3 ROBERT SEMENZA: Yes. I'll move
4 on to our department heads now. At this
5 time I'll go to Paul Papi DPW.
6 Everybody has Paul's report.

7 Paul, do you have anything to add
8 to the council?

9 PAUL PAPI: No. Everything is
10 good. We're doing good.

11 ROBERT SEMENZA: Does anyone have
12 any questions for Paul?

13 RICK NOTARI: I have a couple
14 things, Paul. Is there anything we can
15 do, Hoover Street between Moosic Road
16 and really Vendors Alley is a mess. Can
17 we pothole patch?

18 PAUL PAPI: Yeah. We're going to
19 go out Friday.

20 RICK NOTARI: Okay. It's really a
21 mess in that area where that big tree
22 is, the roots are under that road.

23 LOU FEBBO: Paul, if you do that,
24 go down to Susquehanna, okay.

25 PAUL PAPI: There's Vendors Alley

1 along the cemetery.

2 LOU FEBBO: I'm thinking about the
3 other side.

4 PAUL PAPI: That was just paved.

5 LOU FEBBO: Between Susquehanna
6 and Moosic Road?

7 PAUL PAPI: Parts of it were, but
8 I don't think that section was.

9 LOU FEBBO: If you get a chance,
10 go in between there.

11 PAUL PAPI: Gooses Alley we call
12 that.

13 RUSSELL RINALDI: I think the
14 upper part was paved to Carrie's house.

15 LOU FEBBO: Paul, the other thing,
16 at the corner of Smith and 1st Street, I
17 know we talked about that a little at
18 the last meeting, but now that the trees
19 are grown in, it's kind of on the road
20 by the stop sign.

21 PAUL PAPI: We'll take care of
22 that too, the birch tree. I know
23 exactly where you mean.

24 RICK NOTARI: Okay. There's a
25 birch tree dumped over and things have

1 kind of started growing into the road
2 there by the stop sign. I don't want
3 people to start cutting the road close
4 if there's traffic coming the other way.
5 That's all I have. Thanks, Paul.

6 PAUL PAPI: Sure.

7 ROBERT SEMENZA: Anybody else have
8 anything for Paul?

9 Paul, I've got a few things for
10 you. I know I spoke with you yesterday
11 about the signs on Gray Street, the no
12 parking signs that were removed at one
13 time.

14 PAUL PAPI: Yeah, I'm meeting with
15 the chief tomorrow. We're going to take
16 care of that tomorrow.

17 ROBERT SEMENZA: Okay, good.
18 Another thing is, and it might be
19 another combo between you and the chief,
20 there's some corners in Old Forge that
21 cars are parking right on the corner.
22 One is, and I know it because my mom
23 lives right there on the corner there so
24 I see it, line of sight of people being
25 able to pull out of -- because it's a

1 busy alley coming out of Ray's Market or
2 whatever you want to call it right now.
3 Do you know what I'm saying about,
4 chief?

5 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Yeah, the one
6 where I put a traffic sign there the
7 last time?

8 ROBERT SEMENZA: There's a stop
9 sign coming out. My mother's house is
10 on the right.

11 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Yeah, on the
12 left-hand side. Didn't we put a sign
13 there that says no parking to the
14 corner?

15 ROBERT SEMENZA: But now they're
16 parking right to the telephone pole on
17 my mom's side, which here nor there, but
18 people a couple people came to me and
19 said, they asked if they were my cars or
20 my mom's car, not neighbors parking
21 there.

22 CHIEF DUBERNAS: All right. I'll
23 look on your mom's side.

24 ROBERT SEMENZA: Right in front of
25 my mom's house they're parking like

1 that, but, I mean, you know, not that I
2 complain about people parking.

3 CHIEF DUBERNAS: The apartment
4 side?

5 ROBERT SEMENZA: Right. So they
6 can't pull out onto the street or they
7 got to make it wide.

8 CHIEF DUBERNAS: I'll look at that
9 tomorrow because as a matter of fact, I
10 have to put a sign near there.

11 ROBERT SEMENZA: And a couple
12 other people asked me about, you know,
13 offhand I can't remember, but I'll jot
14 it down at home, some other corners that
15 are just like that.

16 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Okay.

17 ROBERT SEMENZA: Another question,
18 Paul, the storm. Do we have any damage?

19 PAUL PAPI: There were at least
20 eight trees this morning that we removed
21 and we have three blocked storm drains
22 for tomorrow.

23 ROBERT SEMENZA: I was going to
24 say how are our storm drains.

25 PAUL PAPI: We have one in front

1 of the jewelers that's blocked and we
2 have one next to Ghigiarelli's Pizza and
3 one on Martin street.

4 ROBERT SEMENZA: How's the one by
5 the eye care because that usually has
6 problems?

7 PAUL PAPI: No problem. I had the
8 guys cleaning out today cleaning out the
9 debris from the storm drains, and there
10 was only one that held water that
11 wouldn't take anything. So that means
12 there's leaves blocked in the pipe. So
13 we'll take care of that tomorrow.

14 ROBERT SEMENZA: Great. Thanks,
15 Paul. Anybody else have anything for
16 Paul? Thanks Paul.

17 Steve, everybody has Steve's
18 report. Steve, do you have anything you
19 want to add or address council about?

20 STEVE BIERLYA: No, other than
21 what's in the report.

22 ROBERT SEMENZA: Anybody have any
23 questions for Steve?

24 JOE FERRETT: Yeah, I got a
25 question. Steve, have you looked at the

1 specs for Kohler Avenue?

2 STEVE BIERYLA: Pardon me?

3 JOE FERRETT: Have you looked at
4 the specs for Kohler Avenue?

5 STEVE BIERYLA: I haven't even
6 seen it.

7 JOE FERRETT: Are you satisfied
8 that they're being done according to
9 code?

10 STEVE BIERYLA: I haven't even
11 seen them, so I can't answer that
12 question. I haven't seen the specs at
13 all to it. Who has the plans at
14 present?

