MR. LOPATKA: I don't know. The county kind of determines that. I know they have been pushing to get the plans back. The plans are back. I think they're going to have to start ASAP. I would think within the next two weeks.

ATTY. RINALDI: Did they reach out to you on the specs?

MR. LOPATKA: I talked to Tony and told him basically it's the information that I sent him, e-mailed the last time. Same specs.

MR. HOOVER: The change order is done, it's approved. They'll be there probably in a week. Got to at least sweep it up.

MR. LOPATKA: I'll call him tomorrow.

MR. SEMENZA: Anybody else? Thanks, Dave. Steve?

MR. BIERYLA: I have nothing.

MR. SEMENZA: Anybody have any questions for Steve? You have his report in your packet.

MR. NOTARI: Steve, bird feeders on Moosic Road?

MR. BIERYLA: Yes, sir. The was neighbor was complaining that the resident down there had six bird feeders which were empty and she had one up by her house. He was yelling and screaming at her and she's an 83-year-old woman. I told her to just please don't feed the birds at the one bird feeder because your neighbor's complaining about the birds.

MR. SEMENZA: From what I understand there was an excessive amount of birds and they were leaving droppings all over his property. I understand both sides.

MR. NOTARI: The calls that Steve gets.

MR. SEMENZA: Anybody have any questions for Steve?

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: I'm not sure if you were contacted by him or not, and I just saw him on the road a few days ago. On Grace Street, Mr. Kwitakowski, you know the house that we cut the vegetation once or twice in the past? He brought me down there the other day and I told him to contact you. That house is falling into his house.

MR. SEMENZA: Is that the house a couple years back --

MR. BIERYLA: We did it last year, too.

MR. SEMENZA: But somebody bought that property, I believe, didn't they?

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: There's a property management sign in the front yard.

MR. BIERYLA: That was supposed to go up for sheriff's sale this time around.

MR. SEMENZA: I thought when the Preate property went -- remember that time?

MR. BIERYLA: Yeah, but supposedly that one there was supposed to go for sheriff's sale again just at this last Tuesday's meeting.

MR. RUSSEL RINALDI: There's that

sign that's been in that front yard. Some type of property management. If you get a chance, just take a ride by and look. If you look, that house is, like, five inches away from his house. It's coming right into him. I mean, I don't know if there's anything we can do about that before it happens.

MR. BIERYLA: We can always condemn the house, then go back out because, like I said, what I believe was going to happen is Tuesday it was supposed to go up for -- last Tuesday for sherif's sale.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: He told me he was going to contact you. I'm not sure if he did.

MR. BIERYLA: He did not.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: I said we have a meeting Tuesday, I'll let you know. But he did say he was going to call you, too.

MR. BIERYLA: I'll look into it.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Just check it out.

MR. SEMENZA: Do we know who the owner is?

MR. BIERYLA: The party that asked to cut it last year was asking me just last week if we were going to have it cut again this year and I told him hold off, but then I was off.

MR. SEMENZA: Do we know who owns it?

 $$\operatorname{MR}.$$  BIERYLA: I've got to look at the map.

MR. SEMENZA: Anybody else? Thanks,
Steve. Chief, what do you have for us?

CHIEF DUBERNAS: The only thing I
have is the ENRADD system is coming either
July 31st or August 1st, and training will
be conducted the same day when it arrives.

I passed out three hires after the interviews we did.

MR. SEMENZA: Anybody have any questions for the chief? Thanks, Chief. Bill, solicitor's report?

ATTY. RINALDI: The only thing, I just need a response with regard to the fire company. I want to approach that. If you can maybe let me know if you want me to send a letter or if you want me to just send

something to them with regard to the fire company. It's in my report.

MR. SEMENZA: Anybody from council have a chance to review the lease agreement?

MR. NOTARI: I didn't.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: I didn't.

MR. SEMENZA: Will everybody on council review it and see what they think. It's pretty much cut and dry. Right?

ATTY. RINALDI: It's up to you, what you guys want to do. If you want to do a new one or not.

MR. SEMENZA: It's very, very simple. It doesn't really have any kind of -- did you see it?

MR. FEBBO: I breezed through it.

MR. SEMENZA: We'll talk about it at the next meeting, then we can do it after that.

ATTY. RINALDI: They want it complete on the Stocki property. Maybe set them up next week. I got a letter today.

That's all I have.

MR. SEMENZA: Anybody have any questions for Bill? Thanks, Bill.

Marylynn, borough manager's report, please.

MS. BARTOLETTI: Does anyone have any questions on any of the financial reports in your packets?

Just some quick information. The camp is doing very well. We average at least 100 children a day. There's over 250 signed up, so every day it seems like the crowd changes. But there's at least 100 there every day.

