

1 motorcycle repairs, including major repairs;
2 building material yards, roofing, carpentry,
3 including custom woodworking, custom furniture;
4 making commercial recreation entertainment
5 establishments; concrete batch plants; drive-in
6 establishments; so on and so forth. You all
7 can look at the book, but not anywhere in that
8 spot does it say a junkyard is permitted.

9 Special exception uses: Auto body
10 shop, golf course, driving ranges, country
11 clubs, outdoor advertising, mobile home parks,
12 nurseries, nursing homes, places of worship,
13 public and parochial schools, public utilities.
14 Nowhere in that section does it say a junkyard
15 is permitted. Okay?

16 So, I'll turn back to the back of
17 the book, under I-1, industrial zone principal
18 permitted uses: Automobile and metal appliance
19 manufacturing and assembly, structural steel,
20 fabricating shops, machine shops, forges and
21 foundries, bakeries, junkyards. I-1 zone,
22 okay?

23 So, I don't want to waste anybody's
24 time. We all know this is before a Judge, and
25 I understand that the Judge, we all know, has

1 the ultimate say, okay, but I am here on behalf
2 of all the residents that are here who some
3 have -- one has a six-month-old child, we have
4 some teenagers and so on and so forth, with the
5 smell, when it rains, it's horrendous.
6 Horrendous.

7 The noise is just crazy. Your
8 backyard can't be used on weekends because
9 you're listening to machines run and cutting
10 metal, drop metal, smash metal. The machines
11 don't have mufflers on them, so on and so
12 forth.

13 What I'm saying tonight is we want
14 it to end. So, we want the Borough to either
15 direct their solicitor to either get an
16 injunction, have it stopped, do whatever. The
17 stuff is there, it is a junkyard, the Judge
18 himself deemed it that in the order. He's had
19 eight months to conform to a six month time
20 frame, okay, and we're still at the same spot.
21 All right?

22 So, we would like it to stop, okay?
23 Let him find a piece of property, even if it's
24 in the Borough, if it's in an industrial zone,
25 it's legal to do it, haul the stuff there and

1 cut it up there and make the millions of
2 dollars that he's making, just in a legal area.

3 He is permitted there to sell
4 equipment that runs, that is fully functional,
5 okay? He's not even permitted to work on that
6 equipment on that property outside of a
7 building. If he wanted to do repairs to that
8 stuff, it would have to be in a building. If
9 you go to Powell Sales and Service, go to the
10 CAT dealer in Dupont, they all have buildings.
11 They all have equipment and it's all outside,
12 but they don't work on it outside. They put it
13 in a building and they fix it there.

14 So, these are the things that are
15 being brought up to the Judge, okay? So,
16 summer is coming, people's windows are open,
17 their doors are open, it's completely out of
18 control. It's been going on for years. It
19 really shouldn't have gone on at all. So,
20 we're asking, some way, some how, that either
21 an injunction, a stop order, whatever it takes,
22 it needs to stop.

23 MR. SEMENZA: Bill, what could we
24 do?

25 ATTY. RINALDI: Well, like he said,

1 that order is the one we drafted that says he's
2 a junkyard.

3 MR. SEMENZA: I understand that.

4 ATTY. RINALDI: And then we won the
5 injunction, and now it's just a question of
6 holding the fines in abeyance and cleaning up
7 the property. So, we have that order.

8 MR. SEMENZA: But you know as well
9 as everybody in this courtroom that this is not
10 going to stop on May 2nd.

11 ATTY. RINALDI: But that's why the
12 Judge is coming out there to say this doesn't
13 meet --

14 MR. SEMENZA: Chris, do you agree
15 with me?

16 CHRIS GOETZ: Yeah, I would agree.
17 I just would like it to be pushed to the limit
18 where it needs to stop.

19 ATTY. RINALDI: I'm with you. I'm
20 with you.

21 CHRIS GOETZ: He's been given his
22 time.

23 MR. NOTARI: Let me ask this:
24 Obviously that order says cease and desist?

25 ATTY. RINALDI: Right.

1 MR. NOTARI: Who is supposed to
2 enforce that?

3 ATTY. RINALDI: We do. Every month
4 when we go in, he checks the status. So, he's
5 saying, I'm cleaning it up, I'm cutting stuff
6 up and moving it off the property. That's his
7 excuse to cut up, because he can't move it off
8 the trailer.

9 MR. NOTARI: Yeah, but how do we
10 enforce cease and desist on a daily basis? I
11 mean, to me, cease and desist means stop.

12 ATTY. RINALDI: No, no.

13 MR. NOTARI: No? Am I wrong?

14 ATTY. RINALDI: He's got to clean it
15 up.

16 CHRIS GOETZ: Right, but --

17 MR. NOTARI: Clean it up means put
18 it on the trailer and get it out of there.

19 CHRIS GOETZ: Well, his attorney's
20 claim was he can't, bah, bah, bah. Okay? The
21 bottom line is, the other day I watched him
22 with a monster loader pick up a trailer and
23 carry it around.

24 MR. NOTARI: I don't know if Steve's
25 up there every day, but I know he's up there

1 once or twice a week.

2 CHRIS GOETZ: Yeah.

3 MR. NOTARI: And I know we've had
4 the police up there.

5 CHRIS GOETZ: And we've had the
6 police there.

7 MR. NOTARI: You know, we are trying
8 our best.

9 CHRIS GOETZ: What we're saying is
10 he's had his time.

11 MR. SEMENZA: I agree.

12 CHRIS GOETZ: He was given time, and
13 I understand, I've been at every hearing, I
14 know what the Judge is saying, what I'm asking
15 is that we make sure that we drive home that it
16 needs to stop and he needs to come up with a
17 plan to remove the stuff in whole pieces and
18 either take it to the scrap yard or move it to
19 a location where it can then be cut up, okay?

20 If they're not working over there
21 cutting it up, it's very quiet, okay, it's like
22 it used to be, but when they're grabbing chunks
23 of steel three times the size of that table and
24 dropping them and cutting them and throwing
25 them into more piles, it's loud. It's beyond

1 loud. There's residents that live two blocks
2 away that are here.

