MR. PAPI: I have a variance hearing coming up. They want put a sign on Pride Mobility's building. They need a variance for the size. It's going to be a hundred-foot sign. I don't know if we're going to be able to get that in next month
with the Corona and how we have our meetings. We'11 see how it goes.

MR. SEMENZA: Anybody have any questions for Paul?

MR. NOTARI: I have a question. Paul, what's Picc's Ice Cream doing? Are they putting in a driveway or a drive through?

MR. PAPI: Yes, driveway. He got his permit, 1 ike, six weeks ago.

MR. NOTARI: Just saw them doing work the last week or so. I was wondering what was going on. Thank you.

MR. SEMENZA: Anybody else?
Thanks, Paul. I'm going to go to Dave Lopatka next. Everybody has Dave's report in their packet. Dave, anything to add?

MR. LOPATKA: I don't have anything to add.

MR. SEMENZA: Anybody have any questions for Dave? Al1 right. Thanks, Dave.

Chief Dubernas. Everybody has the chief's report in their packet. As we requested, it looks a little more involved.

Thank you, Chief, for adding to your report, as we requested.

CHIEF DUBERNAS: That's just broken down into mostly, like, the crime categories and everything. But that doesn't, like, include if we go to -- this is for alarms or us conducting business checks or some accidents. Depending on the accident, some officers will just switch information on our forms or some will actually do them through our computer reporting system. That's why the numbers are off a little bit.

MR. SEMENZA: Chief, I have to ask you what is flim-flam?

CHIEF DUBERNAS: Like the IRS
calling you asking -- a fraud-type thing.
MR. SEMENZA: Anybody have any questions for the chief?

MR. NOTARI: On the mileage on the vehicles, $I$ see the one vehicle is used more than, it seems like, the others by at least 500 miles. Is there a reason for that?

CHIEF DUBERNAS: It all depends.
One of our cars was out of service. Like, next month you'll probably see a couple cars
a lot higher than car one because our car one is at Barber Ford right now.

MR. NOTARI: Okay.
MR. SEMENZA: Anybody else for Chief Dubernas? Thanks, Chief.

Bill, I'll go to you. Solicitor's report.

ATTY. RINALDI: Attached to my report, just review the amendments I'm proposing to the towing ordinance for the work session. Then we can finalize it there.

Also, we closed on the note on Monday -- last Monday, I guess it was, and we're just awaiting the school property subdivision.

And I'm going to ask council to add item number six to instruct the zoning officer to send the zoning change request for Mariotti to the Lackawanna County Planning Commission for comment so we can get that moving as well.

I think the only other thing I have is, Paul, I sent a letter to the district attorney's office on the Scott property,
because they're prosecuting that, telling them nothing's been done. I believe that's it.

MR. SEMENZA: Anybody have any questions for Bill?

MR. HOOVER: Bil1, the Stocky property, here anything yet?

ATTY. RINALDI: I got all their stuff. I'm waiting to see what the judge wants to do. I haven't heard back from them yet. He's probably reading through it all and he's going to notify us when he wants to hear us argue it. I can follow up with him.

MR. FEBBO: Stocky's being a hundred percent. Every time I've driven by there he had something coming in. Every single day.

MR. HOOVER: Every day. He's going to town. Scrap metal is high. He's going to town.

MR. SEMENZA: A11 right. Anybody else for Bill? Thanks, Bill. We're going to move to Marylynn.

MS. BARTOLETTI: Okay. So the tentative budget will be ready for passage at the December 1 st work session, and then
the actual official budget will be passed on December 15th. So as I have one ready for you I'll send it out so you'll be able to look at it before both meetings.

On the agenda, if you see number one under new business, it's the payment application for D\&M. That's the work on the borough building. So that will be payment application number one.

Also on the agenda, under number two, it's resolution number 12. It's a cooperation agreement for the county, and that is for the elevator. So you just have to vote on that to make it official.

And then under new business, number three, it is for CDBG funds for 2020 in the amount of $\$ 137,591$. Right now it's being held under housing rehab, but as soon as we tell them how we want to use it, then it will immediately be changed to whatever project that we need.

