's the process right now.

MR. NOTARI: That was just the carport or the garage?

MR. BIERYLA: Structure. Carport still has to be the seven foot, but it's not a building where you're doing the impervious coverage on it.

MR. SEMENZA: Ann?

MS. WIKTOREK: I applied for a handicap parking permit in front of my house and I got denied.

MR. BIERYLA: She has a driveway. I have to.

MR. SEMENZA: I understand that. I just want to make sure your understand. You want to update council on the permit?

Anytime you have a driveway it's always denied. Correct, Steve?

MS. WIKTOREK: No, I know people that have driveways and have handicapped.

MR. SEMENZA: They initially get denied, then you have to come to council.

MR. BIERYLA: Underneath the ordinance, if they have off-street parking you cannot have a handicapped just because the off-street parking is your handicapped parking and I have to say no, and then the ordinance says to come to council and express your concerns or appeal my decision. But under the ordinance I have to say no if it's a feasible driveway.

MR. SEMENZA: Do you want to explain to council?

MS. WIKTOREK: We have a driveway, but the way the people park across the street, we can pull in and there's no way --

hard to find a spot in front of your house, and the issue is pulling out.

MR. LETTIERI: She can't get in and out of the driveway.

MS. WIKTOREK: You can't use it.

MR. FEBBO: Can we have the chief take a look at that and come up with a solution or some idea?

MR. SEMENZA: I think the street's so narrow and so tight with parking that if they can't get in their driveway -- you're handicapped, obviously. You applied for it. She has to park too far from her house.

MS. WIKTOREK: I park in my garage, and if I go grocery shopping I can't park in the front. By the time I unload I'm tired.

MR. NOTARI: If there's parking only on one side of the street and they're parking across from your driveway that handicapped spot's going to be across the street from your house.

MS. WIKTOREK: I don't care if they compromise, but they don't want to compromise with us.

MR. SEMENZA: Is there signs on that

street?

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: There's no signs.

CHIEF DUBERNAS: I know everybody parks on the right side because everybody has to travel on the left side to go down the road.

MR. SEMENZA: Who lives directly across from you?

MS. WIKTOREK: It's Soharas.

They're a young couple. They even put

letters in my mailbox a few years ago not to

park in front of their house. They think

they own the street. If we go somewhere

they're standing in the window, the go put a

vehicle there so none of us -- anybody comes

to visit us there's nowhere to park. I

think one-way street, narrow or not, each

household should have parking for one car to

make it peaceful.

ATTY. RINALDI: You should have the chief go up and do it. Make sure people can get in and out of their driveways.

MR. SEMENZA: By our next meeting we'll have a decision.

ATTY. RINALDI: If you get a handicap spot, that doesn't mean it's yours. Somebody else has a handicap can pull right in.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Chief, if she's having a hard time backing out of her driveway, if anyone in the borough's having a hard time backing out of their driveway due to the circumstances that the road is that narrow and tight, well, obviously we're going to send you over to do a study. Can't we restrict parking in a certain area so her car could be able to back out?

CHIEF DUBERNAS: Yeah, for the driveway. I'll look at it. Do they have a driveway?

MS. WIKTOREK: They do. He got so smart. Before he was driving his own car.

Now he brings the van home and parks his van and she parks hers and he leaves his on the street parked all day long. If he goes anywhere on weekends she backs hers out so he has the spot when he comes back.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: So where they park, that's blocking you? If the chief

goes down and does a study and he comes up with that taking a car out of your driveway with whoever is parking back there, if any vehicle's back there, there might not be -- we have to put a no parking sign there.

MR. SEMENZA: Chief, see what you can figure out for us, please. Jason and Mamie?

MS. TUCKER: He just wanted me to ask council about Austin Heights and Mine Street, with the flooding, since all of our homeowners insurance are denying coverage because we don't have flood insurance, and they won't give us flood insurance because there's no standing water. Is there a game plan? I know we had six and a half inches of rain in one day. We lost a lot of stuff.