I put on your agenda today that
we're going to do a resolution, and it is
for the multi-modal transportation grant
that we are going to be applying for.
They're due at the end of this month. Joyce
is here, my partner in writing these grants.

MR. FEBBO: What is that grant?

MS. BARTOLETTI: It's to do the work on Main Street that we talked about, trying to change some of the poles and all of the utility lines, all that type of work. Right now we were thinking we would start at Grace Street and end at Moosic Road. Depending on what money is available, we would either try to do the whole thing or do it in phases.

We're not sure of that yet. So tonight we need to pass a resolution saying that everyone is in agreement that we are going to apply for this grant. As I said, it's due the end of this month.

Then we will be talking probably at the next meeting about another grant we're going to be applying for that is due in September. That's the one that we would use to remodel the borough building, as we've all discussed. I think that's all I need to talk to you about tonight.

MR. FERRETT: Where are we with the borough building?

MS. BARTOLETTI: We have a pretty decent idea of a plan, and what we're doing is we're applying for the Monroe Local Share Grant, which is the gambling money. I've already spoken to Senator Blake and Representative Kavulich, and they're both on board helping us to try to secure some funds. Somewhere around \$200,000, \$250,000.

MR. FERRETT: Do we have a draft of what the building is going to look like?

MS. BARTOLETTI: We are in the

process of that.

MR. FERRETT: That's not completed?

MS. BARTOLETTI: It's not completed because we are now working on the grant for Main Street, and that was due two months before the other one. I want to get that one all situated and then we'll go back to the building one.

MR. FERRETT: What about the discussions that we had one time before of possibly, possibly moving the police station to that building across the street?

MS. BARTOLETTI: We can probably talk about that --

MR. FERRETT: Okay. Just curious.

MR. NOTARI: The multi-modal grant, does that specific say Grace Street to Moosic Road?

MS. BARTOLETTI: It will. That's what our anticipated plan was. It could be changed because it's not -- the grant itself is not finished yet. I did want to say the reason why we are pushing so hard to get it in is because this particular round they're not asking for a match. Usually the match

is whatever we ask for. This particular time there is no match being asked for, so I'm trying to get it in really quickly.

MR. NOTARI: I'm only asking because my thought was why not start at Alicia Street, include those businesses that go to that corner and opposite. It's only one more block.

ATTY. RINALDI: When you make the motion just frame it as authorizing to submit a grant application for Main Street Streetscape Project.

MR. NOTARI: In terms of the details in the grant -- and I'm just throwing it out there because we do have a number of businesses in that block. Probably five or six, even. Then across the street three more. There's a good amount of businesses there. So just a thought.

MS. BARTOLETTI: The whole thing is once we find out if we are awarded grant money and how much that will change what we are able to do.

MR. SEMENZA: Anybody else? Thanks, Mare.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: We don't have to figure on how much we'll be applying for?

MS. BARTOLETTI: Not yet. We will. Hopefully by the end of the week. I'm putting it all together right now.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Do they basically let you just give them a number or is there a number they had set aside that's given?

MS. BARTOLETTI: No, they don't have anything set aside. Once we have the whole plan put together with the estimate of what this will cost to complete we send that in to them. Then if our project is picked, then they decide how much they'd be willing to give towards it.

MR. RUSSEL RINALDI: I wasn't sure if there was already a preset number they had.

MS. BARTOLETTI: No. It's very competitive. It's not one of those here, we'll throw it to you. It's very competitive.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: And it's only for Main Street, like, streetscapes?

MS. BARTOLETTI: That type of work or work on the street itself. There's several different criteria. The one we're using is to beautify our Main Street area.

MR. FEBBO: We're basically saying curb lines because the streets were just paved, we don't touch them for five years. Concerned about the telephone poles?

MS. BARTOLETTI: Yes. If we're able to do this project, what we would be doing is not touching -- for the most part not touching the pavement that was put down on Main Street. So what we would be doing is digging up all the sidewalks and any work that we would be doing in the sidewalk area.

We did figure out for the most part it is way out of our reach to be able to take poles completely down and run everything underground, so what we would be doing is taking the poles and moving them to the opposite side of the sidewalk. Then there would be a new type of pole, more aesthetically better looking.

MR. LOPATKA: Plus raising all the wiring up so it's, like, not right in the

tree line.

to.

MS. BARTOLETTI: Then because it will be for the most part new wiring a lot of what's there could be eliminated because at that point it should be updated. So we won't need as much up there. It's still beautifying. It's just not going to be exactly what everyone wanted, putting it underground. It's virtually impossible for us to do that.

MR. FERRETT: What's going to happen in the future? Are you going to expand that, say, a few years later down the road?

MS. BARTOLETTI: I'd love to be able

MR. FERRETT: Eventually there must be grants somewhere along the line because it seems like Pittston keeps going down.

