MR. SEMENZA: Anybody have any questions for Paul?

MR. LETTIERI: Paul, West Grace Street, 315, there's three dogs. I guess new tenants moved into the neighborhood. They're unchained. They're attacking mailmen, Amazon, UPS people. It's a little out of hand. People are afraid to walk by the house or deliver mail. So I don't know if there's anything -- if you can stop by with a letter or something

MR. PAPI: Yeah, I'11 take care of that tomorrow.

MR. LETTIERI: 315.
MR. PAPI: I got it.
MR. SEMENZA: Pau1, the old Ray's supermarket, $I$ have pictures $I$ can show yhou
after the meeting, but a lot of garbage in the parking lot. TVs are dumped there.

Could you contact Ray Petty and ask him to clean that up? I was on my mom's porch and I could see two black things down there. When I went to the parking lot there's two big flat screen TVs.

Another thing -- and I spoke with the chief about this. But we had talked about blocking that parking lot off at one time. They did block it off with some rope at one time. There's always stuff - -tractor-trailers are parking in there, kids playing. At night it's a dead zone. You can't see anything. There's no reason why people have to access that area with that supermarket being closed.

Chief, did you talk to anybody about the easements?

CHIEF DUBERNAS: I didn't get an answer back from my father-in-1aw.

MR. SEMENZA: There are some
driveways that back out into that parking lot. I would think that wouldn't have an easement. Basically you can use the parking
lot to access your back yard. I mean, does council agree that we should have that blocked off there?

MS. BARTOLETTI: They were told and they did have it blocked off for a while. Eventually it went away and the owners did not block it off again.

MR. LETTIERI: Well, they're liable, correct, Mare, if anything happens?

MS. BARTOLETTI: Yes.
MR. FEBBO: Like Bobby said, it's getting to be a trash zone and a hangout. The only way you can block it off is with concrete barriers.

MR. SEMENZA: That's all. Bill, could they be forced into blocking that off with concrete barriers, since that is all vacant building?

ATTY. RINALDI: Well, it's their private property. So maybe you want to tell them that people are, what, short cutting through it?

MR. SEMENZA: Short cutting through it, there's garbage being dumped there. It's a mess.

ATTY. RINALDI: Send the a letter.
MR. SEMENZA: Tractor-trailers are pulling in there, parking.

MR. FEBBO: Kids on quads.
CHIEF DUBERNAS: We even had a couple of repo people staging cars there.

MR. TAGLIATERRA: Just remember, if you block the parking lot off we're not getting in there if something happens.

MR. FEBBO: Leave an opening with a chain or a gate.

ATTY. RINALDI: Even if they post it no trespassing, then the chief can take action.

MR. SEMENZA: I understand what you're saying but it's not helping. I could remember Justin Furey, he lives on the corner of Lawrence and Grace Street, and he was having trouble and people were getting nasty with him and it was causing problems. He came to one meeting a year ago or so. That's why we wanted to stop the issue there.

ATTY. RINALDI: Chief, if they post it can your parole people go down there?

CHIEF DUBERNAS: We've been throwing them out of there all along. We've been getting complaints. The neighbor across the street calls all the time. That's how we found out a repo guy was stashing cars there. No plates or nothing on them.

MR. SEMENZA: Even if they blocked two of the three ingresses. As long as there's, 1 ike you said, one way for you guys to get in there if need be or some kind of personne1. But there's no reason why you have to take that shortcut.

MR. TAGLIATERRA: There's no plans on the board on anybody that's doing anything with that building?

MR. SEMENZA: I haven't heard anything yet.

MR. NOTARI: Can we ask them to at least rope off the one entrance on Lawrence and then the other entrance on George?

MR. SEMENZA: Paul, will you reach out to him? Tell him council has concerns about what's going on there, the garbage being dumped, and we'd 1 ike maybe for you to secure it somehow.

MR. PAPI: Secure it, clean it up.
MR. SEMENZA: Emergency personnel might have to access, God forbid, a fire or whatever.

ATTY. RINALDI: Make sure they post it no trespassing so the chief can keep --

CHIEF DUBERNAS: He just told me they do have an easement there because there used to be an alleyway there.

MR. SEMENZA: Then if they leave one opening to get vehicles in and out. Anybody have anything for Paul?

MR. NOTARI: Paul, corner of Vine and Main Street, the house next to the old Pecuch building. Weeds and grass really high. It's unsightly. Just take a look.

MR. SEMENZA: Anybody else?
MR. HOOVER: Paul, 625 Oak Street, that garage, Oak and Albion, there's a pile of tires in the back of this building and there's varmints hanging around those tires. Albion and Oak. The old Frank's

Transmission. Huge pile of tires in the back of this building.

If the chief could check some of
those cars there. There's no inspection stickers, no nothing, on the side of the -on Albion street.

The water company just paved Taroli Street, and Eddie Orsleck called me today -sent me an e-mail about water laying in front of his house. I asked Marylynn today. Did we ever have a problem there with water laying in front of his house? He said it cost him $\$ 3,000$ to redo his driveway and he didn't have any water going in there. It kind of did away with it. The borough did something for him.