Does anyone have any questions for me? No? Okay.

MR. HOOVER: Update on the building?
MS. BARTOLETTI: The building is
moving along. We had a progress meeting on it this morning. There's a couple little glitches, couple changes that need to be made. In fact, we'11 probably be able to talk about that a little bit when this meeting is over.

Jimmy, you were there for part of our meeting. Do you have anything that you'd 1 ike to add to it?

MR. HOOVER: No, just that I don't want it to stop. I stopped in today while the meeting was going on and $I$ was glad $I$ did because $I$ saw some of the issues that they're having. But $I$ just want to make sure that -- I don't know if you know, but the architect changed, the person. The architect did change. There was a gir1 that was doing it and she currently left the firm. So now there's another guy, so he has to get on board. But it's going.

MR. FEBBO: Mare, what did they do with that change the room that we're going to have, the work room?

MS. BARTOLETTI: That's stil1 in the process of being worked out right now.

Dave, are you still on?
MR. LOPATKA: Yes.
MS. BARTOLETTI: Anything you might want to add?

MR. LOPATKA: We reworked the layout to extend that room, so we ended up adding -- I think the room now will be, like, 14 feet, ten inches wide by, I think, 11 foot-six or something, which is probably two foot smaller than it was originally.

MS. BARTOLETTI: That's the actual council executive meeting room that we're talking about.

MR. FEBBO: Where were we ale to steal the room from?

MR. LOPATKA: We rearranged the men's bathroom a little bit so we can make it a ittle bit thinner. We kind of relocated everything onto the one wall. We were able to shrink the size of that by about two feet, a 1 ittle over two feet. So we ended up picking up that area, so we extended the size of the other room.

I also had Brominski, the architect, put a large table in there to make sure it
fits in there. It will at this point.
MR. FEBBO: It will accommodate at least ten people?

MR. LOPATKA: Yes.
MR. SEMENZA: Anybody else for Marylynn? Marylynn, anything else?

MS. BARTOLETTI: No, that's it. Most of what $I$ needed was in executive session.

MR. SEMENZA: Okay. Joe has not signed back on yet. Everybody does have Joe's report. Does anybody have any concerns on Joe's report? No? Okay. At this time we're going to go to public comment. Marylynn, do you have anybody there?

MS. BARTOLETTI: No, I don't.
MR. SEMENZA: Does anybody from the public want to address council? If you do, unmute yourself. I see one or two phone numbers. That's about it.

MR. LOPATKA: I just want to give you guys an update on that Mark Levan property that had an issue with the storm water. So I actually drove by there today,
and Pennsy fixed both his driveway and the neighbor's driveway. I don't know if you saw in my report, but when we were there looking at it the neighbor's driveway, who was kind of the issue, he had (inaudible) on the other side of his house that he said he was having some kind of problem with, so we ended up fixing both of them.

MR. SEMENZA: So they're fixed?
MR. LOPATKA: Yes.
MR. FEBBO: What was the fix? What did you do?

MR. LOPATKA: Basically what we did was take each of the driveways and extend them out and kind of round them off right at the curb 1 ine so the water will stay in the curb 1 ine. Before there was -- Levan -- the neighbor's driveway kind of was -- there was kind of a depression there before it went up the driveway and it was probably a foot or two back. We basically took that same elevation that was two foot back, brought it out to the curb and rolled it over onto the edge of the curb 1 ine.

MR. FEBBO: Were they satisfied with
that?
MR. LOPATKA: I haven't heard and I didn't know when when they did it, but when I met Pennsy out there he said they would do it. I guess when they had time they sent a crew down there to do it.

MR. FEBBO: I guess we'll find out after it rains.

MR. SEMENZA: Anything else?
MR. LOPATKA: No. I meant to add that.

MR. SEMENZA: That's all right. Since there's nobody from the public that wants to speak, at this time I'm going to go into --

MR. LOPATKA: One more thing. Just to remind Marylynn, you want me to bring up the Birchwood?

MS. BARTOLETTI: Yes. I have that on the agenda for them to vote on tonight. You can just give a quick little update on that so they'll know what they're voting on.