MS. BARTOLETTI: Pittston is a very different scenario. Dave can explain to you their scenario with the poles, with the wiring. It's very different than what most communities have.

MR. LOPATKA: Some of the stuff

Pittston -- a lot of the power came not from

Main Street, it came from a back street service in a lot of those buildings, so they didn't have to relocate everything. Plus, on these poles there's probably about -- out of 17 poles there's probably six or seven businesses that have phase three electric going in, which would include they actually put a box in the ground for every one of those particular businesses, which is another cost. Plus you have to secure a right-of-way or have access easement.

MR. FERRETT: The only reason I ask that question is because I think it's only common sense once you start a project, once you end a project at a certain place people begin to start asking questions. How come you didn't go further, how come you didn't go this way. You like to try to have some answers.

MS. BARTOLETTI: If we could do the whole thing at once we would love to, but this little bit is millions.

MR. FERRETT: I understand. What
I'm saying is down the road because five
years from now you never know, there may be

it's called Multi-Modal Transportation Funds Program.

MR. SEMENZA: At this time the chair is going to go to public comment. Andrea?

MS. RIVERA: Andrea Scavo Rivera.

I'm here to talk about 220 Moosic Road.

You're talking about overgrown properties.

Have you tried pulling out of Maxson Drive

lately? You can't. The hedges, trees, the

cars, it goes on forever. Okay?

The past week and a half the owner,
Jim Caputo, has been taking apart the back
of the house. The roof, the room, the
carport that was there. There's no permit
for this. I own 209 Maxson Drive. He told
my daughter he's going to put up a
structure -- some sort of structure so he
can put cars under it. What structure?
He's told my nephew who lives at 218 Moosic
Road that he's going to have a satellite
survey done and he's going to put a building
up.

I know what he did on Church Street, what he did in Duryea. I'm asking that this does not happen in Old Forge. He's made a

mess out of there. My mother sat and looked at that stupid green car on the trailer for 20 years. My son-in-law literally pulled a tree out of the road because everything's that overgrown. He couldn't get into the driveway.

MR. SEMENZA: Steve, do we know this property?

MR. BIERYLA: It's Jimmy's.

MR. SEMENZA: Have you addressed it?

MR. BIERYLA: I spoke to him about the bushes and that. It's not cleaned today because I went by to see. I spoke with him about it. He said he was going to clean it up.

As far as taking the carport down, he doesn't need a permit to take that carport down.

MR. SEMENZA: To put a structure up he does. Correct?

MR. BIERYLA: To put a structure up he does.

MR. SEMENZA: Could you get right on this and make sure this is done, cleaned up?

MR. BIERYLA: I saw the one bush is

really sticking out, especially that tree.

It's grown through the hedges and it's kind of like -- the weeds, I can see where you can't see back and forth. I'll talk to him tomorrow.

MR. SEMENZA: Tell him that it was brought to council's attention and council wants it cleaned up per our ordinance.

MR. BIERYLA: I know he was in the process of purchasing a house in Moscow and he was going to move, but something happened to the realtor and that fell through on him, or else he was just going to take everything up to the Moscow area.

MR. SEMENZA: Have there been ongoing complaints? Chief, you get any complaints on this?

CHIEF DUBERNAS: I know Kimbal addressed some of the abandon vehicles. I know he got them registered and that and they're still parked there. But like I said, once they're registered there's nothing we can do. I know there were two or three of them that were addressed. Two of them he was trying to sell. I know I was

going to the magistrate a month or so ago.

He actually had a for sale sign in the window.

MS. RIVERA: He's done that for 20 years. Sorry.

MR. SEMENZA: I know. I don't know your pain with it but --

MS. RIVERA: Complaints weren't made because Uncle Ted and Aunt Rose were alive and lived upstairs. They're gone. Enough. You're a cousin, you're family, I don't really care. The line of weeds up against my daughter's house, my house, it's constant. It's a garbage pit. It has to get cleaned. He worked his way around Church Street and managed to build the building side to side, no nothing. He got that in there without permits, without anything. It's not going to happen here.

MR. RUSSEL RINALDI: What building is that?

MS. RIVERA: Church Street? The barn right across from Saint Nick's.

MR. SEMENZA: That's been there quite some time. The best I can do for you

is get Steve on it, get him on it hard.

MS. RIVERA: I called Steve. I came Friday because he wasn't here. I left three messages, didn't receive a phone call, so I'm here.

MR. SEMENZA: I appreciate it because the ordinance only works if somebody brings the attention to the borough.

MS. RIVERA: My other nephew made a complaint, he got told to cut his hedges, the other side of the road.

MR. SEMENZA: This is the first I'm hearing of it. I'm glad you came in.