Now, when the water company paved the road --

MR. SEMENZA: As long as I'm here I don't remember --

MR. HOOVER: He showed me today.
MR. PAPI: He came to the borough building before.

MR. HOOVER: He showed me. He ran the hose and the water does just lay in front of his house. He said it didn't before.

MR. SEMENZA: Were you the zoning
officer then, Paul?
MR. PAPI: It was a long time ago.
I might have been doing both jobs.
MR. SEMENZA: I don't remember him coming.

MR. PAPI: I don't remember us doing any work there. I know he came to us, and the problem was his building is too low. Too close to the height of the street. He did do some work there and we haven't heard from him since.

MR. HOOVER: Now he's getting water back. I called them today. They're going to look at it. Maybe we should have the -MR. PAPI: He came up to the borough building after one of the local monsoons.

MR. LOPATKA: We looked at it today. It looks like it's kind of where the low point of the road is. If they milled and overlay all they did was take an inch and a half off and put an inch and a half back. MR. HOOVER: He's not going to go away.

MR. SEMENZA: Is there a remedy for

MR. LOPATKA: Not with paving. I was there with Joe today. Looking at it, there's pitch from both directions. It kind of ends right there.

MR. SEMENZA: It pitches right to him?

MR. LOPATKA: The only fix $I$ could see would be to put an inlet or two in. Down the road -- there is an inlet about 200 feet down the road, but it's on the opposite side of the street.

MR. SEMENZA: Is that a storm or is that a sewer?

MR. LOPATKA: That one, I think, is storm. I think that's the one that goes down and dumps into the Lackawanna down behind Mariotti's.

MR. SEMENZA: Is there two 1ines there, storm and sewer?

MR. NOTARI: There's two drains there within -- because I looked the other day. Two storm drains within a hundred feet of each other.

MR. LOPATKA: Yeah. The closest one to that 1 ow spot is probably 150,200 feet
down the road.
MR. SEMENZA: If it's a combined system we can't do that.

MR. FEBBO: Didn't that system end at the top of the hill, at the corner, and go down the other way?

MR. SEMENZA: I don't know.
MR. FEBBO: Moniak's house.
MR. SEMENZA: It definitely doesn't go right. It goes left. I know it goes 1eft.

MR. PAPI: Storm water goes 1eft.
MR. SEMENZA: I don't know if there's anything on Taroli, at the bottom. That goes right by Jeffers' house.

MR. PAPI: There is a storm drain on Taroli in front of Mike Zupon's house.

MR. SEMENZA: John. Is that just storm?

MR. PAPI: Yeah, as far as $I$ know.
MR. SEMENZA: How do we find that out?

MR. LOPATKA: We can check it. It would be pretty obvious.

MR. PAPI: In my opinion there's a
big sewer drain in that so-called alleyway off of Morton Street, and I think that storm drain between Zupon and Fumanti goes between the properties and taps into the sewer. It goes right through Morton Street. There is a lot of flow in that.

MR. SEMENZA: That's the one we had issues with. Right?

MR. PAPI: Yes. We fixed a 1 arge section of it.

MR. SEMENZA: Anybody else have anything for Paul? That's it?

Joe, DPW/street commissioner's
report. Everybody has Joe's report in their packet. Joe, anything to add?

MR. LENCESKI: Not to the report.
MR. SEMENZA: Anybody have any questions on Joe's report? No? Okay.

MR. LENCESKI: I'd 1 ike to add that Pat Stassi notified me, 225 Moosic Road, and he spoke with a representative from PennDOT, and she said that if we called her she'd explain the situation. What Mr. Stassi wants is to eliminate that crosswalk.

MR. SEMENZA: Is it write in front
of his building there?
MR. LENCESKI: In front of his
house.
MR. HOOVER: Talking about that handicap one we just put in?

MR. SEMENZA: He wants just the lines off the road?

MR. LENCESKI: I have a number for Trish at PennDOT. She said we can call her right now and she'd explain the situation. She said before they closed out the job that they already went there and looked at the job, their engineers or what not, and if it was okayed by council and the borough manager they would go ahead --

MR. SEMENZA: Come up here with your phone.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: She wants us to call her now?

MR. NOTARI: Should we do this now or in executive?

MR. LENCESKI: It's a low-lying
area. It's covered with dirt. Before they close this out they will eliminate it with no cost to the borough. They' 11 put the
correct signage up. If council is okay with it they will actually eliminate it.

MR. SEMENZA: I don't have an issue with it. It's the resident that it's in front of.

MR. NOTARI: It's not his property.
Correct?
MR. SEMENZA: Right.
MR. HOOVER: There's one across the street.

MR. SEMENZA: You're going to have to eliminate the other one across the street also.

MR. LENCESKI: No.
MR. HOOVER: We only did the one in front of Stassi's house.

ATTY. RINALDI: How does a handicapped person come across the street, is the question. Do they have to go the other way and around?

MS. BARTOLETTI: I believe Mrs. Prisky could answer that better than I could.

MR. NOTARI: You have to go to one of the corners. It's in the middle of the
street. Who is going to come and fix the curb, PennDOT?

