1 (The Pledge of Allegiance was
2 recited.)

3 MR. SEMENZA: I just want to remind
4 everybody, tonight's virtual meeting is
5 being recorded. Everything that is viewed
6 and said will be placed in the public record
7 and will be available on the Old Forge
8 Borough's website, oldforgeborough.com, in
9 the near future. I'm just going to ask
10 everyone to mute your background noise.

11 Marylynn, roll call, please.

12 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilwoman
13 Avvisato?

14 MS. AVVISATO: Here.

15 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman
16 Lettieri?

17 MR. LETTIERI: Present.

18 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Notari?

19 MR. NOTARI: Present.

20 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Hoover?

21 MR. HOOVER: Present.

22 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Febbo?

23 MR. FEBBO: Present.

24 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Rinaldi?

25 Okay, Councilman Semenza?

1 MR. SEMENZA: Here. When Russell
2 comes back on will you ask for his roll
3 call, please.

4 Okay, welcome to the work session
5 for the Old Forge Borough Council. The
6 purpose of tonight's meeting is to set the
7 agenda for our May 19th meeting. We'll hear
8 from our department heads, go down the
9 table, see if any council members have
10 anything to address.

11 There's public comment that was sent
12 to Marylynn's e-mail address. Marylynn, do
13 we have any public input?

14 MS. BARTOLETTI: No.

15 MR. SEMENZA: Russell joined us.

16 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: I'm back. I
17 got disconnected. I'm here.

18 MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Rinaldi
19 is here.

20 MR. NOTARI: The mayor is absent.
21 Right?

22 MS. BARTOLETTI: Yes.

23 MR. SEMENZA: Okay. At this time
24 the chair is going to ask the department
25 heads, Paul Papi, zoning code enforcement,

1 do you have anything for the agenda?

2 MR. PAPI: No, I don't, Bob.
3 Everything's quiet.

4 MR. SEMENZA: Anybody have any
5 questions for Paul?

6 MS. AVVISATO: I do. Paul, if
7 someone lets their yard go, like, really
8 bad, do we call you if I see it?

9 MR. SEMENZA: Call Marylynn, please.
10 Call the borough manager's office and let
11 them know just so it's -- you know, chain of
12 command goes that way.

13 MS. AVVISATO: Okay, thank you.

14 MR. SEMENZA: Anybody else? How is
15 everything going, Paul? It's probably going
16 to start getting a little busy for you now
17 come up, the grass and everything, garbage
18 and stuff.

19 MR. PAPI: Bob, I must have written
20 about 12 letters so far.

21 MR. SEMENZA: Okay.

22 MR. PAPI: Everything -- I'm getting
23 a response from everybody, though. It's
24 working.

25 MR. SEMENZA: So obviously the

1 magistrate is closed down, so there's no
2 hearing or nothing, Paul, on any of our
3 ongoing stuff?

4 MR. PAPI: All our ongoing stuff has
5 been cancelled and not re-agended yet. So
6 I'm waiting to hear.

7 MR. SEMENZA: I have nothing else.
8 Thanks, Paul.

9 MR. PAPI: You're welcome.

10 MR. SEMENZA: Joe Lencieski, DPW
11 manager. Do you have anything for the
12 agenda, Joe?

13 MR. LENCESKI: No, I don't, but I'd
14 just like everyone to know that everything's
15 going well with the Pittston recycling, to
16 bring all the yard waste there.

17 I see they're milling Moosic Road or
18 they're starting to do Oak Street and Moosic
19 Road. They should be paving in a couple
20 weeks.

21 MR. FEBBO: Joe, are you keeping up
22 with the guys you have?

23 MR. LENCESKI: No. We definitely
24 can use more help, but Marylynn's been on
25 that and hopefully we can get some more

1 help.

2 MR. SEMENZA: Anybody have any
3 questions for Joe?

4 MR. NOTARI: Do we know where the
5 millings are going from Oak Street?

6 MR. LENCESKI: I believe they're to
7 the hairpin turn on Oak Street. I'm not
8 sure of his name or the address.

9 MR. SEMENZA: Mike Mokay.

10 MR. NOTARI: That's on Oak Street?

11 MR. LENCESKI: Yes.

12 MR. SEMENZA: Nobody else has
13 anything else for Joe I'm going to move on.

14 Dave Lopatka, engineer's report.

15 MR. NOTARI: I do have something
16 else for Joe. The stairs that were falling
17 up on North Main Street, across from the old
18 magistrate's office --

19 MR. PAPI: I took care of that.

20 MR. NOTARI: I haven't driven by
21 there in a week or so. Has everything been
22 removed and --

23 MR. PAPI: Yes, everything that's
24 been removed was what was knocked over.
25 What exists is the way it was for the last

1 80 years. And they're going to block the
2 stairs off so they'll never be used again.

3 MR. NOTARI: Thanks, Paul.

4 MR. PAPI: All that debris was
5 removed from there.

6 MR. NOTARI: Excellent.

7 MR. SEMENZA: Anybody else for Joe?

8 MS. BARTOLETTI: Bobby, before we go
9 further I just wanted to jump in for a
10 second. Rick, can you see that the mayor is
11 trying to get in? Can you see anybody
12 trying to get in?

13 MR. NOTARI: No, I have not gotten
14 anything from the mayor.

15 MR. SEMENZA: Marylynn, ask him to
16 go to the website and click on that way,
17 maybe.

18 MS. BARTOLETTI: I'll figure it out.

19 MR. SEMENZA: Thank you, Joe. Dave
20 Lopatka, engineer's report. Dave, do you
21 have anything for the agenda coming up?

22 MR. LOPATKA: Maybe this is for
23 Bill. Bill, are you advertising the storm
24 water ordinance and the illicit discharge
25 ordinance?

1 ATTY. RINALDI: I want to put the
2 borough code and the (unintelligible.)

3 MR. LOPATKA: You can add that.
4 Other than that, I don't have anything. My
5 report, if you have questions on it I'll
6 answer.

7 MR. SEMENZA: Everybody's got Dave's
8 report. Dave, the only thing, like I said
9 earlier, is I'd like to change July 7th as a
10 special meeting to approve bids.

11 MR. LOPATKA: I'll revise that and
12 I'll get you an updated copy.

13 MR. SEMENZA: Marylynn, can we
14 advertise for a special meeting for July
15 7th, please?

16 MS. BARTOLETTI: Yeah.

17 MR. SEMENZA: Anybody have any
18 questions for Dave? Dave, the drawing looks
19 real good. Everybody got two different
20 books at the borough building, an A and a B.
21 Did everybody see their e-mails?