MS. RIVERA: I'll be back. I'm not letting him get away with it for what he put my parents through.

MR. SEMENZA: Steve, do your best to get on it. Try to take care of it.

Chief, as far as the cars, if you see any illegally parked or not registered take care of them, please.

Mrs. Wilk?

MS. WILK: President Semenza, I'm here to thank Rick Notari, Russell, yourself, Joe's not here, Mr. Hoover, and my

buddy sitting over there, and the police chief and mayor for the support they gave the Old Forge School District for the safety of our children. It really was great.

MS. WILK: I intend to. Julie
Grimes is not a stupid person. She
developed a program for the federal
government and they bought it from her.
She's not a stupid person. I've been
called -- Julie and I have been called low
I.Q. and we're tired of this. We're here to
try and help the kids. People don't like
us, we don't care. I don't care who likes
me and who doesn't like me.

Second of all, Bob, what about the signs on West Grace?

MR. SEMENZA: All Paul needed -- he didn't know that we were putting them up.

All he needed was approval from council, which it is per our ordinance that they're there. I spoke with you already about this.

MS. WILK: From Saint Mary's all the way down. Always been down there, Bob.

MR. SEMENZA: I believe the ordinance goes from Lawrence Street to --no, not Main Street.

MR. PAPI: There's two on that block.

MR. SEMENZA: I don't believe it goes all the way to Main Street, it goes to Lawrence Street.

MS. WILK: I remember when I first bought the house there were, on the side of the church, no parking signs. They were taken down for the convenience of the church. The church don't pay taxes in Old Forge.

MR. SEMENZA: Steve, do we know how that ordinance states? Paul or Bill? Does it state with the exception of church no parking? It might say that in the ordinance. I know there were signs there at one time.

MS. WILK: Somebody is going to have a bad accident.

CHIEF DUBERNAS: They used to block it off.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: I remember
they used to put the one-way sign, when
there was church, on the horse. When church
was over he took it right down. Every time

there was church it was up.

MS. WILK: It's really bad. Coming out of George onto Grace, from Grace in the back. On the corner over there you can't see a car coming up. I almost T-boned somebody on my way up to a school board meeting. Who's fault is that going to be?

MR. SEMENZA: I was asked by Ann
Boday about a stop sign. I told her there's
many traffic studies done there. I believe
you might have done one. But I know Larry
had done quite a few beforehand. Do you
remember the findings of that?

CHIEF DUBERNAS: That's where we had to move that and put no parking on the side

Ms. Wilk lives on.

MR. SEMENZA: I'm asking about the stop sign. Do you remember what the findings were, why we couldn't put a stop sign up?

CHIEF DUBERNAS: They wanted a stop sign to control speed. You can't use a stop sign to control speed.

ATTY. RINALDI: So West Grace Street south from Lawrence Street to Melmore

Oak to Maple.

MR. SEMENZA: No, when church is in session. They never ticketed anybody.
Right?

CHIEF DUBERNAS: No, as long as I've always been working we never bothered anybody on that side.

MR. NOTARI: You're not complaining about when there's church, you're complaining about when there's not church.

MR. SEMENZA: Can we redo the ordinance to during church hours let people park there? I don't think we can just say don't ticket people when there's no parking.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: You can't do that. We can't put signs there and then just not ticket them.

MS. WILK: Another thing, the mayor, I took him over my old stomping grounds on Winter Street, 530 Winter Street. Dixon used to own that house and I think it was up for sherif's sale. It was in the paper once. The people that lived in there

stripped all the plumbing in the house. The place is a mess.

MAYOR LEGG: Terrible.

MS. WILK: The growth over there.

The guy next door is using it to park
unlicensed cars, tires under his porch.

That place was always a nice place to live
on Winter Street. People keep their
properties right up. I'm talking about the
house that I was raised in.

MR. SEMENZA: Steve, do you know about this property?

MR. BIERYLA: Yes.

MS. WILK: That should be condemned. It makes me sick.

MR. SEMENZA: Somebody bought it, Steve?

MS. WILK: Nobody bought it. The bank owns it.

MR. BIERYLA: You don't know what bank owns it, you don't have an owner to go after, you don't have a maintenance company posted.

MR. SEMENZA: Legally we can't go on that property. This isn't the first house

we dealt with like this. Could you go take

people stupid.

I will say this, I'm disappointed in you. And you know what else? I'm embarrassed I supported you. I will say that, and I'll say it to your face because you're a disappointment. I never called you stupid, and if somebody said that I'm telling you that you're a liar and they're a liar.

MR. SEMENZA: Let's get on with borough business, please. Gunner?

MR. REVIELLO: I have a problem.

I've been on the zoning board for 30 years.

I was in the hospital for 46 days,
gallbladder operation and a heart operation.