MR. LENCESKI: Yes. It will match the existing sidewalk.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Joe, I'd have to see it to get an exact vision of it. Would we be 1 imiting any handicapped person trying to cross the road? They'd just have to go down a little further? Up a little further?

MR. LENCESKI: Mrs. Prisky said they did a study and they're okay with it.

MR. SEMENZA: Was there a handicap spot there beforehand?

MR. LENCESKI: No.
MR. NOTARI: It was a flat curb.
MR. SEMENZA: Then $I$ don't have an issue with it.

MR. HOOVER: It was an additional one they made me put in.

MR. NOTARI: I don't need any explanation, but there are those all over town now. Is everybody going to come back now and not want that in front of their home?

MR. LENCESKI: The only opportunity Mr. Stassi has to have it changed is before they close out the job.

MR. FEBBO: It's an unusual circumstance because there's not another corner on that corner.

MR. HOOVER: It's at Moosic and Maxson Drive.

MR. FEBBO: You cross the street, most of our intersections --

MR. NOTARI: There's no corner there.

MR. PAPI: In a heavy rain it drops all the dirt there. That's why he's complaining.

MR. HOOVER: I don't have a problem having them move it. If someone comes down in a wheelchair and they have to go across the street they're going to have to go to either Race or cross up at First.

ATTY. RINALDI: Why did they make you put one there?

MR. HOOVER: There's one across the street.

MR. SEMENZA: All right. Anything
else?
MR. LENCESKI: No.
MR. NOTARI: So are we going to tell
them to go ahead and do it?
MR. SEMENZA: Bring a motion to the floor. Do we need to make a motion?

ATTY. RINALDI: Yes, I guess so.
MR. SEMENZA: The chair is going to entertain a motion for 225 Moosic Road to allow the state to eliminate the handicap accessible curb, pedestrian traffic crosswalk.

MR. HOOVER: I'11 make that motion.
MR. SEMENZA: By Councilman Hoover.
MS. AVVISATO: I'11 second it.
MR. SEMENZA: Seconded by
Councilwoman Avvisato. On the question? Public input? Roll call, please.

MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilwoman
Avvisato?
MS. AVVISATO: Yes.
MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Febbo?
MR. FEBBO: Yes.
MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Hoover?
MR. HOOVER: Yes.

MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman

MR. SEMENZA: Anybody have anything for Joe? Joe, it's coming to the season. Are our plows and everything ready to go?

MR. LENCESKI: When we took them off prior to putting them in the ambulance building we greased everything and did all the maintenance that we needed to. Monday we just took them out of the ambulance building and brought them back to DPW. We're ready to roll.

MR. SEMENZA: Dave, engineer's
report. Everybody has Dave's report in the packet. Dave, have anything to add?

MR. LOPATKA: I do not.
MR. SEMENZA: Anybody have any
questions for Dave?
MR. HOOVER: On Fallon Street, obviously they're putting a water main in there. They have to do the servicing yet. DeAndriole, on the corner of Hayes, he asked me about the crown in the road. That one block the crown in the road is pretty high. He was wondering if we can get rid of the crown in the road. Now, again, the water company would only mill and overlay the whole road. It's going to be the same. He wants to know if we can just mill the middle of the road down a little bit more. The crown is pretty high. You'll see when you drive up it. Take a peek, let me know. It's from Alicia to East Mary.

MR. NOTARI: Make sure it doesn't affect the water runoff.

MR. SEMENZA: Anything else?
MR. HOOVER: No.
MR. SEMENZA: Anybody else for Dave?
MR. FEBBO: How about an update on the ambulance building.

MR. LOPATKA: I stopped there today with Joe. It's all dug out and they are
going to pour it, $I$ think, next Monday or Tuesday. Two pours. One inside and one outside.

MR. SEMENZA: Who is the contractor pouring?

MR. LENCESKI: PK Masonry.
MR. SEMENZA: Earthworks did the excavation. Who is doing the heating?

MS. BARTOLETTI: Bobby Gig1io.
MR. SEMENZA: Electrical?
MS. BARTOLETTI: No.
MR. SEMENZA: Who is doing the door?
MS. BARTOLETTI: The door company that was the original.

MR. FEBBO: That will be ready when?
MR. LOPATKA: It will be poured -by Tuesday they'11 be done pouring, so it should be ready a couple days afterwards.

MR. SEMENZA: Typically we want to wait a little bit to put a truck like that on there.

MR. LOPATKA: At 1 east a week.
MR. SEMENZA: You guys obvious 1 y know what's going on there, so everything's good with that?

MR. LOPATKA: Yes.
MR. SEMENZA: When will we be ready for them to move their stuff into there?

MR. NOTARI: October 5th.
MS. BARTOLETTI: I have it all here. What we were planning is October 2nd is going to be the final day working in the regular part of the borough building. So the following Monday, the 5 th, they're going to be able to seal off the building and start doing the demolition. That gives us a little bit more time for the fire truck to stay where it is.

MR. LOPATKA: At 1 east another week, week and a half.

