13	RICK NOTARI: I have a couple
14	things, Paul. Is there anything we can
15	do, Hoover Street between Moosic Road
16	and really Vendors Alley is a mess. Can
17	we pothole patch?
18	PAUL PAPI: Yeah. We're going to
19	go out Friday.
20	RICK NOTARI: Okay. It's really a
21	mess in that area where that big tree
22	is, the roots are under that road.
23	LOU FEBBO: Paul, if you do that,
24	go down to Susquehanna, okay.
25	PAUL PAPI: There's Vendors Alley

along the cemetery. 1 LOU FEBBO: I'm thinking about the 2 other side. 3 PAUL PAPI: That was just paved. 4 LOU FEBBO: Between Susquehanna 5 and Moosic Road? 6 PAUL PAPI: Parts of it were, but 7 I don't think that section was. 8 LOU FEBBO: If you get a chance, 9 go in between there. 10 PAUL PAPI: Gooses Alley we call 11 12 that. RUSSELL RINALDI: I think the 13 upper part was paved to Carrie's house. 14 LOU FEBBO: Paul, the other thing, 15 at the corner of Smith and 1st Street, I 16 know we talked about that a little at 17 the last meeting, but now that the trees 18 are grown in, it's kind of on the road 19 by the stop sign. 2.0 PAUL PAPI: We'll take care of 21 that too, the birch tree. I know 22 exactly where you mean. 23 RICK NOTARI: Okay. There's a 24 birch tree dumped over and things have 25

kind of started growing into the road there by the stop sign. I don't want people to start cutting the road close if there's traffic coming the other way. That's all I have. Thanks, Paul.

PAUL PAPI: Sure.

ROBERT SEMENZA: Anybody else have anything for Paul?

Paul, I've got a few things for you. I know I spoke with you yesterday about the signs on Gray Street, the no parking signs that were removed at one time.

PAUL PAPI: Yeah, I'm meeting with the chief tomorrow. We're going to take care of that tomorrow.

ROBERT SEMENZA: Okay, good.

Another thing is, and it might be another combo between you and the chief, there's some corners in Old Forge that cars are parking right on the corner.

One is, and I know it because my mom lives right there on the corner there so I see it, line of sight of people being able to pull out of -- because it's a

busy alley coming out of Ray's Market or whatever you want to call it right now.

Do you know what I'm saying about, chief?

CHIEF DUBERNAS: Yeah, the one where I put a traffic sign there the last time?

ROBERT SEMENZA: There's a stop sign coming out. My mother's house is on the right.

CHIEF DUBERNAS: Yeah, on the left-hand side. Didn't we put a sign there that says no parking to the corner?

ROBERT SEMENZA: But now they're parking right to the telephone pole on my mom's side, which here nor there, but people a couple people came to me and said, they asked if they were my cars or my mom's car, not neighbors parking there.

CHIEF DUBERNAS: All right. I'll look on your mom's side.

ROBERT SEMENZA: Right in front of my mom's house they're parking like

that, but, I mean, you know, not that I 1 complain about people parking. 2 CHIEF DUBERNAS: The apartment 3 side? ROBERT SEMENZA: Right. So they 5 can't pull out onto the street or they 6 got to make it wide. 7 CHIEF DUBERNAS: I'll look at that 8 tomorrow because as a matter of fact, I 9 have to put a sign near there. 10 ROBERT SEMENZA: And a couple 11 other people asked me about, you know, 12 offhand I can't remember, but I'll jot 13 it down at home, some other corners that 14 are just like that. 15 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Okay. 16 ROBERT SEMENZA: Another question, 17 Paul, the storm. Do we have any damage? 18 PAUL PAPI: There were at least 19 eight trees this morning that we removed 20 and we have three blocked storm drains 21 for tomorrow. 22 ROBERT SEMENZA: I was going to 23 say how are our storm drains. 24 PAUL PAPI: We have one in front 25

of the jewelers that's blocked and we have one next to Ghigiarelli's Pizza and one on Martin street.

ROBERT SEMENZA: How's the one by the eye care because that usually has problems?

paul papi: No problem. I had the guys cleaning out today cleaning out the debris from the storm drains, and there was only one that held water that wouldn't take anything. So that means there's leaves blocked in the pipe. So we'll take care of that tomorrow.

ROBERT SEMENZA: Great. Thanks,
Paul. Anybody else have anything for
Paul? Thanks Paul.

Steve, everybody has Steve's report. Steve, do you have anything you want to add or address council about?

STEVE BIERYLA: No, other than what's in the report.

ROBERT SEMENZA: Anybody have any questions for Steve?

JOE FERRETT: Yeah, I got a question. Steve, have you looked at the

19	STEVE BIERYLA: I'll go over it
20	with Dave for sure.
21	ROBERT SEMENZA: Anything else,
22	Joe?
23	JOE FERRETT: No, that's it.
24	ROBERT SEMENZA: Anybody else have
25	anything for Steve? Thank you, Steve.

Chief?

things. First, we got another grant,
Click it or Ticket. It started on
Monday, so for the next three weeks
you'll see multiple police cars out at
the same time. It goes from any time
kids are at school until late at night.
We got \$1,800 this time.

