1 (The Pledge of Allegiance was
2 recited.)

3 MR. SEMENZA: Welcome to the June
4 12th work session for Old Forge Borough
5 Council. The purpose of tonight's meeting
6 is to set the agenda for our June 19th
7 regular council meeting.

8 I'm going to go to our department
9 heads, see if they have anything for the
10 agenda. I'll go down the table, see if any
11 council members have anything to address.

12 There's a public sign-in sheet if
13 anybody from the public wants to sign in.
14 Roll call.

15 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Febbo?

16 MR. FEBBO: Here.

17 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Notari?

18 MR. NOTARI: Present.

19 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Semenza?

20 MR. SEMENZA: I'm here. That's it.
21 I'll go to our department heads. Paul Papi,
22 DPW, anything for the agenda?

23 MR. PAPI: No, I don't have
24 anything. The only thing we should talk
25 about is the problem on the corner of

1 Nicholas and Winter. We have a sewer line
2 there. We've got a water leak there for
3 months. They found a depression and we
4 filled it in with dirt. Then they fixed the
5 water leak but the water's still blazing in.
6 It's coming from around the sewer pipe into
7 the manhole and it sagged. I had to have
8 Mike Ford come down and flush it out and put
9 a camera in it. As soon as the camera goes
10 in the pipe it goes under water. That means
11 the line has a big sag in it. That means
12 all this water, it's subsiding her front
13 yard, her driveway, and it's subsiding our
14 sewer line.

15 MR. SEMENZA: We talked about it and
16 you said that the water company possibly
17 could shut the water off to her house or
18 somewhere in the line --

19 MR. PAPI: The water company told me
20 that if we have to fix it, we go ahead and
21 fix it and send them a bill. If we get
22 paid, we get paid. If we don't, we don't.

23 MR. SEMENZA: Bill, how does that
24 happen?

25 ATTY. RINALDI: What are you fixing,

1 their water line?

2 MR. PAPI: No. Their water line is
3 leaking. Now, here's what he said. He said
4 he doesn't know if it's leaking on their
5 side of the shut off or the --

6 MR. SEMENZA: Regardless, it's not
7 our responsibility. It's compromising the
8 sewer line.

9 MR. PAPI: You'd have to go after
10 their insurance company.

11 MR. LOPATKA: What's going to happen
12 is it will keep eroding and it will just
13 keep sinking.

14 MR. PAPI: So how about I call the
15 water company, get somebody down there to
16 shut off the valve. If the valve is shut
17 off and the water's still --

18 ATTY. RINALDI: They know they have
19 a leak and they're not worried about it?

20 MR. SEMENZA: It's been going on for
21 a month, maybe longer.

22 MR. PAPI: At least.

23 MR. LOPATKA: If it's on the
24 homeowner's side of the shut off it's their
25 responsibility.

1 MR. FEBBO: We don't know where it's
2 at.

3 MR. PAPI: That's why it's subsiding
4 under their front yard and their driveway's
5 going down.

6 MR. SEMENZA: If it is their
7 responsibility can we force them to fix it?

8 ATTY. RINALDI: How is it getting
9 out to our sewer?

10 MR. SEMENZA: It's coming down under
11 the pipe and coming into the chamber.

12 ATTY. RINALDI: So it's spraying
13 from into the street area?

14 MR. SEMENZA: Yes.

15 MR. PAPI: It's squeezing itself
16 around the pipe and squirting into the
17 manhole, and then it's going into the --

18 MR. LOPATKA: It's the lateral
19 coming into the manhole.

20 MR. PAPI: We'll have the water
21 company do a test.

22 MR. SEMENZA: It's coming in through
23 the line, around the outside of the main
24 line.

25 MR. PAPI: It's coming around the

1 main line. No lateral. The main line is
2 right at the bottom of the sewer. The
3 water's squirting in around the sides of the
4 pipe.