MR. NOTARI: Not until the 12th or the 15th?

MR. LOPATKA: Somewhere in there.
MR. SEMENZA: I know it's a temporary thing, but are we going to -- is inspection on this project going on -- I know it's a small concrete pour, but $I$ want to make sure it's six inches.

MR. LOPATKA: I met Joe down there today. We looked at what's dug out. We'11
put mesh in, six inches. I think they have to final grade it and form it. We took measurements today, too. We're going to leave -- I believe it's 11'11" from the top of the door to the floor. The truck we measured at 11'6".

MR. HOOVER: Everything for Gary is set?

MS. BARTOLETTI: Gary is moving into Saint Lawrence's Church basement. DPW is ready to go. They moved all his stuff out.

MR. FEBBO: I think we're all happy to see that. We made a lot of progress with Joe, Dave, and even PK and Earthworks and Giglio, and Marylynn coordinating the whole thing. Last month at this time we didn't know where we were going. As we sit here tonight it seems like we've answered a lot of problems. Even Gary going down to the church. We did a great job of getting things together, moving forward. It's only been five and a half years.

MR. SEMENZA: Anybody else for Dave? Thanks, Dave.

Chief. Everybody has his report.

Chief, anything to add?
CHIEF DUBERNAS: This Saturday
Marion Street Park -- it was on our Facebook page. We passed out flyers to all the preschools both in Old Forge and Moosic. A lot of kids in Old Forge go to the Itsy-Bitsy in Moosic. They're doing a car seat check at the Marion Street park from 9 until 1 this Saturday. It's part of the Buckle Up grant we received for the last three weeks. That's it. Just the Matt Brown thing.

MR. SEMENZA: Anybody have any questions for Chief Dubernas? Chief, I have one request to do a traffic study. I had a resident that lives in the vicinity of Church, Vine and Maple. They asked for a stop sign. I said I could ask the chief to do a traffic study there and see if it's worthy of one. So see where you can put one there, if you could. If you can't, it is what it is.

CHIEF DUBERNAS: Also, I got with Joe about the softball tournament this weekend, Saturday and Sunday. There's going
to be a cop there all day long for both days.

MR. SEMENZA: Thank you. I've been seeing officers at the park having their presence shown. Sometimes they get called out on a call and they have to go. But for the most part $I$ saw officers there. I got the schedule.

CHIEF DUBERNAS: Do you know if the parks are going to go into October?

MR. SEMENZA: I believe early October. I'11 get you the definite. It depends on how far the little league makes it in their playoffs.

MS. BARTOLETTI: We usually keep them open until just before Halloween.

MR. SEMENZA: Anybody have anything else for the chief? Chief, thank you.

Bil1, solicitor's report. Everybody has Bill's report. Bill, anything to add?

ATTY. RINALDI: Because the bank did not get the commitment letter to me as quick and they still owe me a note, maybe what we'11 do is advertise for a special meeting before the work session for the ordinance.

Otherwise, the only other additions I have are a lease termination for the Old Forge Hose \& Engine Company and a new lease for the Old Forge Hose \& Engine Company for the ambulance building.

MR. SEMENZA: Chief, are you guys aware of both of them changes?

ATTY. RINALDI: We can sign them, give them to them. It's pretty much straightforward. It's a dollar for six months. If it needs to go another month or two it's not an issue. Rent free. We pay everything. We're terminating the old one. We'11 get it approved here and get it to you guys.

MR. NOTARI: Bill, in your report you have the letter regarding garbage collection. Do we need to approve that tonight?

ATTY. RINALDI: It's up to
everybody. I just drafted it and put it in there. It hasn't been sent yet. Just for everybody's input.

MR. PAPI: Our ordinance, actually it contradicts itself, and I got a new
ordinance from Duryea which I think is much better than ours. Unfortunately, I forgot to bring it tonight.

MR. NOTARI: How does ours contradict?

MR. PAPI: It says one thing and then it says another. You have to read it.

ATTY. RINALDI: People can contract. It just cost them more money. That's why I put that in the letter.

MR. PAPI: They're the only ones in the whole area that do this. They license their solid waste garbage haulers.

MR. NOTARI: That's what we're supposed to do.

MR. PAPI: They charge a hundred dollars a year.

MR. SEMENZA: It's a thing in their window.

MR. PAPI: Then they just fill out a form, hand it in to the borough, give them a thousand dollars and they're good for a year.

MR. SEMENZA: We visited many avenues for garbage pick up. Right,

Marylynn? Didn't it seem like it was the best fit for the borough?

MS. BARTOLETTI: Yes.
MR. SEMENZA: Whether some residents don't like it or not. We start being open on Monday nights for residents to go to the borough building to pick up stickers. We now have online sales for stickers you can get mailed to your house. So, I mean, we can talk, but if anybody has any better ideas.

ATTY. RINALDI: The only thing you might want to do tonight is you do not have a fee for your garbage licenses that I found.

MR. PAPI: Duryea charges a hundred.
ATTY. RINALDI: It should go along with how long it take Paul to check out the information on the application.

MR. SEMENZA: Fees for what, a contractor to come in?