22 MR. LOPATKA: What's the preference?

23 MR. SEMENZA: I like B.

24 MR. NOTARI: I like B.

25 MS. AVVISATO: B looks better.

1 MR. SEMENZA: It's not much of a
2 difference, but I just like the look of B.

3 MR. LOPATKA: I think those raised
4 roofs make it look a lot nicer, and the
5 windows.

6 MR. LETTIERI: A little more modern.

7 MR. NOTARI: That's what I thought
8 too, Mike. B is more modern looking.

9 MR. LOPATKA: It needs to be dressed
10 up a little bit if you're going to do this.

11 MS. AVVISATO: Definitely.

12 MR. LOPATKA: The only other
13 thing -- and it's not for the agenda but
14 it's all included in my report. I included
15 a bunch of different programs that have to
16 be vetted by the borough and approved by the
17 borough. Just public education and
18 outreach, public involvement, participation
19 program, and then the illicit discharge
20 program, which is structured for the borough
21 itself. If you guys want to read through
22 those and let me know if there's anything
23 that you think I need to change in there.
24 They've been submitted to DEP, though.
25 There's a lot of information in there.

1 Those reports are all requirements for your
2 MS4 permit. They're all submitted. I mean,
3 they're under review. They can be modified.

4 Other than that, I don't have
5 anything for the agenda other than -- well,
6 I do actually have something for the agenda,
7 which would be the -- well, there's, like,
8 70 to 75 percent drawings for the May 19th
9 council meeting which you guys need to
10 approve of us bidding it then, at that
11 meeting. I think you have to make a motion
12 for us to put it out to bid. So it will go
13 out to bid on June 30th.

14 MR. SEMENZA: Yeah.

15 MR. LOPATKA: I'd like to add that
16 to the agenda. You need to make a motion to
17 approve us to go out to bid.

18 MR. SEMENZA: Right. That will be
19 on our May 19th meeting.

20 MR. LOPATKA: Yes.

21 MR. NOTARI: Dave, will you have a
22 pre-bid meeting?

23 MR. LOPATKA: There will be a
24 pre-bid. Right now we have to figure out
25 how we need to do it with all this social

1 distancing and grouping up. I'll talk about
2 that and we'll try and figure that out.
3 Hopefully I'll have an answer for you on the
4 19th.

5 MR. SEMENZA: Thanks, Dave. Anybody
6 have any questions for Dave on anything?
7 Thanks, Dave.

8 Chief Dubernas, police report. What
9 do you have? Do you have anything for the
10 agenda, Chief?

11 MR. LOPATKA: I have nothing for the
12 agenda, but things are really starting to
13 pick up. The last two days we were slammed
14 with calls. I'm not sure exactly what's
15 going on. I'm not sure if the little bit of
16 openings put more people out on the streets,
17 but we've been really, really busy the last
18 two days.

19 MR. SEMENZA: Anybody have any
20 questions for Chief Dubernas?

21 MS. AVVISATO: Chief, how are the
22 calls for the meth?

23 CHIEF DUBERNAS: We haven't hardly
24 had any drugs calls at all because I think
25 everybody's hibernating right now.

1 MS. AVVISATO: I was worried about
2 that. When I saw the last report I got a
3 little nervous.

4 CHIEF DUBERNAS: But the thefts are
5 gone through the roof. We're having a pile
6 of people cutting catalytic converters off
7 of cars on car lots now. Now you're
8 starting to see the effects of nobody
9 working. Everybody's trying to make some
10 type of money.

11 MS. AVVISATO: Sorry to hear that,
12 Chief. Thank you.

13 MR. SEMENZA: Anybody else? Thank
14 you, Chief.

15 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Also, on Sunday
16 nights you're going to see Eric Williams.
17 He's going to be on the bike because it
18 seems like we've been getting a lot of
19 people walking around the parks in the
20 evenings. At both parks. The Marion Street
21 and the Miles Street park. They're not in
22 the park but they're walking out and about
23 with kids and everything. So Officer
24 Williams has been on the bike on Sundays for
25 that.

1 MR. FEBBO: That sounds good.

2 MS. AVVISATO: Thank you.

3 MR. SEMENZA: Chief, are we having
4 any issues of social distancing?

5 CHIEF DUBERNAS: No.

6 MR. SEMENZA: You're not coming
7 across any large parties or kids playing or
8 whatever it may be?

9 CHIEF DUBERNAS: No. The only one
10 we had was for a birthday party. We've been
11 doing a lot of these birthday parties.
12 We're probably up to about 50. Only one
13 that there was a whole group of them on the
14 front lawn. But other than that, even with
15 the parties, like families, they've been in
16 their own cars and pretty much staying away
17 from each other.

18 MS. AVVISATO: Good. Thank God.

19 MR. FEBBO: Jay, were you able to
20 make contact on that car on Morton Street
21 for me?

22 CHIEF DUBERNAS: No, I did not, but
23 I will take care of that first thing in the
24 morning. I got busy. We had a lead on a
25 person stealing the catalytic converters and

1 that's what we were doing all afternoon.
2 I'll take care of that first thing in the
3 morning, as soon as I come in.

4 MR. FEBBO: Thanks, Chief.

5 MR. SEMENZA: Thanks, Chief. Bill,
6 do you have anything for the agenda?

7 ATTY. RINALDI: Yes. Everybody has
8 the draft of the resolution with regards to
9 extending the real estate tax deadline,
10 Covid-19 pandemic. Everybody can review
11 that and consider it at the next meeting.
12 Okay?

13 Also, the two ordinances Dave spoke
14 with, they're probably 98 percent done. I'm
15 just going to fill in who enforces it. It's
16 going to be the borough engineer and code
17 enforcement are on both. That's it unless
18 anybody has anything for me on the Project
19 70 land. I don't know what they wanted to
20 do.

21 MR. FEBBO: Bobby, did you and Rick
22 meet at all?

23 MR. SEMENZA: No, we did not.

24 MR. NOTARI: We can meet this week
25 on it, probably. Right?

1 MR. SEMENZA: Yeah, I'd like to meet
2 this week, Rick. You set something up,
3 whether it's via facetime or just meeting.

4 MR. NOTARI: Okay.

5 MR. SEMENZA: Anybody have any
6 questions for Bill? Anything else, Bill?

7 ATTY. RINALDI: No, that's it.

8 MR. SEMENZA: Anybody have any
9 questions for Bill?

10 MS. AVVISATO: I'm good.

11 MR. NOTARI: I have one thing. It
12 could be for Bill, it could be for Marylynn.
13 We talked about the paperwork for the fees
14 for the rental property ordinances and the
15 nuisance ordinances. Is that paperwork
16 available at the borough building yet for me
17 to go over and to look to see if we can come
18 up with a schedule for fees?