15 JOE FERRETT: Ask MaryLynn. Who
16 has the plans?

17 MARYLYNN BARTOLETTI: I'm sure I
18 do.

19 STEVE BIERYLA: I'll go over it
20 with Dave for sure.

21 ROBERT SEMENZA: Anything else,
22 Joe?

23 JOE FERRETT: No, that's it.

24 ROBERT SEMENZA: Anybody else have
25 anything for Steve? Thank you, Steve.

1 Chief?

2 CHIEF DUBERNAS: I have a few
3 things. First, we got another grant,
4 Click it or Ticket. It started on
5 Monday, so for the next three weeks
6 you'll see multiple police cars out at
7 the same time. It goes from any time
8 kids are at school until late at night.
9 We got \$1,800 this time.

10 We got an update on my car. One
11 of the pieces for my car is on back
12 order. They think it should be here by
13 the 31st. The guy called me twice and
14 they're going to try to get it rushed.
15 As soon as that part comes in, my car
16 will be ready to be delivered.

17 The two new hires from last month
18 are working around a schedule. I'm not
19 sure if any of them -- if you've seen
20 them around.

21 Dave worked yesterday with me. We
22 had 21 calls because of that storm, so
23 we were all over. I was in touch with
24 Paul with trees all over the place and
25 the roof that blew off Kennedy Street.

1 It wasn't off a residence. It was off a
2 mobile home and I'm not a construction
3 person, but they must have recently put
4 a couple shingles on and that's what
5 took it off. No water damage inside.
6 The fire department pulled the meter and
7 they tarped it for them until they got
8 someone to come and fix it today.

9 The last thing is a civil service
10 list. Jay Thomas has gone to the city,
11 I got everything back for him. Scranton
12 paid for his vest that we had ordered.
13 So I want to restart the civil service
14 list for a full-time police officer.

15 ROBERT SEMENZA: I think maybe e
16 would like to re-administer the test.
17 Is that something we would like to do?
18 Re-administer the test? Give the test
19 again, because you never know, we might
20 get some more.

21 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Because the
22 people who are on there are not
23 qualified.

24 ROBERT SEMENZA: Is everybody in
25 agreement with that?

1 JIM HOOVER: Yes.

2 RUSSELL RINALDI: Yes.

3 RICK NOTARI: Yes.

4 LOU FEBBO: Yes.

5 ROBERT SEMENZA: Okay. We'll get
6 that taken care of.

7 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Get it started.

8 ROBERT SEMENZA: Thank you, chief.

9 Anything else?

10 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Nothing else.

11 ROBERT SEMENZA: Anybody else have
12 any questions for the Chief Dubernas?

13 RICK NOTARI: One, chief, one
14 question, the \$1,800 grant for Click it
15 or Ticket, that goes toward salary?

16 CHIEF DUBERNAS: No. That's all
17 paid time and a half for traffic
18 enforcement and all the fines that are
19 issued through traffic enforcement, the
20 Borough collects it. It's a statewide
21 grant. The \$1,800 is to us.

22 ROBERT SEMENZA: It allows us to
23 put extra people on.

24 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Right.

25 RICK NOTARI: The other question

1 is, I had a concern relayed to me about
2 the alley behind Kiddie Kampus, I guess
3 that's Henderson.

4 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Mayor, is that
5 the one you talked to me about?

6 MAYOR LEGG: Yes.

7 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Cars going
8 through?

9 MAYOR LEGG: Yes.

10 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Okay. I'll let
11 the Mayor address that.

12 RICK NOTARI: Cars going through
13 it at higher speeds than normal and a
14 lot of traffic, people dropping their
15 kids off and using that as a cut.
16 There's some residents that are
17 concerned about their kids playing in
18 their yards and wandering out into the
19 alley.

20 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Yeah, I think
21 Mayor Delaney spoke to him too and it's
22 being addressed.

23 RICK NOTARI: What are we going to
24 do?

25 CHIEF DUBERNAS: In the morning I

1 have Dave and Kim who are on first
2 shift, moving all around different
3 places that overlap. This is route that
4 people decided they want to go faster to
5 get to work because there is no snow on
6 the ground, so that's another area. I
7 actually have a whole list of extra
8 areas where everybody has been
9 complaining.

10 RICK NOTARI: More to patrols
11 there, is that what you're saying?

12 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Yes.

13 LOU FEBBO: Chief, what about that
14 radar system we're supposed to get.

15 CHIEF DUBERNAS: The N-Rad. That
16 will be coming in two weeks. It's on
17 back order. I guess he had a lot of
18 them and then all of a sudden the radar
19 thing never passed. It's still at the
20 house or whatever, so now everybody is
21 back to buying the N-Rad systems.

22 ROBERT SEMENZA: I thought ours
23 was there though and ready to go?

24 CHIEF DUBERNAS: They have them
25 but they have to keep getting them

1 because they're on back order now.

2 ROBERT SEMENZA: Did we pay for
3 ours yet?

4 MARYLYNN BARTOLETTI: No.

5 LOU FEBBO: Do we have a timeline?

6 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Hopefully if he
7 comes on the 30th, he will bring it with
8 him.

9 ROBERT SEMENZA: The same guy who
10 brings the car?

11 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Yes, the same
12 gentleman.

13 ROBERT SEMENZA: So, hopefully
14 both will come at once. Joe?

15 JOE RUSSICK: That's a pretty
16 scary place where those kids are being
17 picked up. Cars are packed on the
18 opposite sides and kids running around
19 the cars. God forbid something happens.

20 Something has to be done down
21 there. Believe me, I cringe when I go
22 through there with the kids running
23 around the cars and the parents, they
24 can't control them.

25 It's just where that place is.

1 First is the pick up. Something has got
2 to be done. Really, it's just a matter
3 of time. Believe me, I don't want to
4 say that, but I just see it coming and
5 that's not a good feeling when I go
6 through there. I even stay away from
7 that area.

8 RICK NOTARI: The side door or the
9 front door?

10 CHIEF DUBERNAS: It's the back
11 door. The elementary has a set system.
12 They don't have a set system. Like, if
13 everybody lined up on Henderson and went
14 down the alley or up the alley and out
15 Henderson, they don't because it's all
16 different times. Like, some people are
17 picking up their children at three
18 o'clock and some people are picking up
19 their children at 5:30. I guess there's
20 two or three different pick up times,
21 some is after school area and day care.