3 MR. NOTARI: I'm with you, and I
4 think everybody at this table is with you, but
5 we're going through the court process.

6 CHRIS GOETZ: Right.

7 MR. FEBBO: Chris, the unfortunate
8 thing is Judge Munley, if he had come down when
9 he was supposed to a couple months ago he would
10 have seen exactly what we saw, but for him
11 sitting there, and Stocki's lawyer is really
12 painting a pretty picture for him that this kid
13 is an innocent kid doing his best, and excuse
14 my language, it's a shit house over there. We
15 were over there, you're up to your knees in
16 grease and oil.

17 CHRIS GOETZ: I'm with you. But I
18 also listened to his lawyer and himself lie to
19 the Judge six times --

20 MR. SEMENZA: And he believes it.

21 CHRIS GOETZ: -- in front of his
22 bench.

23 MR. FEBBO: But the Judge is
24 drinking the kool aid that he's giving him.

25 MR. SEMENZA: My issue is he's not

1 an innocent kid. He's been a repeated offender
2 in this Borough, breaking ordinances and
3 everything.

4 CHRIS GOETZ: Absolutely. Maybe we
5 need to bring that up.

6 MR. SEMENZA: The Judge knows and is
7 very well aware of it, but I do not know how he
8 keeps getting away with this time over and time
9 again. I mean, we have people in this Borough,
10 contractors, mechanics, people that run things,
11 equipment or whatever, equipment sales or
12 whatever it may be, that follow the rules,
13 along with everybody else in this room, and
14 that's what I can't understand, why he keeps
15 getting more time and more time and more time.

16 MR. HOOVER: When I go there, I get
17 that the Judge kind of believes him, that he
18 thinks that if that machine's sitting there and
19 it runs, it's a good machine, he doesn't have
20 to get rid of it. Right, Chris?

21 CHRIS GOETZ: And that's what
22 they're falling back on.

23 MR. HOOVER: And that's what they're
24 falling back on.

25 ATTY. RINALDI: If it runs. If it

1 runs.

2 MR. HOOVER: All those machines up
3 there, if they run, but he takes stuff off of
4 them and it's junk.

5 CHRIS GOETZ: Yeah. But there's
6 hundreds of pieces of equipment.

7 MR. FEBBO: Thousands.

8 CHRIS GOETZ: Thousands.

9 ATTY. RINALDI: Which is why the
10 Judge is coming out there.

11 CHRIS GOETZ: Right.

12 ATTY. RINALDI: And he said, I'm
13 going to look at each piece of equipment and
14 see what it does.

15 MR. SEMENZA: But you know what, not
16 for nothing, that's like me coming in your
17 office and saying I want to look at all your
18 cases and give you my opinion on it, which I
19 know nothing about law. You know what I'm
20 saying? What's he know about equipment, you
21 know? I don't know, I don't want to go there.

22 CHRIS GOETZ: We'll have to paint
23 the picture, but the point is --

24 ATTY. RINALDI: There's a lot of
25 stuff there that's easy to --

1 CHRIS GOETZ: What I would ask is
2 that, and Solicitor Rinaldi, it'll be his job
3 to do it, is, listen, it's we're now allowing
4 him to operate an operation that's not zoned
5 for that area as to say clean up. Now, he was
6 given the six months, and he -- I don't know,
7 did he sign this, Bill?

8 ATTY. RINALDI: Yeah. Actually, no,
9 the Judge made it an order. It's an order.

10 CHRIS GOETZ: So, he was given a
11 time and he agreed to it, okay, and here we
12 are. During the winter you can tolerate it to
13 a certain extent, okay, but now it's time to be
14 eating dinner on your back patio at 4:30 or
15 5:00 not listening to a D190 screaming as loud
16 as it can for hours on end, and that's what
17 needs to be presented to the Judge. It needs
18 to come to a stop.

19 DEP fined him \$92,000 for what he's
20 done to the soil. Now, he's appealed that,
21 everybody's entitled to that, but Steve maybe
22 can give you more information, that's not the
23 first time he was cited. He's been cited four
24 or five times, but that's the largest one.

25 So, it's becoming a public nuisance

1 with the odor, the noise. There's noise
2 ordinances in this Borough. So, there's a lot
3 of things that we need to look at, but I'm just
4 asking that whether you can, you know, you can
5 direct Solicitor Rinaldi or you can suggest,
6 but we're looking for it to stop.

7 And I know the Judge is in charge,
8 but maybe that's the case that needs to be
9 presented to the Judge is it needs to stop
10 immediately until a plan is put in place. The
11 time to clean up is over. The time to clean up
12 is over.

13 MR. FEBBO: He's gonna say there is
14 a plan in place. Bill, is there anything that
15 we can do?

16 ATTY. RINALDI: Well, the Judge says
17 anybody who wants to show up, show up, so the
18 more neighbors the better, in my opinion.

19 MR. SEMENZA: May 2nd on site,
20 anybody can show up?

21 ATTY. RINALDI: Yes.

22 CHRIS GOETZ: Yeah. The tough part
23 is, you know, people work. I'm taking leave
24 from my job to go to these hearings and
25 basically you walk out of there, you know,

1 slapped, really. I mean, that's where we're at
2 at this point unfortunately.

3 MR. NOTARI: Some of us have done
4 that, too.

5 CHRIS GOETZ: And you've done that
6 and Jimmy's there and these guys are there, but
7 that's the tough part. The problem I have with
8 the situation on May 2nd is, one, it's 30 more
9 days; two, you told him the day you're coming.
10 You need to show up there when he doesn't know
11 you're coming, okay, with the noise and the
12 machines. I could tell you, when Judge Munley
13 comes, you will be able to hear a pin drop over
14 there. There's no doubt about it.

15 MR. NOTARI: Have you thought about
16 having the neighbors write letters to Judge
17 Munley or to call individually if you can't
18 make it to the hearing?

19 MR. HOOVER: That's what I thought,
20 just to call and complain.

21 CHRIS GOETZ: Well, we could try to
22 do that, yeah.

23 MR. HOOVER: Just to call his office
24 and complain.

25 MR. NOTARI: I mean, you're here

1 venting to us, and I hope you realize, I feel
2 the same way you do.