5 MR. SEMENZA: As clear as could be.

6 ATTY. RINALDI: The water is
7 squirting from the water line?

8 MR. PAPI: Into the sewer from
9 somewhere. We don't know where.

10 ATTY. RINALDI: So that's got to be
11 a right-of-way. It can't be squirting 20
12 feet from the guy's yard.

13 MR. SEMENZA: It's like a fire hose
14 coming out.

15 ATTY. RINALDI: It's got to be their
16 problem.

17 MR. PAPI: The water company or the
18 person. The person has the insurance from
19 the water company that everything will be
20 taken care of if they have a problem. So
21 the way I look at it the water company's
22 responsible either way.

23 ATTY. RINALDI: Tell the resident
24 he's paying a water bill that he's not
25 getting water for.

1 MR. PAPI: They called me and said
2 our front yard is sinking down. I got there
3 and I looked and I popped the manhole.

4 MR. SEMENZA: Who is the resident?

5 MR. PAPI: It's a new couple. I
6 think it's two girls. It's the first house
7 on the left off of Winter when you drive
8 into the new development. It's right before
9 Donati's.

10 MS. BARTOLETTI: They had a problem
11 when I first started here with pipes in
12 their yard.

13 MR. PAPI: Our borough line runs
14 right down the front yard of these houses.
15 It's not in the street.

16 ATTY. RINALDI: So do we have an
17 easement on their property for it?

18 MR. SEMENZA: The sewer line in the
19 yard.

20 MR. LOPATKA: When was that
21 development?

22 MR. PAPI: '70s, early '80s.

23 ATTY. RINALDI: Then you should have
24 The plans that show where that sewer's going
25 on their property.

1 MR. PAPI: I can't even find plans
2 for that development.

3 MR. SEMENZA: Paul, call Frankie and
4 get LLVSA involved also because if there's
5 infiltration into the sewer line they will
6 be on it. If it's past the person's shut
7 off --

8 MR. PAPI: If it's on this side of
9 the shut off the water company has to take
10 responsibility. If it's on the other side
11 they'll say well, the lady has insurance.

12 MR. SEMENZA: Wouldn't they have no
13 water at all?

14 MR. PAPI: I think their pressure
15 would be low.

16 MR. SEMENZA: The amount of water
17 coming out there, I can't even --

18 MR. NOTARI: Wouldn't the pressure
19 be low in the entire development, then?

20 MR. SEMENZA: It possibly is.

21 ATTY. RINALDI: And they're not even
22 coming out to check it out?

23 MR PAPI: They came out but they
24 were buried. They had water leaking here,
25 water leaking there. They were here six

1 times in two days. It's already creating a
2 subsidence. That's why the lady called me.
3 I'll get in touch with Steve Ozelinski.
4 We'll get that straightened out.

5 MR. SEMENZA: Tell him it was
6 brought up in the council meeting --

7 MR. PAPI: They want you to come
8 there, meet with me and figure this out.

9 MR. SEMENZA: Tell him we have a
10 meeting Tuesday and we want to know what's
11 going on.

12 MR. PAPI: That's it.

13 MR. SEMENZA: Before we go any
14 further, I'd like to have a moment of
15 silence for our zoning officer's wife, who
16 passed away.

17 (A moment of silence was observed.)

18 MR. SEMENZA: Thank you. I'd like
19 to have another moment of silence for Art
20 Lucarelli, who just passed away also.

21 (A moment of silence was observed.)

22 MR. SEMENZA: Thank you. Dave?

23 MR. LOPATKA: I don't have anything.

24 MR. SEMENZA: Anybody have any
25 questions for Paul?

1 MR. NOTARI: No, I don't have
2 anything for Paul.

3 MR. SEMENZA: Anybody have any
4 questions for Dave?

5 MR. NOTARI: I have nothing for
6 Dave.

7 MR. FEBBO: I don't. I've got some
8 questions but I don't know who to direct
9 them towards. Where are we at with the
10 church rectory?