22 JOE RUSSICK: And then they park
23 on the opposite side of the street and
24 you're in traffic.

25 MAYOR LEGG: Could we ask them for

1 a better system?

2 CHIEF DUBERNAS: I was talking to
3 that lady and she said, I'm not sure if
4 they are aides or teachers, but the
5 aides or teachers are supposed to be out
6 there. If not, the parent escort them
7 out.

8 MAYOR LEGG: Can we do a courtesy
9 stop in there and tell them our
10 concerns?

11 RICK NOTARI: And even if they
12 send a letter to the parents to park on
13 the side of the street. They need to
14 follow traffic laws.

15 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Well, what they
16 do is they park on both sides of the
17 street. If somebody would park on Main
18 Street and then just walk across the
19 street or whatever, but the aides are
20 supposed to be out there.

21 RICK NOTARI: What Mr. Russick is
22 saying is they're parking on both sides.

23 JOE RUSSICK: Yeah, sometimes they
24 do.

25 ROBERT SEMENZA: They're parking

1 any which way they can. Wherever they
2 can park, they park.

3 RICK NOTARI: If they come up the
4 alleyway north or Henderson east to drop
5 off and pick up so the kids are always
6 on the right side of the car.

7 ROBERT SEMENZA: Is that something
8 that the Borough should get involved in,
9 tell them how to make their pick-ups?

10 MAYOR LEGG: Not tell them, but
11 request.

12 RUSSELL RINALDI: Could we make
13 Foster to Main a one way.

14 RICK NOTARI: The alley you mean?

15 RUSSELL RINALDI: Not Foster,
16 Lawrence to Main. Just half of the
17 street instead of making the whole
18 Henderson one way out, just make it from
19 Lawrence out to Main.

20 CHIEF DUBERNAS: So no one can
21 turn in.

22 RUSSELL RINALDI: We make it safer
23 and direct them.

24 ROBERT SEMENZA: So you can't turn
25 off of Main onto Henderson.

1 RUSSELL RINALDI: But you can't
2 come down Lawrence. You just can't make
3 that left.

4 ROBERT SEMENZA: Off of Main
5 Street.

6 RUSSELL RINALDI: Or right.

7 CHIEF DUBERNAS: If you come up
8 Main or down Main, you can't turn on
9 Henderson.

10 RUSSELL RINALDI: Turn off
11 Henderson.

12 ROBERT SEMENZA: But if you come
13 out of Lawrence, you can make a right or
14 a left.

15 Could you do a traffic study there
16 and get something figured out, chief?

17 RUSSELL RINALDI: Get them facing
18 out.

19 RICK NOTARI: Is that going to put
20 more traffic on Merritt Street?

21 JIM HOOVER: Into the parking lot,
22 they'll go through Ace's Hardware.

23 CHIEF DUBERNAS: And the other
24 thing is, they're going to be using
25 Foster Street, that's the only problem

1 and they're going to come down one block
2 to try to go around that block.

3 JOE RUSSICK: One of the big steps
4 there is make sure the vehicles are
5 parked on the right side of the street.
6 That would be a big step and then
7 something has to be done though to get a
8 system.

9 RUSSELL RINALDI: How many times a
10 day do they have pick up there?

11 ROBERT SEMENZA: Three, maybe.

12 CHIEF DUBERNAS: After school and
13 then around quarter to five.

14 ROBERT SEMENZA: There's one in
15 the afternoon too, an early one.

16 PAUL PAPI: There's an earlier
17 one.

18 CHIEF DUBERNAS: A bus drops kids
19 off there too.

20 ROBERT SEMENZA: That's after
21 school kids.

22 JOE RUSSICK: That's not an issue
23 because there's somebody on Main Street
24 and somebody taking them in.

25 ROBERT SEMENZA: A kid could dart

1 out from behind a car.

2 MAYOR LEGG: There should be some
3 responsibility. We're going to change
4 street signs and inconvenience residents
5 when they're not doing their job.

6 ROBERT SEMENZA: I hate for the
7 Borough to get involved in something
8 they shouldn't be.

9 RUSSELL RINALDI: They used to
10 have a crossing guard there for a couple
11 times a day.

12 MAYOR LEGG: I thought they did.

13 RUSSELL RINALDI: I mean years
14 ago, 10 or 15.

15 ROBERT SEMENZA: We have some time
16 here. School is almost over, so it
17 wouldn't be as busy coming up soon.

18 See what you can do, chief, figure
19 something out.

20 CHRIS THOMAS: Is there parking on
21 both sides on that side?

22 ROBERT SEMENZA: Yes.

23 CHRIS THOMAS: Why not parking on
24 one side? The side closer to Kiddie
25 Kampus, make it like a loading and

1 unloading zone.

2 ROBERT SEMENZA: That's a good
3 idea. What side, the opposite of Kiddie
4 Kampus?

5 CHRIS THOMAS: The side closest to
6 the Kampus.

7 ROBERT SEMENZA: On their side on
8 the alley down.

9 CHRIS THOMAS: You can do that.

10 ROBERT SEMENZA: Because if you go
11 up further, you're causing problems with
12 the residents. Give us some scenarios.

13 Anybody have anything else for the
14 chief?

15 JOE FERRETT: I have one question.
16 Chief, the one thing I guess I probably
17 should be asking the solicitor, but you
18 came before him, and I want to know -- I
19 personally believe there has to be some
20 mistake. I don't know if it's a mistake
21 made by the person taking notes or the
22 paperwork that you gave to the
23 solicitor, but according to the minutes,
24 the solicitor said I'm going to prepare
25 an ordinance to advertise for that

1 one-way street. When I questioned it he
2 said Butler Street. It's not a one-way
3 street, it's parking that we talked
4 about, correct?

5 ATTORNEY RINALDI: I think we
6 corrected it that night. I misspoke.

7 JOE FERRETT: I want to make sure
8 that's not a one-way street.

9 CHIEF DUBERNAS: No, no, no.
10 There's only one way in.

11 JOE FERRETT: I just want to make
12 sure. I'm reading the minutes and I
13 want to make sure I'm not getting the
14 wrong impression.

