The condemnation of the property on West Grace Street, the mortgage company was notified so that they could handle it.

I have met with the magistrate again, but it's going to come back to Council, the dangerous building for the 305 Keyser Avenue property where the tree is fallen and the property doesn't belong to the owner but the house does.

1 So, the dangerous building letter has been sent to him. Once again, there's a title search 3 Attorney Rinaldi is doing. The paperwork has been filed at the magistrate for the ongoing issues up at Garver Street. 5 I'm waiting to hear for a trial date from the 6 7 magistrate on that one. Once again, it's coming back to Mr. 8 9 Preate on his property up there and maintenance of the 10 property. He said that he would take care of everything on that corner, and he's kind of slacked 11 12 off. 13 So, that's still waiting for another hearing date with the magistrate. And, of course, the 14 ongoing litigation with Attorney Rinaldi and the Stocki 15 property. That's still up in the air as to when, I 16 17 believe it's the 18th for us and I believe tomorrow is, for the attorneys, is the 4th. MR. LOPATKA I could see if I can get a detailed breakdown from the contractor. We gave them drawings and specs. We didn't give them an itemized bid that they were bidding off of.

CHAIRMAN SEMENZA: Yeah. But don't they usually send back, when they do a bid, send back itemized what you're going to do with all that or no?

MR. LOPATKA: When you award it, on the payment app, they usually list each of the sections, which they would probably list similar to what they have there. Break them out. They wouldn't break it

Everything is there. 24 Just has to be passed by each individual fire company. 25