11 ATTY. RINALDI: I was going to ask
12 you guys that question because --

13 MR. FEBBO: Nothing from the
14 diocese? Father sent a letter in to them
15 and they were supposed to get back to you
16 because I told him we had everything done as
17 far as surveying and all that.

18 MR. LOPATKA: I didn't get a company
19 of the map.

20 ATTY. RINALDI: I did. We just have
21 to plot out what we want to do. Maybe you
22 want to come up with a suggestion there. We
23 need the rectory and give us all the parking
24 now. Leave the church alone.

25 MR. LOPATKA: We'll put a line on

1 the map and then we can talk about it.

2 MR. FEBBO: Corcoran Street. Mare,
3 you said the end of the month?

4 MR. PAPI: They started.

5 MR. LOPATKA: It's almost done.

6 MR. PAPI: They ran into some
7 problems.

8 MR. NOTARI: What kind of problems?

9 MR. PAPI: They chopped the gas
10 line, they chopped the water line. The
11 laterals aren't marked. Nobody knows where
12 the laterals are.

13 MR. FEBBO: What about Kohler?

14 MR. LOPATKA: Kohler is, well,
15 county. It's still with the county, I
16 guess -- no, Kohler is CDBG. It was bid, it
17 was awarded. There were some changes they
18 wanted to make, we made those changes. Now
19 Brenda came back and said those changes are
20 excessive. They wanted curbs and some other
21 stuff on one side of the road, so we sent
22 her a cost estimate and we're waiting to
23 hear back.

24 So the project itself is bid. He
25 wasn't supposed to start it until June

1 anyway.

2 MR. NOTARI: Because at that point
3 we were waiting on the contractor before we
4 made the changes.

5 MR. LOPATKA: He couldn't start
6 until June, so now it's June and they need
7 to give them the go ahead, whether it's what
8 we had designed originally or whether
9 they're going to add changes to it. So the
10 way we were told it was going to work was
11 they were going to go with the original
12 contract, then submit a change order after
13 they started. So at this point I don't know
14 if they're going to sign the change order
15 or --

16 MR. NOTARI: We're waiting on county
17 approval, is what you're saying, of our
18 changes?

19 MR. LOPATKA: Ultimately.

20 MR. FEBBO: Bill, DPW easements, you
21 said we need one for Calis and Diakiw.

22 ATTY. RINALDI: They're done. They
23 just have to get signed.

24 MR. LOPATKA: Signed and notarized.

25 MR. FEBBO: Are we going across

1 their property?

2 MR. LOPATKA: Are they all the way
3 in the back?

4 ATTY. RINALDI: You're going ten
5 feet by 17 feet by ten feet by 20 feet.

6 MR. LOPATKA: Our line's going down
7 along one property, and right where the
8 slope changes it goes onto their property,
9 where the outfall is. So we need an
10 easement from them for the outfall.

11 MR. FEBBO: That's all set to be
12 done? Just need to be signed?

13 ATTY. RINALDI: I was going to get
14 them over today but they told me today
15 Calis' wife is deceased, so I have to take
16 her off the deed.

17 MR. NOTARI: How about Apollo and
18 Eisenhower?

19 MR. LOPATKA: They're doing it on
20 their own. They're going to bid it on their
21 own and do it on their own.

22 MR. SEMENZA: So it could be
23 another, basically --

24 MR. FEBBO: We're not getting
25 involved in that?

1 MR. LOPATKA: The county wants to
2 bid it on their own.

3 MR. NOTARI: So all those hoops we
4 had to jump through --

5 MR. LOPATKA: The one reason we were
6 going to do it is we were going to try to
7 get it done at the end of last year. Now
8 it's the next year.

9 MR. FEBBO: How about submitting
10 your bill and Bill's bill to them.

11 MR. SEMENZA: Can we do anything
12 about that? There was a lot of time put
13 into this with Dave and yourself. I mean,
14 this is ridiculous.