15 ROBERT SEMENZA: Anything else,
16 Joe?

17 JOE FERRETT: No.

18 ROBERT SEMENZA: Anybody else have
19 anything for the Chief Dubernas.

20 RUSSELL RINALDI: Just one
21 question. Did you say that Jay Thomas
22 went to work for the City of Scranton?

23 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Yeah.

24 RUSSELL RINALDI: No longer
25 employed here?

1 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Done.

2 RUSSELL RINALDI: When do we have
3 to fill the spot by to fill the
4 contract?

5 ATTORNEY RINALDI: That's why
6 you're doing the civil service exam.

7 RUSSELL RINALDI: I know. What's
8 the timeline?

9 CHIEF DUBERNAS: If we post the
10 test it's probably by August you'll have
11 somebody hired because once you do the
12 physical, you have the oral.

13 ROBERT SEMENZA: No, that's not
14 Councilman Rinaldi's question.
15 Councilman Rinaldi's question is, Bill,
16 how long is in the contract to fill a
17 vacate?

18 RUSSELL RINALDI: For full-time
19 officers.

20 ROBERT SEMENZA: Right.

21 ATTORNEY RINALDI: We don't have
22 any deadline, just the initial
23 vacancies, which we filled and now the
24 normal.

25 CHIEF DUBERNAS: And I think if

1 you show progress. I know.

2 RUSSELL RINALDI: Do we have
3 enough part-timers to make it to August?

4 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Yeah, because the
5 two we hired the last time are now
6 working and now we can hire two more in
7 June and they can go through and then
8 I'll be ready for the end of the summer
9 and the school coming back --

10 RUSSELL RINALDI: That was going
11 to be my third question.

12 CHIEF DUBERNAS: -- and then the
13 holiday season.

14 RUSSELL RINALDI: Okay. So we
15 only have a few more weeks with school
16 being shorted a full-time officer.

17 CHIEF DUBERNAS: I was told. I
18 want to say June.

19 ROBERT SEMENZA: June 12th.

20 CHIEF DUBERNAS: No. June 4th
21 starts finals. So they go in at 9 and
22 are done by 11.

23 ROBERT SEMENZA: When's
24 graduation?

25 CHIEF DUBERNAS: The 11th. But

1 the seniors start finals the 7th or the
2 8th, Thursday or Friday earlier they
3 start finals because then they have
4 their final trip. May, I'm sorry.

5 ROBERT SEMENZA: We have a school
6 board member here. When is it?

7 CHRIS THOMAS: They start finals
8 right after Memorial Day. The reduction
9 of the full amount of kids will happen
10 probably June 1st, because the seniors
11 should start their finals the 29th,
12 30th, 31st and the 1st. The other kids
13 should start the 31st or the 1st.

14 There won't be any kids in the
15 high school after June 5th or 6th.

16 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Yeah, they told
17 me starting the 4th there's only going
18 to be kids there for two hours.

19 RUSSELL RINALDI: So we are going
20 to have coverage for the town and
21 coverage for the school?

22 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Yes.

23 RUSSELL RINALDI: Okay, very good.

24 ROBERT SEMENZA: Does anybody have
25 anything else for Chief Dubernas?

1 Thanks, chief.

2 Dave, what do you got for us?

3 Does everybody have Dave's report?

4 DAVE LOPATKA: I don't have one.

5 I just have a couple comments. Other
6 than DPW's last meeting, we were looking
7 for three quotes. I have three quotes
8 down which I will forward to MaryLynn.
9 They were \$16,000 for Earth Works.

10 \$18,725 was TSE and then \$22,000 was AR
11 Linde, who is doing the street project.

12 RICK NOTARI: This is to fix the
13 run off problem down at the DPW?

14 DAVE LOPATKA: Yeah.

15 ROBERT SEMENZA: What was TSE's?

16 JIM HOOVER: \$18,725 you said?

17 DAVE LOPATKA: Yeah.

18 ATTORNEY RINALDI: Don't forget my
19 easement.

20 DAVE LOPATKA: I sent it.

21 ATTORNEY RINALDI: I got the map.

22 DAVE LOPATKA: I'll get them to
23 you.

24 MAYOR LEGG: What was the last
25 one?

1 DAVE LOPATKA: \$22,000, AR Linde.

2 ROBERT SEMENZA: Is that something
3 we have to vote on tonight?

4 ATTORNEY RINALDI: No. Well, if
5 you want to award the bid, but I have to
6 get an easement in place, that's all.

7 DAVE LOPATKA: I have the
8 description for you.

9 ROBERT SEMENZA: What kind of time
10 frame is it for you to get the easement
11 in place?

12 ATTORNEY RINALDI: I get the
13 description, I type it up and we either
14 have someone come down here and have
15 somebody notarize it or he comes down to
16 my office and gets it notarized.

17 ROBERT SEMENZA: How long are
18 these bids good for?

19 DAVE LOPATKA: They're just
20 quotes.

21 ATTORNEY RINALDI: You can approve
22 it tonight and then it's up to MaryLynn
23 to do the start work order. That's not
24 a problem.

25 MAYOR LEGG: Why don't we do that.

1 ROBERT SEMENZA: \$16,000?

2 JIM HOOVER: Earth Works is
3 \$16,000, AR Linde is \$22,000, and TSE is
4 \$18,725.

5 LOU FEBBO: Can I make a motion
6 that we put that on the floor and vote
7 on it?

8 ROBERT SEMENZA: Yes. I just put
9 it down under new business on my sheet
10 now.

11 DAVE LOPATKA: Paving project. I
12 talked to Pennsy, we're going to put a
13 change order together to remove the five
14 streets like we discussed.

15 ROBERT SEMENZA: Okay.

16 DAVE LOPATKA: I contacted KBA,
17 who is the engineer for the housing
18 authority and told them that they need
19 to get us the number so that we can put
20 a change order together so that we
21 can --

22 LOU FEBBO: Is this for Hollow
23 Drive?

24 DAVE LOPATKA: Yes. I said, you
25 know, it's not our responsibility to

1 measure the streets. It's theirs being
2 it's their project. I put them in touch
3 with Pennsy with regards to the costs
4 per square yard for the construction
5 that we're looking for.