ATTY. RINALDI: No, the fee for the garbage hauler's license.

MR. SEMENZA: So you're saying for any other contractor to be picking up
garbage in the borough?
ATTY. RINALDI: They're all supposed to have a 1 icense with the borough.

MR. SEMENZA: Wouldn't that just fall under a contractor's 1 icense?

ATTY. RINALDI: No, you have a separate 1 icense for garbage haulers.

MR. NOTARI: For commercial garbage haulers.

MR. SEMENZA: What is the permit for, 1 ike, if $I$ was a contractor to build homes? What is my yearly --

MR. PAPI: A hundred dollars for a new home.

MR. SEMENZA: No, I'm saying I'm a contractor and $I$ build homes in the borough of 01 d Forge. I have to have a license to do that. What's that cost?

MR. PAPI: One hundred dollars.
MR. SEMENZA: That should be the same for any other kind of garbage hauler or dog catcher, whatever.

MR. PAPI: That's what Duryea charges, $\$ 100$ garbage hauler fee.

MR. HOOVER: Is it the same for
utility contractor?
MR. SEMENZA: It can be the same for everybody.

MR. PAPI: Meaning what?
MR. HOOVER: A contractor instaliing gas mains. If a contractor wants to come in and install a gas main on a block.

MR. SEMENZA: Say you install gas mains, 1 ike TSE. They have to have a contractor's license to work in the borough of 01d Forge. Correct?

MR. PAPI: No.
MR. SEMENZA: Why not?
MR. PAPI: I don't know. We never did that.

MR. SEMENZA: Shouldn't every contractor that works in the borough of 01d Forge have a contract?

MR. PAPI: We never charged a contractor a license fee for garbage hauling before. Never.

MR. SEMENZA: If you guys want to bring some ideas to the table with that.

But $I$ think anybody that does work in the borough --

MR. NOTARI: I'd like to see the copy of the ordinance that Paul got from Duryea because I don't really think there's anything wrong with the garbage collection ordinance that we have now. I'm willing to read what Paul has.

MR. SEMENZA: Pau1, could you have Marylynn e-mail all of us that ordinance.

MR. HOOVER: I believe Marylyn asked to have a meeting about this, about al the fees.

ATTY. RINALDI: Before you send a 1etter 1et's figure out what the fee is.

MR. HOOVER: We have to get a meeting with Geoscience, too.

MR. SEMENZA: Anything else?
MR. NOTARI: No.
MR. SEMENZA: Anything else for Bi11? Thanks, Bil1. Bil1, do you have anything else?

ATTY. RINALDI: No, just the fee issue.

MR. SEMENZA: Marylynn?
MS. BARTOLETTI: Okay. First, do we have any other questions on anything going
on with the ambulance? I think we covered all that.

The borough building, we just have to sign the contract. Bobby, maybe we'll do that later or tomorrow. I told you October 2nd is the day we're going to close it off.

Tonight, on the agenda we're going to purchase a Case loader for the DPW, and we're also going to purchase an attachment that goes along with it. The total cost is $\$ 65,782.75$. It's in the budget, but we're going to pass it tonight as a formality so it's on the books.

Do any of you have any questions on any of my financial reports?

One more thing we have to discuss tonight are the 2021 minimum municipal obligations. First one is for the police pension, and that one is $\$ 21,084$.

The second one is for the 01d Forge Borough administrative pension plan for $\$ 14,0398$. It was on the agenda.

And I just have a couple things for executive session.

MR. PAPI: I did talk to Sandy last
week. I think she was supposed to e-mail that to you guys. I had given her a copy of the ordinance.

MR. SEMENZA: I didn't see it in there.

MR. PAPI: Either way, I'11 get it to you tomorrow.

MR. SEMENZA: Anything else, Marylynn?

MS. BARTOLETTI: No.
MR. SEMENZA: Anybody have any questions for Marylynn?

MR. NOTARI: Marylynn, have we started the process on transferring the land at the pit to the school?

MS. BARTOLETTI: No. I thought that was not going to happen. That's what I thought the 1 ast words were, that they were no longer interested.

MR. SEMENZA: I thought the same thing.

MS. BARTOLETTI: Shortly after they said yes, then I got another e-mail saying they were no longer interested.

MR. NOTARI: From Doctor Keating?

MS. BARTOLETTI: Yes. Mare, are we going to schedule a finance meeting soon?

MS. BARTOLETTI: Definitely.
MR. NOTARI: Get started on the budget. It's that time. Right?

MS. BARTOLETTI: Absolutely. I'd like to wait until after the move. Maybe the second week in October, somewhere around there.

MR. SEMENZA: Have you heard anything from the police union, Marylyn?

MS. BARTOLETTI: No.
MR. SEMENZA: Their contract is up in --

MS. BARTOLETTI: December 31st.

MR. SEMENZA: Anybody have anything for Marylynn? At this time the chair is going to go to public comment. AJ?

MR. LEVAN: I'm just looking for an update on, in July, the water runoff from Smith Street into my yard.

MR. SEMENZA: We spoke about this 1ast meeting?