19 ATTY. RINALDI: I believe we have
20 it, Marylynn. Right? I know we talked
21 about it.

22 MS. BARTOLETTI: There's an old one
23 that's hanging in the office but, yeah, that
24 was never updated. So it needs to be -- it
25 definitely needs some work.

1 ATTY. RINALDI: I know I did a scan
2 of the Old Forge Borough code. You can scan
3 for fees (unintelligible) the whole code.
4 That's what I did.

5 MR. NOTARI: Thank you.

6 MR. SEMENZA: Anybody else have any
7 questions for Bill?

8 MR. LETTIERI: Bill, with the church
9 thing and the rectory, what's the status on
10 that? Did we move forward on anything with
11 that?

12 ATTY. RINALDI: Well, you own the
13 rectory, and until they supply us that
14 they're closing the church (unintelligible.)

15 MR. LETTIERI: So they still didn't
16 close on the church?

17 ATTY. RINALDI: No, it's not closed.
18 They haven't provided us yet.

19 MR. FEBBO: I talked to Sal Luzio.
20 He said that the finance committee and all
21 that have been talking to Father. As you
22 said, Bill, nothing's going to happen at the
23 diocese until -- I guess until this whole
24 thing blows over and everybody gets back on
25 their feet.

1 MR. LETTIERI: Thank you, Bill.

2 MR. SEMENZA: Anything else?

3 MS. AVVISATO: Thanks, Bill. No,
4 good.

5 MR. SEMENZA: Thanks, Bill.

6 Marylynn, borough manager. Do you have
7 anything for the agenda, Mare?

8 MS. BARTOLETTI: I just have a
9 couple things for tonight. The first is, I
10 had a couple requests from the school. The
11 first is to possibly close Marion Street on
12 June 11th or June 12th for graduation.

13 The second request would be that
14 they would like to have a parade, probably
15 through Main Street. Like, through the
16 regular parade route.

17 So I already talked to the chief
18 about it and he's aware, but I just wanted
19 to make everyone else aware of the request.

20 MR. NOTARI: I don't have an issue
21 with either of them, but are they -- they're
22 going to close Marion Street for graduation?

23 MS. BARTOLETTI: Yes.

24 MR. NOTARI: What are they going to
25 do about parking? Or is it going to be

1 student graduation only?

2 MS. BARTOLETTI: I'm not sure. I
3 think we're a little bit in the early stages
4 of it, but I wanted to put it out to you
5 guys as a request for now just so you know
6 that there's a possibility of it.

7 MR. SEMENZA: Well, we have a few
8 school board members on right now, I see.
9 If one of them wants to unmute and enlighten
10 us if they have any information on what
11 they're going to do for parking or whatever
12 it may be. Alicia? Chris? Rob?

13 MS. AVVISATO: I have no idea what
14 the plans are.

15 MR. THOMAS: Chris Gatto put them on
16 the website. Graduation is June 11th. If
17 social distancing guidelines will permit,
18 Mr. Gatto wants to use the stadium. That's
19 a Thursday, I believe. If social distancing
20 guidance says no, then they're going to go
21 up the Circle Drive-in, and then they want
22 to come back home from that and parade
23 through the town.

24 MR. SEMENZA: So why do they want
25 Marion Street closed down, Chris?

1 MR. THOMAS: I'd have to ask
2 Mr. Gatto, but I didn't hear anything about
3 that.

4 MR. SEMENZA: Marylynn, do you want
5 to let them know what was requested to you?

6 MR. THOMAS: I can call him and ask
7 him to call in.

8 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Council President,
9 I was contacted yesterday by Ms. Trotta
10 along with the fire chief. They're just
11 asking if we can do a parade and close
12 Marion Street like we do for the spring
13 olympics or athletic day or whatever that
14 is.

15 MR. SEMENZA: Okay.

16 CHIEF DUBERNAS: We're supposed to
17 meet with them and work on some type of
18 details of exactly what they're looking for
19 or how they want to do it, whatever their
20 plan is.

21 MR. SEMENZA: Chief, Marylynn,
22 whoever it may be that's involved or any
23 school board member, keep council up to date
24 on what's going on with this, please.

25 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Yes.

1 MR. NOTARI: I don't have any
2 problem with them doing that, but I think
3 they need to have a plan. Otherwise, the
4 neighborhood surrounding the school are
5 going to be inundated with cars.

6 MR. SEMENZA: Right.

7 MR. NOTARI: Just to plan ahead.

8 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Correct. I think
9 the way they're saying they want to block
10 it, they want to block it at Railroad Street
11 and West Grace like they do for field day or
12 whatever. I'm not positive. I have to get
13 more information. I was just contacted
14 yesterday with fire chief Tag.

15 MR. THOMAS: Jason, did he say what
16 night they want to do that?

17 CHIEF DUBERNAS: June 11th is the
18 priority, June 12th is the rain date.
19 Because my understanding was everything was
20 going to be done at the stadium, and then I
21 got contacted yesterday.

22 MR. THOMAS: I know the plans are
23 online for Thursday, stadium, if social
24 distancing is allowed, and the backup is we
25 have the Circle Drive-in reserved for June

1 12th.

2 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Okay.

3 MR. THOMAS: But I just sent
4 Mr. Gatto a text to keep you guys updated.

5 MR. SEMENZA: Thanks, Chris.
6 Marylynn, do you have anything else?

7 MS. BARTOLETTI: Yes. The other
8 thing that Joe had mentioned earlier about
9 the DPW employees, I did hire one person who
10 just started and probably tomorrow we're
11 hiring another one. I think having two
12 extra people will be very helpful for the
13 DPW right now.

14 This is something that I may have
15 for the agenda. I'm in the process of
16 setting up with a credit card payment
17 company to be able to accept payments for
18 whether it's sewer or garbage stickers or
19 police reports or anything like that. So we
20 may have to have something to be able to
21 pass at the meeting in two weeks. That's
22 all I have for tonight.

23 MR. SEMENZA: Anybody have any
24 questions for Marylynn?

25 MR. LETTIERI: You were just talking

1 about DPW help. I know last time we spoke
2 we were talking about school signs.

3 MS. BARTOLETTI: Maybe that's
4 something we can do in the next week.

5 MR. SEMENZA: I'm going to talk
6 about that shortly. Chris Thomas, I think
7 you're getting a lot of background noise.

8 MR. THOMAS: I wanted to ask a
9 question of Marylynn. There was a car going
10 by. For our borough taxes did we change our
11 dates? Did we alter our dates? Or are
12 following the dates that went out on the tax
13 bill?

14 MS. BARTOLETTI: Bill Rinaldi
15 brought that up just a couple minutes ago.
16 I think council is going to make a decision
17 at the next meeting about extending.