MR. LOPATKA: Basically what they're doing is sending in for a flood elevation adjustment to FEMA. So they filled out all
the paperwork, I reviewed it, and there's nothing -- $I$ mean, all the borough really needs to do is sign it saying it was -- the paperwork was correct, and they have to send it in and FEMA will give them a determination as to the flood elevation.

MR. SEMENZA: Anything else?
MR. LOPATKA: That's it.
MR. SEMENZA: Anybody have any questions on that?

MR. NOTARI: Dave, you approve of that or is that something that we need to worry about?

MR. LOPATKA: No. Basically, they put all the paperwork together. We just looked at it. For the most part, what they're doing is looking at the one section where they have a location of a townhouse. It's actually -- the new FEMA map shows it slightly within the floodway. So they're looking to make a revision to the flood map based off of that.

We don't really need to do anything other than the paperwork that they had.

MR. NOTARI: Okay. We wouldn't need
to approve that or --
MR. LOPATKA: No. All we need to do is, $I$ guess Marylynn has it on there just to approve it, and then the borough needs to sign off on it.

ATTY. RINALDI: Is this under the new ordinance, Dave? You can just sign it, right, if it's under the new ordinance? You or Paul.

MR. LOPATKA: I don't know. Maybe you can. I think it says a borough official on the form, though.

ATTY. RINALDI: Okay.
MR. LOPATKA: Probably be Bob or Marylynn that can sign off on it.

ATTY. RINALDI: I remember when I was doing the new ordinance $I$ said everything gets approved by either borough council or a designee, the zoning officer or engineer. So as long as you're good with it.

MR. NOTARI: So we're not going to be held 1 iable if there's a flood, if they they take themselves out of the floodplain and there's a flood and they get damaged?

MR. LOPATKA: No, it's actually more they're looking to kind of relocate the -where this property is, it's up from where everything else is. I'm not sure how it's actually in the floodway the way it is.

MR. NOTARI: They're looking to not pay for flood insurance, is what they're doing. I want to make sure, if anything ever happens, it doesn't come back on the borough that we're 1 iable, that we allowed this to happen.

MR. LOPATKA: I don't know if $I$ have the answer to that. They filled out the paperwork. I guess FEMA has to look at it and approve what they're proposing.

ATTY. RINALDI: Is this the floodplain change that was made by Spano and now it was changed again with the new map? Because there was one made originally when Spano was developing it, and then they came out with their new map. So $I$ don't know if they changed that 1 ine again or didn't change it again.

MR. LOPATKA: I don't know if they changed it again, but $I$ don't know if before
their new map came out they made some grading adjustments that weren't in the floodplain at the time based off of -- like, FEMA's map, I think, is a little bit older, before they put the development in. So the area that they filled where they're putting that one -- I guess one of the last townhouses, I mean, I can't see how it's in the floodplain if everything else isn't because there's a slope there. They're looking for a revision on the line, basically. And that's paperwork they have to fill out and they have to prove to FEMA that the line needs to change there.

ATTY. RINALDI: Are they asking
for -- I'm just looking at the app. It says it meets our floodplain management requirements. So does that mean that they don't have to build up higher or they do?

MR. LOPATKA: Well, it depend on if FEMA allows the change in the floodplain. If it was still in the floodplain they would have to build the finished floor 18 inches higher than the elevation. It's going to be a determination by FEMA at this point.

ATTY. RINALDI: I'm looking at A. It says "request involving placement of fi11", and then they have in there "including requirement that no fill be placed." So I'm confused. Are they putting in fill or not putting in fill?

MR. LOPATKA: No, it was already filled prior.

MR. FEBBO: Probably after Spano went as he developed it.

MR. LOPATKA: So their new map I don't think has those new grades. I'm sure it was flown well before they finished anything.

ATTY. RINALDI: I know Spano got it changed all along the river so he could build, but $I$ don't know which map that is on. I know it was holding him up a long time and he finally got it. So I'm assuming the new map that FEMA did has that on it. Right?