I called Steve Bieryla back to tell him I'm okay to come back to serve on the zoning board and he told me I was off the board.

There's only one person, one committee could dismiss me from the board. Here's a copy of the state of Pennsylvania and the person who you can get in touch with if you want to know who he is. You guys are the only ones that can get me off the board, not two people from zoning.

MR. SEMENZA: Wait, who are you saying that -- we're the only people that can dismiss you from the board?

MR. REVIELLO: The board is the only people who could dismiss me for them reasons.

MR. SEMENZA: Your term was up.

Your term expired and we had numerous

attempts to try and reach you and were

unsuccessful.

MR. REVIELLO: I was homebound for 46 days, so there's no such thing that you tried to reach me.

MR. SEMENZA: There were numerous attempts. Marylynn, what were the attempts to try to reach him?

MR. BIERYLA: Mr. Reviello's term was up February of '17. We did not get a letter of intent to renew. We had numerous zoning meetings in which he didn't show. We made an attempt to try to get a hold of him. I stopped by the house several times to see if he was home.

MR. REVIELLO: That's a lie. I was home 46 days.

MR. BIERYLA: Mr. Paddock, if he was here, could attest that he tried to get a hold of him. He had called him. We had no response. At that point in time the board asked that we appoint somebody. We couldn't get a hold of him. So for 46 days, but what happened to the year and a half prior?

MR. REVIELLO: They cannot dismiss me on account of absenteeism. It's right in there.

MR. SEMENZA: But really you weren't dismissed. Your term was expired.

MR. REVIELLO: They never contacted me.

MR. SEMENZA: We had no letter of intent to take your seat back over.

MR. REVIELLO: He's lying. They never tried to contact me. I was home 46 days. A lie.

MR. SEMENZA: I know that when Mr. Paddock had contacted me with the name that they were requesting for the seat I asked him if they had tried to reach you, and he had told me yes.

MR. REVIELLO: Why didn't they

contact me when my time was up? Why didn't they send me a letter? It's right in there. They should have contacted me 15 days before.

MR. SEMENZA: With all due respect, when my term on council is up I know when it's up and I rerun for election. I mean, with zoning -- since I've been here, with zoning and planning we had letters of --

MR. REVIELLO: I've been on the board for 30 years, pal. Don't tell me about zoning.

MR. SEMENZA: Well, I'm telling you since I've been here we had letters of request that they want to re-up their term.

But you never sent us a letter.

MR. REVIELLO: They never told me it was up.

MR. SEMENZA: You don't know when your term is up?

MR. REVIELLO: No, I never did. They always sent me a letter.

MR. SEMENZA: I know when my term's up. I'm sure Councilman Rinaldi and the rest of the council members know when their

MS. BARTOLETTI: Not from me.

MR. SEMENZA: You can ask anybody that's on either of them boards.

MR. REVIELLO: Listen, I don't want to ask. I just want to let you guys know what's going on.

MR. SEMENZA: I know what's going Your term was up, we had to appoint on. somebody. Your seat sat vacant for a long I don't know where to go with this.

MS. BARTOLETTI: If I may remind you guys I think what the problem was, there's no extra people on the zoning board. Meetings constantly had to be cancelled because they never had a quorum. We ended up adding a person on as an alternate to try to help, and then you guys put the next person on. You waited until March of 2018 until you added someone else on. But there was a couple years' time that they really struggled with that.

MR. SEMENZA: Everybody in the audience here tonight, us on council don't want to remove anybody from a board. always did a very good job. The problem was

he was absent from the board for a long time, and like Marylynn said, it was tough getting quorums sometimes. You need people that are going to be committed to the borough.

I understand, and I thank him for his 30 years of service, but when you're not active -- and these guys are not lying.

They did try to reach him and were unsuccessful.

MAYOR LEGG: I think he was out of line calling Steve a liar.

MR. SEMENZA: Correct.

MR. HOOVER: We should do the same thing we did for Mr. Scarnato for him. He was here 30 years. Maybe we should send him a letter thanking him for his time on the board like we did with Mr. Scarnato.

MR. SEMENZA: Sometime back we had requested -- and Councilman Febbo, I don't know if you were here. We requested every board member submit a letter that they would like to be reinstated to their seat. The borough shouldn't have to go looking for these guys. They should know when their

term is up and they should want -- whatever.

I mean, I don't think we have to explain

ourselves in that matter.

There's nobody else on public comment. At this time the chair will go down the table and see if any council members or the mayor have anything to address.

MAYOR LEGG: The tiles were ordered two weeks ago, and former mayor Turquato, I just want to say publicly he was extremely helpful to me and I thank you. I'm waiting for them to come. As soon as they come I'll see Louis Mancuso, we'll get those done and that project will be completed.