18 MR. THOMAS: Okay.

19 MR. SEMENZA: Anybody have any
20 questions for Marylynn?

21 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Who did we
22 hire for what or are we hiring somebody?

23 MR. SEMENZA: Temporary help we
24 hired for DPW and she's going to hire
25 another one.

1 MR. RUSSEL RINALDI: Who did we
2 hire?

3 MR. SEMENZA: A 90-day temp guy.
4 Marylynn, do you want to step in here?

5 MS. BARTOLETTI: We hired summer
6 help for DPW named Michael Bernardi and
7 probably tomorrow I'm going to be hiring
8 another. It's just for seasonal help.

9 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: That's like we
10 do with the fields and stuff?

11 MR. SEMENZA: The 90 day temp guys.

12 MS. BARTOLETTI: Not a 90-day temp,
13 a seasonal.

14 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: That kid's not
15 going to be picking up recyclables and
16 stuff?

17 MS. BARTOLETTI: Yes. Every summer
18 we usually put two people on with DPW just
19 for help in the summer.

20 MR. RUSSEL RINALDI: Okay. I didn't
21 know they did that type of work. I thought
22 they helped with the fields and stuff.

23 MS. BARTOLETTI: That's a little bit
24 different, yes.

25 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: So these kids

1 are able to ride in the truck and
2 everything?

3 MS. BARTOLETTI: Yes.

4 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: And we've done
5 that before, in the past?

6 MS. BARTOLETTI: Yes.

7 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Who were some
8 of the workers in the past? I don't recall
9 them.

10 MS. BARTOLETTI: If you'd like I can
11 give you a list later.

12 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: All right,
13 that's good. I was just curious. I just
14 don't recall that.

15 MR. SEMENZA: Anybody else?

16 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: No, that's all.
17 I couldn't hear before.

18 MR. SEMENZA: Anybody else have any
19 questions for Marylynn? Okay, at this time
20 I'm going to go to public comment.
21 Marylynn, do we have any?

22 MS. BARTOLETTI: No.

23 MR. SEMENZA: Rick, did you say
24 somebody wanted to speak?

25 MR. NOTARI: I believe Chris Goetz

1 wanted to speak.

2 MR. SEMENZA: Did you e-mail
3 anything to Marylynn, Chris?

4 MR. GOETZ: No, I didn't.

5 MR. SEMENZA: We'll let you go, but
6 in the future we ask that you e-mail in your
7 public comments and we'll address it that
8 way. But go ahead.

9 MR. GOETZ: Okay. So I'm just
10 wondering if there's been any action by the
11 zoning office with regard to Trion Equipment
12 or Scrap Enterprises being cited for
13 operating a business without a permit in the
14 borough?

15 MR. SEMENZA: Bill, do you want to
16 step in on this and address Chris, please.

17 ATTY. RINALDI: The zoning officer
18 hasn't done it. That's part of the
19 contempt, that he's not zoned for it.

20 MS. GOETZ: Okay. My next question
21 would be -- and maybe this is for Bill. I
22 had a neighbor contact me regarding the
23 hours and times of operation over there that
24 he and his attorney agreed to at one of the
25 hearings. Whether that's Monday through

1 Friday certain hours, Saturday and no
2 Sundays or so on and so forth. I know at
3 least two neighbors here called the police
4 in the last week about the constant banging
5 going on at quarter to 8, 8:00 at night. If
6 somebody could look into that, Bill. That
7 should be in the minutes of one of the
8 hearings where his lawyer stated when they
9 were going to do work and not going to do
10 work.

11 ATTY. RINALDI: Well, I know our
12 ordinance had hours of operation in it. I
13 think, if I'm not mistaken, it's 7 a.m. to 8
14 p.m.

15 MR. GOETZ: Okay, but it's on the
16 record that he was only going to work
17 certain hours. The ordinance -- I
18 understand what you're saying, but now we
19 can't say we have an ordinance where he can
20 operate and then he doesn't need a permit
21 because of a case. We need to follow one or
22 the other here.

23 ATTY. RINALDI: Well, he has -- in
24 both cases he needs to come into
25 conformance. I mean, we can cite him.

1 There's no magistrate and we can't go back
2 to the hearing until the judge gives us the
3 okay. The virus has us kind of in limbo.
4 We were two hours away from finishing up.

5 MR. GOETZ: Right, and I was there.
6 I understand we're at the court's mercy, but
7 if it was in the minutes from -- it may have
8 been six months ago. I can't because all
9 the hearings get mangled together. There's
10 been so many of them. This thing is two
11 months away from being two years after a six
12 month deadline given.

13 But anyway, his lawyer stated that
14 he was only going to work so many hours.
15 The same thing about when he's going to cut
16 with torches he was supposed to let the
17 borough know. They're constantly over there
18 cutting with torches and I know there's no
19 firemen or nobody else over there watching
20 them.

21 So if we're not going to hold him to
22 this, then we need to go back to the borough
23 ordinance of operating a business without a
24 permit. He can be cited every single day
25 that he's operating over there for the last

1 seven years.

2 MR. FEBBO: I agree with Chris. I
3 think something should be done. Every day
4 somebody should go over there. If it's not
5 Paul, then the police. Every time that he's
6 in violation of either time-wise or torches
7 somebody should be over there to cite him.
8 It should not continue.

9 ATTY. RINALDI: Well, I don't know
10 what ordinance we have regarding torches.
11 We have cited him when he starts fires. The
12 other ordinance we have is noise, and if we
13 can get equipment we can tackle that
14 problem.

15 MR. HOOVER: The problem we have is
16 that this goes on nightly.

17 ATTY. RINALDI: Well, he shouldn't
18 be doing it after 8:00.

19 MR. HOOVER: How many citations has
20 he been written out since our last meeting?

21 ATTY. RINALDI: They're coming up.
22 Let's see here. Rescheduled to June 16th.

23 MR. HOOVER: But between now and
24 then, Bill, he should be cited. What do we
25 have to do to get him cited? Who do we have

1 to send over there?

2 ATTY. RINALDI: We can send Paul.
3 He's got to cite him for doing something
4 wrong. If he's working, making noise after
5 8:00 there's -- if he's making noise beyond
6 the limit there's an ordinance for that. If
7 you want to cite some other business that
8 operates there without a permit, you know,
9 what permit does he need is what you look
10 at.

11 MR. FEBBO: He doesn't have any
12 permits. He doesn't have an occupancy
13 permit or anything.

14 MR. HOOVER: Between the phone call,
15 whoever makes it, to the police department,
16 by the time the police department gets there
17 he's gone or the noise is stopped and we
18 walk away and we're stuck again. Nothing
19 ever happens. I don't think we've ever
20 written a citation since we've been going to
21 court over there. We have not written a
22 citation, I'm going to say, in at least over
23 a year. Chief, have we?