We got an update on my car. One of the pieces for my car is on back order. They think it should be here by the 31st. The guy called me twice and they're going to try to get it rushed. As soon as that part comes in, my car will be ready to be delivered.

The two new hires from last month are working around a schedule. I'm not sure if any of them -- if you've seen them around.

Dave worked yesterday with me. We had 21 calls because of that storm, so we were all over. I was in touch with Paul with trees all over the place and the roof that blew off Kennedy Street.

It wasn't off a residence. It was off a mobile home and I'm not a construction person, but they must have recently put a couple shingles on and that's what took it off. No water damage inside. The fire department pulled the meter and they tarped it for them until they got someone to come and fix it today.

The last thing is a civil service list. Jay Thomas has gone to the city, I got everything back for him. Scranton paid for his vest that we had ordered. So I want to restart the civil service list for a full-time police officer.

ROBERT SEMENZA: I think maybe e would like to re-administer the test.

Is that something we would like to do?

Re-administer the test? Give the test again, because you never know, we might get some more.

CHIEF DUBERNAS: Because the people who are on there are not qualified.

ROBERT SEMENZA: Is everybody in agreement with that?

1	JIM HOOVER: Yes.
2	RUSSELL RINALDI: Yes.

6	that taken care of.

8	ROBERT SEMENZA: Thank you, chief.
9	Anything else?
10	CHIEF DUBERNAS: Nothing else.
11	ROBERT SEMENZA: Anybody else have
12	any questions for the Chief Dubernas?
13	RICK NOTARI: One, chief, one
14	question, the \$1,800 grant for Click it
15	or Ticket, that goes toward salary?
16	CHIEF DUBERNAS: No. That's all
17	paid time and a half for traffic
18	enforcement and all the fines that are
19	issued through traffic enforcement, the
20	Borough collects it. It's a statewide
21	grant. The \$1,800 is to us.
22	ROBERT SEMENZA: It allows us to
23	put extra people on.
24	CHIEF DUBERNAS: Right.
25	RICK NOTARI: The other question

is, I had a concern relayed to me about 1 the alley behind Kiddie Kampus, I guess 2 that's Henderson. 3 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Mayor, is that 4 the one you talked to me about? 5 MAYOR LEGG: Yes. 6 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Cars going through? MAYOR LEGG: Yes. 9 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Okay. I'll let 10 the Mayor address that. 11 RICK NOTARI: Cars going through 12 it at higher speeds than normal and a 13 lot of traffic, people dropping their 14 kids off and using that as a cut. 15 There's some residents that are 16 concerned about their kids playing in 17 their yards and wandering out into the 18 19 alley. CHIEF DUBERNAS: Yeah, I think 20 Mayor Delaney spoke to him too and it's 21 being addressed. 22 RICK NOTARI: What are we going to 2.3 do? 24 In the morning I CHIEF DUBERNAS: 25

have Dave and Kim who are on first shift, moving all around different places that overlap. This is route that people decided they want to go faster to get to work because there is no snow on the ground, so that's another area. I actually have a whole list of extra areas where everybody has been complaining.

RICK NOTARI: More to patrols there, is that what you're saying?

CHIEF DUBERNAS: Yes.

LOU FEBBO: Chief, what about that radar system we're supposed to get.

CHIEF DUBERNAS: The N-Rad. That will be coming in two weeks. It's on back order. I guess he had a lot of them and then all of a sudden the radar thing never passed. It's still at the house or whatever, so now everybody is back to buying the N-Rad systems.

ROBERT SEMENZA: I thought ours was there though and ready to go?

CHIEF DUBERNAS: They have them but they have to keep getting them

because they're on back order now. 1 ROBERT SEMENZA: Did we pay for 2 ours yet? 3 MARYLYNN BARTOLETTI: LOU FEBBO: Do we have a timeline? 5 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Hopefully if he 6 comes on the 30th, he will bring it with 7 8 him. ROBERT SEMENZA: The same guy who 9 brings the car? 10 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Yes, the same 11 gentleman. 12 ROBERT SEMENZA: So, hopefully 13 both will come at once. Joe? 14 JOE RUSSICK: That's a pretty 15 scary place where those kids are being 16 picked up. Cars are packed on the 17 opposite sides and kids running around 18 the cars. God forbid something happens. 19 Something has to be done down 2.0 there. Believe me, I cringe when I go 21 through there with the kids running 2.2 around the cars and the parents, they 23 can't control them. 24 It's just where that place is. 25

First is the pick up. Something has got to be done. Really, it's just a matter of time. Believe me, I don't want to say that, but I just see it coming and that's not a good feeling when I go through there. I even stay away from that area.

RICK NOTARI: The side door or the front door?

CHIEF DUBERNAS: It's the back door. The elementary has a set system. They don't have a set system. Like, if everybody lined up on Henderson and went down the alley or up the alley and out Henderson, they don't because it's all different times. Like, some people are picking up their children at three o'clock and some people are picking up their children at 5:30. I guess there's two or three different pick up times, some is after school area and day care.

JOE RUSSICK: And then they park on the opposite side of the street and you're in traffic.