3 CHRIS GOETZ: I know you do.

4 MR. NOTARI: Obviously, I don't live
5 there so I don't have to put up with it every
6 day, but I'm as frustrated with the process,
7 because I'm like you, I don't know how it's not
8 stopped. You know?

9 CHRIS GOETZ: Yep. It should be
10 finished.

11 MR. NOTARI: And as the people, the
12 neighbors know, when the winter comes, he
13 didn't do anything over the winter until he had
14 two weeks left to meet the deadline, and then
15 he started moving stuff.

16 CHRIS GOETZ: Well, his attorney
17 told the Judge that the snow slowed him down.
18 However, in the middle of the snowstorms and
19 the blizzards and the rainstorms, they're still
20 working. They're better than the postal
21 service, trust me. I mean, it's incredible.

22 So, that was the case I wanted to
23 bring on behalf of all of our neighbors over
24 there. Not all of them could make it tonight
25 but they're all as frustrated as I am, and some

1 of them aren't even as close to it as I am but
2 they're still feeling it a block away, two
3 blocks away. And it doesn't look good for the
4 town. Mr. Dunbar's attorney's gonna speak, I
5 mean, he's invested millions of dollars up and
6 down Keyser Avenue and then that's what you're
7 coming on.

8 We're all in it for the system, but
9 our ask is that the next step be stop it and
10 come up with a plan and get it out. Not cut it
11 up, because we're just continuing to allow him
12 not only to do it illegally, he's profiting
13 millions of dollars.

14 He told the Judge five months ago
15 there was 270 million pounds of metal over
16 there, steel. I called the scrap yard the
17 morning of one of the hearings, they told me 10
18 cents a pound. Do the math, folks. That's the
19 problem. Thank you for your time.

20 MR. SEMENZA: Thanks, Chris. Mike?

21 ATTY. GALLAGHER: Good evening,
22 gentlemen. My name is Mike Gallagher, and I do
23 represent Mr. Dunbar whom I think as many of
24 you know is a resident of Old Forge, he's been
25 here a long time. He does live over on Amity

1 Avenue, and he has invested literally tens of
2 millions of dollars in the community. He's
3 very involved with community activities.

4 He's happy to be a resident of Old
5 Forge, but I just have to kind of echo what
6 Mr. Goetz was saying in relation to what's
7 going on over there.

8 It is coming into the summer months
9 now, the weather is getting nicer, and
10 Mr. Dunbar and his family and his neighbors and
11 everyone, they can't go outside at night, they
12 can't enjoy a weekend, they can't have a
13 backyard barbecue, they can't have parties,
14 they can't have guests over and have them
15 outside because this has been going on since
16 last summer. And it's to the point where
17 literally their property values are going to be
18 decreasing if they haven't already. Their
19 quality of life has been diminished to a large
20 extent because of what's going on.

21 And we understand and we appreciate
22 that the Borough has taken some action on this,
23 but the one thing that we want to see is if
24 when Judge Munley does come out on May 2nd, I
25 doubt it is going to be cleaned up by that

1 point in time, that at least there is some
2 request from the Borough to put restrictions on
3 his cleaning this up so that it's not going on
4 on Saturday afternoons and Sunday mornings and
5 5:30 at night when people are coming home and
6 want to go out and have dinners on their patios
7 and on their back decks and enjoy the weather.

8 So, that was the one suggestion we
9 were going to make is if it isn't cleaned up by
10 then, which very seriously I doubt that it will
11 be, that there could be some restrictions put
12 on that. We just wanted to, again, just echo
13 Mr. Goetz's comments of, you know, we want to
14 make sure the Borough is pursuing this
15 aggressively.

16 And the one thing, too, is this has
17 been going on for quite some time. We're not
18 quite sure how it got to this point, but we
19 want to kind of make sure that this doesn't
20 happen again in the community.

21 Mr. Dunbar is a developer, he has
22 people who come into town and they come and
23 they look at his apartments, they come from all
24 over the place, they come from outside this
25 area, many of them are professionals, he's

1 renting higher end properties to professionals,
2 and when they come into town and they drive
3 down Keyser Avenue or they come in Lonesome
4 Road or they come in a certain way and they see
5 something like that, he has literally had
6 people who have literally driven up, seen the
7 town and said, Change my mind, don't want to
8 live in this community.

9 So, we're wondering if, given the
10 fact that this has happened, is there something
11 in place to kind of nip this in the bud a
12 little sooner in the future to prevent this
13 from happening again to the point where it gets
14 to someone drives into town and they see
15 something like this and they don't even want to
16 live here.

17 It's bad for Mr. Dunbar, it's bad
18 for the community, the community loses tax
19 revenue, the businesses suffer because they
20 lose people moving into the community. And
21 we're just kind of curious, is there something
22 in place to kind of make sure that this doesn't
23 happen again?

24 ATTY. RINALDI: Well, I could tell
25 that he had permission from planning to sell

1 used equipment. He started to turn that into a
2 scrap yard, he got a notice of zoning
3 violation, he appealed that zoning violation.

4 We went to court, we filed a
5 complaint and an injunction, our injunction was
6 granted, and the remedy was he's got to clean
7 up the site. So, the Judge deemed it a
8 junkyard, not allowed in a C2 zone, what are
9 you going to do about it.

10 MR. SEMENZA: The Borough never gave
11 him permission to do what he did.

12 ATTY. RINALDI: Right.

13 MR. SEMENZA: A lot of those
14 vehicles he brought in at night.

15 ATTY. RINALDI: So, if you noticed,
16 he cleaned up first the lot next door, then he
17 cleaned up the encroachments, then he's been
18 moving stuff off the property. And, yes, the
19 Judge is giving him time.

20 ATTY. GALLAGHER: Yeah.

21 ATTY. RINALDI: We went in at the
22 last hearing, This is it, we're done.

23 ATTY. GALLAGHER: I understand,
24 you're bound, Bill. As a fellow attorney, I
25 understand, you're bound by the Judge. There's

1 nothing you can do right now until May 2nd.

2 ATTY. RINALDI: And DEP is all over
3 him, but, once again, he's appealing those,
4 too. I mean, he's fined so much with DEP it's
5 not even funny.