6 So I haven't heard back. That was
7 about a week and a half ago. So I'm
8 assuming at this point they're measuring
9 the streets and should be getting back
10 to me with the number for change a
11 order.

12 JIM HOOVER: I talked to Tony
13 today about something else and I asked
14 him about this and he said that he's
15 meeting Nello next week and he's going
16 to get a quote off of Nello to do the
17 base and the overlay.

18 DAVE LOPATKA: It's full depth.

19 JIM HOOVER: Yeah, it's full depth
20 to get the base and the overlay.

21 DAVE LOPATKA: Nello gave me, and
22 I sent it to Tony, the full depth price,
23 it was \$46 and some cents per square
24 yard. But there's also, aside from
25 doing that, he had to do some logistics.

1 RICK NOTARI: Let me ask you a
2 question: You said you asked them they
3 have to give us a number?

4 DAVE LOPATKA: Yes.

5 RICK NOTARI: For? A number for
6 what?

7 DAVE LOPATKA: To give you guys
8 the money to pay Pennsy because it's
9 running through our contract.

10 They're going to pay for it.
11 They're going to tell us what the number
12 is and they're going to pay for it.

13 ROBERT SEMENZA: But isn't the
14 number the number?

15 DAVE LOPATKA: No. The number is
16 based off the measurements.

17 ROBERT SEMENZA: Right.

18 DAVE LOPATKA: We didn't measure
19 it.

20 ROBERT SEMENZA: Oh, they measured
21 it?

22 DAVE LOPATKA: They have to
23 measure it. We're just running it
24 through our contract.

25 ROBERT SEMENZA: They gotta give

1 them the footage and everything like
2 that, what needs to be done?

3 DAVE LOPATKA: Right. So,
4 initially the number I gave you guys way
5 back when was me just doing a quick
6 estimate. That wasn't an actual
7 measurement for everything.

8 ROBERT SEMENZA: Correct.

9 DAVE LOPATKA: So I told them that
10 they need to measure everything, get us
11 what the number is so we can put it on
12 the change order, and that's the number
13 they will pay you guys.

14 ATTORNEY RINALDI: So I can send
15 him the change order and we're going to
16 vote on the change order?

17 DAVE LOPATKA: Correct.

18 JOE RUSSICK: Why can't that be a
19 separate invoice?

20 ATTORNEY RINALDI: It is. It's a
21 separate change order.

22 JIM HOOVER: Why are we the middle
23 man?

24 ROBERT SEMENZA: What they're
25 doing is piggybacking off or contract.

1 JOE FERRETT: What happens if they
2 run into a problem and there might be
3 some more money and things of this
4 nature?

5 DAVE LOPATKA: Well, anything
6 could happen. They're going to have to
7 provide us what the number is and
8 they're going to have to provide us the
9 cost that they're going to pay. It's
10 not going to be paid by you guys. It
11 will be paid by them.

12 JOE FERRETT: That's what I'm
13 trying to say. They're going to be
14 liable for any costs afterwards.

15 DAVE LOPATKA: They're going to be
16 liable for any costs to do the work
17 either way. That's what I'm saying.

18 ROBERT SEMENZA: Do we still have
19 to sign a contract with them or no?

20 ATTORNEY RINALDI: No. We're
21 going to get a change order. Pennsy I
22 think wants to use our charge order.

23 ROBERT SEMENZA: I get it, but
24 it's under Old Forge Borough also.

25 ATTORNEY RINALDI: Right. But

1 they're paying for it. So in other
2 words --

3 ROBERT SEMENZA: I'm just saying
4 they flip flopped so many times over the
5 last three years, right, Joe, so I'm
6 just afraid at the end what's going to
7 happen is we're going to have mud on our
8 face once again.

9 JOE RUSSICK: Why don't they
10 invoice the housing authority?

11 JIM HOOVER: That's the way it
12 should be because we're removing five
13 streets from the change order and now
14 you're going to add another street to
15 the change order. We're going to get
16 the check off of HUD and then we're
17 going to pay Pennsy. Why can't HUD just
18 pay Pennsy?

19 DAVE LOPATKA: How this all
20 started was --

21 JIM HOOVER: Because it's a HUD
22 street.

23 DAVE LOPATKA: No, no. The only
24 reason this started was to try and save
25 time and get it done in a timely manner.

1 JIM HOOVER: It's not working.

2 DAVE LOPATKA: It's not working
3 because they never got us the numbers
4 for the change order. So, what they
5 have to do is if you want it done that
6 way, they would have to bid it out
7 themselves.

8 JIM HOOVER: He told me today that
9 he's going to talk to Nello and if he
10 thinks that Nello's price is too high,
11 that will take another two weeks.

12 RICK NOTARI: Who told you that?

13 JIM HOOVER: Tony at KBA, he's the
14 housing engineer.

15 DAVE LOPATKA: The whole part of
16 this is to get it done as part of last
17 years paving project. We are beyond
18 that. So if you take your five roads
19 off, your contract is completed and they
20 can bid it themselves if that's how they
21 want to do it.

22 JOE RUSSICK: Is that all legal?
23 Doesn't smell good, but...

24 ATTORNEY RINALDI: They don't talk
25 to each other is the problem. The

1 engineer doesn't talk to this one and
2 that one. So now the engineer, they
3 call him up and say, oh, why can't you
4 do it this way.

5 DAVE LOPATKA: That was the idea
6 then and now we're beyond that, so be
7 it.

8 ATTORNEY RINALDI: We did them a
9 favor.

10 DAVE LOPATKA: Right. So, I mean,
11 that's what that is. If they end up
12 wanting to bid it themselves, we'll just
13 put a change order together and close
14 out your order with Pennsy.

15 LOU FEBBO: Could we do that?

16 ROBERT SEMENZA: Who is dragging
17 their feet here?

18 JIM HOOVER: I'm going to call
19 Nello tomorrow and I'll ask when that
20 meeting with Tony is, to let me know
21 when the meeting is.