MR. SEMENZA: I know. I don't know what to say. Really, the borough didn't cause the flood.

MS. TUCKER: Did it come from Ranson? Somebody found an eel in their yard.

MR. SEMENZA: The water coming off the mountain was crazy. It rained so much

that day.

MR. FEBBO: Act of God.

MR. SEMENZA: If you think about for the three weeks prior to that it rained more, so the ground couldn't hold that much water. I don't even know what to say.

MS. BARTOLETTI: Mike can say a couple words. He's up to date on the Lackawanna EMA and what options are available.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: I will say this, it's not a yes or no, I've heard it through conversation, I spoke to a lot of people around town. They filed a request through FEMA, and FEMA's been giving a lot of people funds. That's what I heard, if you wanted to give them a call.

MR. SEMENZA: Ronald?

MR. DOUGLAS: Ron Douglas. I live on 1298 Mine Street and I'm on the corner of Austin Street. I spoke with Paul. He invited me down here to the meeting to address an issue. Now, aside from what we had here, we had a flood. Too much water. That was a huge barrier for me to block.

I want to talk about a simple rainfall. Coming down there, I mean, years ago they had nice curb coming down on Austin Street, probably as wide as this podium here, with steps coming in. They left the pavement down and in, and a simple rainfall water's bailing over the side, coming down my steps, right at my house. So you can only imagine what happened that day.

MR. SEMENZA: I feel bad. It must have been horrible. That water coming off your house, I couldn't believe what I saw.

MR. PARKER: I had tarps in my archway and literally used the tarp to sandbag water and divert it away from the house. I mean, the levels rose so quick in that basement. I got it on video. That much water was pouring into the basement. That was a flooding situation. I want to talk about normal rain.

MR. SEMENZA: Around that bend, going down, you're saying a curb going around there?

CHIEF DUBERNAS: No, he's saying on Austin Street, where the steps goes down

into his house, the roadway is level with his steps. There's no curb there.

MR. DOUGLAS: There's no curb to back a simple rainfall up.

CHIEF DUBERNAS: Here is a curb but it's low.

MR. SEMENZA: Bituminous curb there?

All honesty, no curb would have stopped that water. I understand what you're saying.

MR. DOUGLAS: I'm requesting a higher curb in front of my steps.

MR. SEMENZA: Could you go up there and look at that, Paul, see what we can do.

MR. DOUGLAS: I had to put in my own drain system in my yard.

MR. SEMENZA: Do you get flooded on a normal rainstorm?

MR. DOUGLAS: A normal rainstorm I can have water in the basement if that gets -- like, if my trap -- I had to make my own trap to divert the water out to the road, but if that clogs up and spills over, yeah, that's going right into my basement. That's because of that low spot.

MR. FERRETT: The solution to a

problem of that nature because of the contour of the land and everything is if you go to work and put a storm drain. That would catch all the water before it goes -- I know what you're going to stay.

MR. SEMENZA: Ain't going to stop that problem, Joe. That storm, you weren't stopping it.

MR. PAPI: I think what you're worried about is the normal, everyday rain.

He wants a low curb to prevent normal water.

MR. SEMENZA: Take a look and see if we can put a bituminous curb up or something or if we have to send a contractor out to do something.

MR. PAPI: I'll call you.

MR. SEMENZA: At this time we'll go into new business. The chair will entertain a motion to accept resolution No. 3, Community Development Block Grant program to transfer \$2,894.71 from the Sampson Street storm water improvement project to the Kohler Avenue improvement project.

MR. NOTARI: I'll make that motion.

MR. SEMENZA: By Councilman Notari.

MR. SEMENZA: Seconded by Councilman Rinaldi. On the question? Public input? MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Febbo? MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Ferrett? MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Hoover? MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Notari? MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Rinaldi? MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Yes. MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Semenza? The next ordinance is a motion to accept ordinance No. 3, amending chapter 328, vehicles and traffic, section 328, 653, schedule ten, parking prohibited certain hours on the south side of West Grace Street. MR. HOOVER: Amended times on that?