6 MR. FEBBO: The unfortunate thing is
7 that the wheels of democracy turn slowly. He
8 gets appeals and appeals and extensions and
9 appeals. You should be on this side of the
10 table, talk about being frustrated, and you're
11 going to court with all that. Every time that
12 we think that we have him, that he's either
13 going to go to jail or the Judge is going to
14 fine him severely, he gets a slap on the wrist
15 and we get mud on our face.

16 ATTY. RINALDI: And, quite honestly,
17 I put the schedule in because I didn't want to
18 say, Okay, it will be cleaned up in six months
19 and I come back and nothing be done. So, I
20 wanted the Judge on him every 30 days to say,
21 What have you done in the last 30 days? What
22 have you done?

23 So, he has done things except for
24 one snow period, but for the most, yes, he got
25 off the one property, he got off the

1 encroachments. He was supposedly supposed to
2 sign an agreement; he didn't. We brought that
3 up with the Judge. He has moved stuff off.
4 You know, we have photos every 30 days.

5 ATTY. GALLAGHER: And that was the
6 other question, you know, is the Borough --

7 ATTY. RINALDI: Every 30 days we
8 have flyover photos and --

9 MR. SEMENZA: He basically did what
10 he wanted to do and that was it.

11 ATTY. GALLAGHER: Right.

12 MR. SEMENZA: Like Chris had stated
13 before, the zoning book, he had said the zones
14 of the Borough, and we have regulations of what
15 you can do in each zone, we're not giving
16 people permission to put stuff like that. So,
17 you're saying nip it in the bud, he shouldn't
18 have did it in the first place. He got away
19 with it. He pulled a fast one on the Borough,
20 basically.

21 ATTY. GALLAGHER: I understand. It
22 just seems like it has gotten to the point
23 where there's so much there, that's what my
24 client and I think some of the residents are
25 having a difficulty understanding.

1 MR. SEMENZA: And like I had said
2 before, he's a repeated offender in the
3 Borough. He does what he wants to do and
4 there's no repercussions for him, and I can't
5 understand how or why this happens.

6 ATTY. RINALDI: He's got state
7 police violations for moving the stuff out on
8 illegal trailers. I mean, I could tell you,
9 he's got -- there's more citations against him
10 that he's appealing than you can shake a stick
11 at.

12 MR. SEMENZA: This goes on for years
13 and years and years on every project that he
14 does.

15 ATTY. GALLAGHER: Oh, I trust you --

16 MR. FEBBO: The Judge is tooling you
17 with it. It's been over -- tooling you, and
18 because he gets away with it all, I mean, he
19 chuckles at us and slides out the door again.

20 MR. NOTARI: Mr. Gallagher?

21 ATTY. GALLAGHER: Yes.

22 MR. NOTARI: I think since this has
23 happened, I think our code enforcement officer
24 has been more diligent in keeping an eye on
25 properties around town so that this does not

1 happen again. That's kind of what you're
2 leaning to.

3 ATTY. GALLAGHER: That's what we're
4 looking for because --

5 MR. NOTARI: Unfortunately, I think
6 some of our entrances into town are zoned in
7 ways that allow businesses -- like you said,
8 Lonesome Road, well, there's not much we could
9 do with the zoning there.

10 We continually are on property
11 owners to keep things clean and we do our best
12 to do that, and I know Steve works hard at
13 that, and I think that's what you were alluding
14 to. And I think since this has happened to us,
15 I think we are more vigilant in paying
16 attention to that kind of stuff.

17 ATTY. GALLAGHER: And that's all
18 we're asking. It's a great community, my wife
19 is from here actually, she lived here and grew
20 up in this area.

21 MR. NOTARI: I'm hoping Mr. Dunbar
22 buys those properties eventually on Keyser and
23 does --

24 ATTY. GALLAGHER: And, you know,
25 Mr. Dunbar is interested in keeping it a good

1 community, keeping it looking nice, keeping it
2 so that when people come in they go, This is
3 the kind of place that I want to live. I want
4 to bring all of my tax money here, all of my
5 business here, and eat at the restaurants and
6 shop at the local stores, and this is where I
7 want to raise my family and have them grow up
8 here and live here in the future.

9 So, that's really what we want to
10 accomplish and hope that the Borough is working
11 towards that. But in the meantime, if there is
12 going to be future activity, at least make it
13 so that the residents can enjoy some of this
14 summer and not have this going on continuously
15 while they're outside trying to enjoy the
16 weather.

17 MR. FEBBO: Mr. Gallagher, I believe
18 that all seven of us here, that's one topic
19 that we all agree about. We all agree that we
20 need to go ahead -- it's a blight in the
21 community and the eyesores that we do see. If
22 anything else that we disagree on, I think
23 that's one thing that we're doing the best that
24 we can.

25 ATTY. GALLAGHER: Thank you very

1 much. We do appreciate that and we're always
2 happy to give support in that regard if we can.
3 Thank you.

4 MR. SEMENZA: You didn't sign in,
5 but you want to speak?

6 MR. SCHECTMAN: I didn't sign in.

7 MR. SEMENZA: I'll let you go this
8 time.

9 MR. SCHECTMAN: Thank you. Jay
10 Schectman from the Lackawanna County community
11 relations, formerly with the economic
12 development, and usually I speak over projects
13 such as paving and storm water and so on, and
14 now I -- hopefully I can do as good a job as
15 Councilman Notari, who has been promoted in the
16 county.

17 MR. NOTARI: He's my replacement.

18 MR. SCHECTMAN: I am here to talk
19 about the Easter bunny. What I want to do is
20 present some of the activities in Lackawanna
21 County. We have a lot of activity going on
22 this month, April, and May.

23 We'll start with the Lackawanna
24 County library system is playing their American
25 Masters series. We're presenting Colson

1 Whitehead who is the author of The Underground
2 Railroad, and he'll be speaking Thursday, April
3 18th at 7 p.m. at the Scranton Cultural Center
4 for all those interested. I'm going to leave a
5 flyer also for each of these events.