MAYOR LEGG: Could we ask them for

a better system?

CHIEF DUBERNAS: I was talking to that lady and she said, I'm not sure if they are aides or teachers, but the aides or teachers are supposed to be out there. If not, the parent escort them out.

MAYOR LEGG: Can we do a courtesy stop in there and tell them our concerns?

RICK NOTARI: And even if they send a letter to the parents to park on the side of the street. They need to follow traffic laws.

CHIEF DUBERNAS: Well, what they do is they part on both sides of the street. If somebody would park on Main Street and then just walk across the street or whatever, but the aides are supposed to be out there.

RICK NOTARI: What Mr. Russick is saying is they're parking on both sides.

JOE RUSSICK: Yeah, sometimes they do.

ROBERT SEMENZA: They're parking

any which way they can. Wherever they 1 can park, they park. 2 RICK NOTARI: If they come up the 3 alleyway north or Henderson east to drop off and pick up so the kids are always 5 on the right side of the car. 6 ROBERT SEMENZA: Is that something 7 that the Borough should get involved in, 8 tell them how to make their pick-ups? MAYOR LEGG: Not tell them, but 10 request. 11 RUSSELL RINALDI: Could we make 1.2 Foster to Main a one way. 13 RICK NOTARI: The alley you mean? 14 RUSSELL RINALDI: Not Foster, 15 Lawrence to Main. Just half of the 16 street instead of making the whole 17 Henderson one way out, just make it from 18 Lawrence out to Main. 19 CHIEF DUBERNAS: So no one can 20 turn in. 21 RUSSELL RINALDI: We make it safer 22 and direct them. 23 ROBERT SEMENZA: So you can't turn 24 off of Main onto Henderson. 25

1	RUSSELL RINALDI: But you can't
2	come down Lawrence. You just can't make
3	that left.
4	ROBERT SEMENZA: Off of Main
5	Street.
6	RUSSELL RINALDI: Or right.
7	CHIEF DUBERNAS: If you come up
8	Main or down Main, you can't turn on
9	Henderson.
10	RUSSELL RINALDI: Turn off
11	Henderson.
12	ROBERT SEMENZA: But if you come
13	out of Lawrence, you can make a right or
14	a left.
15	Could you do a traffic study there
16	and get something figured out, chief?
17	RUSSELL RINALDI: Get them facing
18	out.
19	RICK NOTARI: Is that going to put
20	more traffic on Merritt Street?
21	JIM HOOVER: Into the parking lot,
22	they'll go through Ace's Hardware.
23	CHIEF DUBERNAS: And the other
24	thing is, they're going to be using
25	Foster Street, that's the only problem

and they're going to come down one block 1 to try to go around that block. 2 JOE RUSSICK: One of the big steps 3 there is make sure the vehicles are 4 parked on the right side of the street. 5 That would be a big step and then 6 something has to be done though to get a 7 system. 8 RUSSELL RINALDI: How many times a 9 day do they have pick up there? 10 ROBERT SEMENZA: Three, maybe. 11 CHIEF DUBERNAS: After school and 12 then around quarter to five. 13 ROBERT SEMENZA: There's one in 14 the afternoon too, an early one. 15 PAUL PAPI: There's an earlier 16 17 one. CHIEF DUBERNAS: A bus drops kids 1.8 off there too. 19 ROBERT SEMENZA: That's after 20 school kids. 21 JOE RUSSICK: That's not an issue 22 because there's somebody on Main Street 23 and somebody taking them in. 24 ROBERT SEMENZA: A kid could dart

25

out from behind a car. 1 MAYOR LEGG: There should be some 2 responsibility. We're going to change 3 street signs and inconvenience residents 4 when they're not doing their job. 5 ROBERT SEMENZA: I hate for the 6 Borough to get involved in something 7 they shouldn't be. 8 RUSSELL RINALDI: They used to have a crossing guard there for a couple 10 times a day. 11 MAYOR LEGG: I thought they did. 12 RUSSELL RINALDI: I mean years 13 ago, 10 or 15. 14 ROBERT SEMENZA: We have some time 15 here. School is almost over, so it 16 wouldn't be as busy coming up soon. 17 See what you can do, chief, figure 18 something out. 19 CHRIS THOMAS: Is there parking on 20 both sides on that side? 21 ROBERT SEMENZA: Yes. 22 CHRIS THOMAS: Why not parking on 23 one side? The side closer to Kiddie 24 Kampus, make it like a loading and 25

1 unloading zone.

ROBERT SEMENZA: That's a good idea. What side, the opposite of Kiddie Kampus?

CHRIS THOMAS: The side closest to the Kampus.

 $\label{eq:ROBERT SEMENZA: On their side on } \\$ the alley down.

CHRIS THOMAS: You can do that.

ROBERT SEMENZA: Because if you go up further, you're causing problems with the residents. Give us some scenarios.

Anybody have anything else for the chief?