24 CHIEF DUBERNAS: I haven't
25 personally written a citation to him over a

1 year because I was off, but there's been
2 citations issued for him, equipment
3 violations where he actually had one of his
4 trucks towed. There was another one. I
5 know we have hearings coming up in June, I
6 think there's myself and a few other
7 officers, from having citations issued to
8 him for equipment violations, open burning,
9 unsupervised burning, don't have the proper
10 fire extinguisher, proper fire extinguisher
11 agent. I'm not sure. There's a whole pile
12 of them he's been issued.

13 MR. FEBBO: He's still not in
14 compliance with it, and that's on a regular
15 basis.

16 MR. HOOVER: Does Bill have a copy
17 of all these violations?

18 CHIEF DUBERNAS: Attorney Rinaldi is
19 actually going to be at the hearings with
20 us.

21 MR. HOOVER: He should have a copy
22 so when we go to court or we have this
23 virtual meeting Judge Munley knows about
24 these. This is just -- I think it's
25 ridiculous. He's doing what he wants up

1 there.

2 MR. FEBBO: He's growing, by the
3 way.

4 MR. HOOVER: He's got more cars
5 there than you can shake a stick at.

6 MR. FEBBO: I think it's time to
7 have another drone fly over the place and
8 take some pictures for us.

9 MR. GOETZ: I know you're saying
10 about him working until 8:00, but if the
11 court -- his lawyer made a statement on the
12 record in court that he's going to work only
13 certain hours, then that's what I believe we
14 need to follow. So someone needs to get the
15 court records and find out because you're
16 saying we're tied up in court and we have to
17 do what the court says. That's why we can't
18 cite him for not having a permit to operate
19 a business. It can't be both. It has to be
20 one or the other. It can't be both.

21 ATTY. RINALDI: We've reviewed the
22 (unintelligible) and not as open --
23 occupancy permits are for buildings and
24 structures (unintelligible.) You've got to
25 go by what our ordinances are. So whatever

1 we can cite him with we've been citing him
2 with.

3 MR. FEBBO: Bill, to be in a
4 business like he's in it's just like being
5 in the car business, which I was in for 40
6 years. He needs to have permits from the
7 state. He needs all sorts of licenses right
8 down to a salesman's license to sell
9 equipment, of which we've never asked him
10 nor he's never presented, and I think we
11 should go after that part of it, too.

12 ATTY. RINALDI: That would be a
13 state issue for a car lot, and they're
14 always on top of that.

15 MR. FEBBO: He doesn't even have a
16 permit from the borough. He has no permits.

17 MR. GOETZ: You can't tell me that
18 you can open a business in this town without
19 a permit from the borough.

20 MR. FEBBO: You can't sell equipment
21 or trucks without having a salesman's
22 license.

23 MR. GOETZ: You can't sell candy.

24 MR. FEBBO: We stick our head in the
25 sand all we want but it's not going away.

1 ATTY. RINALDI: Whatever we can cite
2 him with we cite him with. If I can find an
3 ordinance to cite (unintelligible.)

4 MR. GOETZ: Since December he should
5 have been cited 50 times.

6 ATTY. RINALDI: He has been cited.
7 He's been cited by Taylor, Old Forge, state
8 police. (Unintelligible.)

9 MR. GOETZ: He's never been cited by
10 the borough. He's in violation of the
11 zoning ordinance for operating a business in
12 a zone that does not allow that. And even
13 if he was operating a business that was
14 allowed in that zone, he still needs a
15 permit to operate the business which he does
16 not have and admitted that on the stand.
17 That's then. That was in December. Neither
18 zoning officer has cited him for operating a
19 business without a permit.

20 ATTY. RINALDI: They cited him. He
21 was cited for operating (unintelligible.)
22 It included that business that
23 (unintelligible.) You were in court. We
24 ran through each of them.

25 MR. GOETZ: He hasn't been cited.

1 ATTY. RINALDI: Chris, the property
2 owner gets the citation. He's been cited.
3 He has cited him. Our case is against
4 Stocki individually for operating or leasing
5 any kind of business (unintelligible.) He's
6 been cited and fined and he appealed it.

7 MR. GOETZ: Once.

8 ATTY. RINALDI: He only has to cite
9 him once.

10 MR. GOETZ: He can be cited every
11 single day he's open. Every day he's there
12 is another violation.

13 ATTY. RINALDI: The fine that he got
14 is a daily fine. He's appealing that.

15 MR. GOETZ: I'm not saying that. He
16 can get another citation every day.

17 MR. FEBBO: Exactly.

18 MR. GOETZ: There's another company
19 over there. It's a company called Trion
20 Equipment that was not part of -- was never
21 cited. Hasn't been cited ever.

22 ATTY. RINALDI: That's not the way
23 the ordinance works.

24 MR. GOETZ: It was a made up company
25 so he can come in and sell equipment.

1 ATTY. RINALDI: You cite the person
2 for violating the ordinance. If they do not
3 cease and desist or appeal with 30 days you
4 go to the magistrate and the magistrate
5 fines him. You also ask him to fine him for
6 every day that that continues. You don't go
7 down every day and recite him. That was
8 done.

9 MR. GOETZ: I do hear what you're
10 saying, but I have gotten other opinions
11 that disagree with that, that he could be
12 cited each day that he continues to operate.
13 I'll leave it at that.

14 But I'm going to go back to my
15 original point, Bill.

16 ATTY. RINALDI: I don't know how it
17 (unintelligible.)

18 MR. FEBBO: Bobby, could we have
19 some updated pictures? Have a drone fly
20 over, get some pictures?

21 MR. SEMENZA: Do we have somebody
22 with a drone?

23 ATTY. RINALDI: I have a person that
24 does all my -- I have somebody that takes
25 pictures from time to time. I'll contact

1 them.

2 MR. FEBBO: How about getting an
3 update of the field over there, Bill, just
4 to take a look at what we have as of today's
5 date or tomorrow's date or this week.

6 ATTY. RINALDI: I'll get it before
7 we go back.

8 MR. FEBBO: We've seen incoming,
9 nothing going out. I just see stuff coming
10 in.

11 MR. GOETZ: Well, it's going out in
12 a dumpster. I'm hearing it being cut up
13 every day.

14 ATTY. RINALDI: Are there dumpsters
15 rolling out of there?

16 MR. GOETZ: Well, it's getting out
17 of here somehow because they're cutting it
18 up over here every single day of the week.