6 We also have Electric City Trolley
7 Museum is sponsoring a hop on the trolley with
8 the Easter bunny. We have activities Saturday,
9 April 20th, activities on the hour, 9:30 to
10 1:30, and we'll have various activities, face
11 painting, arts and crafts, balloons, so on.
12 So, if you have children, grandchildren, so on,
13 please consider that event.

14 We also have a morning with mother
15 goose, also the Electric City Trolley Museum.
16 We're having a trolley excursion, being the
17 trolley excursion season, April 27th, 9:30 a.m.
18 to 12:30 p.m., and there are hourly events
19 during that time. Again, April 27th. You can
20 contact the Trolley Museum, you can contact our
21 office, community relations, you can contact me
22 at 963-6800 extension 1871, if I can be of
23 assistance on that.

24 The County is also going to be
25 presenting their seventh annual job fair at PNC

1 Field, open to the public from 12 to 4,
2 Thursday, May 16, 2019. Again, same thing, if
3 there's any questions, contact us at community
4 relations.

5 Also, we're on track, the baseball
6 trolley excursions are running, see the Rail
7 Riders and ride the trolley. These are
8 Sundays. They depart at 12:15 and they arrive
9 for a 1:05 game, and the cost is \$20. It
10 includes the excursion and the tickets. And,
11 again, contact number for that is
12 (570)963-6590.

13 Lackawanna County's also sponsoring
14 their blood drive which will be held at the
15 Lackawanna County Government Center at the
16 Globe. That'll be Friday, April 26th, from 10
17 to 3. You can call the Red Cross,
18 1-800-733-2767, to schedule an appointment with
19 them.

20 And we also are having our
21 Lackawanna County parks and recreation is
22 sponsoring the women's golf clinic where
23 there'll be four Monday sessions, and they're
24 going to be April 22nd and 29th and May 6th and
25 13th from 6 to 7:30. The cost of that will be

1 \$60 and it's going to be held at Scott Greens
2 Golf Club, and we have contact information,
3 Scott Green at (570)254-6979 or Lackawanna
4 County parks and recreation, (570)963-6764.

5 And just as a reminder, we're also
6 in the works to present our inaugural
7 Lackawanna County heritage fair which will be
8 held May 29 through June 2nd at Montage
9 Mountain. Still also accepting vendors and so
10 on for that event. It's a family friendly
11 event. We're trying to showcase the ethnic
12 diversity of Northeast PA, and we're hoping for
13 a successful event at the end of May.

14 And that is the events we have in
15 the near term, and there are a number of events
16 coming up then through this summer and early
17 fall. And I'm going to leave the information,
18 the flyers, for these events, and if there's
19 any other events, you can contact me at
20 community relations, 963-6800 extension 1871.
21 Are there any questions for me?

22 MR. SEMENZA: May 11th fishing
23 derby, don't leave that one out. That's a big
24 one.

25 MR. SCHECTMAN: I do. I figured, I

1 don't want to overwhelm today.

2 MR. SEMENZA: That's a big one I'm
3 pushing.

4 MR. SCHECTMAN: We do have a big
5 one. My next visit, I will be talking about
6 the fishing derby. And I will leave these
7 current flyers. I'm going to leave them with
8 Council.

9 MR. SEMENZA: You could just leave
10 them on the table, Jay. Thank you.

11 MR. SCHECTMAN: All right. Thank
12 you.

13 MR. SEMENZA: Well, that concludes
14 our public participation. At this time the
15 Chair is going to go around the table and see
16 if Council has anything to address. Councilman
17 Febbo?

18 MR. FEBBO: No, I'm good.

19 MR. SEMENZA: Councilman Notari?

20 MR. NOTARI: I just want to let
21 everybody know, we're going to have a school
22 committee meeting on April 23rd at 5 p.m. at
23 the school. We're going to meet in the board
24 room for about an hour, and then the school
25 safety committee and the school facilities

1 committee, they're going to have their public
2 meeting at 6:00. So, our meeting will just be
3 with them.

4 I would like, Mary, if you're
5 available that day, to come. I'd like the
6 mayor and at least one of the officers in
7 charge to be there, as well. But I'll let the
8 mayor know before I leave tonight.

9 MR. SEMENZA: What time did you say
10 that was, Councilman?

11 MR. NOTARI: 5:00. I'd like to
12 schedule a sewer committee meeting, as well.
13 So, Mr. Hoover and Mr. Rinaldi, if we could get
14 together after the meeting and come up with a
15 day that's good for us to meet?

16 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Sure.

17 MR. HOOVER: Okay.

18 MR. NOTARI: I'd also like, the
19 mayor's not here, but I'd like to see our
20 officer in charge, at least one of them, at our
21 meetings going forward, like the Chief used to
22 be here for every meeting. I think it's
23 important that we have somebody here in case we
24 have any questions about things that are going
25 on.

1 MR. SEMENZA: Councilman, let me
2 interrupt you for one second.

3 MR. NOTARI: Okay.

4 MR. SEMENZA: My opinion, I think
5 the mayor should take that information off the
6 officer in charge. For us to pay an officer to
7 be on overtime --

8 MR. NOTARI: Oh.

9 MR. SEMENZA: The Chief gets salary.
10 So, we'd have to pay an officer overtime to sit
11 in an council meeting.

12 MR. NOTARI: Okay. I didn't think
13 about that.

14 MR. SEMENZA: So, I think they
15 should relay that information to the mayor and
16 he should present that to us. That's my
17 opinion.

18 MR. NOTARI: Okay. How about our
19 meeting then on Tuesday, same concerns?

20 ATTY. RINALDI: Well, I think there
21 is one on -- well, check with the mayor,
22 somebody is on at night in charge, I believe.

23 MS. BARTOLETTI: No. They're both
24 in the daytime.

25 ATTY. RINALDI: Oh, they're both

1 day?

2 MR. SEMENZA: Yeah, they're both
3 day. Well, we could relay that information
4 to -- well, let's talk about this after.

5 MR. NOTARI: Okay. That's fine.
6 Lastly, Mr. Ferrett, you brought up the street
7 paving program for this year?

8 MR. FERRETT: Right.

9 MR. NOTARI: Are we going to move on
10 that? Have you had a list of streets?

11 MR. FERRETT: Not yet. We're
12 getting together and we're meeting with the
13 engineer and we're going to go around and look
14 at the streets and have things ready for the
15 next meeting.

