The third will be our engineer's report, Dave Lopatka. We all have his report. Dave, anything to add or update us on?

MR. LOPATKA: No, other than the Main Street project is done, the sewer replacement.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: In front of Driscoll's?

MR. LOPATKA: Yes. That was paved last Thursday.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Everything went well? It's all finished?

MR. LOPATKA: Yes.

MR. HOOVER: Dave, I gave you that paving list. I sent everybody the paving list. As of today oil is \$68 a barrel. It's the most it's ever been. Very expensive. I recommend that we put paving off until January or February, put it out to bid when contractors are ready to start the new season. Maybe oil will be a little cheaper by then. Give you time to -- a lot of streets. There's 14 streets. Some are pretty big.

So we're going to have to make a decision on which ones to do out of the 13 or 14. Get that for us, Dave. Everybody has that list.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anyone else have any questions for Dave? Thanks, Dave. Chief Dubernas, police report, we have it. Anything to add?

CHIEF DUBERNAS: No.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anybody have any questions for the chief? Thanks, Chief.

Attorney Rinaldi, solicitor's report.

ATTY. RINALDI: Just for passage tonight you have a resolution authorizing the purchase of a police vehicle, and approve the stipulation for Zupko quiet title action.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Anyone have any questions for the solicitor? Thanks, Bill.

Borough manager's report,

Ms. Bartoletti is absent this evening. We
all have her report. If we have any
questions we can contact her tomorrow.

Before we go into new business we'll go to public comment, and we have Ann Monacelli.

MS. MONACELLI: I filled out an

application for which I thought was a handicap, and the street commissioner came down last week, I believe, maybe the week before, and he said he was going to give me two spots on my driveway that would say no parking to the driveway.

CHIEF DUBERNAS: That was me and Joe actually there.

MS. MONACELLI: He was there and Joe. That isn't going to do me any good because -- it will help me when I'm coming down Main Street and I have to back in my driveway and nobody stopping behind me. That will help me for that. Otherwise, nobody can park there. Right?

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: If it's a no parking? Correct.

MS. MONACELLI: Ever?

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Yes. Is that what you requested?

MS. MONACELLI: No. I want a handicap sign. That way when my family comes down for Sunday dinner, which I still have, there's someplace to park. My daughter-in-law is handicapped, my brother

walks with a cane, my sister-in-law walks with a walker. Well, okay, if I had those two spaces empty. My neighbor has two cars which would be behind that. That's four spaces. Then we got the guys going down with the canoes, and I live right near the river. First house on the right. Then when we have the fishermen. My family is going to walk from the bridge down to my house.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: So what seems to be the problem? You didn't want -- first you wanted no parking or you were misunderstood.

MS. MONACELLI: I misunderstood, which I thought I asked for a handicapped.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: So you have a problem with people parking by your driveway? You can't get out? You can't see?

MS. MONACELLI: Right, but having those no parking, that won't -- it will help me get in, but that's about it.

LISA MONACELLI: I need to show you what goes on. You cannot get in coming from Main Street. This is what we deal with.

Cars that don't move for days. This is what she's looking for, two spots right here.

CHIEF DUBERNAS: She's looking for one right where the pole is that separates the two driveways.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: No, one right after the driveway. One next to the lamp pole?

MS. AVVISATO: After the driveway.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Before the driveway.

MR. LETTIERI: Toward the car wash.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Before her house, where the lamp post is.

CHIEF DUBERNAS: That's where we were told they wanted no parking there.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: She misunderstood. She wanted a handicap spot.

CHIEF DUBERNAS: Maybe I can go there tomorrow and meet with them.

ATTY. RINALDI: I think it's a safety issue. They need some sort of access to the driveway.

MR. RUSSELL RINALDI: Can we send the chief down? Chief, go down tomorrow.

Let him see exactly what you're looking for.

The chief will do the traffic study. Once

the chief goes down he'll come back to us

and tell us what he needs.

Lou Pettinato?

MR. PETTINATO: I just want to thank
Chris for -- he gave me a call several days
ago, gave me an update on the nuisance
property. I just wanted to ask him where
things were for the other neighbors who
might not know.

MR. HART: Like I spoke at last meeting and everything, there was a couple zoning violations. The owners of the garage are aware as well. But the letter was sent to the property owner. Where it stands right now I can't tell you. I didn't get any response back from him. They have 30 days, we're only at 21. Once we hit 30 days I'll reach out. I have the information to reach out to the property owner and then we'll go from there.

MR. PETTINATO: I think you're talking about the junk cars that have to go and cars parked up again Connie and George's

property.

MR. HART: That was all with the police.

MR. PETTINATO: I want to just bring up something you can look at, too. There's a number of either quad batteries or car batteries out in the heat right next to where people would walk. If they can get that cleaned up.

MR. HART: That was one day.

MR. PETTINATO: I have a picture from August 9th and August 12th.

MR. HART: I have a picture of one time. DEP actually contacted me. I contacted the owners of the garage, and they were in the process of --

MR. PETTINATO: There's still some out tonight.

MR. HART: I'll look at it.

MR. RUSSEL RINALDI: We'll send him back up.

MR. PETTINATO: And I want them to know nobody decided to pick on the former owner, nobody decided to pick on the kids.