19 MR. FEBBO: He's in violation of
20 that. He's not supposed to be using any
21 torches until he's down to the last 20
22 percent and can't be moved by a truck.
23 That's what -- he's supposed to have a
24 permit with fire people there and somebody
25 from our borough over there to oversee it as

1 he's doing it. He's never complied with
2 that. He just does it when he wants to do
3 it.

4 MR. GOETZ: I'm going to go back to
5 the original question, Bill, and that is I
6 would like to somehow -- if I have to
7 request it of the borough. Someone needs to
8 check the minutes of the hearing when his
9 lawyer told the judge the days and the hours
10 of the week that he was going to work,
11 because if he said he wasn't going to work
12 on Sunday he better not be working on
13 Sunday.

14 ATTY. RINALDI: We have an ordinance
15 that says he can't work on Sunday. I'll see
16 if we can the equipment to find out where
17 the noise violation is.

18 MR. GOETZ: Again, I'm going back to
19 what his lawyer told the judge. His lawyer
20 told the judge there were going to be
21 certain hours and days he was going to work.
22 So to me he has to follow that.

23 ATTY. RINALDI: Right,
24 (unintelligible.) That's what we're in the
25 hearing over. That's our case. He's still

1 scrapping, period.

2 MR. GOETZ: I understand that's the
3 case. What I'm telling you is back in
4 December -- wasn't December. I don't know.
5 It was one of the summertime hearings,
6 August, whatever. He talked about with the
7 fire. They talked about calling the borough
8 when they were going to torch, when they
9 were going to use torches. Louie was there,
10 all these guys were there. His lawyer said
11 we're going to work Monday through Friday
12 from 7 to 5, Saturdays until 2 or 3, and
13 we're not going to work Sunday. Then why is
14 that not being followed?

15 ATTY. RINALDI: That was a
16 conversation I don't think was on the
17 record.

18 MR. GOETZ: That's all I want to
19 know. Okay.

20 MR. SEMENZA: Anything else? Thank
21 you.

22 MR. GOETZ: That's all I have.
23 Thank you for the time. That's it.

24 MR. SEMENZA: Marylynn, is there any
25 comment put in? Anybody e-mail you comment

1 since the last?

2 MS. BARTOLETTI: No, there's
3 nothing.

4 MR. SEMENZA: Then at this time the
5 chair is going to go down the table. Mayor,
6 do you have anything to address? Okay, he's
7 not answering. Councilwoman Avvisato,
8 anything?

9 MS. AVVISATO: No, I'm good.
10 Thanks.

11 MR. SEMENZA: Councilman Febbo?

12 MR. FEBBO: Do we bring it up now
13 that Jimmy and myself met with --

14 MAYOR LEGG: I came back. I'm good.

15 MR. SEMENZA: Thank you, Mayor.

16 MR. FEBBO: He and I met with
17 Schuback yesterday to discuss the towing
18 issues. Do we want to discuss that now or
19 in executive?

20 MR. SEMENZA: You can bring it up if
21 you want.

22 MR. FEBBO: Bill, I read everything
23 that you sent out, which was quite lengthy,
24 the three of those other municipalities.
25 You have good information, and I don't know

1 what Jimmy's opinion is on this, but I think
2 after meeting with Mike and also Billy the
3 borough should not get involved at all with
4 the towing situation at all. We're going to
5 open up a can of worms. The municipalities
6 that we talked about in the issue, there,
7 they more or less have their own person that
8 deals with -- Scranton particularly. They
9 have their own dispatcher that sends people
10 out in a rotation method. Now, we have the
11 odd/even with the two towing companies.

12 I think if we venture into that
13 we're going to get into some legal disputes
14 with it. I don't think we should involve
15 ourselves at all with towing. Let the
16 towers work it out themselves.

17 That being said, from what I read
18 the chief of police in the three
19 municipalities are the ones that designate
20 the towing. Again, that being said, I think
21 we just let our police officers dictate who
22 they call for a tow job.

23 There's also other issues there
24 about the permits, their equipment being
25 acceptable, the kind of equipment that's

1 needed. If we're going to get involved
2 we're going to have to hold everybody to
3 that complaint.

4 So again, my feeling is that let's
5 just sit down and let them work it out and
6 let the police work it out. If a cop is on
7 the scene he knows who to call -- who he
8 should call based on the qualifications that
9 they have. This third guy that comes in
10 here, put his name on there. But if the
11 police officers feel they're not comfortable
12 working with him -- because personalities
13 get involved there also.

14 MR. SEMENZA: Personalities all over
15 the borough, Councilman Febbo. I disagree
16 with that.

17 MS. AVVISATO: I disagree.

18 MR. SEMENZA: There are
19 personalities all over the borough, not only
20 the --

21 MR. FEBBO: I agree, but do we want
22 to venture into that? Do we want to venture
23 into making the calls and taking on towing
24 as part of our responsibility?

25 MR. HOOVER: First of all, talking

1 with the two of them it's very hard. Both
2 of them have different prices for
3 everything.

4 MR. FEBBO: That's the other part,
5 pricing. The pricing is completely out of
6 whack. Billy told me that he'll tow a car
7 for somebody with a DUI and he'll normally
8 charge one price for somebody. A lady will
9 come up to him, she'll be crying, she has a
10 family, she's a single parent, he'll say
11 give me \$20, give me \$30. Mike does the
12 same thing. There's not one set price
13 between the two of them on what they charge
14 each individual. It's up to the insurance
15 departments a little bit. And for us to
16 come up with a pay scale to say it's a
17 certain amount of money to tow a car, to do
18 this, to do that, a certain amount of money
19 to store a car in your fenced-in area at
20 your shop, it's things that I don't think we
21 should get involved. I really don't. It's
22 going to be a big headache for the borough.

23 And they only get -- neither one of
24 them have towed a car in four weeks. They
25 only get 40, 50 tows a year. It's not a lot

1 of tows. But like Mike said -- Mike was
2 perfectly honest with me. He said when he
3 first started doing this seven or eight
4 years ago he was on the bottom of the rung.
5 He was on the bottom of the barrel. He had
6 to work his way up. He had to get
7 experience, he had to do this, he had to do
8 that. He had to play the game. He let
9 Billy -- Billy started calling him when he
10 was busy, and that's kind of how he got
11 where he is today, instead of somebody just
12 jumping in and saying I want to be part of
13 the towing contract and not even have the
14 right stuff to do what he's doing. I told
15 him we'd talk to them again about this.
16 This is just the beginning. But talking to
17 Lou, I think we should talk about this in
18 executive session and really discussed what
19 we want to do. It's a lot more involved.

20 MR. SEMENZA: Well, with all due
21 respect, I don't want to leave it up to our
22 police officers to make the decision who to
23 call, who not to call. That's my opinion,
24 my personal opinion.