MS. BARTOLETTI: You should probably talk to Dave and Joe.

MR. LOPATKA: Me and Paul met out there. I'm waiting for a quote from a contractor to do a fix.

MR. SEMENZA: We did speak about it at our last meeting. We sent our engineer out there.

MR. LEVAN: I was there when he came.

MR. SEMENZA: Okay. So we're in the process now of waiting.

MR. HOOVER: What are we doing there?

MR. LOPATKA: When they paved it the water kind of comes down into the one corner. It kind of jumps that little area. I think we'll have to cut some of the edge of the road out and back into that driveway. I mean, we have to talk to the neighbor, I guess, about what has to happen there. But we're going to have to build that up around the corner so the water funnels its way out and into the road.

MR. LEVAN: I went and bought cold patch and built up my own dam, and the water just either goes over it or around it. It
pours into my yard.
MR. SEMENZA: When do you think you'11 have an answer on that?

MR. LOPATKA: I should have it this week. I'11 call him again.

MR. SEMENZA: AJ, Dave will be in touch with you. Thank you.

MS. PARTAGAS: We're planning a block party Saturday, September 26th. A small block party. It's mostly in our yards, but we're hoping to get permission to block off a portion of Reilly Street from the corner of McClure. It's only to the alley headed towards Sibley. The on1y two houses that are there with driveways are ours. We're neighbors across the street. The block party is going to take place primarily in our yards, but we just want to have the street blocked so it's safe for kids to go back and forth.

MR. SEMENZA: What kind of time frame are you looking for?

MS. GIGUERE: One to eight.
MR. SEMENZA: Right now I'm going to ask the fire chief do you guys see any issue
with that? I just want emergency personnel to be aware of it.

MR. TAGLIATERRA: No.
MR. SEMENZA: As long as everybody's aware of the blocking.

CHIEF DUBERNAS: We have to block it off at Sibley because $I$ can't block it off at that alley.

MS. PARTAGAS: We are both on the corner of McClure.

MR. FEBBO: How many people?
MS. PARTAGAS: About 25.
MS. GIGUERE: It will be our first time doing it.

MR. SEMENZA: I'm going to put this to a motion on the floor on September 26th, 1 p.m. to 8 p.m. to close the road down on Reilly, from McClure to the alley, north side. Chief, you guys will take care of that closure?

CHIEF DUBERNAS: I'll ask Joe to get the signs.

MR. NOTARI: I'11 make that motion.
MR. SEMENZA: By Councilman Notari.
MR. LETTIERI: I second.

MR. SEMENZA: Seconded by Councilman Lettieri. On the question? Public input? Roll call, please.

MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilwoman

MR. HALUSKA: John Haluska, 599 Milwaukee, Old Forge. The Hometown Hero program has been a success, as you're all aware, and my reason tonight is twofold. It's to thank the borough, DPW, Marylynn, the mayor, police department for all your
cooperation in getting these banners up as they come down from natural causes, weather-related wind storms, whatever.

The second reason is we lost our communications with the tri-borough. So the program is still going on. We're not openly canvassing for new applications, but any veteran or family member with a veteran is still eligible to put them up. I think we put up probably a dozen this year. Again, I want to thank the borough for your cooperation.

My primary reason for coming is to -- I think the borough should thank Rick Melucci. He goes above and beyond his time. He's a contractor, he's still working. Rick is out there with his truck fixing the banners as they're hit, and I think the borough should give him an acknowledgment. Maybe a plaque or something, would be a suggestion on my part. He's a true veteran in every sense. I don't use the word hero a lot. It's overused in the military. But in my respect the guy is an everyday hero. When he sees a banner down he's there. We
lost, I think, two or three. We replaced them at no cost to the owners, the sponsors.

The program is ongoing, it's very successful, and a lot of people said well, after three years we thought the program was going to end. It's not going to end, as far as $I$ can tell. There's still interest in it. As long as I have people that are interested we'll continue it.

But Rick and I have been the primary along with John O'Hearn and Leo McLane and Marylynn. We're the five nucleus that are going this keep with the borough's support. I just want to thank you people for your support. It's an ongoing program, and I think Rick should get something from the borough.

MR. SEMENZA: I'd like to let the record show that I thank all you guys for doing what you do, and I thank you for your service to this country also. I think it's a wonderful thing, the Hometown Heros. I think the town needed something like that. I just want to be on the record saying thank you and Rick Melucci and everybody involved.

MS. BARTOLETTI: John, I'd just like to let you know we still have a waiting list at the borough. Anybody who calls, we've been putting them on a list. So we can probably do an order soon.

MR. SEMENZA: Anything else? Thank you very much.

ATTY. SOLFANELLI: I was here 1ast month. I know we had voted on a request $I$ submitted -- I'm David Solfane11i. I'm here on behalf of Summit Tower, LLC. We submitted a general application for rezoning of several parcels off Marion Street, and last month they were both -- it was brought up to forward the application to the planning commission of the county and the borough for review per the zoning code and, as a prerequisite, the borough hearing and deciding on the request itself. I think there had been some confusion about the procedure, whether that was the vote on the zoning request. I think we got a little mudd1ed.