The hometown Heros, we're not accepting any more applications. I thought we'd get 25 to 50. The end count is 204. People are very appreciative of council. Marylynn has been fantastic and Paul and his crew have been great. We hung 44 on Saturday, Garrett and Ryan. About five and a half hours. The program was beyond expectations. That's all.

MR. SEMENZA: Councilman Febbo?

MR. FEBBO: No.

MR. NOTARI: First off, I believe there's an opening on our civil service commission. What's the process by which we go about filling that spot?

MS. BARTOLETTI: I believe we have posted it in the past, but you guys should talk about posting it again.

 $$\operatorname{MR}.$  NOTARI: I have someone who spoke to me with interest.

MR. SEMENZA: I had someone else approach me, too.

ATTY. RINALDI: Do you want to put an ad in?

MR. SEMENZA: Yes, when we put the other ad in. Both at the same time.

MR. NOTARI: Also, Paul, there's a fire hydrant on the corner of Hoover and Moosic Road, Gilchrist's property. It's overgrown. I find it odd that the whole property is cut but the hydrant is surrounded by weeds. Maybe it's for Steve.

MR. BIERYLA: He cuts it with a tractor and then he puts it back on the trailer and leaves.

MR. NOTARI: It's not our responsibility to cut the hydrants. Correct?

MR. PAPI: You have to maintain your property right up to abutting the curb.

MR. NOTARI: I think it's a hazard that it hasn't been cut. Please look into that.

My other question is if there's any committee reports. The borough school committee, we haven't had a meeting since I last gave a report, but we are going to meet again with the school representatives July 26th at 6 p.m. to further discuss our role in security at the school district. It will be here again.

MR. SEMENZA: Thank you, Councilman.
Councilman Rinaldi?

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: I only have two items. I'm the safety coordinator for the Old Forge Junior Blue Devils, and they asked me but let me ask you guys, the football field, the softball field that we use, lower Pagnotti, to practice at, they were asking about having it sprayed. Have

we ever had that sprayed for bugs?

MS. BARTOLETTI: It's treated the way all the other fields are, chemicals that kill weeds and I don't know. You want to have someone go and spray with bug spray?

MR. RUSSEL RINALDI: No, they said that they contacted a guy. They didn't do anything yet, though. They just contacted a guy and got a price quote. The guy comes down, he said he sprays it three times a year. It's \$300 and change. I think just one time \$300. It lasts about six weeks, seven weeks, sprays it again. You get about four months, maybe five months. That goes from the season, July, until, like, October.

What they said was, they wanted me to ask you if we did it they -- and they don't know if we do and I told them I don't know if we do it either. If we don't, they asked if they can go ahead and do it.

MR. SEMENZA: I don't have an issue with that.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: It's a company that comes and does it. We found a stake in the grass that was -- it had to be done this

year, probably for softball. It was a spike in the ground that had Tru on it.

MS. BARTOLETTI: TruGreen does all of our fields. I think it's based on grass and everything.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: I'll get more information on it. We have a meeting this Sunday.

MR. FEBBO: Make sure you find out the contents of the chemicals.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: I will. The girls practice cheerleading. They weren't sure. Did they practice on Semenza Field?

MR. SEMENZA: They do, in the outfield. When does it start?

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: That was going to be the second part of this question. It start next Monday, but they said last year for a few weeks they had to practice at the high school because softball was still running into playoffs.

MR. BARTOLETTI: No one ever actually asked for permission to use any of the other fields. The lower field was specifically put there for the junior

football to use as a multi-purpose practice field, but no one ever asked anything about having the cheerleaders.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: They were practicing at the school. Would we allow them to practice at Semenza?

MR. SEMENZA: The problem is I believe -- and Marylynn probably knows better than me, but any kind of organized sport needs proof of insurance. I don't know if it would fall under your insurance.

MS. BARTOLETTI: I'm sure it does.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: It falls under our insurance.

MS. BARTOLETTI: The fact that it's not a designated field for the junior football, then you guys have to decide what you want to do.

MR. SEMENZA: We've still got at least another three weeks left.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: They said they'd definitely use the school field for a few weeks, then they said they were on that field.

MS. BARTOLETTI: At the end of last

towards the end of the season. 1 MR. NOTARI: I have no problem with 2 3 it, but we also have that area down on Ripple Street, that if we cleaned it up a 4 little bit. 5 MR. SEMENZA: The area behind the 6 7 tennis court and Marion Street park. MS. BARTOLETTI: I think the whole 8 9 purpose of it was because a lot of the 10 parents are dropping off a boy at football and a girl at cheerleading, so they have to 11 go from this place to that place. 12 MR. NOTARI: Again, if that's where 13 14 they want to be I have no problem. 15 MR. SEMENZA: My only problem is if it interferes with softball. 16 MR. RUSSELL: That's what they said. 17 I'll bring this back to them on Sunday, get 18 19 some more information, then I'll have Joe call you. All right, thank you. 20 MR. SEMENZA: Councilman Ferrett? 21 MR. FERRETT: I'm good. 22 MR. HOOVER: Dave, I have a couple 23 water projects we're doing in the borough. 24 25 I'll send them to you. Beach Street.