22 DAVE LOPATKA: I'll call him.

23 JOE RUSSICK: Why doesn't someone
24 call Martino Washington down at HUD in
25 Philadelphia and ask her if it's

1 acceptable to HUD because it has to go
2 through HUD.

3 DAVE LOPATKA: As part of this,
4 Joe, we sent them the information.

5 JOE RUSSICK: In Philadelphia?

6 DAVE LOPATKA: Yes. We sent it to
7 them. We forwarded them everything.

8 JOE RUSSICK: They're okay with
9 it?

10 DAVE LOPATKA: Right. We're
11 chasing this thing around, like, I got
12 to call.

13 MAYOR LEGG: Jimmy, he said talk
14 to him.

15 JIM HOOVER: I will. I talk to
16 him every day.

17 ROBERT SEMENZA: Who is dragging
18 their feet now KBA or the HUD?

19 ATTORNEY RINALDI: HUD approved
20 it.

21 ROBERT SEMENZA: So they're
22 dragging their feet.

23 DAVE LOPATKA: Right. There's no
24 communication between the housing
25 authority and KBA.

1 JOE RUSSICK: Do you have any
2 paperwork on that, because if you don't
3 got it in writing, you don't got it.

4 RICK NOTARI: We have it in
5 writing.

6 DAVE LOPATKA: All of our bidding
7 information was requested by HUD so they
8 can do it this way.

9 JOE RUSSICK: As long as you have
10 it in writing, you have a leg to stand
11 on it.

12 DAVE LOPATKA: It doesn't have to
13 be done if they want to bid it
14 themselves.

15 RICK NOTARI: They have to make
16 that decision. We were the ones doing
17 them a favor.

18 DAVE LOPATKA: We're still
19 waiting. Will you talk to them, Jim?

20 JIM HOOVER: Yeah. I'll work them
21 both out and I'll call you.

22 DAVE LOPATKA: Give me a call and
23 tell me how you want to handle it. If
24 they determine they want to bid, I'll
25 finalize the change order and you guys

1 can close out the contract.

2 ATTORNEY RINALDI: By the time we
3 agreed on the language it was December,
4 so they're not that far behind.

5 ROBERT SEMENZA: What about behind
6 Burger King?

7 ATTORNEY RINALDI: We approved it
8 in December.

9 DAVE LOPATKA: Is that something
10 that's in the change order?

11 ROBERT SEMENZA: That has to be
12 paved. We dug that road up. Was that
13 part of the bid or no?

14 DAVE LOPATKA: No.

15 RUSSELL RINALDI: We talked about
16 that and Beech Street we were going to
17 add it.

18 JOE FERRETT: That's up to them.
19 We're not involved with it whatsoever.
20 We can drop out of this. That's not our
21 problem, that's their problem.

22 DAVE LOPATKA: I'm not disagreeing
23 with you.

24 JOE FERRETT: That was the reason
25 I made the recommendation to take the

1 five streets off because they're going
2 to be there all year. I don't like the
3 idea of us doing work for somebody else
4 and using tax payers money and --

5 ATTORNEY RINALDI: We're not.
6 We're not doing that.

7 JOE FERRETT: Well, now you're
8 not.

9 ATTORNEY RINALDI: We were never
10 doing that.

11 DAVE LOPATKA: We're just trying
12 to facilitate it to get it finished.
13 You know, however you want to do it and
14 however they want to do it. I have no
15 problem.

16 LOU FEBBO: I think you and Jimmy
17 should work together with that and get
18 back to us.

19 DAVE LOPATKA: If they turn around
20 and say that they're going to bid it, so
21 be it. We'll close out the contract.

22 ROBERT SEMENZA: I mean, I don't
23 know how much longer we're going to
24 chase this, you know what I'm saying?

25 DAVE LOPATKA: No, I know.

1 ROBERT SEMENZA: Well, we're
2 trying to do something for the residents
3 of our Borough. Even though it's not
4 our responsibility to have that road
5 paved, we're trying to aid the process
6 and aid our residents that live down
7 there because it's a shame.

8 JOE RUSSICK: It's only going on
9 two years.

10 RICK NOTARI: It's been going on
11 longer than that. It's a shame the way
12 the roads are taken care of in that
13 development and in the development on
14 Kohler Avenue. They have lived with
15 that problem for too long.

16 DAVE LOPATKA: They should be
17 calling us. We shouldn't be calling
18 them.

19 RICK NOTARI: I agree a hundred
20 percent, Dave.

21 LOU FEBBO: Right, but they're
22 not.

23 ATTORNEY RINALDI: We were chasing
24 them because we were also doing it with
25 our project, but last month we took our

1 project off the table. So now we don't
2 have to chase them.

3 DAVE LOPATKA: If you want to
4 close it out, then we can close it out.

5 RICK NOTARI: Okay. But we do
6 need to pave Meade Street now.

7 DAVE LOPATKA: If we want to pave
8 Meade Street, maybe we can add that and
9 get Pennsy to do that.

10 ROBERT SEMENZA: It will have to
11 be done from behind Burger King up to
12 Oak.

13 PAUL PAPI: Probably, yeah. To do
14 it right, yeah.

15 JIM HOOVER: And the intersection
16 of Oak should be done too.

17 ROBERT SEMENZA: Sussex you mean.

18 JIM HOOVER: Sussex.

19 DAVE LOPATKA: You want to do
20 Meade and Sussex.

21 ROBERT SEMENZA: That piece of
22 Sussex.

23 JIM HOOVER: Just that
24 intersection.

25 ROBERT SEMENZA: I think probably

1 the intersection, but you're going to
2 have to go down a little ways to Main
3 Street there.

4 DAVE LOPATKA: Right, but you
5 don't want to get to the right-of-way.
6 You want to stop at the right-of-way.

7 ROBERT SEMENZA: What's the
8 right-of-way?

9 DAVE LOPATKA: Probably 50 feet.

10 ROBERT SEMENZA: Oh, yeah. I'm
11 saying right to when you stop at Burger
12 King.

13 DAVE LOPATKA: So you don't have
14 to get an HOP.

15 ROBERT SEMENZA: Okay. Just down
16 the street maybe 20, 30 feet.

17 DAVE LOPATKA: We're going to look
18 at storm water with their engineer
19 tomorrow and Paul's coming, I sent an
20 email to MaryLynn.