So $I$ sent everybody an e-mail
yesterday. Basically I'm asking that my
client have an opportunity to go through the process and be heard and questioned on the merits. I know some people have concerns about the proposed project. We'd like the opportunity to be asked those questions and have them answered for you in a public hearing.

To clarify, the vote that I'm asking to resubmit -- of course, planning is part of the process -- it is not a determination on the question and it will come back here to you for a hearing to vote before any zoning change is made.

So, based on that I ask that you accept my application once more and forward it to planning.

MR. SEMENZA: Anybody have any questions for Mr. Solfanelli? No questions? Well, at this time the chair will put a motion to the floor to resubmit the application for zoning for Summit Towers.

MR. NOTARI: I'11 make that motion.
MR. SEMENZA: By Councilman Notari. Second?

MR. LETTIERI: I'11 second it.

MR. SEMENZA: Seconded by Counci1man Lettieri. On the question? Public input? Rol1 cal1, please.

MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilwoman

MR. NOTARI: Are we closing the alley from Oak to Sussex Street? Is that the plan?

MR. SEMENZA: No, right to here.
MR. COYNE: He did say that perhaps it is better to close it from Oak because if someone does turn in. But $I$ think we had it planned to put up the barriers right there on Oak so no one turns in and then has to back out.

MR. SEMENZA: I'm worrying about somebody coming down the alley. Your back parking lot probably will be filled that day. I'm just worried about someone accessing that alley, coming all the way down. How many people access that alley from the back?

CHIEF DUBERNAS: Both access points.
MR. SEMENZA: The side alley.
MR. COYNE: The side alley will be open.

MR. SEMENZA: If we close it at Sussex and somebody comes down this alley, Chris, your parking lot will be jammed.

CHIEF DUBERNAS: We can put a
barrier right there.
MR. SEMENZA: Are there a lot of people that access that alley through their back yards?

CHIEF DUBERNAS: We can put the barrier right by the dumpster.

MR. SEMENZA: That was my only concern. You think the best way --

CHIEF DUBERNAS: You don't want somebody to come off Oak Street and get stuck and trying to back out.

MR. NOTARI: What about Sussex Street?

CHIEF DUBERNAS: It's getting blocked at Sussex, too.

MR. COYNE: The blue 1 ine is referencing construction fencing.

MR. SEMENZA: Sussex Street to Oak.
MR. NOTARI: Which is what we should be doing.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: You own that dirt parking lot where the dumpster is?

MR. COYNE: Yes.

is a motion to terminate one of our DPW workers, Garrett Gleason. Garrett Gleason has not fulfilled his obligation after he was hired. He was hired under the stipulation that he receive a commercial driver's license within six months of hiring. Garrett Gleason was hired four years ago, almost to the date. Up until this date he's still not received his 1icense. It is my duty as a councilman to follow the rules here, and it's a hard decision $I$ have to make but $I$ have to put this motion to the floor.

MR. HOOVER: I'11 make that motion.
MR. SEMENZA: By Councilman Hoover.
MR. NOTARI: I'11 second it.
MR. SEMENZA: Seconded by Councilman Notari. On the question? Public input?

Roll call, please.
MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilwoman
Avvisato?
MS. AVVISATO: Yes.
MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Febbo?
MR. FEBBO: Abstain.
MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Hoover?
MR. HOOVER: Yes.
MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman
Lettieri?
MR. LETTIERI: Abstain.
MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Notari?
MR. NOTARI: Before I vote, I'd like to know the reason for abstention. I believe we need -- by both councilmen. We need a reason.

MR. LETTIERI: My reason for abstention is because this was going on before I was elected into the council. To my understanding it was granted to him, more time, from council. So I basically don't know all the details on everything that's been going on since he was with the DPW. That's why I'm abstaining.

MR. FEBBO: My reason is that,
again, I agree with everything that you guys said time-wise. I think we're all guilty of overlooking it the last couple years because it did slip by us. He did have enough time to get it.

But that being said, with this virus and so on, we gave him time to get it and he made every effort to make an attempt to get it. At our last meeting we decided to suspend him whereby we took out his ability to get the test because he doesn't have a vehicle. The only vehicle that he would have access to is the packmaster, which he studied on and is what he would have to fill in on.

So that being said, he could not use that because of insurance purposes.

Therefore, he could not take the test. I think that anytime you need to take a test for anything you have to have a tool. If you don't have the tool you can't take the test.

Therefore, I abstain on that. But if you want a vote on that I'll vote that I'm not in favor of firing him.

MR. NOTARI: I appreciate that. Before $I$ vote I'm just going to say that, along with Councilman Semenza, this is not an easy thing to do. I really don't want to do it. However, the gentleman has been given enough time. He's been given four years to do something that he was supposed to do in six months. So I'm voting yes.

MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Rinaldi?
MR. RUSSEL RINALDI: I'm also voting yes, but I'm going to express why. And not to make any argument with Councilman Febbo, but council never overlooked it. We actually gave him more than enough time. We kept pretty close watch to it. We helped him and assisted him as much as we could. We can't allow him to use one of our vehicles. We never allowed any of our DPW employees to use it to take a test. They either all came into the job with one or they went and got one afterwards, whether they borrowed one, rented one or however they obtained it. They never used ours.