16 MR. NOTARI: Would you mind if I
17 gave you a list that I just identified --

18 MR. FERRETT: You're perfectly
19 welcome to do that.

20 MR. NOTARI: -- and you take them
21 under consideration?

22 MR. FERRETT: Right.

23 MR. NOTARI: I appreciate that.

24 That's all I have, Mr. Chairman.

25 MR. SEMENZA: Thank you. Councilman

1 Lettieri?

2 MR. LETTIERI: The only concern I
3 have is with the Stocki, like I said, with the
4 land. Bill, I mean, for us to -- we can't
5 regulate that, how they're -- you know, they're
6 complaining, I mean --

7 ATTY. RINALDI: We did and we got an
8 order saying he has to stop doing that.

9 MR. LETTIERI: Right.

10 ATTY. RINALDI: So, it's just been
11 the cleanup issue at this point.

12 MR. LETTIERI: So, it's just the
13 point of -- yeah. Steve, I know, like you
14 said, you're up there and the thing is, but he
15 keeps continuing to do what he's not supposed
16 to do. So, I feel for these guys back there,
17 man. It's terrible. I've been back there, my
18 sister lives in that development, and I've
19 talked to a bunch of them, but I'm like -- I
20 mean, we can't send cops there to patrol that?

21 ATTY. RINALDI: Well, they go up
22 there every time there's a complaint and if
23 there's a fire.

24 MR. BIERYLA: I just got a complaint
25 last week, over the weekend, they filed a

1 complaint.

2 ATTY. RINALDI: There's a couple
3 hearings that we have.

4 MR. BIERLYA: But for them to get
5 back in the area where he was doing it, there
6 was like that much mud (Indicating). So, they
7 just filed a complaint of him burning it and
8 told him to cease.

9 MR. NOTARI: And the daily fine that
10 you imposed is still on the clock, right?

11 ATTY. RINALDI: Right. We held it
12 all in abeyance until he gets it cleaned up.

13 MR. FEBBO: November of last year.

14 MR. NOTARI: Of '17?

15 MR. FEBBO: '17. Five dollars a
16 day.

17 MR. SEMENZA: Anything else,
18 Councilor?

19 MR. LETTIERI: That's it.

20 MR. SEMENZA: Councilman Ferrett?

21 MR. FERRETT: Nothing.

22 MR. SEMENZA: Councilman Hoover?

23 MR. HOOVER: I think an article in
24 the paper if we can about these people coming
25 tonight --

1 MR. NOTARI: She was here. There
2 was a reporter here.

3 MR. HOOVER: Okay. She was here?

4 MR. NOTARI: I believe that was Kat
5 Bolus.

6 MR. HOOVER: All right. Good. Bob,
7 I gave Dave our ordinance for doing five
8 streets in the Borough this year. I'm going to
9 give a copy to Marylynn, too. We're doing five
10 streets in the Borough this year. Some of them
11 may be on Rick's paving list, because I went by
12 the streets that were on some of mine, but
13 we're doing five streets in the Borough, which
14 that means I'm going to pave them, so we could
15 do other ones. We could do more.

16 Like I said, Corcoran Street is
17 being paved, restoration is being done Friday,
18 probably start paving Tuesday or Wednesday of
19 next week.

20 MR. PAPI: I have a question.

21 MR. HOOVER: Go ahead.

22 MR. PAPI: Broadhead and Millard,
23 those are streets that were all torn up over
24 the winter, are they going to be repaved?

25 MR. HOOVER: Over on --

1 MR. PAPI: Broadhead.

2 MR. HOOVER: -- Beech?

3 MR. PAPI: Broadhead.

4 MR. BIERLYA: Jimmy, that's what I
5 called you about with the white marks, and you
6 said you'd cut the one inch overlay --

7 MR. HOOVER: Where's Broadhead?

8 MS. BARTOLETTI: It's up by Davis
9 Street.

10 MR. HOOVER: Oh, yeah. Yeah.

11 MR. PAPI: They're both going to be
12 over with?

13 MR. HOOVER: Yeah.

14 MR. PAPI: All right. We already
15 have people complaining on that street that
16 their houses are too low and they get water
17 when they get a lot of rain, but I know that if
18 we just add another inch and a half to the road
19 service, it's going to create a problem.

20 MR. HOOVER: We're probably going to
21 have to mill it down a little bit.

22 MR. PAPI: And she calls here five
23 days a week when there's no problem.

24 MR. HOOVER: All right. On
25 Broadhead. What's the address on Broadhead?

1 MR. PAPI: I don't know her address.

2 MR. HOOVER: Text it to me when you
3 get it.

4 MR. PAPI: Yeah.

5 MR. HOOVER: I'll go talk to her.

6 MR. PAPI: I'll text you her name
7 and address.

8 MR. HOOVER: Yeah. Please. Okay.

9 MR. PAPI: Just so you can talk to
10 her before we do it and explain things.

11 MR. HOOVER: Okay.

12 MR. SEMENZA: Anything else,
13 Councilman?

14 MR. HOOVER: No. I'm good.

15 MR. SEMENZA: Councilman Rinaldi?

16 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Just one item.
17 Last meeting I brought up about some of the
18 residents and some of the school officials were
19 asking about that stop sign.

20 MR. SEMENZA: Yes.

21 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: And my
22 question, I guess, would be to Bill. Bill, do
23 we have to put a motion to the floor to ask the
24 officer in charge to go over and do a study, or
25 could we just ask the mayor to instruct the

1 officer in charge to go over and do a study?

2 ATTY. RINALDI: You can't ask the
3 mayor to instruct him to do a traffic study.

4 MR. SEMENZA: Hang on. Let me ask
5 you a question first. Is the officer in charge
6 allowed to do a study, is what I want to ask?

7 ATTY. RINALDI: Yeah, because he
8 usually assigns it to somebody to do it anyway.

9 MR. SEMENZA: Okay. He does?

10 ATTY. RINALDI: I'm almost positive.
11 He's done a few that somebody went out and did
12 it.

13 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: I think
14 Officer Kimbo (phonetic) would go out and do
15 the study, correct?