15 MR. LOPATKA: I heard that from Tony
16 Grizzanti from KBA.

17 MR. SEMENZA: Nice they let us know.

18 MR. LOPATKA: I'll put a final
19 change order together. I was putting a
20 change order together to removing the five
21 streets. We were going to add those. Now
22 I'll put a change order together to remove
23 those streets and then the paving project
24 from last year can get closed out.

25 MR. SEMENZA: What's going on with

1 the road to Pagnotti Park? Can we do
2 something like that going up there? That
3 needs to be paved.

4 MR. NOTARI: I agree.

5 ATTY. RINALDI: There's Connell
6 Street to a point. Are they paved up after
7 Connell Street?

8 MR. SEMENZA: Yes.

9 CHIEF DUBERNAS: From the end of the
10 last house and then the gates are right at
11 the intersection.

12 ATTY. RINALDI: That's where it
13 turns into the private road.

14 MR. FEBBO: That road goes all the
15 way down to Duryea.

16 MR. NOTARI: Mare, did you receive
17 the e-mail I sent about the land
18 conservation? Can we call them and see if
19 there's -- before we start going and
20 spending money?

21 MS. BARTOLETTI: Definitely it's on
22 my list.

23 MR. NOTARI: And I know whenever
24 Commissioner Cummings decides to talk to me
25 during the day she always brings that up, so

1 she's on that board and she's looking to do
2 some things.

3 MR. FEBBO: Last year we had a
4 meeting on that.

5 MS. BARTOLETTI: In regards to their
6 roads.

7 MR. NOTARI: The problem we can run
8 into is it's not our road.

9 MS. BARTOLETTI: Exactly.

10 ATTY. RINALDI: We have an easement.
11 We have an access agreement to use it.

12 MR. SEMENZA: It gets us to our
13 park. If we want to get it paved why can't
14 we?

15 MS. BARTOLETTI: If we intended to
16 try to get grant money.

17 MR. SEMENZA: And we couldn't use
18 liquid fuels either. But if we're going to
19 pay for it out of our own pocket why can't
20 we?

21 MR. LOPATKA: That's through the
22 county conservation district, their roads
23 program.

24 MS. BARTOLETTI: Yes.

25 MR. NOTARI: The parking lot is in

1 Ransom. I think the road is Old Forge.

2 MR. SEMENZA: Half the parking lot,
3 I think, is Ransom.

4 CHIEF DUBERNAS: It's all Old Forge.

5 MR. NOTARI: I was always told the
6 fence line was Ransom. I don't have
7 anything else for Dave.

8 MS. BARTOLETTI: I just want you to
9 know we did get a phone call from a person
10 who lives on the opposite side when you're
11 heading down Connell Street and make the
12 right to go up to Pagnotti, if you continue
13 to go straight. Someone lives in there and
14 they complained that cars come down the hill
15 too fast and don't stop. They continue out.
16 It's dangerous for him if he's walking his
17 dog.

18 MR. FEBBO: This guy has to be a
19 hermit.

20 MS. BARTOLETTI: I tried to drive in
21 there because I was very curious after this
22 phone call, and I drove and drove and then I
23 thought I have no idea what's back here, so
24 I tried to turn around and get back out but
25 I had to back out.

1 CHIEF DUBERNAS: There's two houses
2 back there.

3 MR. SEMENZA: He came to Pagnotti
4 Park with his dog and guns. First of all,
5 dogs are not allowed in the park. Chief?

6 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Just next Monday,
7 interviews. Could you get a hold of --

8 MR. SEMENZA: Next Monday is what?

9 CHIEF DUBERNAS: The 18th.

10 MR. SEMENZA: I won't be here.

11 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Tuesday, prior to
12 the meeting?