Again, it's a tough decision to make, but we have -- it's in our code and
it's in our rules for hiring. All the other DPW workers have it, all the other ones obtained it. I believe we've been more than fair with him, and definitely in a lengthy, lengthy period of time we've give him the chance to get it. With that, I vote yes.

MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Semenza? MR. SEMENZA: Garrett Gleason was hired on September 27,2016 . The kid's a good worker, a hard worker. He doesn't want to lose his job, and I'm sure every member of council does not want him to lose his job either. But for four years, 1 ike $I$ said, he turned his head on a hiring stipulation that we enacted in this borough. When the DPW men are hired, the hiring goes pass a physical, pass a drug test, and obtain a CDL license within six months of hiring. We have given extensions out, yes, but not four years. An extra six months and people went on. I feet bad about this. I really do. But, like I said, my duty as a councilman is to follow our protocol, and $I$ vote yes.

MR. FEBBO: I don't disagree with any of you gentlemen on your votes. Maybe I
do take this personal. I am the head of the DPW and I spend time down there getting to know everybody. I do know Garrett
personally, as you well know, and his dad and everything else. I do know him to be a real good worker. We're not questioning that ability of him.

But that being said, it does not mean he should not follow the rules and regulations. And again, maybe I'm looking at it from a little personal standpoint of view. He's an excellent worker. Good kid, smart kid. Gives the heads up on what needs to be done down there and so on.

But again, $I$ 'm looking at it from a point of view that he's a good worker, and you guys are looking at it from the standpoint of view of what is written, our codes and so on, and I respect your decisions as long as you respect my opinion. That's al1.

MR. SEMENZA: Thank you. Okay. Is that it? Anything else?

ATTY. RINALDI: You have to approve
a lease termination agreement and approve
the lease for the ambulance building.
MR. SEMENZA: The chair is going to entertain a motion to approve a lease termination for Old Forge Hose \& Engine at the Old Forge Borough Building.

MR. HOOVER: I'11 make that motion.
MR. SEMENZA: Motion by Councilman Hoover.

MR. NOTARI: I'll second.
MR. SEMENZA: Seconded by Councilman Notari. On the question? Public input? Roll call, please.

MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilwoman
Avvisato?
MS. AVVISATO: Yes.
MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Febbo?
MR. FEBBO: Yes.
MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Hoover?
MR. HOOVER: Yes.
MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman
Lettieri?
MR. LETTIERI: Yes.
MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Notari?
MR. NOTARI: Yes.
MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Rinaldi?

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Yes.
MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Semenza?
MR. SEMENZA: Yes. The next motion is a motion to approve a new lease for six months starting October 1st, six months from that date, for 01d Forge Hose \& Engine, the ambulance building.

MR. NOTARI: I'11 make that motion.
MR. FEBBO: I'11 second it.
MR. SEMENZA: Motion by Councilman Notari, seconded by Councilman Febbo. On the question? Pickup input?

MR. HOOVER: Shouldn't we just make it longer? We're going to give it to them anyway. Make it for the year.

MR. SEMENZA: It's six months. If we have to extend it we can extend it.

ATTY. RINALDI: It can be extended month to month no problem.

MR. SEMENZA: Rol1 cal1, please.
MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilwoman Avvisato?

MS. AVVISATO: Yes.
MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Febbo?
MR. FEBBO: Yes.

MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Hoover?
MR. HOOVER: Yes.
MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman
Lettieri?
MR. LETTIERI: Yes.
MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Notari?
MR. NOTARI: Yes.
MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Rinaldi?
MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Yes.
MS. BARTOLETTI: Councilman Semenza?
MR. SEMENZA: Yes. That it? I'm going to have a brief executive after. I'11 go down the table. Mayor, do you have anything?

MAYOR LEGG: I have nothing.
MR. FEBBO: No.
MR. NOTARI: Last week I was up at McDade Park for a work thing, and the Alliance Landfill donated two rocks to the McDade Park that they are saying are 350 million years old. They're fossilized boulders. They said they found them in the Taylor-Ransom section. I asked if they found anything in the 01 d Forge section would they share with us, they said they
definitely would. So I'm just looking for permission to pursue that to either put in our parks or somewhere. It's pretty neat.

There's fossilized plants and trees into these rocks. That's it.

MR. SEMENZA: Councilman Lettieri?
MR. LETTIERI: No.
MS. AVVISATO: No, I'm good.
MR. HOOVER: I'm good.
MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: No.
MR. SEMENZA: I have one thing. After our last meeting me and Councilman Lettieri went over to Dooley's to get something to eat and there was Councilman Notari. So I was thinking you know what would be a nice idea for council, whoever else wants? After every meeting we should patronize one different restaurant after every meeting.

We're going to have a brief executive session afterward. At this time the chair is going to entertain a motion to adjourn.

MR. NOTARI: I'11 make that motion.
MR. SEMENZA: All in favor?

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