MR. SEMENZA: Are you starting from the alley going towards --

MR. HOOVER: From Keyser and going up.

MR. SEMENZA: Myself, the only thing I have is rec board related. Everybody has a sheet in front of them. The rec board is interested in running a softball tournament, girls tournament, August 17th through the 19th, on our borough fields. The tournament will consist of eight to ten teams, girls fast pitch. All profits will go into the borough's general fund for recreation use under the line item recreation or maintenance or whatever.

We really have no definite anything, but Joe DiMattia is on the on the rec board. He's basically going to run the tournament. He has people calling him that are very interested from Allentown to -- it's very, very big. We're going to start small. Cap it at eight to ten teams. If anybody has any comments or anything, councilmen, or Marylynn might answer some questions.

MR. NOTARI: I think it's a great

idea and I commend the rec board for trying to find ways to raise funds to help benefit recreation in the borough. Just off the top of my head, who will payment be made to?

MR. SEMENZA: Old Forge Borough.

MR. NOTARI: Does that work?

Marylynn, is that in the scope of what we're made out to do? Who will pay umpires? Who will serve as paramedics? What kind of costs will be incurred by opening the stand? What kind of costs for field maintenance, insurance? Has it been run by a schedule for the other organizations? You know, in your notes it says along with bathrooms. Are those bathrooms even open?

MR. SEMENZA: Yes.

MR. NOTARI: Because they're not open during high school baseball. I've been told they're not.

MS. BARTOLETTI: Yes, they are. The school put the one next to first base line, then we have the building. A lot of people still --

MR. NOTARI: The checks will be made

payable to he borough?

MS. BARTOLETTI: If this is really going to happen and the funds are going to come to the borough and all that and checks made out to us, then I really want to be much more involved. I want to know everything that's going on, because if I'm going to be paying people and money coming in, then I want to be right on top of it, keep me posted.

MR. NOTARI: The borough's going to have to pay for umpires, so then you'll have to issue checks?

MS. BARTOLETTI: That money would have to come out of the money coming in.

MR. NOTARI: Security?

MR. SEMENZA: I don't know what lines of security we need.

MR. NOTARI: Tournaments get a little heated at times, the parents.

They're going to have to have paramedics on the scene. I would think you'll have to have somebody there. Again, insurance wise are we covered for that?

MR. SEMENZA: The teams have their

own insurances and we are covered for liability on the property just like if anybody else --

MS. BARTOLETTI: I will make sure from our insurance company. But like you said, I would have to have participating insurance.

MR. SEMENZA: They travel from tournament to tournament.

MR. FEBBO: This is through an organization that runs tournaments?

MR. SEMENZA: No, the rec board.

MR. NOTARI: Field maintenance?

MR. SEMENZA: Volunteers. Me, Tony, Joe, all those guys.

MR. NOTARI: Cost for use of the stand? Water, electricity donated by the borough?

MR. SEMENZA: Use of the stand, it will be borough run. The food and everything, the little league, at the end of their season they usually donate their food, like leftovers. They're going to give it back to us.

MR. NOTARI: Obviously the field

the only thing about that is there's a date we have to fill in there for the date of the plans, and they would be the plans that were finally approved by the conservation district. So that's the plans and calculations, and that date we would have to wait. But the agreement, I think it would be good to approve the agreement, that it could be signed once we have that final date.

ATTY. RINALDI: As long as we get it before the final.

SKWRAO: I'd like as many approvals as possible. If that agreement is separate we can do the plan agreement also.

ATTY. RINALDI: We will make it a

separate vote and we'll approve it.

MR. FERRETT: On the plan I'd like to ask one question, if I possibly may. The holding pond, would it not be better if the water should be piped to the creek that's down below in the event that some day in the future we may have a problem with the water situation, where will we go? Did we not have a problem on Wood Street a little while back with a situation of that nature?

MR. SEMENZA: We did.

MR. FERRETT: Isn't that something that we should ask them to try to consider?

MR. SEMENZA: Dave, when we walked that area back there was anything else said after that?

MR. LOPATKA: Yeah, there was a lengthy discussion. They actually provided us -- our concern was the volume of water based off the new impervious coverage. So our discussions with Joe and his group were we need to mitigate that increase in volume somehow. So they provided us calculations to show they're mitigating that volume in the pond.