16 ATTY. RINALDI: Yeah.

17 MR. SEMENZA: Yeah.

18 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: I'm not sure,
19 though, myself, so --

20 MR. SEMENZA: I just want to make
21 sure that he knows how to do it. Dave, maybe
22 you could put some light on this. Is it easy
23 to do a traffic study for a stop sign?

24 MR. LOPATKA: I don't know exactly.
25 Honestly, we don't do a lot of that,

1 detail-wise. We have a traffic engineer that
2 we would use to do studies like that.

3 ATTY. RINALDI: As long as somebody
4 from the police department is moving it up the
5 chain of command. It doesn't actually have to
6 be the Chief.

7 MR. LEGG: Where's that, Russ?

8 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Melmore and
9 Sherry Lane. The entrance to the elementary
10 school. Right at the corner of Benny Mariggi's
11 (phonetic) house there as you enter the --

12 MR. LEGG: Okay. (Inaudible.)

13 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Well, no, it's
14 right on the top, across the street from Benny
15 Mariggi's house.

16 MR. PAPI: And where would you want
17 the stop sign, on Melmore or Sherry Lane?

18 MR. SEMENZA: On Melmore.

19 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: On Melmore.
20 As they enter into the school circle, there's a
21 crosswalk right there, and they were saying
22 that cars are -- I mean, it's been like that
23 since the school's open, but they said more and
24 more now, because now they're exiting the kids
25 out, the walkers come out front, and they're

1 coming fly -- I'm sure they've been doing it.
2 And then with the buses trying to exit, no
3 one's stopping. So, they just think with a
4 stop sign it would probably be a lot safer for
5 the kids, for the busses.

6 MR. LEGG: All right. What do we
7 need, a study then?

8 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Yeah, a study.

9 MR. SEMENZA: Well, we're going to
10 have to put a motion before we do anything.

11 MR. LEGG: All right.

12 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: I'll bring it
13 up under new business.

14 MR. SEMENZA: Okay. Anything else?

15 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: No. I'm good.
16 Thank you.

17 MR. SEMENZA: I have nothing. The
18 Chair's going to go into new business. The
19 Chair's going to entertain a motion to give
20 Chief Dubernas heart and lung benefits, for
21 Chief Dubernas.

22 MR. NOTARI: Mr. Chairman, I'll make
23 that motion.

24 MR. SEMENZA: Motion on the floor by
25 Councilman Notari.

1 MR. LETTIERI: I'll Second it.

2 MR. SEMENZA: Seconded by Councilman
3 Lettieri. On the question? Public input?
4 Roll call, please.

5 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Febbo?

6 MR. FEBBO: Yes.

7 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Ferrett?

8 MR. FERRETT: Yes.

9 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Hoover?

10 MR. HOOVER: Yes.

11 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman
12 Lettieri?

13 MR. LETTIERI: Yes.

14 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Notari?

15 MR. NOTARI: Yes.

16 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Rinaldi?

17 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Yes.

18 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Semenza?

19 MR. SEMENZA: Yes. The next motion
20 is a motion to pass a resolution authorizing
21 the purchase of --

22 ATTY. RINALDI: Let's do the --

23 MR. SEMENZA: Okay. The lot
24 consolidation?

25 ATTY. RINALDI: -- the

1 consolidation, subdivision.

2 MR. SEMENZA: The next motion is a
3 motion to pass a final lot consolidation
4 approval and subdivision approval, St. Lawrence
5 Rectory.

6 MR. NOTARI: Mr. Chairman, I'll make
7 that motion.

8 MR. SEMENZA: Motion on the floor by
9 Councilman Notari.

10 MR. FEBBO: I'll second the motion.

11 MR. SEMENZA: Seconded by Councilman
12 Febbo. On the question? Public input? Roll
13 call, please.

14 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Febbo?

15 MR. FEBBO: Yes.

16 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Ferrett?

17 MR. FERRETT: Yes.

18 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Hoover?

19 MR. HOOVER: Yes.

20 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman

21 Lettieri?

22 MR. LETTIERI: Yes.

23 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Notari?

24 MR. NOTARI: Yes.

25 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Rinaldi?

1 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Yes.

2 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Semenza?

3 MR. SEMENZA: Yes. The next motion
4 is a motion resolution authorizing the purchase
5 of real property from the Bishop of Scranton
6 authorizing the proper officers execute and
7 deliver such documents required for the
8 purchase of said property, option to purchase
9 remaining adjoining properties of the Diocese,
10 license for parking and said adjoined
11 properties of the Diocese and authorizing the
12 payment of fees and expenses incurred for the
13 purchase and acceptance of the said property.

14 MR. FEBBO: Mr. Chairman, I'll make
15 that motion.

16 MR. SEMENZA: Motion on the floor by
17 Councilman Febbo.

18 MR. NOTARI: I'll second.

19 MR. SEMENZA: Seconded by Councilman
20 Notari. On the question? Public input? Roll
21 call, please.

22 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Febbo?

23 MR. FEBBO: Yes.

24 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Ferrett?

25 MR. FERRETT: Yes.

1 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Hoover?

2 MR. HOOVER: Yes.

3 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman

4 Lettieri?

5 MR. LETTIERI: Yes.

6 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Notari?

7 MR. NOTARI: Yes.

8 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Rinaldi?

9 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: On the
10 question, what's the purchase price?

11 ATTY. RINALDI: A buck.

12 MR. SEMENZA: One dollar, Russ.

13 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Okay.

14 ATTY. RINALDI: And the option is
15 60,000.

16 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Yes.

17 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Semenza?

18 MR. SEMENZA: Yes. The next motion
19 is a motion to bid out recycling bins, to put
20 an ad -- what is it, to put an ad to put out
21 recycling bins, is that what we're doing with
22 this?

23 MS. BARTOLETTI: Just that we put a
24 bid package together.

25 MR. SEMENZA: Bid package to bid out

1 recycling bins.

2 MS. BARTOLETTI: Yes.

3 MR. NOTARI: I'll make that motion,
4 Mr. Chairman.

5 MR. SEMENZA: Motion on the floor by
6 Councilman Notari.

7 MR. HOOVER: I'll second it.

8 MR. SEMENZA: Seconded by Councilman
9 Hoover. On the question? Public input? Roll
10 call, please.

11 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Febbo?