13 MR. SEMENZA: How many?

14 CHIEF DUBERNAS: I don't know.
15 Three, four. I think 5:00, start them, or
16 earlier.

17 MR. SEMENZA: I can probably be here
18 for 4:30, 5:00. Find out from Russell.

19 MR. PAPI: We got the signs up today
20 on Butler and on Grace.

21 CHIEF DUBERNAS: I haven't heard
22 nothing on my car.

23 MR. NOTARI: Did we pay for this
24 yet?

25 CHIEF DUBERNAS: The ENRADD system?

1 No, you don't pay for it until it comes in.

2 MR. SEMENZA: So you have to have --

3 CHIEF DUBERNAS: That's part of the
4 deal. Everybody's certified.

5 MR. SEMENZA: Anybody have any
6 questions for the chief?

7 MR. NOTARI: First off, thanks to
8 you and all your officers for taking care of
9 traffic last night and today and patrolling
10 the neighborhood. It was very appreciative
11 by the family.

12 I got a few complaints about truck
13 traffic on West Mary and Alicia that
14 tractor-trailers are being given, through
15 their GPS, to come up. They come Lonesome
16 Road to Main Street to get back to, I guess,
17 King Coil. Trucks are turning down West
18 Mary and then trying to navigate Fallon or
19 turn down Alicia Street to go that way.

20 CHIEF DUBERNAS: The biggest
21 complaint we've been getting now is Hoover
22 to Susquehanna. They're turning on Hoover
23 and then turning on Susquehanna and coming
24 that way.

25 MR. PAPI: There's signs there

1 saying no trucks.

2 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Some guy called us
3 three times last week.

4 MR. NOTARI: Can we put a sign up on
5 Main and West Mary and a sign on Main and
6 Alicia, no truck traffic? They're going all
7 the way down to Hayes.

8 MR. PAPI: If they're coming up
9 Hoover, then what's a sign going to do?

10 MR. NOTARI: Jason said he's getting
11 complaints on Hoover.

12 Lastly, have we looked at the alley
13 behind ABC Kiddie Campus, the traffic?

14 MR. FEBBO: Aulisio's house.

15 CHIEF DUBERNAS: That's on Henderson
16 Street. There's no way you can make that a
17 do not enter from Main Street or come out as
18 a one way. I was on Foster Street on a
19 complaint the other day and they park side
20 by side on Foster. Foster Street is almost
21 like an alley, so that comes out to the
22 alley and goes up to Lanape Street.

23 The other situation is you're going
24 to push all the cars into Ace's parking lot.
25 That's a safety hazard.

1 MR. NOTARI: I drove through that
2 alley a couple times. It's tight. I can't
3 understand how people could be speeding up
4 that alley.

5 CHIEF DUBERNAS: It's real narrow.

6 MR. SEMENZA: They should look into
7 some kind of crossing guard or something.

8 MR. NOTARI: It was people with
9 their yards on the alley that were upset.
10 Not Aulisio, Resio.

11 CHIEF DUBERNAS: My suggestion to
12 maybe try to alleviate some traffic there,
13 instead of having all those families park
14 there they drop the child off and get back
15 in the car and go. They congregate there.
16 Especially at the 3:15, 3:30 mark. We had
17 five or six accidents there.

18 MR. NOTARI: Thanks, Chief. I don't
19 have anything else.

20 CHIEF DUBERNAS: The bikes will be
21 out now.

22 MR. SEMENZA: Bill, solicitor's
23 report?

24 ATTY. RINALDI: Pagnotti Park,
25 they're still waiting for the appraiser to

1 come back.

2 Saint Lawrence I haven't heard
3 anything from.

4 Fred Street, do we have to do
5 anything with that anymore? We have to do
6 it eventually, but is anybody pushing it?

7 MR. PAPI: No.

8 ATTY. RINALDI: Anything on
9 floodplain maps? They finalized yet?

10 MR. LOPATKA: They're not finalized,
11 from what I gather.

12 If somebody wants to build there
13 we're going to have to finish off the road.

14 ATTY. RINALDI: That's all I have.

15 MR. FEBBO: Bill, Stocki's hearing?

16 ATTY. RINALDI: Continued to either
17 the 16th or the 19th -- it's the 16th. It's
18 a Monday. I think 1:30.

19 MR. SEMENZA: Any questions for
20 Bill?

21 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Bill, did you know
22 he has two different names for his company
23 now?