Chief, the one thing I guess I probably should be asking the solicitor, but you came before him, and I want to know -- I personally believe there has to be some mistake. I don't know if it's a mistake made by the person taking notes or the paperwork that you gave to the solicitor, but according to the minutes, the solicitor said I'm going to prepare an ordinance to advertise for that

1	one-way street. When I questioned it he
2	said Butler Street. It's not a one-way
3	street, it's parking that we talked
4	about, correct?
5	ATTORNEY RINALDI: I think we
6	corrected it that night. I misspoke.
7	JOE FERRETT: I want to make sure
8	that's not a one-way street.
9	CHIEF DUBERNAS: No, no, no.
10	There's only one way in.
11	JOE FERRETT: I just want to make
12	sure. I'm reading the minutes and I
13	want to make sure I'm not getting the
14	wrong impression.
15	ROBERT SEMENZA: Anything else,
16	Joe?
17	JOE FERRETT: No.
18	ROBERT SEMENZA: Anybody else have
19	anything for the Chief Dubernas.
20	RUSSELL RINALDI: Just one
21	question. Did you say that Jay Thomas
22	went to work for the City of Scranton?
23	CHIEF DUBERNAS: Yeah.
24	RUSSELL RINALDI: No longer
25	employed here?

CHIEF DUBERNAS: Done. 1 RUSSELL RINALDI: When do we have 2 to fill the spot by to fill the 3 contract? 4 ATTORNEY RINALDI: That's why 5 you're doing the civil service exam. 6 RUSSELL RINALDI: I know. What's 7 the timeline? 8 CHIEF DUBERNAS: If we post the 9 test it's probably by August you'll have 1.0 somebody hired because once you do the 11 physical, you have the oral. 12 ROBERT SEMENZA: No, that's not 13 Councilman Rinaldi's question. 14 Councilman Rinaldi's question is, Bill, 15 how long is in the contract to fill a 16 vacate? 17 RUSSELL RINALDI: For full-time 18 officers. 19 ROBERT SEMENZA: Right. 20 ATTORNEY RINALDI: We don't have 21 any deadline, just the initial 22 vacancies, which we filled and now the 23 normal. 24 CHIEF DUBERNAS: And I think if 25

you show progress. I know. 1 RUSSELL RINALDI: Do we have 2 enough part-timers to make it to August? 3 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Yeah, because the two we hired the last time are now 5 working and now we can hire two more in 6 June and they can go through and then 7 I'll be ready for the end of the summer and the school coming back --9 RUSSELL RINALDI: That was going 10 to be my third question. 11 CHIEF DUBERNAS: -- and then the 12 holiday season. 13 RUSSELL RINALDI: Okay. the seniors start finals the 7th or the 8th, Thursday or Friday earlier they start finals because then they have their final trip. May, I'm sorry.

ROBERT SEMENZA: We have a school board member here. When is it?

right after Memorial Day. The reduction of the full amount of kids will happen probably June 1st, because the seniors should start their finals the 29th, 30th, 31st and the 1st. The other kids should start the 31st or the 1st.

There won't be any kids in the high school after June 5th or 6th.

CHIEF DUBERNAS: Yeah, they told me starting the 4th there's only going to be kids there for two hours.

RUSSELL RINALDI: So we are going to have coverage for the town and coverage for the school?

CHIEF DUBERNAS: Yes.

RUSSELL RINALDI: Okay, very good.

ROBERT SEMENZA: Does anybody have anything else for Chief Dubernas?

Thanks, chief. 1 Dave, what do you got for us? 2 Does everybody have Dave's report? 3 DAVE LOPATKA: I don't have one. 4 I just have a couple comments. I have three quotes 7 down which I will forward to MaryLynn. 8 They were \$16,000 for Earth Works. 9 \$18,725 was TSE and then \$22,000 was AR 10 Linde, who is doing the street project. 11 RICK NOTARI: This is to fix the 12 run off problem down at the DPW? 13 DAVE LOPATKA: Yeah. 14 ROBERT SEMENZA: What was TSE's? 15 JIM HOOVER: \$18,725 you said? 16 DAVE LOPATKA: Yeah. 17 ATTORNEY RINALDI: Don't forget my 18 easement. 19 DAVE LOPATKA: I sent it. 2.0 ATTORNEY RINALDI: I got the map. 21 DAVE LOPATKA: I'll get them to 22 23 you. MAYOR LEGG: What was the last 24 one? 25

DAVE LOPATKA: \$22,000, AR Linde. 1 ROBERT SEMENZA: Is that something 2 we have to vote on tonight? 3 ATTORNEY RINALDI: No. Well, if 4 you want to award the bid, but I have to 5 get an easement in place, that's all. 6 DAVE LOPATKA: I have the 7 description for you. 8 ROBERT SEMENZA: What kind of time 9 frame is it for you to get the easement 10 11 in place? ATTORNEY RINALDI: I get the 12 description, I type it up and we either 13 have someone come down here and have 14 somebody notarize it or he comes down to 15 my office and gets it notarized. 1.6 ROBERT SEMENZA: How long are 17 these bids good for? 18 DAVE LOPATKA: They're just 19 20 quotes. ATTORNEY RINALDI: You can approve 21 it tonight and then it's up to MaryLynn 22 to do the start work order. That's not 23 a problem. 24

MAYOR LEGG: Why don't we do that.