MR. LOPATKA: I don't know exactly. I've seen the map but $I$ don't know exactly what the differences were. I thought it was pretty similar along that back line from
what the original was.
ATTY. RINALDI: Are these the new buildings they're adding or are these current buildings?

MR. LOPATKA: I think it's one of the new buildings.

ATTY. RINALDI: You're the engineer. I have to rely on you.

MR. LOPATKA: I looked at what they provided. FEMA has to make the determination.

MR. NOTARI: From the e-mait I'm reading these buildings are already done. One and three.

MR. LOPATKA: It is one of the original buildings. Sorry. I think they had two more buildings that they're putting up and they're not in that area. One and three that were already constructed.

ATTY. RINALDI: So is this that zone AE on their map where the retention basin is?

MR. NOTARI: Yes. According to the e-mai1, yes.

ATTY. RINALDI: So that's the area
they want to disturb, $I$ guess it is, or --
MR. NOTARI: I'm going to continue
reading the e-mail. "Both buildings fall outside of zone AE. A separate application wil1 be submitted at a later date for proposed building within zone AE." So there's going to be more

MR. LOPATKA: There could be more for the new buildings, but zone $A E$ is basically the floodway. They're saying those two buildings are technically out of the floodway.

MR. FEBBO: They're up high.
ATTY. RINALDI: So the plans that they just submitted, they weren't doing away with the detention area. Right?

MR. LOPATKA: No.
ATTY. RINALDI: So they're stil1 going to build in the detention area. Right?

MR. FEBBO: They are.
ATTY. RINALDI: So is it building one and three that I'm looking at that they want approval for or is it something off that?

MR. SEMENZA: Building one and three.

MR. LOPATKA: No, one and three.
MR. SEMENZA: Then at a later date they're going to come back saying that they want four or five, whatever it may be at that point in time.

MR. LOPATKA: And we can look at those based off of the FEMA mapping at the time. The two buildings that they're looking for approval on now are outside of AE, and AE is what the floodway is.

MR. FEBBO: The other thing is with that creek down there, when it did flood, back when the bridge was there, it flooded Ciuccio's. Took the bridge out, now that backwater never came back that far, never will because the lowest part of the whole thing is down behind the baseball field, really. So everything runs down that way. It will never back up to Dunbar's property. Ciuccio's is a lot lower than his land is. Where Mariotti had the house in the back, there, that's lower than Dunbar's.

MR. SEMENZA: I don't know if it's
as low as you think it is. It might be lower, but it's not that much lower.

MR. FEBBO: When the bridge got washed out, that's why it got washed out. MR. SEMENZA: But where Mariotti built that house there, that's quite a bit above where that bridge is. I know where you're saying, but $I$ 'm trying to picture myself standing at that bridge and looking up towards Dunbar's and looking up towards Rosemount. They both go uphill from that point.

MR. FEBBO: The water would never back up that way.

MR. SEMENZA: I don't think it's going to go back either way.

MR. FEBBO: It's pushed down.
MR. SEMENZA: Anybody else on that?
Al1 right. Joe signed back on. We'11 go to Joe. Everybody has Joe's report in their packet. Anything to add?

MR. LENCESKI: No, I don't, Bob.
MR. SEMENZA: Anybody have any questions for Joe?

MR. FEBBO: I have a comment with

Joe and the DPW guys. They've been doing a heck of a job. Especially with the number of guys that you have and guys out. I'11 tell you what, it was dark out here and I seen them dumping leaves. They're all over town, they're working a lot of overtime. They're really kicking ass to keep up with everything. I have to commend them on the excellent job they're doing.

MS. AVVISATO: Absolutely. Good job.

MR. HOOVER: Joe, tell them about the new machine you got.

MR. LENCESKI: The Skidsteer loader?
MR. HOOVER: No, the mulcher.
MR. LENCESKI: The brush hog came in this past week and it's incredible. We ran it at the yard. It's basically like a weed whacker on steroids.

MR. SEMENZA: Anything else?
MR. LENCESKI: No.
MR. SEMENZA: Anybody have anything else for Joe? Thank you, Joe. Okay, at this time the chair is going to go to new business.