24 MR. FEBBO: Yes.

25 CHIEF DUBERNAS: United Exports

1 and -- I have to go pull his citation. We
2 whacked two of his trucks again last week.

3 ATTY. RINALDI: He signed in care of
4 Scrap, Inc. Walter Stocki. It's only the
5 landowner we're after. It's still in his
6 name.

7 CHIEF DUBERNAS: He's using the 105
8 South Keyser Avenue address.

9 ATTY. RINALDI: It's still the
10 landowner.

11 MR. SEMENZA: Anybody have any
12 questions for Bill? Thanks, Bill.

13 CHIEF DUBERNAS: He did have a
14 permit for that one.

15 MS. BARTOLETTI: I just want to
16 mention to everyone the park will be
17 starting on July 2nd. I have the list of
18 the people who applied. Most of them worked
19 before. I didn't get a ton so we're
20 probably going to hire every person on
21 there. Anybody wants to see the list you
22 can see it. I think there's 23. That's it.

23 MR. SEMENZA: Anybody have any
24 questions for Marylynn? Thank you,
25 Marylynn. Going down the table, Mayor?

1 MAYOR LEGG: I want to thank
2 Marylynn and Paul for all their help. We
3 got 50 flags hung, 25 tomorrow, taking 25
4 up, so it's at 100 right now. It's not
5 stopping. Going like wildfire.

6 By Thursday I'm going to order ten
7 tiles, then that will be taken care of.
8 That closes the five and a half month
9 odyssey. Other than that, that's it.

10 MR. SEMENZA: That will be it for
11 the Wall of Honor. Let me ask you, looking
12 forward to the future, you know there's been
13 other -- what do we do, build another Wall
14 of Honor?

15 MAYOR LEGG: I think I got ten or 12
16 orders for tiles. You can probably put
17 another 30. I'm going to keep the
18 information on where to get them. I think
19 she had 60 of the same color, so I'm going
20 to grab ten or 12 and still have them.

21 MR. SEMENZA: May be 20 years down
22 the line.

23 MAYOR LEGG: You can still fit 20
24 more.

25 MR. SEMENZA: Councilman Febbo?

1 MR. FEBBO: I have nothing.

2 MR. NOTARI: I'd like to schedule a
3 school-borough committee meeting. When are
4 you available?

5 MR. SEMENZA: Mondays, Tuesdays and
6 Thursdays are very good for me -- and
7 Sundays.

8 MR. NOTARI: Can we set one up for
9 June 25th? That will give the school ample
10 time to come up with a representative.
11 Monday, June 25th, 6 p.m. I'd like to
12 invite any representative from the school
13 that would like to come. Let's invite the
14 board president. If they want their
15 committee to come they may. If they want
16 the superintendent to come he may or whoever
17 wants to represent them. I think at least,
18 even if they don't want to come, we need to
19 meet and decide how we're going to go about
20 keeping a police officer in the school. I
21 want it here.

22 Basically it's that day, so if they
23 can't make it, then it's on them.

24 MR. SEMENZA: Bill, is a committee
25 meeting open to the public?

1 ATTY. RINALDI: It's up to the
2 chairman.

3 MR. SEMENZA: So it's up to you if
4 you want it open to the public. If it's
5 open to the public, us three are on the
6 committee, three other councilmen show up,
7 what does that do?

8 ATTY. RINALDI: Just don't let them
9 sit at the table. They can't come in. It's
10 either open to the public or not.

11 MR. SEMENZA: We're having the
12 committee meeting here. We're inviting the
13 school board, their committee. More school
14 directors come and they're going to break
15 the sunshine law and they do, is that going
16 to cause any issues with the borough?