12 MR. FEBBO: Yes.

13 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Ferrett?

14 MR. FERRETT: Yes.

15 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Hoover?

16 MR. HOOVER: Yes.

17 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman
18 Lettieri?

19 MR. LETTIERI: Yes.

20 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Notari?

21 MR. NOTARI: Yes.

22 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Rinaldi?

23 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Yes.

24 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Semenza?

25 MR. SEMENZA: Yes. The next motion

1 is a motion to reapprove the storm water
2 maintenance agreement for Pride Mobility,
3 operation and maintenance agreement for storm
4 water management, best management practices.

5 ATTY. RINALDI: So, this was already
6 approved when we approved his final land
7 development plan, but it's floating around here
8 somewhere and needs to be signed. They need it
9 back because it gets recorded.

10 MS. BARTOLETTI: Okay.

11 MR. SEMENZA: So, we basically just
12 have to reapprove something we approved?

13 ATTY. RINALDI: You're reapproving
14 something we already approved.

15 MR. NOTARI: Mr. Chairman, I'll make
16 the motion.

17 MR. SEMENZA: Motion on the floor by
18 Councilman Notari.

19 MR. FEBBO: I'll second that motion.

20 MR. SEMENZA: Seconded by Councilman
21 Febbo. On the question?

22 MR. NOTARI: I have a question. Do
23 we have to do this?

24 ATTY. RINALDI: Yeah, because it
25 takes the liability off of us. They're

1 required to maintain it.

2 MR. NOTARI: Okay. Are we happy
3 with that storm water, or we can't go back
4 and --

5 ATTY. RINALDI: This has nothing to
6 do with the design of it. This just says we're
7 not responsible for maintaining it, you are.
8 If we see that you're not maintaining it, we
9 notify you. If you still don't do it, we could
10 fix it and lien your property.

11 MR. NOTARI: Okay.

12 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: I'll have one
13 question, if Councilman Notari's finished.

14 MR. NOTARI: I'm done. Yep.

15 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Bill, nothing
16 changed from the first approval, correct?

17 ATTY. RINALDI: No. It's exactly --

18 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Okay.

19 ATTY. RINALDI: The only thing that
20 changed is 2019, instead of 2018.

21 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Okay. That's
22 all.

23 ATTY. RINALDI: Exactly the same.

24 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: I'm good,
25 Mr. Chairman.

1 MR. SEMENZA: Okay. Roll call.

2 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Febbo?

3 MR. FEBBO: Yes.

4 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Ferrett?

5 MR. FERRETT: Yes.

6 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Hoover?

7 MR. HOOVER: Yes.

8 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman

9 Lettieri?

10 MR. LETTIERI: Yes.

11 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Notari?

12 MR. NOTARI: Yes.

13 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Rinaldi?

14 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Yes.

15 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Semenza?

16 MR. SEMENZA: Yes. Councilman

17 Rinaldi, you wanted to put a motion to the
18 floor?

19 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Yeah.

20 Mr. Chairman, I'd ask for a motion to ask Mayor
21 Legg to instruct the officer in charge to go
22 down and do a traffic study at the corner of
23 Melmore and Sherry Lane, a traffic study for a
24 potential stop sign.

25 MR. SEMENZA: Motion on the floor to

1 have the officer in charge do a traffic study
2 for a potential stop sign.

3 MR. NOTARI: I'll second the motion.

4 MR. SEMENZA: Seconded by Councilman
5 Notari. On the question? Public input? Roll
6 call, please.

7 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Febbo?

8 MR. FEBBO: Yes.

9 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Ferrett?

10 MR. FERRETT: Yes.

11 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Hoover?

12 MR. HOOVER: Yes.

13 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman

14 Lettieri?

15 MR. LETTIERI: Yes.

16 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Notari?

17 MR. NOTARI: Yes.

18 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Rinaldi?

19 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Yes.

20 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Semenza?

21 MR. SEMENZA: Yes. Anything else?

22 Do we have anything else, Bill? Marylynn?
23 That's it?

24 MS. BARTOLETTI: If the personnel
25 committee could just stay for a couple of

1 minutes after this.

2 MR. SEMENZA: Okay. Personnel is
3 going to have a brief executive session after
4 the meeting. At this time the Chair's going to
5 entertain a motion to adjourn.

6 MR. LEGG: Before we do,
7 Mr. Chairman, I got off the phone with the
8 Chief and these two people over on South
9 Keyser, PennDOT said it's up to the Borough to
10 name the streets, we can't name streets. So,
11 his suggestion was maybe next meeting pass a
12 resolution from Oak Street up to Taylor
13 Borough, change that to North Keyser.

14 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Bill, would
15 that be something you have to write?

16 ATTY. RINALDI: Why don't we
17 straighten it all out, what's Milwaukee, what's
18 Keyser? So, maybe somebody can give me a metes
19 and bounds, from this point to this point is
20 this and from this point to this point is this.

21 MR. LEGG: So, what do you need,
22 Bill?

23 MR. BIERLYA: The Chief will tell
24 you, because when he was on the phone that day,
25 he explained what was from Oak Street to Sibley

1 from Drakes Lane to Oak Street and all the
2 different up to what point.

3 ATTY. RINALDI: All right. So, if
4 somebody gets me that, I can put it together,
5 we can review it at the work session and then
6 advertise it and pass it.

7 MR. LEGG: Okay. So, what do we
8 need?

9 MR. BIERYLA: When you talk to the
10 Chief, he could tell you, coming from Main
11 Street, once you go down Drakes Lane and make
12 the turn, at what point it turns to Milwaukee
13 and what point it's south. He had that all
14 figured out.

15 MR. LEGG: All right.

16 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Chairman
17 Semenza asked me, if there's no other business,
18 to call for a motion to adjourn.

19 MR. NOTARI: I'll make that motion.

20 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Motion on the
21 floor by Councilman Notari. All in favor?

22 (Unanimous.)

23 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Good night
24 everyone.

25 (Meeting adjourned.)