21 ROBERT SEMENZA: What time, nine
22 o'clock?

23 DAVE LOPATKA: Yes. So, as part
24 of that, I'll run by -- me and Paul can
25 run by Burger King and he can show me

1 exactly what we need to do and we can
2 add that. We'll do a change order to
3 remove the five and to add whatever we
4 have to do there to finish that.

5 ROBERT SEMENZA: Okay.

6 DAVE LOPATKA: And then at that
7 point, we can then close out the
8 contract if the county ever gets back
9 us.

10 RICK NOTARI: That's a good
11 question, is that getting paid out of
12 the sewer?

13 ROBERT SEMENZA: That's a good
14 question.

15 DAVE LOPATKA: It's a paving
16 contract.

17 RICK NOTARI: We are only paving
18 there because of the work that was done
19 on the sewers, so we should be able to
20 pay out of the sewer account.

21 MARYLYNN BARTOLETTI: You should
22 be, yes.

23 DAVE LOPATKA: Can that be paved
24 under the paving contract?

25 MARYLYNN BARTOLETTI: Yes.

1 RICK NOTARI: Good.

2 JOE FERRETT: Can I have the
3 floor?

4 ROBERT SEMENZA: Sure, go ahead.

5 JOE FERRETT: Dave, at the last
6 meeting there was only a couple of us
7 here and we got into the discussion on
8 Kohler Avenue, correct?

9 DAVE LOPATKA: We're making the
10 changes.

11 JOE FERRETT: Pardon?

12 DAVE LOPATKA: We're making the
13 changes that you want.

14 JOE FERRETT: What changes are you
15 making?

16 DAVE LOPATKA: You want a curb on
17 one side of the street.

18 JOE FERRETT: You're going to put
19 a curb on?

20 DAVE LOPATKA: If you want a curb,
21 we can put it on.

22 JOE FERRETT: You said yourself
23 there's no curb, the water is going off
24 the road.

25 DAVE LOPATKA: Well, it's a little

1 different situation. But if you want
2 curb --

3 JOE FERRETT: No, I didn't say --
4 go ahead.

5 DAVE LOPATKA: But, anyway, we
6 feel comfortable with putting the swale
7 there. The reason that Edgewood Drive
8 was, some of that water was actually
9 running into the properties.

10 In this case, everything is
11 running from the properties out to the
12 road.

13 JOE FERRETT: I don't have a
14 problem with what you're doing. All I'm
15 doing is questioning what I've been
16 reading in the minutes that I didn't
17 understand before, and all I'm just
18 merely saying is that you're putting in
19 a swale. The swale is only going to be
20 about a foot deep, not even two feet
21 deep according to your minutes and.
22 You're saying that you're putting inlets
23 on both sides of the road?

24 DAVE LOPATKA: Correct.

25 JOE FERRETT: Now, my question to

1 you is this: The inlet that's going to
2 be on the side of the road where the
3 people are living, how is it going to
4 get to the other side and get to the
5 swale?

6 DAVE LOPATKA: The road is crowned
7 in that area. So half of the road
8 drains one way and the other half of the
9 road drains the other way.

10 JOE FERRETT: I understand, but
11 the water is going into the inlet. You
12 said according to reading your minutes
13 that --

14 DAVE LOPATKA: Maybe it was a
15 mistake.

16 JOE FERRETT: How is the water
17 from the inlet getting into the swale?
18 That's my point.

19 DAVE LOPATKA: The water getting
20 into the swale? The road is crowned, so
21 all of the water --

22 JOE FERRETT: How is the water
23 coming from the inlet on the opposite
24 side of the swale getting into the
25 swale?

1 LOU FEBBO: Inlets on both sides,
2 Dave?

3 DAVE LOPATKA: Inlets on both
4 sides. So pipe is underneath the
5 ground.

6 JOE FERRETT: What size pipe?

7 DAVE LOPATKA: What size pipe? I
8 think they're a minimum of 12-inch.

9 JOE FERRETT: You're going to have
10 a 12-inch pipe going into the road into
11 a 12-inch swale?

12 DAVE LOPATKA: No, no, no. You're
13 missing the point.

14 JOE FERRETT: Don't make sense.

15 DAVE LOPATKA: No, you're not
16 understanding what's on the plan. The
17 plan, there's a swale and there's an
18 inlet in the swale. So the water
19 flowing in the swale drops into the
20 inlet and then it's piped across the
21 street to the other system running done
22 the other side of the street.

23 JOE FERRETT: But you said it's a
24 12-inch pipe.

25 ROBERT SEMENZA: There's a catch

1 basin inside the swale, Joe.

2 JOE FERRETT: What?

3 ROBERT SEMENZA: There's a catch
4 basin in the swale.

5 JOE FERRETT: I understand that.
6 How is the water going from this to the
7 other side --

8 DAVE LOPATKA: Underneath the
9 road.

10 JOE FERRETT: It's going to go
11 underneath the road? How far is it
12 going to be underneath the road,
13 one-inch, two-inch, four-inches,
14 six-inches underneath the road or what?

15 DAVE LOPATKA: Three and a half
16 feet under the road. That's a standard
17 depth for an inlet box, three and a half
18 to four feet.

19 JOE FERRETT: That's what I wanted
20 to know. And it's going into the inlet?

21 DAVE LOPATKA: Going into the
22 inlet, dropping in the inlet, crossing
23 under the road and there's an inlet on
24 the other side of the road.

25 JOE FERRETT: All right. Where's

1 that water going from the inlet?

2 DAVE LOPATKA: That water goes
3 down inside the inlet on Church Street.

4 JOE FERRETT: What inlet on Church
5 Street, on the corner of Kohler Avenue?

6 DAVE LOPATKA: It's across Church
7 Street. You cross Church Street. We're
8 going to cross Church Street with a
9 pipe. It ties into an inlet that way
10 and then it actually goes --

11 JOE FERRETT: You're saying the
12 inlet is right on Kohler Avenue only on
13 the other side of Church Street or is it
14 on the corner of Dunn Avenue.