25 Chief, I don't know how you feel

1 about that, but that's my --

2 MS. AVVISATO: Maybe we should meet
3 in executive session:

4 MR. SEMENZA: Rick, would you stay
5 on and block everybody off after this so we
6 can do an executive after this?

7 MR. NOTARI: I think we can do that.

8 MR. SEMENZA: Let's stay on after
9 this meeting, we'll go into executive.
10 Councilman Febbo, anything else?

11 MR. FEBBO: No, that's all, Bob.

12 MR. SEMENZA: Councilman Hoover?

13 MR. HOOVER: No. I just want to
14 thank Paul for staying on those steps or Joe
15 for staying on those steps on Main Avenue.
16 Bob, who's in charge of that area up there
17 in relationship to the road and cleaning
18 that area up? The weeds and all that stuff.
19 It's a state road. Is that the state?

20 MR. SEMENZA: I don't know.

21 Marylynn, do you know who is in charge of
22 that, the weeds and everything on side of
23 the road?

24 MR. HOOVER: Just the garbage laying
25 around.

1 MR. SEMENZA: I'm sure it would be
2 the property owner. Somebody has to own
3 that property.

4 MR. HOOVER: Both sides of the
5 street it would look so much better if
6 they'd just cut ten feet of those weeds away
7 and just clean the edge of the road up
8 because everybody just throws their stuff
9 out there. It just looks horrible driving
10 by.

11 MR. NOTARI: Can we have Joe call
12 someone at PennDOT and see if it's their
13 responsibility or if it's the borough's?

14 MR. SEMENZA: Maybe it would be Paul
15 who would call. Right?

16 MR. NOTARI: I thought DPW.

17 MR. SEMENZA: Well, it's a garbage
18 issue. Marylynn, who would call? It
19 doesn't matter, really. Somebody call.

20 MR. LENCESKI: From what I
21 understand in the past we've done that, but
22 with the virus and everything that's going
23 on with the yard waste and being behind
24 because they shut down, our third-party
25 vendor from NE Cartage, we haven't been able

1 to get it.

2 MR. FEBBO: So you're saying the
3 borough does it, Joe?

4 MR. LENCESKI: From what I
5 understand in the past we have. It's just
6 the situation that we have with the yard
7 waste and the manpower. We haven't been
8 able to get to it yet to do it.

9 MR. SEMENZA: Okay, then we'll just
10 stay status quo. Get to it when you can,
11 Joe. Anything else?

12 MR. HOOVER: No, that's it.

13 MR. SEMENZA: Councilman Lettieri?

14 MR. LETTIERI: The only question I
15 have is in the beginning of the year we had
16 a tentative committee list. Did we finalize
17 that list of committees?

18 MR. SEMENZA: That is finalized.

19 MR. LETTIERI: Thank you, sir.

20 MR. SEMENZA: Councilman Notari?

21 MR. NOTARI: I have a few things.
22 I'd like to visit the park situation. Have
23 we thought about whether we're going to or
24 when we will reopen the parks officially?

25 MR. SEMENZA: I think, in my

1 opinion, they shouldn't open just yet. With
2 the social distancing I think you're going
3 to have groups of people coming around. I
4 think it's going to be bad. If you look at
5 somewhere like McDade or the other county
6 parks, the difference with that is there's
7 maintenance guys there. There's people
8 around to -- our police can't be in our
9 parks 24/7.

10 MR. NOTARI: So our plan is, then --
11 what are we doing with our parks? We
12 haven't call them back yet?

13 MR. SEMENZA: Not as of yet.

14 MS. BARTOLETTI: We haven't called
15 anyone back yet.

16 MR. NOTARI: And again, in that fact
17 I am interested in having at least the golf
18 nets and the tennis nets placed back up at
19 the Marion Street park. I understand it is
20 technically closed even though we can't
21 close it. But personally, I'm looking to
22 get the parks back open as soon as possible.
23 So that's my first thing.

24 Second thing is have we discussed a
25 paving project at all for this year?

1 MR. FEBBO: No, we haven't. Me and
2 Jimmy touched on that yesterday. I think we
3 said we're going to sit it out this year.

4 MR. HOOVER: I think we can get some
5 streets down, but Dave's still on it. The
6 bidding process is going to be a little
7 hectic. I think everybody's going to be so
8 busy that we're not -- I don't think we're
9 going to be able to get any bidders, and if
10 we do it's going to be high because they're
11 not going to want it.

12 So I think if we really come down
13 with a schedule this year and bid it out
14 early next year, January, February, where
15 nobody has any work to do, where they'll
16 want it and we'll get a decent price on it.

17 MR. LOPATKA: That's a good idea.

18 MR. SEMENZA: I'd rather do a storm
19 water project.

20 MR. LOPATKA: At some point with
21 this MS4 stuff we're going to have to do a
22 storm water project.

23 MR. SEMENZA: I'd rather do a storm
24 water project rather than pave roads. First
25 and foremost, if the water has nowhere to go

1 it's going to destroy the roads. You can
2 pave all you want, you can do it as many
3 times as you want. It's going to destroy
4 the roads. Water destroys roads when it
5 lays in this area.

6 MR. LOPATKA: There's going to be
7 some requirements under this MS4 for you
8 guys to do some work. Once we get that PRP
9 plan done I can kind of give you a better
10 idea of what some of those projects may need
11 to be. So that should be done in about a
12 month or two once we get surveyors out
13 there, once they're available to go out
14 there.

15 MR. FEBBO: So where we stand right
16 now is we're foregoing the paving program
17 for this year and putting our money into the
18 other project that we need to get done?

19 MR. SEMENZA: I would like to see
20 some kind of storm/sewer separation or storm
21 water project. Something.

22 MR. LOPATKA: We'll have a much
23 better idea once we get this PRP plan and
24 map and everything done. Once we have that
25 we could probably sit down and talk about

1 what you want to do.

2 MR. SEMENZA: Most of our town is a
3 combined system.

4 MR. NOTARI: Let me ask these
5 questions, then. I have no problem with
6 putting it off a year as long as we're going
7 to continue to do it, and I've been pushing
8 for storm water management for the past four
9 years. But don't we have a dedicated
10 millage or don't we need to use liquid fuel
11 taxes on road improvement?

12 MS. BARTOLETTI: There's other uses
13 as well, Rick.

14 MR. NOTARI: And is storm water
15 management one of them?

16 MS. BARTOLETTI: If you'd like I can
17 send you the list after the meeting and then
18 you can go over it.

19 MR. NOTARI: Okay, because I'm just
20 saying we have to make sure that -- Bob's
21 saying we can put the money toward storm
22 water. I just want to make sure that that's
23 allowable.