ROBERT SEMENZA: \$16,000? 1 JIM HOOVER: Earth Works is 2 \$16,000, AR Linde is \$22,000, and TSE is 3 \$18,725. 4 LOU FEBBO: Can I make a motion 5 that we put that on the floor and vote 6 on it? 7 ROBERT SEMENZA: Yes. I just put 8 it down under new business on my sheet 9 10 now. That wasn't an actual 6 measurement for everything. 7 ROBERT SEMENZA: Correct. 8 DAVE LOPATKA: So I told them that 9 they need to measure everything, get us 10 what the number is so we can put it on 11 the change order, and that's the number 12 they will pay you guys. 13 ATTORNEY RINALDI: So I can send 14 him the change order and we're going to 15 vote on the change order? 16 DAVE LOPATKA: Correct. 17 JOE RUSSICK: Why can't that be a 18 separate invoice? 19 ATTORNEY RINALDI: It is. It's a 2.0 separate change order. 21 JIM HOOVER: Why are we the middle 22 23 man? ROBERT SEMENZA: What they're 24 doing is piggybacking off or contract.

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JOE FERRETT: What happens if they run into a problem and there might be some more money and things of this nature?

DAVE LOPATKA: Well, anything could happen. They're going to have to provide us what the number is and they're going to have to provide us the cost that they're going to pay. It's not going to be paid by you guys. It will be paid by them.

JOE FERRETT: That's what I'm trying to say. They're going to be liable for any costs afterwards.

DAVE LOPATKA: They're going to be liable for any costs to do the work either way. That's what I'm saying.

ROBERT SEMENZA: Do we still have to sign a contract with them or no?

ATTORNEY RINALDI: No. We're going to get a change order. Pennsy I think wants to use our charge order.

ROBERT SEMENZA: I get it, but it's under Old Forge Borough also.

ATTORNEY RINALDI: Right. But

they're paying for it. So in other words --

ROBERT SEMENZA: I'm just saying they flip flopped so many times over the last three years, right, Joe, so I'm just afraid at the end what's going to happen is we're going to have mud on our face once again.

JOE RUSSICK: Why don't they invoice the housing authority?

JIM HOOVER: That's the way it should be because we're removing five streets from the change order and now you're going to add another street to the change order. We're going to get the check off of HUD and then we're going to pay Pennsy. Why can't HUD just pay Pennsy?

DAVE LOPATKA: How this all started was --

JIM HOOVER: Because it's a HUD street.

DAVE LOPATKA: No, no. The only reason this started was to try and save time and get it done in a timely manner.

JIM HOOVER: It's not working.

DAVE LOPATKA: It's not working because they never got us the numbers for the change order. So, what they have to do is if you want it done that way, they would have to bid it out themselves.

JIM HOOVER: He told me today that he's going to talk to Nello and if he thinks that Nello's price is too high, that will take another two weeks.

RICK NOTARI: Who told you that?

JIM HOOVER: Tony at KBA, he's the housing engineer.

DAVE LOPATKA: The whole part of this is to get it done as part of last years paving project. We are beyond that. So if you take your five roads off, your contract is completed and they can bid it themselves if that's how they want to do it.

JOE RUSSICK: Is that all legal?
Doesn't smell good, but...

ATTORNEY RINALDI: They don't talk to each other is the problem. The

engineer doesn't talk to this one and that one. So now the engineer, they call him up and say, oh, why can't you do it this way.

DAVE LOPATKA: That was the idea then and now we're beyond that, so be it.

ATTORNEY RINALDI: We did them a favor.

DAVE LOPATKA: Right. So, I mean, that's what that is. If they end up wanting to bid it themselves, we'll just put a change order together and close out your order with Pennsy.

LOU FEBBO: Could we do that?

ROBERT SEMENZA: Who is dragging their feet here?

JIM HOOVER: I'm going to call Nello tomorrow and I'll ask when that meeting with Tony is, to let me know when the meeting is.

DAVE LOPATKA: I'll call him.

JOE RUSSICK: Why doesn't someone call Martino Washington down at HUD in Philadelphia and ask her if it's

1	acceptable to HUD because it has to go
2	through HUD.
3	DAVE LOPATKA: As part of this,
4	Joe, we sent them the information.
5	JOE RUSSICK: In Philadelphia?
6	DAVE LOPATKA: Yes. We sent it to
7	them. We forwarded them everything.
8	JOE RUSSICK: They're okay with
9	it?
10	DAVE LOPATKA: Right. We're
11	chasing this thing around, like, I got
12	to call.
13	MAYOR LEGG: Jimmy, he said talk
14	to him.
15	JIM HOOVER: I will. I talk to
16	him every day.
17	ROBERT SEMENZA: Who is dragging
18	their feet now KBA or the HUD?
19	ATTORNEY RINALDI: HUD approved
20	it.
21	ROBERT SEMENZA: So they're
22	dragging their feet.
23	DAVE LOPATKA: Right. There's no
24	communication between the housing
25	authority and KBA.