15 DAVE LOPATKA: No, it's on Church
16 Street. It's not on the Kohler Avenue
17 side of the street. It's across the
18 street on Church Street.

19 JOE FERRETT: So, we're digging up
20 Church Street again, right?

21 DAVE LOPATKA: We're going to cut
22 across Church Street and they'll re-pave
23 that section of Church Street also.
24 We're paving the whole road, it's all
25 getting done.

1 JOE FERRETT: And what's going to
2 happen with people that are living on
3 Hill Crest Drive, that whole piece of
4 property on that side? What are we
5 going to do with the water?

6 DAVE LOPATKA: On which side?

7 JOE FERRETT: On the opposite side
8 where the swale is. All that property
9 between Kohler Avenue and Hill Crest
10 Drive, all that property.

11 DAVE LOPATKA: All that property
12 grade wise drains to Kohler Avenue.

13 JOE FERRETT: But the people that
14 are going to -- the people who purchased
15 all that land, when they go to develop
16 that land, where are they going to put
17 the water?

18 JIM HOOVER: That's up to them.

19 DAVE LOPATKA: That's up to them.
20 They're probably going to have to put
21 some kind of underground system in and
22 tie into one of our inlets.

23 ROBERT SEMENZA: They have to go
24 to planning, Joe.

25 DAVE LOPATKA: We can't account

1 for what they're going to do because we
2 don't know what they're going to do.

3 JOE FERRETT: My question to you
4 is this: You just got finished saying
5 they have to go to work and make you put
6 in an underground system. Why don't you
7 just say we'll do that rather than going
8 into a combined system?

9 DAVE LOPATKA: We're not going
10 into a combined system.

11 JOE FERRETT: We're not?

12 DAVE LOPATKA: We're tying into an
13 inlet.

14 JOE FERRETT: Where's the water
15 from Kohler Avenue going?

16 DAVE LOPATKA: Where does it go?

17 JOE FERRETT: You said to Church
18 Street.

19 DAVE LOPATKA: It ties into an
20 inlet on Church Street.

21 JOE FERRETT: And that inlet is
22 not a storm water. That's a combination
23 inlet.

24 DAVE LOPATKA: I'm not so sure of
25 that. We didn't track it all the way,

1 but it actually doesn't go left down
2 Church Street, it actually goes right.

3 ROBERT SEMENZA: So, most likely
4 it goes down to Saint John's Creek.
5 Paul, do you know anything about it?

6 PAUL PAPI: I think that --

7 DAVE LOPATKA: I mean, we didn't
8 track it the whole way. We tied into
9 it. We shot one down the street from it
10 and I don't know if it ultimately ties
11 into the system or not.

12 JOE FERRETT: So, in other words,
13 you're saying that when Mr. Febbo asked
14 you that question, you said it attaches
15 to an existing on Church Street which is
16 a combined system.

17 DAVE LOPATKA: Well, I don't know
18 if it's a hundred percent combined
19 system. There is a sanitary system that
20 runs down Church Street, but we're not
21 tying into the sanitary -- or the
22 combined system, we're tying actually
23 into an inlet.

24 So that inlet goes to the north
25 and we didn't track it all the way to

1 where it discharges. So I don't know if
2 it actually ties in somewhere. It
3 doesn't tie in right there in the
4 system. It goes towards Dunn Avenue.

5 PAUL PAPI: I know at the section
6 of Dunn Avenue there's a big storm pipe
7 there.

8 JOE FERRETT: That's a
9 combination.

10 PAUL PAPI: For the new
11 development, Joe.

12 DAVE LOPATKA: I mean, if you want
13 me to go up and track where it ends up,
14 I mean, we shot the inlet, we shot where
15 it goes down stream. I didn't
16 ultimately chase it to wherever it
17 discharges. That's typically not what
18 we would do.

19 JOE FERRETT: All right. That's
20 not a problem.

21 LOU FEBBO: Dave, what kind of
22 curbs?

23 DAVE LOPATKA: On that side, up
24 where there's concrete we're going to
25 replace it with concrete up on the

1 corner. We'll put it -- because we're
2 doing a project with always needing
3 money, on that corner we have to put a
4 handicap ramp.

5 ROBERT SEMENZA: It's CDBG, isn't
6 it?

7 DAVE LOPATKA: Right.

8 ROBERT SEMENZA: Anything else,
9 Joe? Dave, anything else?

10 DAVE LOPATKA: No. I touched on
11 the pride, we're doing that meeting.
12 Other than that, no.

13 ROBERT SEMENZA: Okay. Anybody
14 have any questions for Dave?

15 RICK NOTARI: Do we have a
16 tentative start date for Kohler Avenue?

17 DAVE LOPATKA: The county did not
18 give you us a start date yet. I believe
19 we are waiting for the contractor. The
20 contractor at the time we met out there
21 said that he can start there in June. I
22 didn't get a definite start.

23 RICK NOTARI: Okay. Thanks, Dave.

24 ROBERT SEMENZA: Anybody else?

25 Thanks, Dave. Oh, I'm sorry.

1 JIM HOOVER: Corcoran Street,
2 when's that starting?

3 DAVE LOPATKA: We reviewed shops.
4 We're waiting for the manhole to be
5 built. Once the manhole is built, we
6 can start. That was about two or three
7 weeks ago. The manhole should be
8 constructed by now.

9 JIM HOOVER: That's why I asked.

10 DAVE LOPATKA: I can check with
11 them and see what their schedule is.

12 ROBERT SEMENZA: Anything else?
13 Thanks, Dave.

14 Bill, solicitors report, please.

15 ATTORNEY RINALDI: Okay. We have
16 one item tonight. It's the ordinance
17 for no parking on Butler Street. It was
18 advertised. There's a copy attached to
19 my report with the two originals.

20 For the park we're just waiting on
21 an appraisal and then we can issue a
22 title policy and close. If everybody is
23 in concurrence, I would just like a vote
24 to concur my response to the
25 grievance -- or as the Borough concurs,