24 MS. BARTOLETTI: Another way that
25 you can also do storm water is through CDBG

1 money. That's another option as well.

2 MR. NOTARI: That's correct, yes.

3 MR. SEMENZA: But I thought it

4 was --

5 MR. NOTARI: Might want to make

6 sure that --

7 MR. SEMENZA: -- that we can use

8 that for storm water or sewer.

9 MR. NOTARI: Liquid fuels?

10 MR. SEMENZA: Yeah, I thought it

11 was. Maybe I'm wrong. Maybe I

12 misunderstood.

13 MR. HOOVER: Maybe we can do both.

14 Maybe we can do something with both.

15 MR. SEMENZA: If we don't start

16 putting storm basins in, something like that

17 you're spinning your wheels paving roads.

18 You go look at the water laying on roads,

19 puddles on the edge of the roads. I don't

20 know. I think we are wasting money doing

21 this time over time again.

22 MR. FEBBO: I agree with you and

23 Dave. I think this year, anyway, that we

24 should concentrate on the water runoff more

25 so than roads. It is late in the year to go

1 looking for bids on roads and so on. Just
2 forego that and go with your projection on
3 the water runoff. Let Dave come up with his
4 plan that is required by DEP.

5 MR. SEMENZA: Sounds like a plan.
6 Councilman Notari, anything else?

7 MR. NOTARI: I believe that's it for
8 right now. Thank you, Mr. Chairman.

9 MR. SEMENZA: Councilman Rinaldi?

10 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: No items, Bob.
11 I'm good. Thank you.

12 MR. SEMENZA: The only thing I have
13 is I would like to set up interviews for the
14 DPW workers on May 12th, Marylynn. Can we
15 do that?

16 MS. BARTOLETTI: Sure.

17 MR. SEMENZA: You set it up or does
18 Rick have to set it up for us? How does it
19 go?

20 MS. BARTOLETTI: Maybe Rick can help
21 set that up, yeah.

22 MR. NOTARI: It's not a problem if I
23 set up. Then I can set up and then shut
24 off. I just won't be at the meeting. I can
25 set up the meeting and then I can leave the

1 meeting.

2 MR. SEMENZA: But I need somebody to
3 be able to drive the bus.

4 MR. NOTARI: I can do that.

5 MR. SEMENZA: Can Marylynn do that?

6 MR. NOTARI: I'm not sure if she
7 could or not. They would have to sign her
8 up with a school account, I believe. But
9 otherwise, if I set it up for you I can come
10 in and let everybody in and then I can
11 leave.

12 MR. SEMENZA: Russell and Jimmy, are
13 you good on May 12th?

14 MR. HOOVER: Yeah.

15 MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Yeah, I'm
16 good.

17 MR. SEMENZA: 5:00 or 5:15,
18 Marylynn, could you set them up for?

19 MS. BARTOLETTI: Yes.

20 MR. SEMENZA: Is that good for you
21 guys?

22 MR. HOOVER: I'm good.

23 MR. RUSSEL RINALDI: This Tuesday,
24 correct.

25 MR. SEMENZA: I'd like to hire on

1 the 19th. I'd like to put on the agenda
2 hire a DPW worker for the agenda for the
3 19th.

4 MS. AVVISATO: This is full time.
5 Right?

6 MR. SEMENZA: Full time, yes.

7 MR. NOTARI: How many are we hiring,
8 one?

9 MS. BARTOLETTI: Just one.

10 MR. SEMENZA: How many applications
11 do we have?

12 MS. BARTOLETTI: Two.

13 MR. NOTARI: Do we need more than
14 one?

15 MS. BARTOLETTI: No, right now we
16 have one opening and we have one person on
17 workman's comp. So right now I think we'd
18 be hiring just one person.

19 MR. NOTARI: Thank you.

20 MR. SEMENZA: That's all I have. If
21 that's it, the chair is going to entertain a
22 motion to adjourn.

23 MR. LENCESKI: Bob, I'd like to talk
24 real quick. I think the DPW committee
25 should sit down with me to discuss the

1 streets that might need to be paved. I'd
2 like to sit down with the DPW committee
3 about the streets that might need to be
4 paved and the paving committee about the
5 storm water or vise-versa because the DPW
6 workers know the areas that are troublesome
7 when there are storms and I'd like to
8 address them.

9 MR. SEMENZA: That would be the
10 paving and I'm going to say the sewer
11 because it's a combined system. Probably 90
12 percent of our town is a combined system.
13 Correct?

14 MR. LENCESKI: I think so.

15 MR. LOPATKA: Does the borough have
16 a sewer map from LLVSA or anybody that shows
17 exactly what's combined?

18 MR. SEMENZA: Paul Papi, unmute
19 yourself.

20 Dave, quite a bit is combined. I
21 can contact LLVSA. I think they'll know.
22 But I think Paul would know, too. Marylynn,
23 do you have any idea?

24 MS. BARTOLETTI: I think there's a
25 map in the office.

1 MR. LENCESKI: I know we have a
2 variety of maps in our office I didn't get
3 the opportunity to look at right now, only
4 being here a few months. But there are maps
5 to go through. I just haven't had the
6 opportunity to go through them.

7 MR. LOPATKA: If you want to get
8 them to me or I can stop down there and just
9 kind of leaf through them because it would
10 be helpful for some of this MS4 stuff that
11 we're putting together.

12 MR. LENCESKI: Definitely.

13 MR. LOPATKA: Joe, I'll give you a
14 call.

15 MR. SEMENZA: Dave, like I say, 90
16 percent of the town is still a combined
17 system.

18 MR. LOPATKA: We want to delineate
19 that the best we can. That has to be part
20 of this map that we put together. If I can
21 at least get a map or at least get an idea
22 of what it is it would help us kind of put
23 that map together.

24 MR. FEBBO: Are they requiring us to
25 do something, come up with immediately to

1 show that we are making some progress on
2 that?

3 MR. LOPATKA: With regards to the
4 first requirement, the biggest requirement
5 as part of this PRP plan is for us to
6 quantify an amount of sediment load that's
7 required to be captured by the borough. So
8 as part of that we're mapping in the area
9 right now some of the basins that are in
10 place. Some of them we can use, some we
11 can't use. But once we have that map
12 together it kind of gives us a plan so that
13 we know where we can start and where we can
14 start separating some stuff. Joe, I'll give
15 you a call.

16 MR. SEMENZA: If nobody has anything
17 else, the chair is going to entertain a
18 motion to adjourn.

19 MR. NOTARI: I'll make that motion.

20 MR. SEMENZA: By Councilman Notari.
21 All in favor?

22 (Unanimous. Meeting adjourned.)