JOE RUSSICK: Do you have any 1 paperwork on that, because if you don't 2 got it in writing, you don't got it. 3 RICK NOTARI: We have it in 4 writing. 5 DAVE LOPATKA: All of our bidding 6 information was requested by HUD so they 7 can do it this way. 8 JOE RUSSICK: As long as you have 9 it in writing, you have a leg to stand 10 on it. 11 DAVE LOPATKA: It doesn't have to 12 be done if they want to bid it 13 themselves. 14 RICK NOTARI: They have to make 15 that decision. We were the ones doing 16 them a favor. 17 DAVE LOPATKA: We're still 18 waiting. Will you talk to them, Jim? 19 JIM HOOVER: Yeah. I'll work them 20 both out and I'll call you. 21 DAVE LOPATKA: Give me a call and 22 tell me how you want to handle it. If 23 they determine they want to bid, I'll 24 finalize the change order and you guys 25

can close out the contract. 1 ATTORNEY RINALDI: By the time we agreed on the language it was December, 3 so they're not that far behind. 4 ROBERT SEMENZA: What about behind 5 Burger King? 6 ATTORNEY RINALDI: We approved it 7 in December. 8 DAVE LOPATKA: Is that something 9 that's in the change order? 10 ROBERT SEMENZA: That has to be 11 paved. We dug that road up. Was that 12 part of the bid or no? 13 DAVE LOPATKA: No. 14 RUSSELL RINALDI: We talked about 15 that and Beech Street we were going to 16 add it. 17 JOE FERRETT: That's up to them. 18 We're not involved with it whatsoever. 19 We can drop out of this. That's not our 20 problem, that's their problem. 21 DAVE LOPATKA: I'm not disagreeing 22 23 with you. JOE FERRETT: That was the reason 24 I made the recommendation to take the

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25

five streets off because they're going to be there all year. I don't like the idea of us doing work for somebody else and using tax payers money and --

ATTORNEY RINALDI: We're not. We're not doing that.

JOE FERRETT: Well, now you're not.

ATTORNEY RINALDI: We were never doing that.

DAVE LOPATKA: We're just trying to facilitate it to get it finished. You know, however you want to do it and however they want to do it. I have no problem.

LOU FEBBO: I think you and Jimmy should work together with that and get back to us.

DAVE LOPATKA: If they turn around and say that they're going to bid it, so be it. We'll close out the contract.

ROBERT SEMENZA: I mean, I don't know how much longer we're going to chase this, you know what I'm saying? DAVE LOPATKA: No, I know.

ROBERT SEMENZA: Well, we're trying to do something for the residents of our Borough. Even though it's not our responsibility to have that road paved, we're trying to aid the process and aid our residents that live down there because it's a shame.

JOE RUSSICK: It's only going on two years.

RICK NOTARI: It's been going on longer than that. It's a shame the way the roads are taken care of in that development and in the development on Kohler Avenue. They have lived with that problem for too long.

DAVE LOPATKA: They should be calling us. We shouldn't be calling them.

RICK NOTARI: I agree a hundred percent, Dave.

LOU FEBBO: Right, but they're not.

ATTORNEY RINALDI: We were chasing them because we were also doing it with our project, but last month we took our

1	project off the table. So now we don't
2	have to chase them.
3	DAVE LOPATKA: If you want to
4	close it out, then we can close it out.
5	RICK NOTARI: Okay. But we do
6	need to pave Meade Street now.
7	DAVE LOPATKA: If we want to pave
8	Meade Street, maybe we can add that and
9	get Pennsy to do that.
10	ROBERT SEMENZA: It will have to
11	be done from behind Burger King up to
12	Oak.
13	PAUL PAPI: Probably, yeah. To do
14	it right, yeah.
15	JIM HOOVER: And the intersection
16	of Oak should be done too.
17	ROBERT SEMENZA: Sussex you mean.
18	JIM HOOVER: Sussex.
19	DAVE LOPATKA: You want to do
20	Meade and Sussex.
21	ROBERT SEMENZA: That piece of
22	Sussex.
23	JIM HOOVER: Just that
24	intersection.
25	ROBERT SEMENZA: I think probably

the intersection, but you're going to 1 have to go down a little ways to Main 2 Street there. 3 DAVE LOPATKA: Right, but you 4 don't want to get to the right-of-way. 5 You want to stop at the right-of-way. 6 ROBERT SEMENZA: What's the 7 right-of-way? 8 DAVE LOPATKA: Probably 50 feet. 9 ROBERT SEMENZA: Oh, yeah. 10 saying right to when you stop at Burger 11 12 King. DAVE LOPATKA: So you don't have 13 to get an HOP. 14 ROBERT SEMENZA: Okay. Just down 15 the street maybe 20, 30 feet. 16 DAVE LOPATKA: We're going to look 17 at storm water with their engineer 18 tomorrow and Paul's coming, I sent an 19 email to MaryLynn. 20 ROBERT SEMENZA: What time, nine 21 o'clock? 22 DAVE LOPATKA: Yes. So, as part 23 of that, I'll run by -- me and Paul can 24 run by Burger King and he can show me 25

exactly what we need to do and we can add that. We'll do a change order to remove the five and to add whatever we have to do there to finish that. ROBERT SEMENZA: Okay. DAVE LOPATKA: And then at that point, we can then close out the contract if the county ever gets back RICK NOTARI: That's a good question, is that getting paid out of ROBERT SEMENZA: That's a good DAVE LOPATKA: It's a paving RICK NOTARI: We are only paving there because of the work that was done on the sewers, so we should be able to pay out of the sewer account. MARYLYNN BARTOLETTI: You should DAVE LOPATKA: Can that be paved