MR. SEMENZA: So it's the same water, basically, coming out.

MR. DURKIN: In actual fact the pond, if you look at it just visually you'll see the size of the pond compared to the side here. We're actually reducing the existing runoff, so from what's currently happening now it's going to be less than that for all those storms for the one year, two year, five, ten, all the way up to the hundred. It's going to be reducing. That's why we have this big pond there.

MR. SEMENZA: My only concern is -I don't know if you were back in that area,
you hit a wall. There's nowhere for the
water to go. If it does go left it's going
to go down to Tamara, Micheline, and you
might possibly have problems with water in
them houses. I want to make sure there's --

MR. LOPATKA: That was our biggest concern, where it was going.

MR. DURKIN: We agree. We did spend quite a bit of time going through that and analyzing it.

MR. SEMENZA: Are you okay with

this?

MR. LOPATKA: Yes. We asked them -they kind of went above and beyond because
typically it's based off your ordinance,
what the requirement is, that they reduce
the rate below for the two-through
hundred-year storms.

So what we asked to take it a step further was we mitigate the volume from the two through whatever. I think there's a slight increase in volume for at least the 50 and 150. At that point there's water everywhere anyway. For ninety percent of the storms, which are the up to the two-year storms, they have mitigated the increase in volume and the increase in concentration.

MR. SEMENZA: I was nervous about where that water went.

MR. FEBBO: What is that dam going to be down there?

SKWRAO: Actually it's built down into the ground, so we're not actually building up a dam. You're not going to stand here and see a wall in front of you.

MR. FEBBO: That will be retaining

water?

SKWRAO: It holds it for a certain period of time and then it filtrates down.

Again, there's an outlet pipe in there, too.

So it's a combination of both.

MR. FEBBO: The outlet pipe will be at a certain level? The water came up to a certain level to the outlet pipe?

MR. DURKIN: Yes.

MR. FEBBO: Then that would go across the street into the woods?

MR. DURKIN: Right.

MR. FEBBO: What about ownership of that parcel of land where that's going to discharge?

SKWRAO: When we're doing that analysis we're basically looking at the edge of the existing property. So there's a pipe that goes underneath Wood Street, so our analysis that we're -- like, under the borough code we're required to do a preversus post-analysis, so we do an analysis of the property and all the runoff before we do anything. We model the existing conditions, then we come back and we model

J

the post-development condition. We compare those two. What happens is obviously if there's no detention pond there you'd have a significant increase in the runoff coming through there. You put in impervious area. Pavement, rooftop.

But that pond then is designed to cut all that flow back down. So we actually have less. Before we even get to the roadway we have less runoff after we finish our project than you'll have before the project.

MR. SEMENZA: What percentage of impervious coverage do you have there on the Old Forge section?

MR. DURKIN: I have the number.

It's 30-some percent, I think. I probably have it on one of these boards.

MR. SEMENZA: What's our max?

MR. BIERYLA: I have to look.

MR. LOPATKA: They were way under.

They won't need a variance. I think it was,

like, 15 percent or something.

MR. SEMENZA: That was my only concern because of what I found that day we

went back there. Water is nasty. It could destroy somebody. Anybody else?

MR. FEBBO: For legal aspects, if something were to happen there, we have another Agnes like years ago and flooding, you're liable for it?

SKWRAO: There's no difference in the liability. We proved the plan doesn't change whoever's liability. We have an agreement that talks about the maintenance of the property and the whole system, that that's the responsibility of the property That will be the next item that comes up. That maintenance agreement basically says that the property owner has the responsibility to maintain all these facilities, detention basins, piping, all the ditches. So if there's any problem that agreement gives the borough the opportunity to go and investigate that. If you find a problem you can notify the property owner, and they're obligated to fix it at their cost.

MR. SEMENZA: If that got all blocked up with trees or whatever you guys

take care of it?

MR. DURKIN: If anything like that were to happen you -- you don't have to if you don't want to, but if you wanted to you can go inspect that, you can do a report, and you can basically direct the property owner to fix whatever that problem is or repair it. Your solicitor added additional language that actually gave you the right to lien the property for any costs associated with that.

MR. AULISIO: Let me just speak on the part of Pride. We had a storm drain issue down in Duryea, off York Avenue. We had one of those storms come through that kind of blocked up the drain, and Duryea Borough come up, and we got our landscaper to go in and they basically redid the whole basin area. They just wanted it cleaned out. We said no, we'll fix it.

The bottom line is Pride wants to be a good neighbor. We will do what we need to do to maintain our property and make sure everything is functioning the way it's supposed to. I can tell you that much.

MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Hoover? 1 MR. HOOVER: Yes. 2 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Notari? 3 MR. NOTARI: Yes. 4 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Rinaldi? 5 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Yes. 6 MS.