17 ATTY. RINALDI: It's not going to
18 cause the borough issues.

19 MR. SEMENZA: We don't have to tell
20 them, they do what they want to do.

21 ATTY. RINALDI: They have to worry.
22 You're just a committee.

23 MS. BARTOLETTI: Because the last
24 time we attempted to do this it became a
25 problem because the school said they

1 couldn't attend because any meetings that
2 they're going to attend have to be
3 advertised. So if we're having the meeting
4 here is that going to be an issue for them
5 to say they're not going to come because
6 they have to advertise the meeting they're
7 going to be involved in?

8 ATTY. RINALDI: Are they having a
9 meeting?

10 MR. NOTARI: They're not having a
11 meeting, we're having a meeting. Right now
12 it's very political. They're just saying
13 whatever they need to say.

14 MR. SEMENZA: When I spoke with Joe
15 Mariotti he was pretty unsure -- he was
16 asking me how is our policy, do we have to
17 advertise the meeting. No, we set up a
18 committee meeting, we have three members of
19 council. You can't vote.

20 ATTY. RINALDI: They're not voting,
21 just listening.

22 MR. SEMENZA: I think he was a
23 little unsure about that.

24 MS. BARTOLETTI: I think Rick is
25 correct.

1 MR. NOTARI: If we're just having a
2 discussion neither side is going to make an
3 official decision because our committee is
4 going to take it back to council. I would
5 think their committee would take it back to
6 their board.

7 MR. SEMENZA: There's a very big
8 power show going on over there.

9 MR. NOTARI: And they try to put us
10 in the middle. I would have no problem
11 inviting the entire school board, but then
12 it's on them.

13 ATTY. RINALDI: They're still
14 looking for a police officer?

15 MR. NOTARI: That's my guess.

16 CHIEF DUBERNAS: They need a
17 security monitor.

18 ATTY. RINALDI: They call the
19 police, they go right to the school.

20 MR. SEMENZA: I don't think
21 anybody's going to be shooting up domestic
22 relations.

23 ATTY. RINALDI: You'd be surprised.
24 They're there for a reason.

25 MR. NOTARI: We're the committee.

1 MR. SEMENZA: Have the meeting. If
2 they can make it, they can make it.

3 MR. NOTARI: Do we invite the entire
4 school board or just let their president
5 handle that?

6 ATTY. RINALDI: Just say whoever
7 their representative is to come and
8 discuss --

9 MR. FEBBO: We want to know what
10 they're looking for for next year so we know
11 where we are.

12 CHIEF DUBERNAS: That tells us how
13 many part-timers we would have to hire next
14 week.

15 MR. SEMENZA: Do you want to have
16 the phone call made?

17 MS. BARTOLETTI: Rick can do it.

18 MR. NOTARI: I would prefer it come
19 from you. Even if it's just a call to the
20 superintendent.

21 MS. BARTOLETTI: We can't do that.
22 I might call Brian.

23 ATTY. RINALDI: They adopt their
24 budget the end of this month.

25 MR. NOTARI: I wouldn't mind having

1 Brian here.

2 CHIEF DUBERNAS: We're done at the
3 school for two weeks now.

4 MR. NOTARI: Keep me posted. We're
5 going to have a meeting no matter what.
6 That way we can discuss what our options are
7 going to be. When they finally want to come
8 to the table the week before school starts
9 we'll have a plan.

10 I'd also like to set up a sewer
11 committee meeting, but I'll text you and
12 Russell.

13 MR. SEMENZA: Jimmy Hoover.

14 MR. NOTARI: That's all I have.

15 MR. SEMENZA: I have nothing myself.

16 The chair would enter a motion to adjourn.

17 MR. NOTARI: I'll make that motion.

18 MR. SEMENZA: Motion by Councilman
19 Notari. All in favor?

20 (Unanimous. Meeting adjourned.)