3	floor?
4	ROBERT SEMENZA: Sure, go ahead.
5	JOE FERRETT: Dave, at the last
6	meeting there was only a couple of us
7	here and we got into the discussion on
8	Kohler Avenue, correct?
9	DAVE LOPATKA: We're making the
10	changes.
11	JOE FERRETT: Pardon?
12	DAVE LOPATKA: We're making the
13	changes that you want.
14	JOE FERRETT: What changes are you
15	making?
16	DAVE LOPATKA: You want a curb on
17	one side of the street.
18	JOE FERRETT: You're going to put
19	a curb on?
20	DAVE LOPATKA: If you want a curb,
21	we can put it on.
22	JOE FERRETT: You said yourself
23	there's no curb, the water is going off
24	the road.
25	DAVE LOPATKA: Well, it's a little

different situation. But if you want curb --

JOE FERRETT: No, I didn't say -- go ahead.

DAVE LOPATKA: But, anyway, we feel comfortable with putting the swale there. The reason that Edgewood Drive was, some of that water was actually running into the properties.

In this case, everything is running from the properties out to the road.

problem with what you're doing. All I'm doing is questioning what I've been reading in the minutes that I didn't understand before, and all I'm just merely saying is that you're putting in a swale. The swale is only going to be about a foot deep, not even two feet deep according to your minutes and. You're saying that you're putting inlets on both sides of the road?

DAVE LOPATKA: Correct.

JOE FERRETT: Now, my question to

you is this: The inlet that's going to be on the side of the road where the people are living, how is it going to get to the other side and get to the swale?

DAVE LOPATKA: The road is crowned in that area. So half of the road drains one way and the other half of the road drains the other way.

JOE FERRETT: I understand, but the water is going into the inlet. You said according to reading your minutes that --

DAVE LOPATKA: Maybe it was a mistake.

JOE FERRETT: How is the water from the inlet getting into the swale? That's my point.

DAVE LOPATKA: The water getting into the swale? The road is crowned, so all of the water --

JOE FERRETT: How is the water coming from the inlet on the opposite side of the swale getting into the swale?

LOU FEBBO: Inlets on both sides, 1 Dave? 2 Inlets on both DAVE LOPATKA: 3 sides. So pipe is underneath the ground. 5 JOE FERRETT: What size pipe? 6 DAVE LOPATKA: What size pipe? 7 think they're a minimum of 12-inch. 8 JOE FERRETT: You're going to have 9 a 12-inch pipe going into the road into 10 a 12-inch swale? 11 DAVE LOPATKA: No, no, no. You're 12 missing the point. 13 JOE FERRETT: Don't make sense. 14 DAVE LOPATKA: No, you're not 1.5 understanding what's on the plan. The 16 plan, there's a swale and there's an 17 inlet in the swale. So the water 18 flowing in the swale drops into the 19 inlet and then it's piped across the 2.0 street to the other system running done 21 the other side of the street. 22 JOE FERRETT: But you said it's a 2.3 24 12-inch pipe.

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ROBERT SEMENZA: There's a catch

basin inside the swale, Joe. 1 JOE FERRETT: What? 2 There's a catch ROBERT SEMENZA: 3 basin in the swale. JOE FERRETT: I understand that. 5 How is the water going from this to the 6 other side --7 DAVE LOPATKA: Underneath the 8 road. 9 JOE FERRETT: It's going to go 10 underneath the road? How far is it 11 going to be underneath the road, 12 one-inch, two-inch, four-inches, 13 six-inches underneath the road or what? 14 DAVE LOPATKA: Three and a half 15 feet under the road. That's a standard 16 depth for an inlet box, three and a half 17 to four feet. 18 JOE FERRETT: That's what I wanted 19 to know. And it's going into the inlet? 2.0 DAVE LOPATKA: Going into the 21 inlet, dropping in the inlet, crossing 22 under the road and there's an inlet on 23 the other side of the road. 24 JOE FERRETT: All right. Where's

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that water going from the inlet?

DAVE LOPATKA: That water goes down inside the inlet on Church Street.

JOE FERRETT: What inlet on Church Street, on the corner of Kohler Avenue?

DAVE LOPATKA: It's across Church Street. You cross Church Street. We're going to cross Church Street with a pipe. It ties into an inlet that way and then it actually goes --

JOE FERRETT: You're saying the inlet is right on Kohler Avenue only on the other side of Church Street or is it on the corner of Dunn Avenue.

DAVE LOPATKA: No, it's on Church Street. It's not on the Kohler Avenue side of the street. It's across the street on Church Street.

JOE FERRETT: So, we're digging up Church Street again, right?

DAVE LOPATKA: We're going to cut across Church Street and they'll re-pave that section of Church Street also.

We're paving the whole road, it's all getting done.

JOE FERRETT: And what's going to happen with people that are living on Hill Crest Drive, that whole piece of property on that side? What are we going to do with the water?

DAVE LOPATKA: On which side?

JOE FERRETT: On the opposite side where the swale is. All that property between Kohler Avenue and Hill Crest Drive, all that property.

DAVE LOPATKA: All that property grade wise drains to Kohler Avenue.

JOE FERRETT: But the people that are going to -- the people who purchased all that land, when they go to develop that land, where are they going to put the water?

JIM HOOVER: That's up to them.

DAVE LOPATKA: That's up to them.

They're probably going to have to put

some kind of underground system in and

tie into one of our inlets.

ROBERT SEMENZA: They have to go to planning, Joe.

DAVE LOPATKA: We can't account

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1	for what they're going to do because we
2	don't know what they're going to do.
3	JOE FERRETT: My question to you
4	is this: You just got finished saying
5	they have to go to work and make you put
6	in an underground system. Why don't you
7	just say we'll do that rather than going
8	into a combined system?
9	DAVE LOPATKA: We're not going
10	into a combined system.
11	JOE FERRETT: We're not?
12	DAVE LOPATKA: We're tying into an
13	inlet.
14	JOE FERRETT: Where's the water
15	from Kohler Avenue going?
16	DAVE LOPATKA: Where does it go?
17	JOE FERRETT: You said to Church
18	Street.
19	DAVE LOPATKA: It ties into an
20	inlet on Church Street.
21	JOE FERRETT: And that inlet is
22	not a storm water. That's a combination
23	inlet.
24	DAVE LOPATKA: I'm not so sure of
25	that. We didn't track it all the way,

1.8

but it actually doesn't go left down Church Street, it actually goes right.

ROBERT SEMENZA: So, most likely it goes down to Saint John's Creek.

Paul, do you know anything about it?

PAUL PAPI: I think that --

DAVE LOPATKA: I mean, we didn't track it the whole way. We tied into it. We shot one down the street from it and I don't know if it ultimately ties into the system or not.

JOE FERRETT: So, in other words, you're saying that when Mr. Febbo asked you that question, you said it attaches to an existing on Church Street which is a combined system.

DAVE LOPATKA: Well, I don't know if it's a hundred percent combined system. There is a sanitary system that runs down Church Street, but we're not tying into the sanitary -- or the combined system, we're tying actually into an inlet.

So that inlet goes to the north and we didn't track it all the way to

where it discharges. So I don't know if 1 it actually ties in somewhere. It 2 doesn't tie in right there in the 3 system. It goes towards Dunn Avenue. 4 PAUL PAPI: I know at the section 5 of Dunn Avenue there's a big storm pipe 6 7 there. JOE FERRETT: That's a 8 combination. 9 PAUL PAPI: For the new 10 development, Joe. 11 DAVE LOPATKA: I mean, if you want 12 me to go up and track where it ends up, 13 I mean, we shot the inlet, we shot where 14 it goes down stream. I didn't 15 ultimately chase it to wherever it 16 discharges. That's typically not what 17 we would do. 18 JOE FERRETT: All right. That's 19 not a problem. 20 LOU FEBBO: Dave, what kind of 21 curbs? 22 DAVE LOPATKA: On that side, up 23 where there's concrete we're going to 24 replace it with concrete up on the 25

corner. We'll put it -- because we're 1 doing a project with always needing 2 money, on that corner we have to put a 3 handicap ramp. ROBERT SEMENZA: It's CDBG, isn't 5 it? DAVE LOPATKA: Right. 7 ROBERT SEMENZA: Anything else, Dave, anything else? Joe? 9 DAVE LOPATKA: No. I touched on 10 the pride, we're doing that meeting. 11 Other than that, no. 12 ROBERT SEMENZA: Okay. Anybody 13 have any questions for Dave? 14 RICK NOTARI: Do we have a 15 tentative start date for Kohler Avenue? 16 DAVE LOPATKA: The county did not 17 give you us a start date yet. I believe 18 we are waiting for the contractor. 19 contractor at the time we met out there 20 said that he can start there in June. I 21 didn't get a definite start. 22 RICK NOTARI: Okay. Thanks, Dave. 23 ROBERT SEMENZA: Anybody else? 24 Thanks, Dave. Oh, I'm sorry. 25

JIM HOOVER: Corcoran Street, when's that starting?

DAVE LOPATKA: We reviewed shops.

We're waiting for the manhole to be

built. Once the manhole is built, we

can start. That was about two or three

weeks ago. The manhole should be

constructed by now.

JIM HOOVER: That's why I asked.

DAVE LOPATKA: I can check with them and see what their schedule is.

ROBERT SEMENZA: Anything else? Thanks, Dave.

Bill, solicitors report, please.

ATTORNEY RINALDI: Okay. We have one item tonight. It's the ordinance for no parking on Butler Street. It was advertised. There's a copy attached to my report with the two originals.

For the park we're just waiting on an appraisal and then we can issue a title policy and close. If everybody is in concurrence, I would just like a vote to concur my response to the grievance -- or as the Borough concurs,
